FOREWORD

With the desire to record some of the family data that I possess, this pamphlet is published. It concerns the ancestors and descendants of James Andrews, who migated with his family from Dighton, Mass., to Conway, Mass., in 1792. He was my great-great grandfather.

In 1887 a Lieut. George Andrews U.S.A. published an Andrews Genealogy in which the above James Andrews was mentioned, but it did not definitely tie him to the emigrant John Andrews on whom the Genealogy was based. Further information and study now make this possible and hence this Genealogy will begin with the emigrant John Andrews and trace the line to James Andrews. Beginning with James Andrews all his descendants so far as known will be given.

Numerous descendants have supplied information and to mention any one might well be an injustice to another. It is hoped that any who have corrections or supplemental information will send it to me so that another edition will be more nearly complete.

Investigations have yielded corrections and supplemental information to that given in the Andrews Genealogy by Lieut. Andrews and all such have been included. In 1924 Lieut. Andrews was living in Washington, D.C., and corresponded with the late Miss. Anna Trowbridge Andrews of Putnam, Conn., as to the place that James Andrews of Dighton and Conway fitted into in his Andrews Genealogy. Such correspondence has been made available by her sister Mrs. William R Barber of Putnam, Conn.

For the early generations Lieut. Andrews refers in his General alogy to a bible record elsewhere reported in the possession of the Providence, Rhode Island branch of the family. This, of course, is an important source and I have endeavored without success to trace its present location and can only hope it is safely preserved somswhere. Any information as to its whereabouts will be appreciated.

An important source of later Andrews information is that recorded in 1870 by Earl Andrews Hitchcock who, while visiting on the Andrews farm in East Deerfield, wrote down all the family information told him by his grandmother Experience Bardwell Andrews, wife of Andrew Andrews and daughter-in-law of James Andrews. Without this pretviously unpublished data the list of descendants would not be nearly so complete. She stated that the parents of James Andrews were James Andrews and his wife Mary Reed. Her data has been proved correct wherever checked from independent sources.

The descendants of James Andrews who remained in New England can be traced rather well, but those of his three sons who went to Chili, N.Y. are not so easily traced and some lines disappear as succeeding generations moved away from Chili.

In this Genealogy I have not listed all the ancestors of the wives who married the various Andrews men from In John Andrews through 5. James Andrews although in most cases that information is available and will be included in another Genealogy in preparation. The parents of the wives who married the Andrews men beginning with the children of 5. James Andrews have been included where known. The decimal numbering system has been used beginning with James Andrews to identify his descendants.

This small Genealogy will be followed by another larger one in which will be given all of my known ancestors back to the emigrant.

To me genealogical investigations are interesting although there are those who care nothing for such family information. It is hoped that all who have family data will at least record and preserve it for possible use by others who are interested.

1.JOHN ANDREWS

JOHN ANDREWS, a cooper by trade, came from Wales, England, according to the bible record which the Andrews Genealogy by Lieut. George Andrews U.S.A. states was in the possession of the Providence, Rhode Island branch of the family. He was first in America at Charlestown when he was listed as Mr. Andrews in the assignment of land in the first division on 6 March 1637. not previously nor later listed as an inhabitant of Charlestown. His was lot 28 of 5 acres. On 30 April 1657 John Andrews of Boston, county of Sussex, cooper, sold to John Knight of Charlestown the house and land at Charlestown which he had previously bought of James Mirick, cooper, and his wife Margeute. Said John Andrews and his wife Hannah acknowledged the sale on 13 May 1657. in Boston in 1653 when his wife Lucie died on 1 September 1653. He rented a house in Boston belonging to Thomas Emons, cordwainer, because in his will dated 20 January 1660 Thomas Emons left two houses in Boston to his wife Martha, one of which was then rented to John Andrews, cooper.

