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ADAMS IMMIGRANTS TO AMERICA

By JAMES TAYLOR ADAMS

FOR fifty years following Sir Walter Raleigh's ill-fated attempt to plant colonies along the Atlantic seaboard, immigration to America was looked upon in England as a most hazardous undertaking.

The story of the mysterious disappearance of the colony on Roanoke Island had been told and retold until it was a fireside tale in every British home. Stories of hardship and suffering were rife in the land; and intermingled with them were many wild and terrible sounding, superstitiously concocted, tales, picturing, in the most blood chilling manner imaginable, the tragic and violent death awaiting the homeseeker in that strange, new land far across the treacherous sea.

America was, in truth, a dominion of wild beasts and savage people. Supported, as they were, by an evil-omened ocean and a strong superstition, it would take brains, brawn and bravery to wrest it from their grasp. It can not be wondered at then that none but the fearless could be persuaded to tear their lives away from kindred, home and friends, and plunge into the untracked wilderness of the western world, seeking their fortune, where death might be their only reward.

So it came about in those days that the departure of a colonization expedition from the shores of Britain was attended by more real, genuine excitement than would be manifested today if a fleet of airships should fly away, bound for the planet Mars. It was a time for tears; a time for fond farewells; and a time for evil prophesying. Big, strong bodied, men with reputations for daring deeds, lost courage, turned back at the last moment and refused to go. Only the staunch-hearted and resolute set their face toward the west, determined to do or die.

The breaking of home-ties; leaving familiar scenes and a quiet, uneventful life, and crossing the broad Atlantic to

establish a home or seek a fortune in a strange, unfriendly land was an act of courage. Yet it was only the initial test of the strength needed to carry such an undertaking to a successful end. The real, final, soul-searching test was awaiting the immigrant on the shores of America. There he would be confronted by nature, ever at work, trying and testing the new-comer; weeding out the weak from among the strong. Wild, ferocious, animals would stalk him through deep forests; the savage yell of the murderous Indian would disturb his dreams at night; and deadly fevers would be found lurking in every swamp and pool. If he possessed the courage and physique to meet and overcome all these and a thousand other obstacles he stayed to carve his name on the breast of the land where, in after years, it would be honored by a great and appreciative nation; and revered by a proud posterity. While, on the other hand, if he failed to pass the supreme test—if he was unable to cope with and master the dangers besetting him on every hand—he soon gave up and went back to the land from whence he came, there to spend a quiet old age, beside a peaceful hearthstone, conjuring up and reciting terrible tales of the life in America, to wide-eyed grandchildren.

Those were times that tried the very souls of men. Spirits were broken until none but the hardy and fearless were left undaunted. It took a strong courage to come to America; it took a mighty resolution to stay when here. Such a condition aided, rather than hindered the substantial growth of the colonies, however. It was a natural system of selection—the choosing of a parent stock from which has sprung the finest type of manhood the world has ever known.

The Adamses were among the first to arrive and no record has been found of one that returned to his fatherland. They had cut all ties that bound them to the old world and came, ready and willing, to tackle the new. They were not lured across the Atlantic through love for adventure. They were a home making, forest felling, nation building people, and came seeking for themselves and posterity, a freedom of thought, speech and action, forever

denied their fathers. And they came prepared to suffer to gain their goal; even unto death.

History shows them ever at the front; leaders in every progressive movement, from subduing the forests to wresting their country from the strangling grasp of a despotic monarch. It was an Adams who hewed out and laid the foundation stone of American Independence; and it was the Adamses who encouraged their countrymen to shake off the heavy yoke of a foreign tyrant, and build thereon one of the greatest nations that lies beneath the heaven's blue.

Onward, westward, they have pushed, not only with the advance of civilization, but leading the parade. They have scaled mountains; broke up prairies; harnessed great rivers; and reclaimed deserts. Today they are to be found in every nook and corner of the United States; leaders, still, in every movement having as its objective the betterment of home, country or mankind.

Records show the Adamses fighting and dying to defend the country which their ancestors suffered so bravely to establish. On every roster can be found their names, from the Revolution to the World War.

The compiler of this work craves no greater honor than the knowledge that he is a descendant of one of these brave-hearted men of old.

JOHN

Was probably the first Adams to set foot on American soil; having arrived on the ship "Fortune" in 1621, and settled at Plymouth, Massachusetts. He married Ellen Newton, who came on the ship "Ann" in 1623; and of whom it was said: "she was the only female north of Chesapeake Bay with such a baptismal name." He died in the year 1633, leaving his wife and three children, John, James and Susan.

RALPH

Was living at "Adams" near Elizabeth City, Virginia, in 1623.

ROBERT

Came on the ship "Bona Nova" before 1624, for in that year he, and his servant, Richard Smith, were witnesses before a Court held at James City in Virginia.

WILLIAM

Born in England, February 3, 1594, he came to America in the spring of 1628. Settled first at Cambridge, then at Newtown, Massachusetts, where he was made freeman in 1639; removed from thence to Ipswich, Massachusetts, prior to 1642, where he died in 1661. He is said to have descended from Randall Adams, of an old Saxon family at Norwood, town of Wem, in Shropshire.

JEREMY

Came to America in 1632, and settled at Braintree, Massachusetts; removed to Cambridge, then called Newtown, in 1635. He went with the Rev. Mr. Hookers company to Hartford, Connecticut, in 1636, where he died August 11, 1683.

HENRY

Came to America with eight sons and one daughter in 1634, and settled at Braintree, Massachusetts. He was the great-great-grandfather of John Adams second President of the United States.

RICHARD

Came in the ship "Abigail" in 1635, and settled in Salem, Massachusetts. He was a bricklayer.

ROBERT

Came to Ipswich, Massachusetts, in 1635, with his wife, Eleanor; thence to Salem in 1638. Settled at Newbury in 1640 on lands still in possession of his descendants. Eleanor died June 12, 1677, and he married, February 9, 1678 Sarah, the widow of Henry Short. He died October 12, 1682, at the age of eighty years.

PHILLIP

Is mentioned in "Farmer's Register" as a "first-comer" to Massachusetts.

ROCHELL

Came to Virginia with James Vanerit in 1636, and settled in Elizabeth City County.

THOMAS

Came to Virginia with John Neale in 1636, and settled in

Accomack County. Records show his name spelled "Addams."

ANDREW

Came to Virginia with Francis Fowler in 1637, and settled in James River County.

THOMAS

Came to Virginia with Humphrey Higgensin in 1637; nothing further is known of him.

GEORGE

Came to Virginia with Captain Francis Eppes in 1637, and settled in Charles River County.

FERNANDINI

Was called a "shoemaker from London" and was living at Dedham, Massachusetts with his wife, Ann, in 1637.

EDE

(Probably Edward) came to Virginia with Richard Milton in 1638, and settled in Charles City County.

RICHARD

Embarked for Virginia in the ship "Globe of London" August 6, 1638. His age was given as 22.

EDWARD

Was living at New Haven, Connecticut, in 1640; at Milford, in 1646; and at Fairfield in 1650. His will, dated August 7, 1671, mentions wife, Margaret and children, Samuel, Abraham, Mary, Merwin, Nathaniel, John and Nathan.

JOHN

Came to Virginia with William Lawson in 1642, and settled in Isle of Wight County.

RICHARD

Came to Virginia with James Whitting in 1643. Records shows his name as "Addams."

ANDREW

Was living at Hartford, Connecticut in 1643, where he was employed as a schoolmaster.

GEORGE

Was at Watertown, Massachusetts, before 1645; removed to Lexington in 1664. He was called a "glover."

CHRISTOPHER

Was at Braintree, Massachusetts, in 1645. Later he removed to Killery where he had a fine estate. In his will dated June 13, 1686, he mentions wife, Margaret and four children, John, Mark, Ann and Mary, also a cousin, named Isaac Goodwright, to whom he gives two cows.

JOHN

Came to Virginia with Roger Johns in 1645, and settled in Northampton County.

THOMAS

Came to Virginia with Lewis Burwell in 1648, and settled in Yorke River County.

CHARLES

Was taxed at Dover, New Hampshire, in 1648. Nothing further known of him.

THOMAS

Came to Virginia with Joseph Croshawe in 1649, and settled in Yorke County.

JOHN

Born in England in 1622, and came to New England in 1650, with his wife, Ann and daughter, Rebecca, and settled at Cambridge, Massachusetts.

WILLIAM

Was in Hartford, Connecticut, in 1650. Bought lands at Farmington in 1653. Died there in 1655. His wife was named Eliza.

WILLIAM

Came to Virginia with John Pouncey in 1652. Nothing further known of him.

ALEXANDER

Was a shipwright in Boston in 1652 where he was made freeman in that year. Later he removed to Dorchester.

NATHANIEL

Was a "turner" in Boston; married there November 25, 1652, Elizabeth, the daughter of Philemon Portmort.

NATHANIEL

Was a blockmaker in Boston in 1653. Married Mary — by whom he had eleven children. He died March 30, 1690.

PETER

Came to Virginia with John Hansford in 1653, and settled in Gloucester County.

GEORGE

Came to Virginia with Richard Carey in 1643. Nothing further known of him.

RICHARD

Came to Virginia with Captain Nicholas Marteaw in 1654 and settled in Westmoreland County.

WILLIAM

Came to Virginia with George Abbott in 1656, and settled in Nansemond County.

GEORGE

Was at Branford, Connecticut, in 1657 when he married the widow of Leslie Bradfield. His will dated October 10, 1677, mentions only one son, John.

THOMAS

Was at New Haven, Connecticut, April 7, 1657, when he took the oath of fidelity. Married November 27, 1667 Rebecca, daughter of William Potter. There is a story of his having been mistaken, in New Haven, in 1652, for Charles II, of England.

FRANCIS

Came from England to Charles County, Maryland, in 1658, and was living at a place called "Troop's Rendezvous" in 1661.

HENRY

Was at Boston, Massachusetts, May 10, 1660, when he married Mary, daughter of William Petty of Weymouth.

EDWARD

Was living at Winsdor, Connecticut, in 1660, where on May 25, of that year, he married Eliza, daughter of Thomas Buckland. He died August 15, 1683 leaving an only child, Mary, born at Winsdor, August 28, 1671.

THOMAS

Was in Isle of Wight County, Virginia before 1664. Brother of William Adams of Kenton, Devonshire, England.

JOHN

Was at Winsdor, Connecticut, before 1675; at Simsbury in 1677, where he married Abigail, daughter of Humphrey Pumey.

ROGER

Was living at Roxbury, Massachusetts before 1675. His will is dated December 14, 1713.

JOHN

Came to Virginia and was granted lands with George Brent in 1677 on Hunting Creek.

DANIEL

Was living at Simsbury, Connecticut, in 1687, which year he is supposed to have married Mary, daughter of Samuel Pumey. Was probably a brother of John Adams of Winsdor, Connecticut.

ABRAHAM

Was an "Inn-holder" in Boston, and one of the Band of Volunteers who, in October, 1689, took a pirate vessel in the Vineyard Sound and brought her into Boston. He had lived at Falmouth, Massachusetts, where, before 1667, he had married Sarah, daughter of Arthur Mackworth.