At his death on 25 June 1679 an inventory of his effects dated 29 July 1679 included "Tooles and Cooper's stuff, Dwelling House, grounds and house hold effects ". John Barber and Samuel Jackson were the appraisers. His second wife to whom he was married by January 1656 was HANNAH JACKSON, born on 1 March 1635-6, daughter of EDMUND JACKSON, who died in 1675, and MARTHA, who died on 12 November 1652. Edmund Jackson was admitted to the First Church in Boston on 15 November 1635 and was then a shoemaker. His house and garden were on the corner of what is now Court and Hanover Streets.

Hannah Andrews married John Dickinson for her second husband. On 5 November 1696 she filed a statement in connection with the estate of her late husband, John Andrews, in which she stated he left eight children and gave to son John Andrews of Bristol in the County of Bristol and to son Samuel Andrews of Weymouth all the remaining house and land at Boston in consideration of the fact that they had paid to younger children their portion of the money inheritance. Her father, Edmund Jackson, married Elizabeth Pilkenton on 17 October 1660 for his second wife. He died and his widow Elizabeth married William Beal of Marblehead. She died in November 1683. Edmund Jackson in his will dated in May 1675 mentioned his children by his first wife and among them Hannah. John and Hannah Andrews had ten children.

2. JOHN ANDREWS

JOHN ANDREWS, son of John and Hannah Andrews was born on 20 September 1662 and was in early life a house wright by trade. In 1692 he purchased a house and land from Thomas Lewis of Mendon New Bristoll now Bristol, Rhode Island which he 1701 in order to buy a farm at Taunton, Massachusetts. The farm carried with it water privileges on Three Mile River and there with Nathaniel Linkon he built a grist and sawmill. That location was known for 100 years afterwards as "Andrews Mills " and is now Westville. He was chairman of the board of Selectmen four years. His will was probated 17 August 1742, but the estate was not settled for twenty years. He married for his first wife ALICE, born on 6 July 1666, died on 1 February 1735, daughter of John Shaw and his wife Alice Phillips of Weymouth. John Shaw was baptized on 23 May 1630 and died on 16 September 1704 in Weymouth Massachusetts. His parents were ABRAHAM SHAW and his wife BRIDGET Best. They were married in Yorkshire, England on 24 1616. June He was of the parish of Halifax in Yorkshire and was in town, Massachusetts in 1636. His house and effects were lost by fire there in 1636 whereupon he moved to Dedham. Massachusetts. He died shortly after November 1638 and before November 1640 as there is a record in Lechford's Note Book of the latter which stated he was late of Dedham. Abraham and Bridget Best had eight children. The will of Abraham Shaw is known and in it he mentioned his son John and daughter Martha as being children. His eldest son Joseph and son-in-law Nicholas Biram were executors. Marye and Joseph were also mentioned as daughter and son. in Dedham was mentioned. There was no date on the will, inventory of the estate was dated 1638. His wife Bridget Best was baptized on 9 April 1592 and was the daughter of Henry Best of Ovenden, England. She probably died before November 1638 as she was not mentioned in his will dated then. John and Andrews had eight children. His second wife was Mary Danforth, widow of Jacob Barney and daughter of Rev. Samuel Danforth.

3. EDMUND ANDREWS

EDMUND ANDREWS, the third child of John and Alice Andrews was born at Bristol, Rhode Island on 7 June 1693 and died in Taunton Massachusetts on 14 January 1750. About 1715 he married Esther Harvey for his first wife and they had two children. Esther, wife of Edmund Andrews, was mentioned in a quit claim deed dated 23 February 1713-4 as given in the Bristol County deeds vol.10, p24. In 1719 he married for his second wife HANNAH LINCOLN, born in 1692, died on 16 February 1762, the daughter of THOMAS and MARY LINCOLN. Edmund Andrews left a will dated 16 June 1750 and it

mentioned all his children, including his married daughters. James Andrews was executor and was so appointed on 27 February 1750-1. The inventory was taken 28 February 1750-1 and approved on 13 March 1750-1.