JOHN

Came from Worcestershire, England, to Charles County, Maryland, about 1700. He, it is said, was a first cousin of Lord George Lyttleton. His will dated September 16, 1640, mentions his wife, Elizabeth (Nailor) Adams and five sons: Richard, Thomas Randolph Greenfield, John, Luke and George.

MATTHEW

Was living in Chowan County, North Carolina, before 1700. His will dated August 9, 1703, mentions wife, Sarah and son, Matthew and daughter, Eleanor.

JONATHAN

Was a "blockmaker" in Boston. It is learned from his will, dated April 1, 1707, that his wife was Rebecca, a daughter of James Andrews of Falmouth.

ALEXANDER

Was ordained by the Bishop of London in 1703 and came to Maryland in 1704. He was for several years Rector of Stepeny Parish in Somerset County. His will left his estate to his sons, John and William and the children of his deceased son, Rev. Alexander Adams.

EBENEZER

Said to have been a son of one Richard Adams of Abridge, Essex, England, who is described as "Citizen and Merchant Tailor of London." He was living in New Kent County, Virginia, before 1714. He received grants of 3,983 acres of land in New Kent and Henrico Counties. About 1718, he married Tabitha, daughter of Richard Cocke "the younger" of Brems. He died June 13, 1735.

WILLIAM

Came to America from Argyleshire, Scotland in 1721, and settled at Londonderry (Derry), New Hampshire. He is thought to have married his wife Mary, in America. Their first child was born in 1726.

JAMES

Born in Scotland and came to America in 1721 with his brother William.

JOHN

Was living in Bath County, North Carolina, before 1732. His will dated February 17, 1733-34, names his son, Abraham executor; and mentions seven other children: James, Emanuel, Martha, John, Thomas, Rachell and Mary.

ABRAHAM

In his will made March 13, 1733, and recorded in Barthia County, North Carolina, he mentions sons, Willowby, Abraham, Richard and William.

PETER

In his will, dated December 13, 1745, and recorded in Chowan County, North Carolina, he mentions his wife, Sarah and son, John. Also brother, John Adams of Wrentham, New England, and his children; and sister, Mary Mounie, of Crediton in Devonshire, Kingdom of Great Britain.

JOHN

Was living in Wrentham, Massachusetts in 1745, at which time he was named in his brother, Peter Adams's will, made December 13 of that year.

SAMUEL

One of three brothers, all of them shipbuilders, who came from Scotland about 1750, in a vessel of their own construction. They settled first on Long Island, but later moved to Hunterdon County, New Jersey.

WILLIAM

Brother of Samuel with whom he came to America about 1750. Served in the Revolution with the New Jersey troops and was probably killed in battle.

PAUL

Came from Scotland to Long Island, New York, with his brothers, Samuel and William, about 1750. A sister also was with the three brothers. They all removed to New Jersey; the brothers enlisting in the War of the Revolution in which two of them lost their lives. The survivor was the ancestor of Aaron Adams who was living in New York City as late as 1892.

JOHN

Came from Ireland to Virginia about 1755 and married the daughter of one Andrew Miller.

JAMES

Shipped as a stowaway on a Man-o-War from England, when refused passage on account of his youth; was discovered at sea and forced into the service. For several years he sailed the seas, deserting the ship at Norfolk, Virginia about 1769. He served through the Revolution on the American side, at the close of which, he settled in South Carolina; later removing to Alexander County, North Carolina, where he died about 1800.

JOHN

Was born in Great Britain in 1720, and came to America about the middle of the eighteenth century and settled in Pennsylvania. A few years later he removed to Rockbridge County, Virginia and settled at Timberridge. It is said that his wife, Jane Hutchinson, was closely connected with the nobility of Scotland; and that he was connected with the nobility of England. He was a planter of means and owned many negroes, and entertained with such lavish, such princely hospitality, that his homestead was known as "Eden."

DAVID

Came from England, Ireland or Scotland to North Carolina about 1770; served the American Revolution and died soon after the close of the war, leaving descendants.

WILLIAM

Born at Paisley, Scotland, August 26, 1790; emigrated to America in 1821 or 1822 and settled at St. John, New Brunswick; removing to Pawtucket, Rhode Island, a few years later where he died, leaving descendants.

HENRY

Born in Germany; he emigrated to the United States about 1860 and settled at Cincinnati, Ohio.

THE ADAMS FAMILY IN AMERICA 1790

By JAMES TAYLOR ADAMS

THE constitutional requirement under which the first Federal enumeration of the inhabitants of the United States of America was made is contained in Article I, section 2, and provides that—

“Representatives and direct taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union according to their respective numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole number of free persons, including those bound to service for a number of years, and excluding Indians not taxed, three-fifths of all other persons. The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent term of ten years, in such manner as they shall by law direct.”

This provision was embodied in the Constitution for political reasons wholly, and with no thought of providing for a system of collecting and preserving the statistical data so beneficial to the genealogist and historian of these latter times. It was evidently the framers of the Constitution contemplated that the two-fold purpose of the enumeration would insure a reasonably accurate return of the population on the part of the individual States, the temptation to exaggerate for purposes of representation in Congress being offset by the fact that, in such cases, the apportionment of direct taxes would be correspondingly increased. It is true, nevertheless, that under this constitutional requirement the United States was the first country to provide for a regular periodical, and systematical, enumeration of its inhabitants; but in the modern sense of the term it could not be rightly called a census, and, as a matter of fact the word “census” does not form a part of the organic act providing for the first enumeration, passed at the second session of the First Congress.

By this act, which was approved March 1, 1790, the marshals of the several judicial districts of the United

States were required to cause the number of the inhabitants in their respective districts to be taken, omitting Indians not taxed, and distinguishing free persons, including those bound to service for a term of years, from all others. The act also required the marshals to distinguish the sex and color of free persons and free males of sixteen years and upwards from those under that age; in the latter case, undoubtedly, for the purpose of ascertaining the military and industrial strength of the nation.

The First Enumeration was to commence on the first Monday in August, 1790, and close within nine calendar months. The inquiries related to but six items, and called for the name of the head of the family and the number of persons in each family of the following descriptions: Free white males sixteen years of age and upward; free white males under sixteen years; free white females; other free persons; slaves.

The following tables have been compiled from data collected by a careful and painstaking search of the reports of this First Federal Enumeration and, with the exception of those for Virginia, are uniform. The first figure, or group of figures, following the name of the head of the family, represents the total number of free white males sixteen years of age and upward, including head of family; the second, free white males under sixteen years; the third, free white females; the fourth other free persons; the fifth, slaves; the sixth, or final group of figures show the total number of all persons belonging to the household, white or black, free or bound or slaves. Explanation of the Virginia tables will be found at the beginning of the Virginia section.

It will be noticed in these records that no tables appear for Delaware, Georgia, Kentucky, New Jersey and Tennessee. The returns from these states, also from Virginia, were destroyed during the War of 1812, and while some fragments may be in existence, they have not been found available for this work. Virginia was more fortunate than her sister states of Delaware, Georgia, Kentucky, New Jersey and Tennessee, inasmuch as there had been a state enumeration made of her inhabitants in the year 1782,

some of the belated returns being known as the "Census of 1784." This enumeration of the inhabitants of Virginia was incomplete, however, several of the county records being unaccounted for in the returns.

It will be well for those searching for the names of their Adams ancestors in the tables to bear in mind that the enumerations in the several states were all not made on the same day, in the same week or even in the same month. The marshal of one district may have completed his work before he in the adjoining district had commenced his. This condition allowed for two or more enumerators to list the same family where there had been emigration from one locality to another. While it is doubtful if there is to be found a duplication in the tables following, still it is possible.

ADAMS OF SNOW HILL

ACCORDING to the most reliable information obtainable Phillip Addams,^① and his wife Anne, were living in Somerset County, Maryland, as early as 1676. Anne must have died about 1688; for on September 1, 1691, Phillip married his second wife, Mary Barry. He died in 1696.

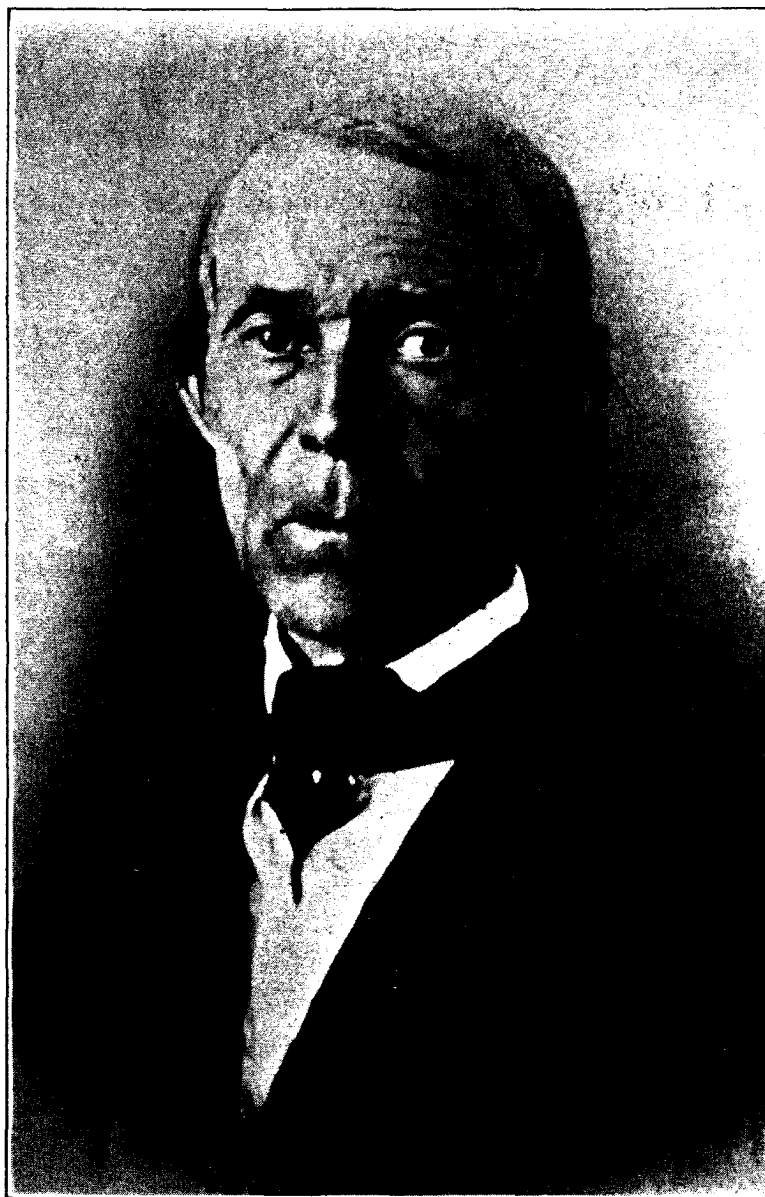

Christopher Beeks came to America at the time of the Revolution with a Commission from the King of England, but deciding that the Cause of the Americans was just, he returned the Commission and joined the Americans in their struggle for freedom.
Eli Adams was a local preacher in the Ohio Methodist Episcopal Church for over fifty years.

In November, 1847, the following obituary notice of Mrs. Elizabeth (Beeks) Adams, by C. B. Warrington, appeared in Ohio newspapers.