4. JAMES ANDREWS

JAMES ANDREWS, son of Edmund and Hannah Andrews was born in Taunton, Massachusetts and married MARY REED on 6 October 1743 and the Taunton vital records state they were both of Taunton. She died on 12 October 1771. She was the daughter of William Reed and his wife Mary Richmond. With his brother Samuel he inherited from his father Edmund Andrews the grist mill on Three Mile River at Taunton as well as other real estate. In 1749 troops were sent to the frontier between New England and the St. Lawrence River. Taunton sent a Troop of Horse and James Andrews went as a private. In the campaign of 1756 a Taunton Company was under the command of James Andrews. Samuel Andrews was a corporal in the company. The activities of the company were reported in 28 February 1756.

James Andrews was the administrator of the estate of his unmarried sister Hannah. The appointment was dated 11 October 1765. James Andrews second wife was Mary Hoskins daughter of Joshua Hoskins and widow of Paul Pratt, who was born at Taunton on 9 June 1735 and died suddenly holding a plow on 24 April 1769. Paul Pratt and Mary Hoskins were married on 4 December 1755. On 6 May 1788 she signed a quit claim in connection with her estate and on 30 August 1784 leased to her son Paul Pratt of Taunton, her dower right in her husband's estate which consisted of 13 acres of land and a half interest in a house and barn. James Andrews second wife apparently outlived him, but the settlement of the estates of neither is recored. James Andrews was frequently in the records concerning deeds and the last recorded date was 9 May 1788. He died in 1789 according to an entry in 1807 in the diary of his son James which stated mother Andrews died 36 years ago in October and father Andrews died 18 years ago. This entry as to the death of his mother agrees with the date in the vital records.

5. JAMES ANDREWS

JAMES ANDREWS, son of James and Mary Andrews was born in Taunton, Massachusetts about 1748 and died suddenly in Conway Massachusetts on 10 August 1821, aged 75 years. About 1773 he married SUSANNA ATWOOD, born on 4 January 1757, died in Conway, Massachusetts on 26 May 1839. She was the daughter of Joseph Atwood and his wife Elizabeth Carpenter. James Andrews held a note dated 20 August 1784 at Dighton, Massachusetts from Elkanah Andrews for 18 shillings and also one from Jonathan Andrews dated 9 March 1781 at Dighton. James Andrews went to Conway, Massachusetts in 1792 from Dighton in an ox cart with his family. William Holloway and Seth Godfrey went to Conway from Dighton at about the same time.

In the 1780's James Andrews sold land at Dighton as evidenced by recorded deeds and just before leaving for Conway sold his house to George Williams. This house stood on Williams St. and was torn down in 1904 by Manuel Silva and a new house built on the site. He bought his farm in Conway from Abner Sheldon. James Andrews served in the American Revolution. His record is listed in the records of Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the War of the Revolution. The History of Taunton by S.H. Emery 1896 states that he was a private in Capt. Robert Crossman's Company in the alarm of 8 December 1776. He was also in Capt. Josiah King's Company in a secret expedition from 9 September 1777 to 29 October 1777.

James Andrews was a man of great honesty, uprightness and deeply religious. The story has been handed down to the writer that once some watermelons were stolen from the watermelon patch of James Andrews and while he had his suspicions as to who had done it he could not prove it. Accordingly he wrote to that that his wrong doing was known by three; meaning, although he did not so state, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. The man who had tak-It is said that en the melons came to James and paid for them. ministers visiting Conway used to stop at his house. will dated 7 September 1818 and filed 12 February 1822. tioned wife Susannah, sons James, John, Joseph Atwood, Cyrus, Andrew and daughters Susannah and Hannah. His son Benjamin was made executor and was bequeathed all the real estate after third life interest of Susannah, the wife. The will was witnessed by Elisha Thayer, Josiah Holloway and Seth Godfrey. James Andrews had a brother Seth.