ELIZABETH BEEKS ADAMS

Died November 18, 1847, near Mechanicsburg, Champaign County, Ohio, sister Elizabeth Adams, consort of Rev. Eli Adams, and daughter of Christopher and Catherine Beeks.

Sister Adams was born November 15, 1790, in the state of Virginia and emigrated, with her parents, from Augusta County to Xenia, Ohio, where in August, 1810, she was united in marriage to Reverend Eli Adams.

In 1814 she, with her husband, united with the Methodist Episcopal Church, and soon thereafter embraced religion. She was a pious and exemplary Christian, beloved by all who knew her, and has left an affectionate husband and eight children, with a large circle of friends and acquaintances, to mourn her loss; she died in the triumph of faith and gave satisfactory evidence that she has gone to the Regions of Light and Bliss.

She endured her affliction with patience and Christian fortitude.

For about eighteen months previous to her decease her zeal in the service of God was very much increased, and frequently while engaged in family devotion, she was constrained to praise the Lord aloud. A short while before she died she tenderly embraced her husband and said: "We have lived to see all our children grown but one, and the Lord will take care of him. We have been blessed above many parents in this respect. It was not designed for us always to remain here together. We must part. This body is all weakness, but God is my strength."

Five of her children, she called them one by one to her bedside and after affectionately embracing them, bid them farewell and exhorted them to meet her in Heaven. Taking her son, who was the attending physician, by the hand, she said: "William, my child, live for God. Mourn not for me; as children you have been greatly blessed; you have not been deprived of your parents in early life and thrown upon an unfriendly world like many others; but the Lord has permitted us to raise you all, but James."

She then again called James to her bedside and said to him: "Be a good boy and meet your mother in Heaven."

Three of her sons being in Illinois, her dying request to them was to meet her in Heaven.

Her only sister, Mrs. Mary Powers, being present and not a subject of Saving Grace, she affectionately addressed her on the subject of religion and exhorted her to seek salvation and meet her in Heaven.

She requested to be buried at Mechanicsburg; and desired that her funeral sermon be preached from Revelations: Fourteenth chapter and thirteenth verse, "And I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me Write, Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them." Her request was fulfilled.

She died of inflammation of the lungs.

The following obituary notice, and sketch of the life of the Reverend Eli Adams (43), was prepared by William Williams, and published in church and newspapers in the

vicinity of Tradersville and Xenia, shortly after his death in May, 1870.

ELI ADAMS

The subject of this sketch was born in Worcester County, Maryland, July 13, 1785. He was brought by his widowed mother to the western wilds and settled in what now constitutes the state of Kentucky when he was but seven years of age. Here he remained until 1808, when he removed to Xenia, Ohio. In 1810 he was united in marriage to Elizabeth Beeks, with whom he lived long, and happily.

In 1814, they both experienced religion and united with the Methodist Episcopal Church and continued faithful members of the same until death gave them their discharge and reward. Brother Adams was licensed to preach about fifty years ago; four years after was ordained deacon, and four years from that, elder. In his private and public relations to the church he was always faithful, earnest, devoted.

He preached a great deal and was always respected as a very industrious, and earnest minister of the Word, and only failed to work for the Master when old age and increasing infirmities rendered it impossible.

As a citizen, he stood without reproach or suspicion, strictly upright in all business relations, and was highly esteemed by his neighbors.

His religious life was more distinctly marked by a holy, sweet example than by words or outward professions; he lived well and around his life there gathered a quiet, spiritual power. Thus was the church blessed through fifty years with this pure and devoted life.

Many will rise up in Heaven and call him blessed. His form and words are gone but his spirit is indelibly impressed on our souls.

His patience, love and wisdom are more sacred now than when he moved among us. His last sickness was attended with much suffering, yet endured with Christian patience and resignation. He peacefully fell asleep in Jesus at the home of his son, Eli, in Madison County, Ohio, May 10, 1870, at the advanced age of eighty-four years, ten months and four days. "Servant of God, well done."

The following is a newspaper account of the death and funeral services of Mrs. Eliza Ann (64) Adams Nagely of Clinton, Illinois.

ELIZA ANN ADAMS NAGELY

Mrs. Eliza A. Nagely passed away at 9:45 p. m., Sunday, July 18, 1897, of Bright's disease, aged 77 years.

Last November she was taken sick and for the last four weeks had been confined to her bed. During the last hours of her life she was in an unconscious state and death came peacefully in the presence of her family.

Those from abroad at her demise were: Thomas Bosler, Los Angeles, California; Amos Johnson, Ellenwood, Kansas, both sons-in-laws to the deceased; Mrs. William Henry Harrison Adams, Bloomington, Illinois, and Charles Nagely of Chicago.

Mrs. Nagely was born in Madison County, Ohio, February 14, 1820, being a daughter of Reverend Eli Adams, who was for fifty years a prominent Methodist minister in that state. On October 4, 1838, she was united in marriage to Aaron Nagely at the home of her parents.

With her husband she continued to reside in Ohio until 1849 when they came to Illinois and settled in Clinton, where they have since resided.

Mrs. Nagely was the mother of nine children, two of whom died in infancy and another, Mrs. William Phares, died February 18, 1896.

The names of the surviving children are William G. Nagely, Denver, Colorado; Mrs. Pearl Bosler, Los Angeles, California; Jennie and D. C. Nagely, Clinton and Charles

Nagely of Chicago, and Mrs. Amos Johnson of Ellenwood, Kansas.

Funeral services were held at the family residence at 3 o'clock, Tuesday afternoon, July 20, Mrs. Jeanette Edmiston, having charge of the music.

Mrs. Nagely became a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1836, in her sixteenth year. In the summer of 1862 she was baptized by Elder Dudley Downes, and united with the Christian Church of Clinton.