5.1 JAMES ANDREWS

James Andrews was born at Dighton, Massachusetts on 19 May 1774 and died at Chile, New York on 9 September 1835. He married at Conway, Massachusetts Sophia Clary and their intentions were posted there on 29 March 1799. She was born on 5 April 1773 and died on 27 November 1830. James moved to Chile, New York about 1815. The 1830 census for Chile lists one male in his family between 50 and 60 and that was James and one female between the same ages who was his wife. Also a male between 20 and 30 who was his son Ira. A male between 15 and 20 can not be identified as a son of James and may have been a hired man or a son-in-law Of the females listed, one between 20 and 30 was Clarinda and one between 15 and 20 Sophia, but one under 5 can not be identified and may have been a grandchild. Children:

5.11 James Jr., died Sept. 1802.

5.12 Ira, born on 8 January 1805, died on 19 Oct.,1876. He married first Adeline Sheldon. After the death of his first wife prior to 1850, Ira married his cousin 5.52 Harriet Andrews and they had no children. Ira and Adeline had children. Children:

5.121 James Allen born in 1843, died in 1930. He married Amelia Kennell born in 1846 and died in 1915. They had one child Bertha born in 1870 and died 18 April 1942 at Rochester, New York and was buried in the Presbyterian cemetery in Chile. On the death of his bachelor cousin Joseph Allen Andrews in 1905 he went to live on the which was willed to James by Joseph. John Zuber of Paul Road worked for James Allen from 1905 to 1913 and states Bertha sold the farm about 1940. 5.122 H. (prob. Harriet) Adeline was born in 1845 and married Rev. Gillette. They had four children. John Zuber of 461 Paul Road, Chile states that a son of Rev.and Mrs. Gillette was in the Philippines in 1908. The National Archives has furnished information received from the Division of Territories and Island Possessions, Department of Interior that a Harrison Gillette was appointed Philippine service on 15 May 1901 and served as a teacher at Cavite, Cavite; Lingayen, Pangasinan; and Laoag, Ilocos Norte. On 17 September 1902 he was appointed a Deputy Treasurer of Ilocos Norte and was listed as holding that position as late as 1 January 1905. In 1914 the Bureau of Education, Philippine Islands stated his services had been entirely satisfactory, indicating he was still then in some branch of the Philippine service. His birthplace was given as Ohio. His sister Harriet F. Gillette was also a teacher in the Philippines and her home address was 15338 Columbia Ave., Harvey, Illinois. In 1905 she mentioned C. B. Gillette of Harvey, Illinois as her nearest of kin in

the United States. The National Archives further stated that it appeared both brother and sister visited the United States in 1904 and Harriet again visited in 1910. It appears most probable that the above Harrison and Harriet Gillette are two of the children of Rev. and Mrs. Gillette because when Joseph Allen Andrews (5.58) died in 1905 he left his money to H. Adeline Gillette of Harvey, Illinois. No further record of either Harrison or Harriet or their descendants has been found.

5.123 Two children died young.

5.13 Clarinda married and went to Michigan and died there. It is not known as to whether there are any descendants.

5.14 Sophia went to Michigan.

MARY ANDREWS

Mary Andrews was born at Dighton, Mass., on 29 November 1775 (19 November 1775 according to the Conway vital records) and died at Conway, Mass., on 13 October 1795.

5.2 DAVID ANDREWS

David Andrews was born at Dighton, Mass., on 17 June 1778 and died there on 30 April 1779.

5.3 JOHN ANDREWS

John Andrews was born at Dighton, Mass., on 2 July 1780 and died at Shelburne, Mass., on 21 February 1856 in his 76th year. On 3 March 1808 he married Content Hawks and their intentions were posted on 30 January 1808. Content was born on 20 September 1784 and died on 9 April 1850, the daughter of Hilkiah Hawks and Joanna Brooks. Hilkiah Hawks was the son of Zadock Hawks and Mary Bardwell and they were married on 5 July 1758. Mary Bardwell was the daughter of Samuel Bardwell and Martha Allen. Children:

- 5.31 Frederick Hilkiah was born at Conway, Mass.on 18 April 1809 and died at Greenfield, Mass., on 20 June 1851. He married 5.53 Mary Andrews, a cousin, and they had no children.
- 5.32 Velorus was born at Conway on 21 March 1813 and died at Deerfield on 1 April 1883. On 1 May 1850 he married Fanny Hoyt, born on 21 June 1817 and died on 1 February 1893, aged 75. She was the daughter of Jonathan and Dolly Hoyt. Velorus resided at Wisdom, Deerfield, Mass. Children:
 - 5.321 Frederick Herbert was born in March 1853 and married Lizzie A Cushing in November 1882. No children.
 - 5.322 William was born in May 1863. Married Dulla and they had ten children among whom were Vera Gold, and Velorus.
 - 5.323 George V was born in 1852 and died on 5 January 1861.
 - 5.324 John was born in 1854 and died on 15 November 1855. 5.325 J. Henry was born in 1856 and died on 22 August 1856.
 - 5.326 Charles was born in 1858 and died on 3 March 1859. (The above four children are buried in the Hawks cemetery on the edge of Shelburne and Deerfield)

5.3454 William Perry was born on 6 May 1907. He was graduated from Clark College and the University of Virginia Law School. He resides in Putnam, Conn., and in 1945 was Judge of the Municipal Court and a State Senator.

- 5.33 Caroline was born at Hawley, Mass., on 25 September 1815 and died on 1 November 1903. She married in 1864 Hiram Holmes of Williamsburg, Mass., being his third or fourth wife. They had no children.
- 5.34 John Alfred was born at Shelburne, Mass., on 26 June 1818 and died on 15 March 1894. He married first in 1849, Elvira Kingsbury of Halfax, Vt., who died on 19 November 1855 aged 28 years. His second wife was Sarah A Carpenter of Shelburne and they were married on 25 September 1856. She was the daughter of George Carpenter and was born on 11 June 1823 and died on 18 October 1904.

 - 5.3452 John Alfred was born on 1 June 1902 and died on 22 November 1936. A graduate of Worcester Polytechnic Institute. He did not marry.
 - 5.3453 Sarah Carpenter was born on 23 January 1905.A graduate of Connecticut College for Women. On 25 June 1931 she married Raymond Luther Pierce, born at Putnam, Conn., on 28 October 1903. He is a graduate of the University of Connecticut. They reside in Norwich Conn., and have three children: Elvira Ann, born on 25 May 1932; Nancy, born on 24 April 1934 and Sally Jane, born on 14 March 1939.
- 5.35 Dolly Hawks was born at Shelburne, Mass., on 22 May 1821 and died on 8 September 1893. On 4 May 1843 she married Nathan Osymn Newhall, who was born on 17 March 1815 and died on 4 July 1907. He was the son of Nathan Newhall and Graty Bardwell who were married on 31 December 1809. She was the daughter of Chester Bardwell and Mary (Polly) Hannum. Chester Bardwell was a descendant of the emigrant Robert Bardwell. Children:
 - 5.351 Alfred Andrews was born at Shelburne on 22 March 1846 and died on 19 December 1918. On 10 March 1881 he married Mary E Nims. Children:
 - 5.3511 Albert Earl was born on 12 February 1885. He never married.
 - 5.3512 Gertrude Nimes was born on 1 November 1888. On 11 November 1920 she married Edwin J Howes.

5.352 Nathan Byron was born at Shelburne on 10 April 1848 and died on 4 July 1917. On 9 June 1875 he married Florence Adelia Hawks who was born on 20 November 1854 and died on 10 May 1902.

5.3521 Halford Myron was born on 28 January 1878 and died on 5 June 1943. On 2 January 1904 he married Helen Aurelia Peterson, who was born on 21 July 1877. They had one child, Florence Ellen, born on 30 July 1906, now resides at Greenfield, Mass.

5.3522 Charles Nathan was born on 27 October 1883. On 16 June 1920 he married Jennie Sanderson who was born on 5 April 1897.

5.353 Corrilla Jannette was born at Shelburne on 29 December 1852 and died on 6 July 1921. On 16 June 1880 she married Tyler H Dodge who was born on 6 May 1852 and died on 5 December 1932. They had no children.

5.354 Dumont Osymn was born at Shelburne on 21 February 1857 and died on 29 April 1917. On 15 November 1882 he married 5.761 Susanna Andrews Hawks who was born March 1857 and died on 5 January 1940. She was the daughter of James Andrews Hawks and Ellen Sophia Stearns of Deerfield.

5.3541 Ernest Stuart was born on 9 September 1883 died on 3 March 1935.

5.3542 Rose Ellen was born on 20 July 1891. On 5 February 1920 she married Frank Wallace Vivier. Children:

They have five children: Barbara F, born on 12 February 1922; Dorothy E, born on 29 December 1923; Helen Joyce, born on 13 January 1925; Margaret Ella, born on 19 September 1926 and Catherine E, born on 11 April 1929 5.36 Edwin was born at Shelburne on 26 September 1826 and died on 3 November 1905. On 3 January 1855 he married his first wife, Fanny Amelia Batcheldor, who was born in 1832 and died on 10 June 1856. There was one child by this marriage, Carrie Amelia, born on 3 February 1856. On 1 or 3 December 1859 he married Lydia Warren Carpenter for his second wife and she was born on 3 January 1828 and died on 1 May 1908. Children:

5.361 John Kimball was born on 14 October 1860 and died on 19 January 1939. On 11 June 1903 he married Clarise Anabella Fiske, who was born on 28 October 1865 and died on 31 December 1931. They had no children.

She was the daughter of Hezikiah Warriner and his wife Catherine Leonard. Other than the life interest to his mother Benjamin inhemited the farm and other real property left by his father James Andrews. Children:

5.5 JOSEPH ATWOOD ANDREWS

Joseph Atwood Andrews was born at Dighton, Mass., on I August 1784 and died in 1848. He moved to Chili, N.Y., when years old or in 1815. He married Rebecca, who was born in in 1787 and died in 1853. Presumably he married Rebecca prior to moving to Chili. In the 1830 census of Chili a male listed as between 40 and 50 was Joseph Andrews and a female 40 and 50 his wife. The male under 5 was his son Joseph Allen and the males between 15 and 20, and between 30 and 40 can not be identified and were probably hired men. The female under 5 daughter Mahala and the 3 females between 5 and 10 must have been daughters Harriet, Mary and Ruth although Harriet and Mary were over 10 years of age. Children:

5.51 J.Allen was born in 1820 and died at 11 months of age.

5.52 Harriet was born on 22 November 1816 and married her cousin 5.12 Ira Andrews. She was listed in the 1850 census with Ira Andrews andwas either keeping house for him had oralready married him. She died on 20 March 1880. 5.53 Mary was born in 1819 and died in 1897. She married 5.31 Frederick Hilkiah Andrews for her first husband and after his death in 1851 married a man named Norton and moved to Michigan. In later life probably after the death of her she lived in Chili with her brother Joseph Allen and was buried in the Presbyterian cemetery there. 5.54 Dennis was born in 1823 and died in 1830. 5.55 Ruth married Rufus Randall before 1850 and moved to Michigan and there had a son Rufus born in 1849. Ruth Randall with son Rufus age one year were listed in the 1850 census of previously Chili so it is evident that her husband had died which confirms family tradition. According to left by Experience Bardwell Andrews as recorded in 1870 Ruth Randall was to marry again but did not. The Utica, N.Y.directory 1878 lists for the first time a Randall in business with a partner named Hawley as a paint dealer at 71 Genesee St.and residing at 13 Rutger St. In the 1880 directory R.P.Randall was living at 16 Howard Ave. In the 1883 directory Rufus P. Randall was living at 20 Lansing and Mrs.Ruth Randall, without

doubt his mother, at 18 Lansing St. After 1885 both disappear in future directories indicating removal elsewhere. John Zuber of Paul Road, Chili who worked for Mrs. J.N. Andrews on her farm for seven years between 1906 and 1913 states that Mrs. Ruth Randall had a daughter Gertrude in addition to a son Rufus. He also states that young Rufus Randall went on the stage and joined a show somewhere in Virginia. I believe he is refering to Rufus Randall, the grandson of Mrs. Ruth Randall and in that case it seems likely Gertrude was also a grand daughter.