She was loved by a large circle of old acquaintances who mourn her death.

JACOB SMITH ADAMS

The Reverend Jacob Smith Adams, superannuated member of the Ohio Methodist Conference, died at his home in Delaware, Ohio, on February 26, 1906. He was eighty-four years old and was highly esteemed. Funeral services were held at the William Street Church under the direction of Dr. Mann and Dr. Barnes. They were assisted by Dr. J. H. Fitzwater, Dr. Homer Smith, Dr. Kemble and Dr. Idleman. Reverend Paul R. Hickok presented a tribute from the Minister's Association of Delaware, who attended in a body.

The exercises were closed at Mortuary Chapel by the impressive ritual of the I. O. O. F. Dr. Mann referred to the fact that there were but two ministers in the Ohio Conference older than Mr. Adams and that, with his own sainted father, he had toiled in those early years in the laying of the foundations of that great conference.

Dr. Barnes based his remarks upon the text, "Thine eyes shall see the King in His beauty."

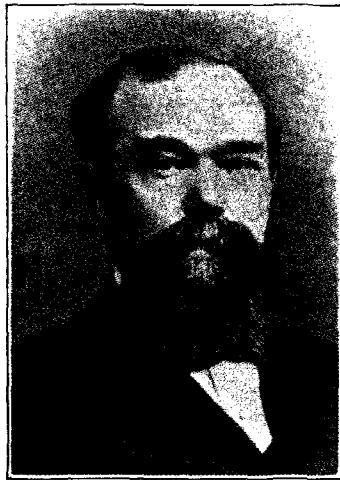

William Henry Harrison Adams, D.D.

107. (1) William Henry Harrison, born at Effingham, Effingham County, Illinois, March 30, 1840; died at Hot Springs, Arkansas, March 12, 1890, and is buried in Bloomington, Illinois. He was twice married, first, August 30, 1861 to Sarah E. Campbell, born September 7, 1837; died January 14, 1866; second, August 27, 1868, Hannah Westfall Concklin, born in Plymouth, Ohio, October 26, 1842; she resides at 1837 Greenleaf Avenue, Rogers Park, Illinois. At the outbreak of the Civil War he enlisted as a private in Company A, 111th Illinois Volunteers. In 1863 he was promoted to First Lieutenant, later to Captain and then breveted a Major with a

Commission signed by President Lincoln, "for faithful and meritorious service." He commanded the Fourth Battery; drilled the first 200 colored troops mustered into the service; organized them into companies and placed them in their proper commands. He resigned July 4, 1865.

Shortly after his resignation from the army he entered Northwestern University at Evanston, Illinois, carrying the work of the college of letters and the Garrett Biblical Institute's course at the same time, receiving the degree of B. A. in June, 1870 and B. D. in October of the same year. Was pastor of the Methodist Church in Monticello, Illinois, and later at Clinton in the same state. In June, 1875, he was elected President of the Illinois Wesleyan University at Bloomington, Illinois; he entered upon the duties of that position in the September following.

The degree of Doctor of Divinity was conferred upon him by Northwestern University in June, 1876.

As a preacher and platform speaker he had not many peers and fewer superiors. The great simplicity of his language, combined with richness and fullness of thought indicated something of his greatness, while his geniality and magnetism held his audience in his own grasp. This soon gave him great popularity as a public speaker and he received and answered many calls to deliver lectures and addresses; and to dedicate churches, especially in the great middle west.

Having contracted acute muscular rheumatism through exposure while serving in the army, this, combined with overwork, caused a breakdown and he resigned from the Presidency of the Illinois Wesleyan University in 1888. He was not content to remain idle when the "harvest was great and the laborers so few" and in the last year of his life he requested the conference to give him an appointment near his home city and was sent to Atlanta, Illinois, where the people were surprised and delighted at receiving him as their pastor.

A student of the class of 1880, Illinois Wesleyan University, Dr. Newall D. Gilbert, described him thus: "The face strong but benignant, its lines graven by experience and sacrifice and suffering and toil; the eye kindly, earnest, observant; the lips aligned to inflexible purpose, yet ever relaxing with welcome and good cheer; the forehead written over with aspiration and courage and hope, with clear and strong grasp of mind, with a catholicity of thought and sympathy. And filling the lines of that face, lighting the eye, moving the lip, animating the frame, is the great, loving, aspiring soul. The personal friend, to encourage or restrain, but ever ready to help; or in the classroom with genial humor pricking our large-blown bubbles of sophomore philosophy or unfolding large views of truth in beautiful

perspective; in public address a power suffused on form and features, a power that raised him to the peerage of the best platform orators."

He was a Lieutenant Colonel of the Fourth Regiment of Ohio Infantry in the Spanish-American War. After the war he served as Provost Marshal General of Porto Rico. Later was military instructor at the Ohio State University and in 1902 was appointed Superintendent of the Ohio State Reformatory at Lancaster, Ohio. In 1909 he became Superintendent of the St. Charles (Illinois) School for Boys, where he remained until 1913, when he accepted the position as Superintendent of the Massachusetts State Reformatory at Concord Junction, Massachusetts. Two years later he was appointed State Superintendent of Prisons of Massachusetts, which position he held until 1918, when he was again induced to take the superintendency of the St. Charles School for Boys by Gov. Frank O. Lowden, of Illinois, and at this post he remained until his death, which occurred suddenly from angino pectoris. It is said of Colonel Adams, that he took a personal and fatherly interest in the training of every boy that came under his care.

The following account of the life and death of Colonel Cyrus Barton (128) Adams is taken from a Illinois newspaper.

CYRUS BARTON ADAMS

The sudden death of Col. Cyrus Barton Adams about 3:20 o'clock on Friday afternoon, May 12, 1922, was not only a severe shock to the entire community but cast gloom over the big state institution, the St. Charles School for Boys, of which he was superintendent. To the 800 boys in the institution, Col. Adams was "The Big Father," and he took a personal interest in every lad sent to the school. Many a boy who never before had a chance in the world, after a few years of training under Col. Adams, has gone out into the world and made his mark in business and professions.

Col. Adams installed a system of military training in the school—and most of the boys have benefitted physically and mentally by this method of training.

Until Thursday evening, Col. Adams was apparently in the best of health. He complained that evening of illness and while in Geneva visited a drug store and got some pepsin. He found no relief during the night and at 3 o'clock in the morning his son-in-law, Dr. Carpenter, was called. His sickness was not considered at all serious, and the following day Dr. Carpenter was not called. Early in the afternoon Col. Adams was lying down, and asked Mrs. Adams to take a nap, as she had had but little rest the night before, and stated that he was feeling better. Shortly afterwards he had passed away. Physicians attributed his death to angino pectoris.

Two years ago Col. Adams was elected President of the American Prison Association. He was one of the best known penologists in this country.

Col. Adams was born in Marion County, Ohio, July 4, 1862. Was graduated from the Ohio Wesleyan University in 1884. At the outbreak of the Spanish-American War he went to Porto Rico as Lieut. Col. of the 4th Regiment of Ohio Infantry. Later was military instructor at Ohio University, until 1902 when he was appointed Superintendent of the Ohio State Reformatory at Lancaster, Ohio. In 1909 he was appointed by Governor Deneen, of Illinois, Superintendent of the St. Charles School, and he remained there until December 31, 1913, when he accepted the position of superintendent of the State Reformatory at Concord Junction, Massachusetts. After two years there he was appointed State Superintendent of Prisons of Massachusetts. February 20, 1918, Governor Frank O. Lowden, induced Col. Adams to return to St. Charles where he remained till his death.

Besides his widow, Mrs. Winifred Adams, he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Frances Stimson, wife of Robert Stimson of Detroit, and Mrs. Catherine B. Carpenter, wife of Dr. Ralph

Carpenter of Geneva, and a brother, Ernest E. Adams of Chicago.

Services were held at the big gymnasium at the school at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon. Col. Adams's favorite hymns were sung by the entire gathering, "Rock of Ages," "Lead Kindly Light" and "Abide with Me." Also his favorite passage of scripture, the familiar 23d Psalm, was read. Dr. Abel White of Chicago, a personal friend, conducted the funeral, taking this Psalm as his text.

EDWIN F. ADAMS

At four o'clock on Sunday morning, December 27, 1908, in St. Luke's Hospital in Cedar Rapids, occurred the death of Mr. Edwin F. Adams, general agent for Ginn & Co., a man well known in Delaware, Ohio, his former home and the present home of his mother, Mrs. Jacob Smith Adams. Death was due to valvular heart trouble, brought on by rheumatism. This ailment he first discovered six years ago, but with the reserve and courage which marked his whole life, he did not impart the information to his friends or family and it was only when he was dying at the hospital at Cedar Rapids that they knew that

he alone carried the knowledge that he could live but a very short time.

Mr. Adams was born in Madison County, Ohio, and was 44 years of age. Of his career the Des Moines Register-Leader thus speaks:

"His death will be a personal sorrow to many of the educators of the state as he was very popular and had a host of friends." The death of Mr. Adams followed but a short while after the death of his wife, who died last April. It seems untimely because he leaves a child a year and a half of age. This child has been adopted by his brother and wife in Chicago. Another brother is Col. Burton (Barton) Adams of Lancaster, Ohio, who is noted not only in the state but throughout the country.

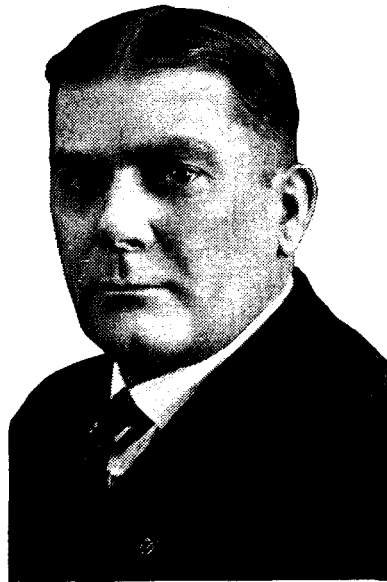

JOHN ADAMS OF MOUNTAIN CITY

By JAMES TAYLOR ADAMS

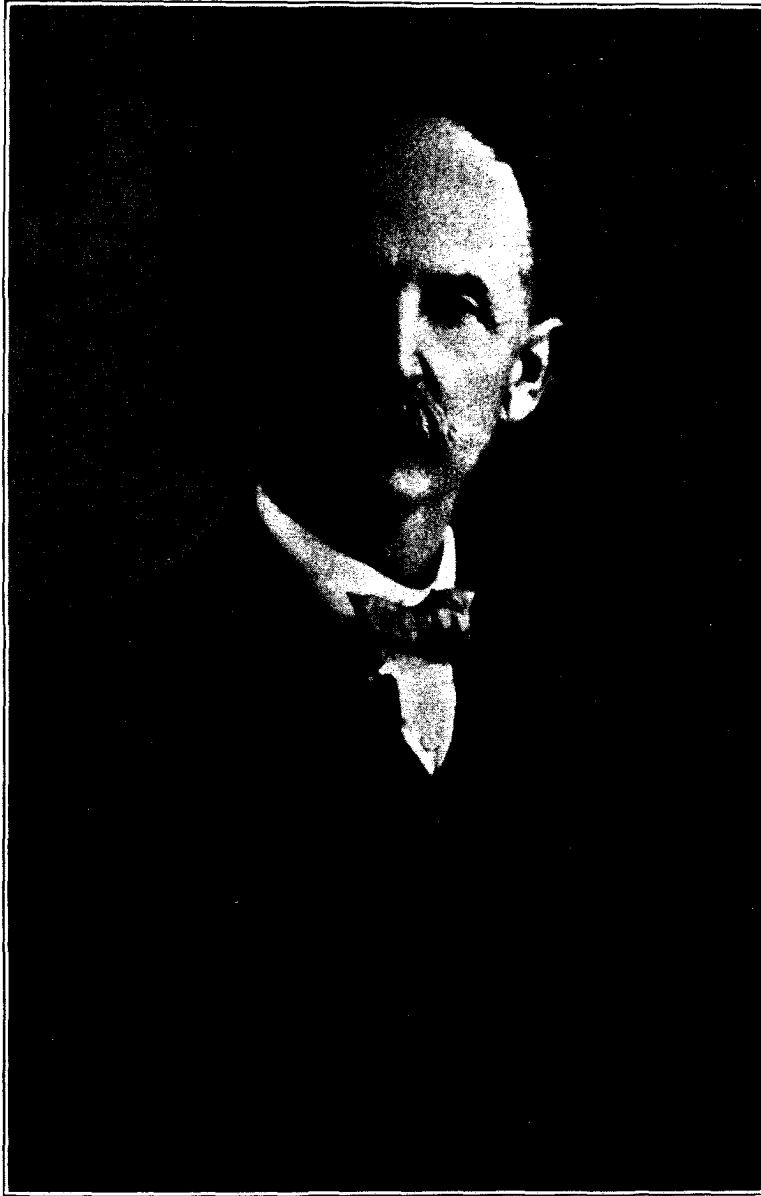


HE father of John Adams is said to have been one of two brothers, Irish schoolmasters, who emigrated to America about the middle of the eighteenth century and settled in North Carolina; of their later lives and movements, nothing is known.

John Adams was born about 1770. His early life was spent on Yadkin River in Surry County, North Carolina, where he was married, about 1798, to Rhoda Johnson; to this union there was born thirteen children. He removed, about 1827, to Johnson County, Tennessee and settled near Taylorsville (now Mountain City) where the remainder of his life was spent. Rhoda, his first wife, died about 1835, and he married, about 1840, Ruth Robinson, by whom he had one son. He died in 1855, and is buried beside his first wife, Rhoda, at Mountain City, Tennessee.

Prof. Adams's whole life was devoted to teaching in the public schools of Tennessee

He was very fond of his daughter, Martha Adams Blevins, who was the only one of his daughters that lived to reach womanhood.

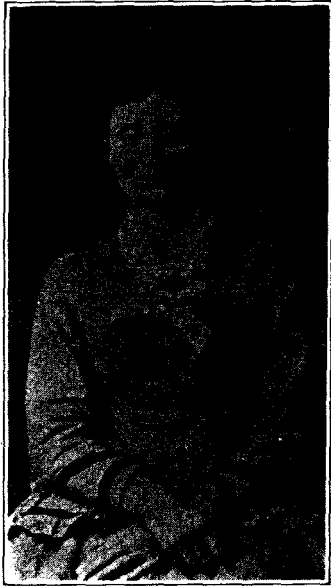

In his early married life he taught in the public schools of Johnson County, Tennessee, but soon forsook this calling to follow his natural bent, mechanics.

For many years he was a contractor and builder and for a time owned and operated a wagon factory.

He has never aspired to any greater calling and has frequently remarked that when his call to death shall come that he may be found in the school room, teaching boys and girls to walk in the paths of the lowly Nazarene. His children are all married and are scattered from near the Atlantic Ocean, in Virginia, to the Pacific coast

in Washington. All are at occupations or professions of their own choosing and all are happy and prosperous in pleasant homes and each one of them is an active church worker in the community in which they live.

Notes and Queries

RUSSELL-ADAMS

Wanted: The ancestry of Elizabeth Russell, who married April 10, 1739 at Ipswich, Massachusetts, Stephen Kinsman, born March 30, 1718, died after October 23, 1767. It is believed she is the daughter of Henry Russell and Sarah Adams of Ipswich, who had children born there at this time. No proof for such relationship is as yet obtainable.

ADAMS-CUPPYHEIFER

About 1800 Moses Adams emigrated from Virginia or North Carolina to what is now Letcher County, Kentucky. Tradition says that his father was a soldier in Washington's army during the American Revolution and that he died of measles at Valley Forge. Information is wanted of both Adams and Cuppyheifer families.

HOLTZCLAW-ADAMS

Benjamin Holtzclaw and his wife Malinda (Russell) Holtzclaw emigrated from Fauquier County, Virginia, to Garrard County, Kentucky, in 1804. Information is wanted of Benjamin Holtzclaw's ancestry. He is believed to be a grandson of "Old Jacob Holtzclaw," who emigrated from Germany to Fauquier County and died there about 1760. The Holtzclaws later intermarried with the descendants of Absalom Adams in Kentucky.

BOGGS-ADAMS

William Boggs married Sarah Adams and resided for a time at least, in Livingstone County, Kentucky, where both are presumed to have died and been buried. ADAMS-BARNES

Who knows anything of ——— Adams who was killed in Wythe County, Virginia, while at, or returning home from a muster during the Revolution or War of 1812? He had married Anne Barnes (or Barnwell) of Princess Anne County, Virginia and had two children: Anne, married a Crawley, and William B. The widow removed to her relatives in Stokes County, North Carolina, later going to Kentucky, where many of the descendants still reside.