5.56 Mahala was born on 20 May 1826. She married Samuel Carpenter at Readsboro, Vermont on 4 March 1863 and resided there. The Readsboro town records list her as Rebecca M Andrews. She was listed in the 1850 Chili census as Mahala R. Andrews, 24 years old. Samuel Carpenter died at Readsboro on 3 May 1890, age 76 years. They had no children.

5.57 John Newton was born in September 1831 and died in 1904. He married Annie M.Loder, who was born in Chili, N.Y., in 1837 and died in 1913. He lived on Paul Road, Chili, N.Y., and was buried at Grove Place cemetery there. He was listed in the 1850 Chili census as 19 years old. They had a child Charles D., born in 1871 and died in 1872.

5.58 Joseph Allen was born in 1829 and died in 1905. He resided at Chili, N.Y. and never married. On his death he willed his farm to his cousin, 5.121 James Allen Andrews, who went to live on it with his wife Amelia and daughter Bertha. After the death of her parents Bertha sold the farm about 1940. Joseph Allen willed his money to Mrs. H Adeline Gillette 5.122, sister of James Allen. Joseph Allen was listed in the 1850 census as 22 years old.

5.6 CYRUS ANDREWS

Cyrus Andrews was born at Dighton, Mass., on 27 August 1786 and went to Conway with his parents in 1792 and later moved to Chili, N.Y. He had two children who later went to Illinois. He had three wives. The 1830 census listed Cyrus Andrews as between 40 and 50 years old and his wife as between 30 and 40. Also listed was a male between 60 and 70 who can not be identified and may have been his wife's father. Also listed was a male between 5 and 10, a female between 5 and 10 and a female between 10 and 15 years old.

5.7 SUSANNA ANDREWS

Susanna Andrews was born at Dighton, Mass., on 7 October 1788. She married Orlando Hawks of Deerfield on 26 December 1811 He was born on 23 October 1787 and was the son of Hilkiah Hawks and his wife Joanna Brooks. They resided in Deerfield, Mass., and he was killed on 27 August 1851. Children:

Andrew Andrews, son of James and Susanna Andrews was born in Dighton, Mass., on 16 October 1790 and when two years old moved to Conway, Mass., with his parents. At 17 years of age he went to Buckland, Mass., to learn the tanners trade. When 20 years old he went to Watertown, Mass., and worked at his trade for three and a half years. From there to Hawley where he bought a farm with brother John and they built a house. On 18 May 1820 he married Experience Bardwell, who was born in Shelburne, Mass., on 10 May 1789 and died at Deerfield, Mass., on 22 October 1885. She was the daughter of Ebenezer Bardwell and his wife Philine Smead a descendant of the emigrant Robert Bardwell. After 17 years at Shelburne Andrew went to Meadow Mills in Deerfield, Mass., and tended a sawmill. Three years later he moved to Great River in Deerfield and bought a farm. This farm of about 110 acres on the Connecticut River was left to his son Andrew Baxter and later taken over by Andrew Andrews' daughter Catherine Andrews Hitchcock and finally passed out of the family in 1920 when it sold by Delbert Baxter Hitchcock and his brother Walter Bardwell Hitchcock to a man named Way. Eliakim Brooks had been dead as much as 20 years in 1870 when Experience Andrews related to Andrew Earl Hitchcock the Andrews family history referred to in the foreword. Children:
