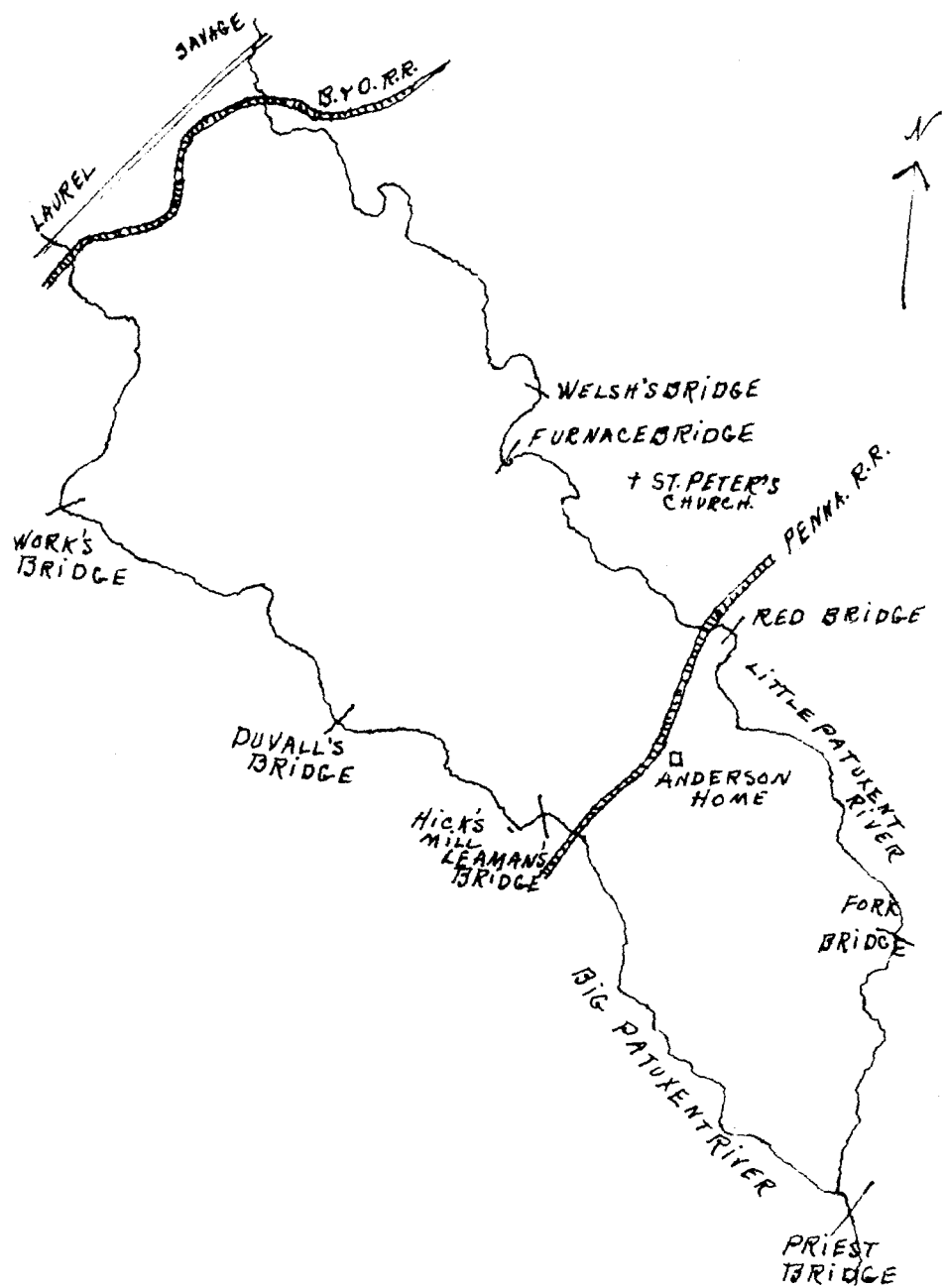

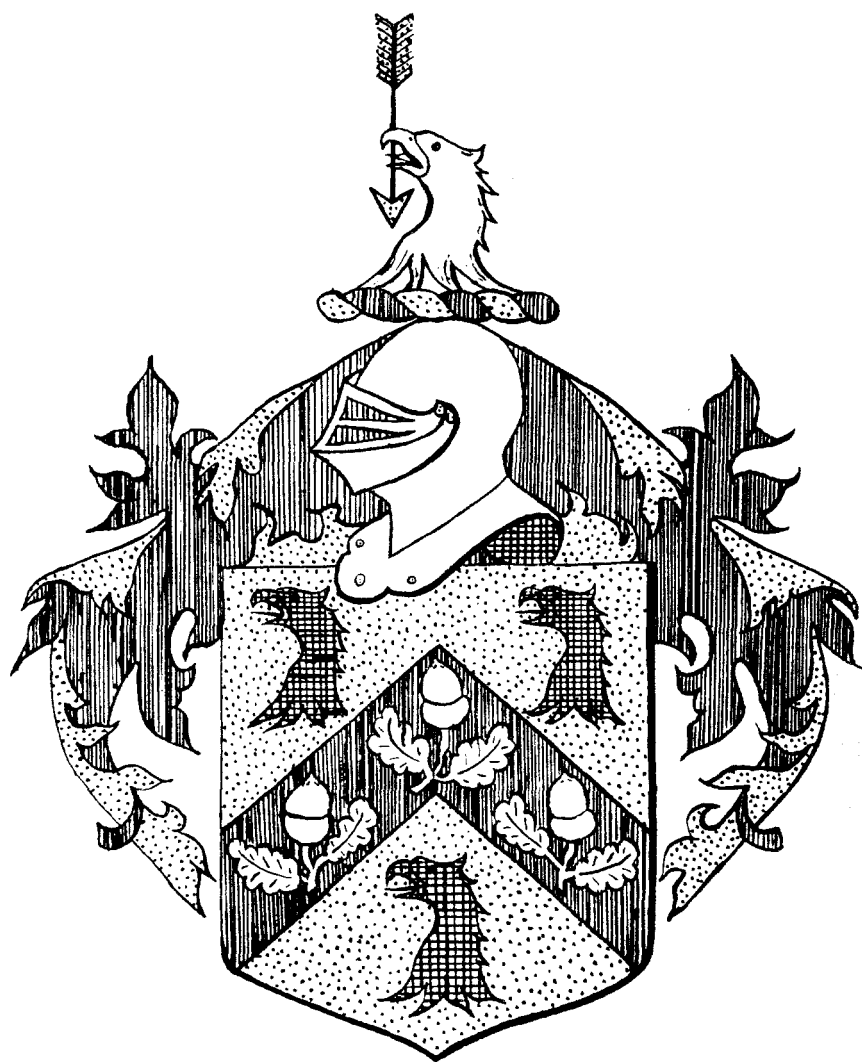

The Great Fork of the Patuxent

In a recent article it is stated that 20,000 books and articles have already been written about the State of Maryland. Be that as it may it still can be said truthfully that the material for study is so abundant and diverse that there is small repetition even in such a great number. This State, which is the seventh smallest State in the Union, can offer seashore or mountain, level terrain on the Eastern Shore or thirty three hundred foot peaks in the West, native minerals or native game, industry or agriculture. These, however, are the particulars enumerated and discussed in books of history.

One province of the State has been consistently, although probably unintentionally, neglected. Admitting that the truly historical section of Maryland lies along the Bay shore and the bigger water-ways, which were readily accessible to the early settlers, this area of approximately forty square miles has nevertheless had its moments. A tract lying in the center of a triangle formed by lines extended from Baltimore to Washington to Annapolis, it can be reached by turning south from the Washington Boulevard at Laurel, or by turning north from the Crain Highway to Patuxent Station. In reality a mere strip of land, five miles at its greatest latitude, it extends from the junction of the Big and Little Patuxent Rivers to Laurel, a distance of nine miles. Visitors have marvelled at the isolation of this place as near as it is to the activities of three large cities, not twenty five miles from any of them. While the upper part of the Great Fork was described briefly by Mrs. Myrtle D. Helfrich in an article in the Baltimore Sun (May 11 1941), the lower portion has never been mentioned previously in print.

In the opinion of Dr. Arthur Bibbins, the eminent geologist, this region shows unmistakable evidence of glacial activity. Some fossil cycals have been found and also pieces of petrified wood. According to Dr. Bibbins vein quartz discovered here showed "a little gold." Agglomerate stone is very plentiful through the Great Fork as are many beautiful flints. Sufficient iron ore was dug out to supply two large furnaces for a good many years.

The Patuxent River was originally so-called by the Indians, the name meaning "running over loose stones," a fitting description of its course before it reaches the fork. On the maps of the Lords Baltimore it was designated as the Anne Arundel River, and much later, to the people of the countryside, it was Snowden's River because the Snowden family owned immense tracts of land on either side, but neither of these later names stayed with it. Much of the land along the Big Patuxent and the Little Patuxent is marshy and unfit for cultivation. The valleys of both streams are very wide and at flood times are completely covered with water. Floods have caused separate channels to wash and formed islands, making it difficult to tell sometimes which is the main channel. In 1888 there was a flood so great that water came up around the present Railroad Station at Patuxent and boys swam over the fields south of Hicks' Mill.

These pocosin lands of the Great Fork have become a natural wild flower preserve capable of producing a wider variety of wild flowers than any other part of the State. Spring blankets large spaces with bluebells, dogtooth violets, lady's slippers, Dutchman's breeches, wild iris, and Quaker ladies. Even the fast disappearing arbutus is found in out of the way places. Later in the season alder, magnolias and dogwood

make the woods beautiful. The delicacy of the autumn laurel is followed by the winter resplendence of holly, partridge berry, coon berry, trailing cedar and crowfoot. Love of beauty demands the naming of the wild rose, honeysuckle, trumpet vine, May flowers and numerous varieties of fern which are so abundant. No wonder an Anne Arundel County poet wrote

The Upper Patuxent

"From the sights and sounds of the city, from the babble and jest of the street bred

My mind that is ever roving returns to a scene I have loved well.
I see in my vision a vista where the murmur and lapping of water
And sighing wind in the forest sound in the days of summer.
Here is a winding river, by Indians named the Patuxent,
With thickets still dark in their denseness and soil unturned by the
plowman.

The surge of the world has passed over and the spot has altered but slightly

The aspect it wore ere the white man came over the stormy Atlantic.
Quiet the flow of the river, the boughs interlacing above it,
On each side stretches the swampland, by Indians called the pocosin.
Somber moist the pocosin, its great trees loaded with creepers,
Threaded by sloughs and streams, the home of the frog and the turtle.
To the right the swamp is more open, a pond lies locked in its bosom
Where broad leaves and lillies lie green on the face of the water;
While from the grass of its margin wild iris springs in abundance.
Wild ducks feed by the lillies and after the coming of nightfall
The racoon prowls on the margin and the great owl shouts from the tree
tops.

Before me stretches the river to a bend where it turns in its windings
Lost in a green indistinctness of the creepers and trees that hang over.
Behind me the river is wider and flashes and glows in the sunlight
Until it divides at an island to flow in separate channels.
This is the scene that surrounds me, the time is the middle of summer.
Still and warm the day, but cool the breath of the river.
Brilliant and blue the sky, green the land it covers,
As when in boyhood I found it, a place for communion with Nature.
Its charm and its beauty invite me, but now it is only remembrance.
And I far away in the city must join in the jest and the babble,
The foil and the talk of the street bred - of the product of civilization!"

The heavy fall of the rivers above Laurel and Savage furnished water power for the operation of a large cotton mill in each town.

The rocks in the river at Laurel are lovely and are visible from the Main Street, but the Rocks in the gorge above the mill at Savage rival

in beauty, if not in size, the Great Falls of the Potomac. Below these towns there were grist and saw mills. Within a short distance from Patuxent Station the locations of ten of these mills can be seen plainly. Three of them were in operation within the past thirty years. The Bealmear mill was built from stone and part of the masonry is standing yet. The old mill stones are still there. This mill was well known and people came from as far as Bladensburg for their meal. Another Bealmear mill was run by water impounded in a storage lake which covered about fifteen acres. This mill has been abandoned for a great many years. No one can be found who remembers when it was used, but the old mill race is still very plain and the site is clearly marked. The stones from this mill were used in the foundation of Mr. Jacob Myer's house. The other mills were Snowden's mill, near the Works bridge; Duvall's upper mill, afterward called Griffith's mill; Duvall's lower mill; the Charles Duvall mill near the present District Training School; the Farmhouse mill between Welsh's bridge and Furnace Bridge; Anderson's mill; White's mill and Mullikin's mill. Still another mill was situated on the Rogue's Harbor branch just before it empties into the north side of the Little Patuxent River.

Neither the Big Patuxent nor the Little Patuxent has great depth but each has deep holes which the local people call "still water". There was plenty of shallow water with gravel bottom for fords to cross each stream. Anderson's ford, afterward called Gray's ford, was the first to be used, and is not entirely abandoned now. Duvall's ford and Mullikin's ford were in use as long as people lived near them. These fords were great mileage savers and were useful for carriages, buggies and people on horseback. Automobiles proved to be a different story.

Years ago there were a good many fish in these Rivers: pike, catfish, chubs, suckers and carp. When herring came up in the spring people set fish traps for them. The traps caught the debris washed down by floods and caused shifts in the channel. There is now a law against the placing of fish traps.

A mile or so below the Pennsylvania Railroad Bridge where the railroad crosses the Big Patuxent River the boulders on the side of Jack's Hill rise for one hundred and twenty five feet above the river. Rocks were blasted from this place to build the original abutments of the two railroad bridges.

There were many Indians in the Great Fork. A field not far from the station at Patuxent was their last camping place. This was a comfortable spot protected by a high hill to the Northwest and well supplied with water by two large springs. Arrowheads and axes found here lead collectors to think that the Indians travelled as far as PenMar for their weapons. Nearly every home has an Indian relic and Dr. Bibbins took several particularly good specimens from here to the library at Goucher College. The last Indian died in the 1830s and was buried by his white friends not far from the old camp. A large mound remained over the grave for years but it has been levelled by the weather.

The first land in the Great Fork was taken up by people looking for good building material. Upon finding the striking stand of ash, white oak and hickory on the ridge between the rivers they immediately took possession. Thomas Brown, the Patuxent Ranger, may have led them here. This timber was in such quantities that as late as 1863 Government shipwrights were able to find a ninety foot oak, squaring four feet,

ship's timber. Within the memory of the writer a tulip poplar measuring thirty feet in circumference was on the Anderson farm. The last good stand of trees was taken from around the landmark known as the Quaker Meeting-house.

The first road in the Fork followed the river from Governor's Bridge, crossing the old Post Road at Priest's Bridge and entering the Fork at Anderson's ford. It was called the Ridge Road, and afterward the Stage Road. This road continued along the ridge above the Big River to the Snowden Iron Works. The Baltimore Road, the forerunner of the Boulevard, entered the Fork at Works Bridge and joined the Stage Road. Buck's Tavern stood between Birmingham and the Tyson place on this road. A wooden bridge, called the Fork Bridge was built near Conaway's before 1834. Later bridges were the Works Bridge, near the Snowden Iron Works, the Griffith's mill bridge, Leaman's bridge, Steele's bridge, Bealmear's bridge, Red bridge, Furnace ford bridge (completed in December 1869) and Welsh's bridge. The road which crosses the Fork from the Furnace Ford to Griffith's Mill was quite old and probably led from Bladensburg to Elkrige. It is likely that George Washington may have used this road since it was an important road to the north. One landmark, near the Fork bridge, was the wild cherry tree which stood in a fork of the road. Distances were measured "as far as from here to the wild cherry tree". As have others this sign has finally succumbed to the march of time.

In the early plantation days there was always a man trained to do the blacksmith and wheelwright work. After the Emancipation some of these men opened blacksmith shops because there was a great need for this kind of work. "Vachel" had a shop near Old Patuxent for many years.

A man named Hopkins opened a shop at Patuxent after the Railroad came and later it was run by John Turner. Mr. Turner's son learned his trade in this shop and now does beautiful wrought iron work that is in such demand he is unable to keep it supplied. No Western movie of the present day ever gave a greater thrill than that a small boy received when he watched the sparks fly from the anvil. If he were permitted to pump the bellows that day became a very special day. These shops were the centers for local gossip. Every farmer who came discussed current world events and picked up the news, foreign and local. The smith knew everybody and everybody's affairs and often let fall "chunks of wisdom". There were endless arguments. One memorable one pursued the thesis that ice and snow made cold. Or did cold make ice and snow?

The Snowdens very early constructed an iron ore furnace on the Big Patuxent River which is described as the "first internal improvement of Upper Anne Arundel County". The Ellicotts built another large furnace on the Little Patuxent and the bridge built at this point has always been referred to as the Furnace Bridge. Ore pits filled with water and became ponds in lots of places while cinder piles stayed along the roads for years. The pits were deep and treacherous but have supplied interesting specimens of petrified wood as well as iron ore. The whole section as far as the fork of the rivers was called Patuxent Furnace until the coming of the Annapolis and Elkridge Railroad when a Post Office was established. It was called Patuxent Office or sometimes Patuxent Switch. Both of these undertakings brought in many employees, a few of whom remained to become permanent members of the community. One of the boys who drove a cart for the furnace was Henry Harman who studied Latin as he sat on the shafts of his cart driving

back and forth. He became Dr. Henry Harman, Professor of Latin at Dickenson College. The Ellicotts built St. Peter's P. E. Church, first called Ellicott's Chapel, a chapel of ease of Queen Caroline Parish, for the benefit of the people at the Furnace. St. Peter's was taken into the Fort George G. Meade Reservation during World War I and was destroyed by a field fire. The old graveyard around the Church was not moved.

When the first telegraph line was built in 1844 it followed the old road from Patuxent Switch to Griffith's mill. That road has been known ever since as the Telegraph Road. At that time it was planned to lay the wire in lead pipes on the ground but the plan was abandoned because the "Snowden darkies might steal all the lead pipe." Big wooden screws were used as insulators on the telegraph line.

The Snowden, Hopkins, Cowman, Tyson and Waters families, all Quakers, built the Indian Spring Meeting-house before 1792. John Snowden conveyed a lot to John Cowman and others, and William Anderson conveyed a small lot, also, for this purpose. The Anderson lot contained the Indian spring, a large spring whose water was always clear and cold. The site of this spring is so sheltered that even in January green ferns are found around it. People came to the Quaker Meeting-house from as far as Pennsylvania for the Annual Meetings. When the original families scattered and there was no more congregation the Quakers turned this property over to the colored people who used it for a Church and then for a school for many years. The original building was constructed of field stone with a shingle roof. It was finally razed when the colored people built a substantial new church nearby. The new church is called the Fork Church. The Trustees who took title

on 16 April 1892 for the Zion A.M.E. Forks Church were Nathan Allen, John Fleets, Charles Matthews, Amos Bowie and Richard Toogood. Affairs were not moving very rapidly when the transfer was made and one of the Trustees told the Attorney who had charge of the matter: "You know, suh, any kind of machinery moves better when de wheels is greased, so here is a little money to grease de wheels."

Methodism came into the Great Fork 5 April 1783 when Richard Jones deeded land to Nicholas Ridgely, Greenberry Ridgely and Thomas Ijams of Anne Arundel County; Seth Hyatt, Shadrach Turner, Benjamin Waters and Thomas Duvall of Prince George's County, for the use of the "people called Methodists". An octagonal log meeting house was built on this lot. Bishop Asbury mentions in his diary having preached "in the Fork of the Patuxent," and it was undoubtedly at this place. It would be of interest to know with whom he "supped" on that day. Those were the days when religious fervor stirred men's souls. There is a story that one of the old preachers, a veteran of the saddlebags, announced from the pulpit that if one soul were converted that night he would be so happy that he would carry Sister Phelps around the meeting house on his back seven times. Sister Phelps weighed three hundred pounds.

When changes caused the old meeting house to be abandoned Samuel Anderson and his wife gave a small lot in 1846 on which a church called "Providence" was erected. The Trustees were Caleb White, William Gardner, John Gardner, Eli Gaither and Isaiah Waters. This church constructed by John Redmiles for Six Hundred Dollars, was thirty feet long by twenty-two feet wide. It had eight windows. The building costs included benches spaced every three feet, a pulpit and a gallery

opening from the outside of the building for the use of the colored people. The original contract for the construction of this building is still in existence. Two forked trees grew in front of the old church. A pole was placed securely between them. This vantage point commanded a view of the road for three-quarters of a mile. The men of the congregation would sit along this pole and talk until they saw the preacher approaching, whereupon they would file into the church to be found sitting decorously inside when he arrived. The preacher always went home to dinner with some member from the congregation. Ministers who served this church included Mr. Edwards, Mr. Ward, N.J.B.Morgan, Littleton Morgan, Dr. Arnold, J.W.Cornelius, Louis C. Muller, Mr. West, T.J.Cross, B.F.Clarkson, Charles W. Baldwin Jr., J.D.Still, Charles Joyce and L.A.Thirkeld. Changing centers of population and the effects of the War between the States caused this church to be closed. Occasionally the arguments between the Northern and Southern groups in the congregation were so prolonged that neutral members closed the shutters and doors and went home leaving the others to conclude their differences in the dark.

When the split finally came one part of the congregation built a church "Salem," which stood near the junction of the Telegraph road and the Stage road. This church, too, has been closed for many years. The other group built "Trinity", near Patuxent Station and this church is still in use. Another Methodist Church called the "Burnt Woods Church," was located not far from the present Barberville. This was also a log building. It was given to the colored people when "Locust Chapel" was erected at a more accessible spot about a mile nearer Laurel.

Before the Pennsylvania Railroad was built between Baltimore and Washington, surveys were made for a railroad called the Potomac and Aquia Creek Railroad. A map dated 1860 shows this railroad. It was to have crossed the lower end of the Fork. At least ten miles of the project was graded before the survey was abandoned and a new one adopted. The second crossed the Fork about four miles farther north than the first and shortened the distance between the Cities by several miles. With the completion of the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad in 1872 a station called Patuxent was placed at the foot of the grade near the Little Patuxent River. A Post Office listed as Woodwardville opened here 23 August 1875. This office was closed in 1927 and the whole Fork is now cared for by rural delivery from Odenton.

The Pennsylvania Railroad, or Baltimore and Potomac as it was termed in those days, was built with pick and shovel by Irish immigrant labor. Many of the laborers brought their families with them. Bill Brennan and Maurice Gavigan, two of the boys who went to school with neighborhood children, told them enchanting stories of Irish fairies and elves. Maurice always concluded his stories with "And if they don't live happy, then we may". Dick Malone, the Contractor, ran his own camps and a slaughter pen for the use of the local camp was located near the old Varley store. Around the old barracks on Barn Hill there were thousands of bones from the round steaks served to the laborers. Those were the good old days!

On 2 July 1872 the first train to pass over this railroad made the trip from Baltimore to Washington. Prior to this a trial run had been made. A train composed of one small green passenger car and one flat car with cross ties for seats was taken from Bowie to Jackson's

Woods by Engineer Franklin. Aboard the train were some of the officials and their families and a few local people. One lady was so overcome by fear at the idea of crossing rivers on a train that the engineer had to stop and let her walk across the bridges. Some of the oldest engineers were Alfred Redmiles, Bill Elliott, Harry Boyer and Joe Harman. Joe Harman was a local boy who had "made good." About 1897 he ran the "four o'clock train." This was almost the best run which the Railroad Company had to offer. His whistle was unusual and every small boy, white and black, listened for it and announced with great satisfaction "There's Joe-boy." If Joe-boy were on time everything else was all right. The A.U. tower stood at the top of the grade about half way between the rivers. At first the signals were semaphores worked by hand; oil lanterns were used for signals at night and the telegraph instruments were operated by bluestone batteries. The ridge between the rivers made a very steep grade for the small engines and the Railroad Company worked at it with steam shovels until the Cut has been so lowered that the present Diesel engines speed over it with ease. In the old days a train which stalled on this grade stayed there until helped away by a pusher engine. And in those days the Company would gladly stop a "through" train at the tower for passengers bound beyond Baltimore. The grading of the Cut uncovered a well-defined vein of pottery clay but no effort has ever been made to develop the land on either side of the Railroad.

Pioneer parents erected a school two miles or so from Griffith's Mill. This they maintained for several generations until a public school was opened by the State about 1865. The teachers were boarded in the homes of the community as part of their pay. From 1868 to 1880

some of the teachers included "Billie" Harding, Miss Sarah Pennington, Mr. Frank Waters, Mr. Howell, Mr. Marion Duckett, Miss Ida Kennedy and Miss Rachel Marriott. Miss Rachel Marriott was a maiden lady of uncertain years, a dearly loved teacher. She walked a great deal in going to and from school and always knitted as she walked. Neighbors used to say they would pick up a ball of yarn which Miss Rachel had dropped and finally catch up with her, still knitting, half a mile down the road. This old school house was # 25 until after 1868 when it was called # 4. The Waters school house # 26 stood on the Ridge road not far from the John Henry Waters home but it was closed more than 75 years ago. Three of the teachers who served this school were Mr. Pope, Washington Welsh and Miss Rachel Adams. In 1879 a public school, # 8, was built near Patuxent Station and W.T.Anderson Jr., was the first teacher. This school was consolidated with the Odenton school in 1927. School # 12, called the Patuxent School was opened near the Furnace Bridge in 1900 and Miss Gertrude Baldwin was the first teacher.

"Storekeeper" Bill Anderson had a general merchandise store about half a mile from the "Old school house," and years later Mr. Francis Newman kept this same store. Some of the folks who were children at the school 70 years ago remember the lovely cakes with pink icing which he kept in his store. Mr. Newman's home was "Cherry Walk" in Prince George's County. After the Railroad was built Mr. Abram G. Woodward had a store and kept the Post Office at Patuxent Station.

Birmingham Manor, the Snowden manor house, was the only brick Colonial house built in the Great Fork. It burned to the ground about seventy years ago, but the wonderful old boxwood survived the fire and was still there when the Government recently included this property

in the Fort George G. Meade reservation. When Mr. Julius Snowden moved in 1941 he took with him firebacks made in the old Snowden furnace. There is also one of these firebacks fastened to the side of a building on Church Circle, in Annapolis.

There were old frame houses on the Linthicum plantations but these, too, succumbed to fire. The original frame house on the Bealmear farm was recently torn down. The oldest part of the Anderson house remains. This was the original house erected near Phelps' Spring and removed on rollers to its present location about 1794. The frame of this house was of heart gum, hand hewn. The land supplied stone for two huge chimneys one of which is still in use. Two of the Mullikin houses were burned and one was torn down.

There were family and slave graveyards on the Bealmear farm, the Linthicum-White farm, the Woodward farm, two on each of the Anderson and Mullikin farms, as well as Church cemeteries at the Quaker Meeting-house, Salem and Trinity. There must have been other family cemeteries too, for inquiries come in, now and then, from people living in distant states asking for data. There were also large family graveyards on the Jones farm, the John Henry Waters farm and the Snowden farm.

Coblin's Marsh, often called Cobbler's Marsh, reached from Salem Church to the Big River. The pocosin near Mullikin's ford, called Stimpson's Marsh, was the home of "Yo-ho," the headless horse which pursued unwary travelers returning from Baltimore. Old Cyrie was one of the slaves who nearly got caught, but he did manage to reach his cabin and slam shut the door. The remains of Cyrie's cabin was a fascinating place to visit but the children who went there were very watchful and quiet as they returned home. The Bealmear house had its

own ghost. Steps sounded through the house and doors opened at night. The owner of this place was not able to keep a tenant for many years before it was torn down.

One branch which empties into the Little Patuxent River is called Rogue's Harbor. Along this branch there were so many places of concealment that it was an important station for escaping slaves on the way north. Slaves from local plantations fed and helped them on their way.

The old householders always planted quantities of fruit trees. Pear and apple trees as well as lilac bushes have remained for years around the location of old homes. Larkspur has blossomed for more than eighty years where one old house used to stand, and on one sunny slope the daffodils bloom every spring just where "Miss Prissy" planted them long "befo' the War".

During the War of the Revolution many local men signed the Oath of Allegiance. Capt. Thomas Mullikin's Battalion of Severn Militia included First Lieutenant Belt Mullikin, Second Lieutenant Absalom Anderson, and Ensign Vachel Gaither. William Clark Anderson was also in the Service and Thomas Woodward. Francis Bealmear signed the Oath of Fidelity.

Francis Bealmear Jr. and Nicholas Woodward took part in the War of 1812.

The War Between the States did not bring any greater casualties to the Fork than those of broken friendships, but the loss of the slaves through emancipation was an economic disaster from which neither this section nor the South has ever entirely recovered. Until 1865 most of the land was in a high state of cultivation. Several elderly

men have told of cultivating corn where there has been nothing but woods for sixty years. Unskilled labor has never been plentiful to this day. Many people were forced to give up their farms and seek employment in the Cities. Quite a number of the colored people, though, remained in this section and have their own settlement, Wilsontown where they are a respected group.

It was by the old Post Road that Gen. Ambrose Burnside's army travelled from Annapolis to Washington in 1861. The soldiers camped on White Hall farm near Conaways and white and black folk went out to see them. When the march was resumed one of the officers seized Charles Queen, a Bealmeare slave, to drive a supply wagon and act as guide across the swamp at Priests' Bridge. He must have been good for they kept him through the rest of the War. Although he was wounded he never was able to get a pension because he was not an enlisted man. This upland colored boy got his first knowledge of tidewater when the army was in the Pamunkey Swamp in Virginia. It was there he saw razor back hogs which "could eat an acorn out of two feet of water and never wet an eyelash". Charles Queen was in Grant's procession in Washington and was seen by Malvina, who had been one of the Contee house servants. She always told us "Just as soon as I saw dat man wid his pontoons on, I say to myself 'Dat's de man fo me'". At any rate they met and married, came back to the Fork and lived happily ever after. They were a highly respected old couple. "Uncle Charles" died in 1923 at the reputed age of 108.

There were eleven men from this section who served in World War I, and thirty-two in World War II. None of them was killed. One brought home a Purple Heart from Sicily and another brought a Bronze

Star from Germany. The Battle Stars collected by the group would make a brilliant constellation.

The Great Fork of the Patuxent is divided into two parts by the Pennsylvania Railroad. The lower section contains approximately five and one half square miles.

In 1684 Walter Phelps took a tract of two hundred acres which he called Phelps His Choice. The whole acreage finally came into the possession of Susannah Anderson whose first husband was a son of Walter Phelps. In 1754 she took, by Warrant of Re-Survey, a tract of six hundred and seventy acres which she called Providence and which included Phelps His Choice. This tract reached all the way across the Fork from the Little Patuxent to the Big Patuxent River. It is not to be confused with the six thousand acre tract called Providence which Amos Garrett took in 1725 and which lies between Millersville and Annapolis.

John Gaither took Pole Cat Hill in 1684 and some of the Gaither descendants have lived in the Great Fork until the present century. A second generation acquired more land and called the whole tract by a sweeter name, Gaither's Felicity.

Turkey Neck was taken up by Richard Snowden in 1698 and after passing through many hands was finally owned by Richard Hart and has since been known as the Hart place.

Duvall's Range was taken up in 1694 by Capt. John Duvall, son of the immigrant, Mareen Duvall. He sold it to Hezekiah Linthicum who divided it among his children. Linthicum descendants lived in the Great Fork until 1890.

Four generations of the Harman family have lived in the Great

Fork and still own land here.

Many of the earlier owners moved on to seek greener fields. Linthicums and Waymans went to Eastern Shore; Linthicums, Waymens, Clarks, Gaithers, Andersons and Bealmears went to Montgomery and Frederick Counties and then farther west to Ohio and Kentucky.

Stephen Stewart, owner of the shipyard in Annapolis, married a daughter of Hezekiah Linthicum and lived in the Great Fork for a while on Stewart's Purchase. He and his son Stephen were very prominent in the Revolutionary War. Benjamin Howard purchased land adjoining the Stewarts and made his home there for sixteen years until he removed to Baltimore County. He also acquired Ovenwood Thicket which he sold to Abraham Woodward in 1759. Thomas Contee owned land adjoining Benjamin Howard and his daughter married James Anderson. Gideon White was living in the Great Fork in 1793. The White family purchased part of Gaither's Felicity and descendants lived there until 1895. Other families in the lower section of the Great Fork before 1800 were the Fowlers, Olivers, Rankins, Trammils, Lacklands, O'Connors, Williams, Barrys and the Bishops. Caleb Barry's daughter said she wanted more than anything else in the world to be the belle of Baltimore City for one season, and later on she was. All of these families intermarried and it would require more space than is available to tell of their interesting lives in the Fork.

The upper section of the Great Fork, north and West of the Pennsylvania Railroad, was a much, much larger section, containing approximately thirty-seven square miles, and of this the Snowden family took up as much as thirty-two square miles. There is a tradition that Lord Baltimore told Richard Snowden that he could have as many acres

as he could ride around in a day. He must have started early and ridden hard all day. The Snowden tracts were called Birmingham Manor, 12,422 acres; Second Addition to His Manor, 5476 acres; Robin Hood's Forest, 1976 acres; Mt. Vernon, 494 acres; Waters' Lotte, 618 acres; and Duvall's Delight, 1000 acres. Richard, John and Ann Snowden took up this land for the iron ore which it contained and later sold it for farming purposes. The Hyatts bought large pieces of land from the Snowdens and the Tysons also. The Tyson family built the house on the "old Baltimore Road" near Birmingham, recently occupied by Dr. Coates. Many of those who came to mine ore or burn charcoal for the furnaces remained to become permanent residents. Part of the Birmingham Manor was retained by Snowden descendants until they were displaced by the United States Government in 1941. Robin Hood's Forest was sold to Richard Jones, and Waters' Lotte was sold to John Waters in 1703. Descendants of both of these families were still living on the land until displaced by the Government. The Spears built the house lately occupied by William Clokey. It was a very old house and had a beautiful location on the top of a high hill. It was still standing in 1942. Other families in the upper section of the Great Fork were the Hopkins, Cowmans, Ijams, Marriotts, Jacobs, Clokeys, Donaldsons and Watts.

Stimpson's Choice and Merriton's Fancy were purchased by Jeremiah and Thomas Mullikin in 1743. Duvall's Delight was taken up by the Snowdens in 1695. This was cut into several large farms one of which was owned by Lycurgus G. Welsh who came here from Howard County to make his home when he married Elizabeth Ann Spears.

Almost the whole of this upper section of the Great Fork was taken over by the Government in 1941 as a part of the Meade Reservation.

A N D E R S O N

The Anderson name is Scotch. There is a tradition among the widely scattered descendants that the family came to Anne Arundel County, Maryland, from Virginia.

John Anderson who died in 1727 may not have been the original Anderson settler in Anne Arundel County but he is the first to present a proved genealogical line. There is no trace of any land belonging to him through grant, inheritance or purchase. John Anderson's Will dated 20 September 1725, probated 31 March 1727 and recorded in Liber 19, C.C.2, 272, Land Office, Annapolis, Maryland, was witnessed by Thomas Gimber, William McDaniel and Samuel Battel. The estate valued at £200/6/2/, an affluent one for that day, consisted of

38 head of cattle,
26 head of sheep,
4 horses,
52 hogs,
1 white man servant.

(See Inventory Liber 12, folio 440; See also Testamentary Proceedings Liber 28, folio 124.) To his son Thomas Anderson he bequeathed "one shilling and no more;" to his daughter Hannah "one cow and one calf;" to his daughter Elizabeth Powell the use of one cow and one calf during her natural life and then to his granddaughter Elizabeth Powell; to his sons William and Benjamin one gun apiece. The residue of his estate was left equally to his son William and his wife Elizabeth, who were named as his Executors.

William Anderson, son of John and Elizabeth Anderson, married after 23 July 1726, Susannah, daughter of John and Mary Meek and widow of John Phelps. (See Will of Mary Meek Boice probated 23 July 1726 and recorded in Liber 20, folio 271.) Susannah Phelps was a widow 2 July 1724, the date of a deed from Walter Phelps to Susannah Phelps and Charles Phelps, recorded in S.Y. No. 1, folio 28, in which he conveyed to them 200 acres, Phelps His Choice. In 1738 Susannah Anderson and Charles Phelps divided this land. In 1739 William Anderson purchased 60 acres of his portion from Charles Phelps, Carpenter, and in 1747 Susannah Anderson, widow, purchased the other 40 acres from Charles and Margaret Phelps.

William Anderson died in 1741 leaving his wife to settle his estate as his sons were all under the age of twenty one years. He left an estate valued at £149/14/9, consisting of 84 head of stock, farm tools, cooper's tools, shoemaker's tools and an assortment of furniture. Susannah Anderson filed an Account which is recorded in Liber 18, folio 422.

In 1754, by Warrant of Re-survey, Susannah Anderson took 670 acres of land which she called Providence, and in 1755 she took 230 acres called Mistake in Friendship.

On 11 October 1755 she conveyed Mistake in Friendship to her son John Phelps. On 12 October 1756 she conveyed one hundred and sixty five acres, part of Providence to her son William Anderson; on the same date she conveyed sixty acres, part of Providence, to her son James; and on the same date two hundred and nine acres, part of Providence,

to Richard Snowden, Ironmaster.

On 8 September 1758 Susannah Anderson made her Will which was witnessed by Jeremiah Mullikin, William Nicols and Joshua Clark. Her Will was probated 30 December 1766 and recorded in Land Office records Book C.G.3 (Book 35) folio 251. In it she named her children:

In her Will she devised to her son Absolom Anderson the remainder of the tract called Providence. The original Will is on file in the Land Office.

The house where William and Susannah Anderson lived was undoubtedly the one that stood on Barn Hill. The old barn was still standing in 1895. It was used as a barracks for workmen when the Pennsylvania Railroad was built. There was also a pear tree with a hundred-leaf rose bush under it which grew between the house and the spring.

The original family burying-ground was in the field which now is the back lot of the Mullikin land, just east of the Pennsylvania Railroad. In 1828 another burying lot was put on the side of the hill below the spring. Three bodies were moved from this lot to the local cemetery when the railroad came too close to the lot in its grading operations. Absolom Anderson Jr. is the only person identified whose remains are still there and his grave could not be found at the time the others were moved. There is also a family lot in the woods opposite the site of the tower and this was the James Anderson lot. The slave graveyard was very close to this.

WILLIAM ANDERSON

William Anderson, son of William and Susannah (Meek)(Phelps) Anderson, was probably the oldest son and named for his father. He died between 11 January and 21 March 1805. William Anderson is thought to have married (1) Elizabeth Edwards, daughter of Edward Edwards and Anne, his wife. She was dead before 18 April 1786 when her father's Will was made. His second wife was Sarah Edwards, daughter of Edward Edwards and Anne, his wife. (Anne Edwards, wife of Edward Edwards, is beleived to have been a Linthicum.) William Anderson's mother deeded him 165 acres, part of Providence, on 12 October 1756 and this farm was later known as the "Charles Anderson farm". William Anderson took the Oath of Fidelity. (D.A.R. Magazine #51, p.55). In the War of the Revolution he served under Lt. John Smith in the 3rd Maryland Regiment commanded by Col. Mordecai Gist. (Md.Archives 18, p.79.) Children of William Anderson were:

William Anderson's Will is recorded among the Records of Wills of Anne Arundel County in Will Book #37, folio 316. There must have been other daughters in this family for William Anderson also left certain bequests to "my grandchildren Dennis O'Connor, Elizabeth Chaney and O'Neal Connor".

William Anderson, son of William and Elizabeth (Edwards) Anderson, moved to Bedford County, Pennsylvania, where he was living 16 November 1811 when he deeded certain land to Edward E. Anderson. He is

thought to have married Elizabeth Williams 11 January 1785.

James Anderson, son of William and Elizabeth (Edwards)

Anderson is thought to have married 11 February 1784 Jemima Taylor.

He was dead in 1822 but left one son, William Anderson, surviving him.

James Anderson, son of William and Susannah (Meek) (Phelps) Anderson lived on the "part of Providence" given him by his mother. His house stood near the "upper gate," and a pear tree nearby bore fruit long after all signs of the house were gone. James Anderson married Lydia Meek, his first cousin and daughter of James and Elizabeth Meek. She was born 25 February 1729 and died in 1805. (See Will of Lydia Anderson, dated 12 October 1805 and probated 7 November 1805, recorded in the office of the Register of Wills of Anne Arundel County in Book 37, folio 334 etc. See also Bible record, copy on file in D.A.R. He lived a bachelor and bequeathed his estate to his nieces and nephews. James Anderson died 18 February 1825 "in his 73rd year". His Will was probated 12 March 1825 and recorded among the Records of Wills of Anne Arundel County in Liber 39, folio 249. There is a story in the family that James Anderson kept a large wooden bowl on his mantle into which he threw the levies which he collected for grinding meal.

Sarah Anderson, daughter of James and Lydia (Meek) Anderson, married Thomas Warfield who lived at Lugg Ox on the East side of the Patuxent River near the Fork. He was the son of Joshua and Ruth (Davis)

Warfield and had been an officer of the Militia in the Revolutionary War. Their children were:

While he was there his relatives visited him and a visit to such a distant place was anywhere from six months to a year. His niece, Elizabeth

Anderson was one of the visitors and while at Harpers Ferry she met and married Mr. Daniel Moler. After her death Mr. Moler and her sister Mary Jane Anderson were married. Misses Katherine and Betsy Woodward also went out visiting and met and married Mr. Jacob Strider and his brother Mr. Howard Strider. A brother of Mrs. Daniel Moler went to visit his sister and met Miss Hannah Moler of Columbus, Ohio, who had come east to visit her uncle, Mr. Daniel Moler. Mr. William T. Anderson and Miss Moler were married in 1856. Other marriages which came about because of "Uncle William's" living at Harpers Ferry were Miss Annie Anderson to Mr. Robert Osborne; Miss Kate Anderson to Mr. Grafton Plummer and Miss Laura Woodward to Mr. Frank Moler.

Mr. Anderson returned to Maryland before 1854 and purchased land near Annapolis Junction where he built "Grasslands". Anderson, died 13 December 1870 "in the sixty ninth year of his age". He married 10 December 1833 Elizabeth Hall, daughter of Thomas and Ann (Anderson) Hall and they are buried in the Hall family cemetery near Glenn Dale, Maryland. His stone, the only one still standing in the lot is marked:

"Sacred to the memory of our beloved father, Samuel B. Anderson, born November 9 1802, died December 13 1870, aged 68 years.

Mr. Anderson was a merchant and kept store for many years at Lower Marlboro, moving to Chevy Chase not long before the War Between the States. Mr. Anderson was an ardent Southern sympathizer and was threatened many times by the Union soldiers stationed in Washington. The Col. Joseph Belt Memorial stands close to the place where the old Anderson home used to be. Mr. Anderson's children were:

After Mr. Anderson's death Mrs. Anderson married Daniel Dodge Woodward at Ascension Church in Baltimore City. Bruner R. Anderson and William N. Woodward were two of the ushers at this marriage.

Samuel Hall Anderson, son of Samuel Bealmear and Elizabeth (Hall) Anderson, graduated from the University of Maryland and "read medicine" with Dr. William W. Duvall of Prince Georges County, Maryland. He was a beloved physician in and around Woodwardville for a great many years. Dr. Sam never married. He was a Lay Reader at St. Peter's P.E. Church and an active member of the Vestry and Guild, taking part in all business and social meetings. A gifted reader he gave many selections from Poe and from Father Ryan's poems and willingly took parts in all local entertainments and plays, mingling freely with young and old alike. When he began to practice he rode an old white horse named "Victor" and used saddlebags to carry his medicines. As he grew older he used "Buck and the buggy" to visit his patients. When he invited local children to go along for a ride they knew there would be farm gates to be opened. Dr. Sam died May 1912 and is buried at St. Peter's Protestant Episcopal Church.

Martha Anna Anderson, daughter of Samuel Bealmear and Elizabeth

(Hall) Anderson married 19 December 1861 (Thursday) Abram G. Woodward and died without children. Mr. Woodward married (2) Miss Harriet Walmsley of Baltimore, Maryland.

Mary Virginia Anderson, daughter of Samuel Bealmear and Elizabeth (Hall) Anderson, was married 9 January 1868 to Daniel Dodge Woodward and died 12 September 1871 "in her twenty ninth year." She left one daughter:

ABSLOM ANDERSON

Absolom Anderson, son of William and Susannah (Meek) (Phelps) Anderson, was probably the youngest of the three sons, all of whom were under age at the time of their father's death. His Mother willed to him 136 acres "being part of a tract Providence." This is where he made his home and from time to time he added to this tract. Absolom Anderson died between 18 November 1772 and 28 February 1787, probably February 1787. He married (1) about 1753 Mary, thought to have been a Clark and (2) Anne, thought to have been a Duckett. The birth dates of Absolom's children were found in "Cousin Christie's old Bible" formerly referred to:

Absolom Anderson and others of his family were buried on what is now the back lot of a piece of ground purchased by Miss Pearl Riden from the Misses Mullikin. The family lot was moved to a piece of higher ground (on the west bank of the Pennsylvania Railroad) in 1828, on the death of Absolom Anderson's son, Absolom.

Absolom Anderson took the Oath of Allegiance. (See D.A.R. Magazine, Vol. 51, p. 49.) He was commissioned Ensign in Capt. Thomas Mullikin's Comapny of Militia by the Council of Safety, at Annapolis, 22 February 1776. His original commission, as Ensign, is #2 in the

File of Original Commissions at the Maryland Historical Society, and is signed by Dan'l of St. Thos. Jenifer, Thomas Smith, Benj. Rumsay and Thomas B. Hands. He was appointed First Lieutenant in the same Company 28 May 1776, and his commission was issued 17 June 1776. Capt. Thomas Mullikin's Company was a part of the Severn Battalion of Militia. Pages 450, 495 of 11th Vol. Maryland Archives.

ABSLOM ANDERSON
(17 -1787)

"In the name of God, Amen, the eighteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy two, I, Absolom Anderson of Ann Arundel County do make this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, my will and meaning is that the same shall be employed and bestowed as hereafter by this will is expresses, and spirit, I revoke, renounce, Frustrate and make void all wills by me formerly made and declare and appoint this my last will and testament.

Imprimus. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Anne Anderson all my part of a tract of land called Providence containing one hundred and thirty six acres, also a small tract called Vacant Lot containing fifteen acres with all the improvements there unto belonging to the said land During the time of her widowhood. I also give to my said wife Anne the whole of my personal estate, during the time of her widowhood, and in case my said wife marry again then to have only a third of my said estate, real and personal, her life.

Im. I devise to my son William Anderson and his heirs forever the whole of all my lands. But not to (word here not readable, probably possess) any part thereof during the time of the widowhood of my said wife Anne Anderson unless she marry a second time and then my said wife to have a third of my estate real and personal during her natural life.

Im. I further devise to my son William Anderson one mare called Lady and no more of my estate.

Im. I devise to my seven children, Robert Anderson, Absolom Anderson, Richard Anderson, James Anderson, Thomas Anderson, Susannah Anderson, Anne Anderson, the remaining part of my estate, after paying my worldly debts, equally to be divided amongst them.

I do appoint my loving wife Anne Anderson to be my Executrix of this my last Will and Testament as witness my hand and seal the day and year as above.

Ann Anderson, daughter of Absolom Anderson, married Thomas Hall. It has been impossible to reconcile the dates on this line. The Family Bible says "Ann Anderson born February 27 1758," but does not say whether she was the daughter of Mary or Ann Anderson.

According to the Provincial Court Records #143 788, in the estate of Absolom Anderson Jr., dated 22 October 1831, Ann D. Hall, his sister, filed an Answer for Jacob and Absolom Hall, of full age, and Elizabeth Ann, Mary Jane, Isaac, Baruch and Martha Thomas Hall, infants. ABSLOM ANDERSON

Absolom Anderson, son of Absolom and Ann () Anderson, born 25 April 1765, died 4 July 1829. He married 6 June 1794 Ann Burrell who died soon after their marriage. He was very much in love with his young wife and grieved for her till the time of his death.

The Will of Absolom Anderson is as follows:

In the name of God Amen. I, Absolom Anderson of Anne Arundel County in the province of Maryland being in perfect health of body and of sound and disposing mind and memory and understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence; I do therefore make this my last will and testament in maner and form following. That is to say. First and principally. I commit my sole into the hands of Almighty God: and my body to be decently buried at the decretion of my Executor hereafter mentioned and after my debts and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows:-

It is my Will and desire that all my estate both real and personal be equally devided between my Brothers and Sisters children as I will hereafter direct except one black woman Phillis I wish to go with who she pleases. One black man called Adderson who is to pay Phillis fifteen dollars a year for her maintenance during her life and then the above Adderson to be free. It is my will and desire that my Executor will see to the receiving the above mentioned sum of fifteen dollars from the above named Addersons wagers and have it appropriated to the use of the said Phillis for as maney years as she may live.

It is my will and desire that the residue of my property both real and personal be sold and equally devided between my brothers and sisters children, that is to say the heirs of my brother Robert Anderson, James Anderson, Thomas Anderson, Samuel Anderson, Elizabeth Bealmear, Joshua Anderson and Ann D. Hall, or as many as they may have at the time of my death.

And lastly I do hereafter constitute and appoint my brother in law Francis Bealmear to be sole Executor of this my last will and Testament.

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twelfth day of December Anno Domini eighteen hundred and twenty eight.

Signed: Absolom Anderson.

This Will was witnessed by Edward E. Anderson, Leonard Mallonee and Brice Malonee, and was probated in Anne Arundel County, Maryland, 14 July 1829, in Liber

William Thomas Anderson was a small boy when "old Uncle Ab" died and he told his children that a grave was prepared in the old family lot. When the funeral was over and the body was to be interred

the grave had filled with water so a new grave was prepared on the side of the hill. The earth there was so hard that someone remarked that anyone placed in that earth would be there on judgment day. Absolom Anderson's grave could not be located but other bodies removed from this lot after being there for more than fifty years were found almost intact.

The Executor of Absolom Anderson's Will filed a Petition in the Chancery Court and Answers were filed by and for Richard, Aden, Robert, Catherine and Mary P. Anderson, of full age, and Talbot Anderson, an infant (under twenty one years) children of Robert Anderson of Frederick County, Maryland; Absolom, Richard, Sarah Ann, Elizabeth, William T., Mary Jane and Samuel Anderson, children of Samuel Anderson; James, Thomas and Absolom Bealmear, Ann Brewer and Richard Isaacs and Eliza, his wife, children of Elizabeth Bealmear; William and Absolom, of full age, Elizabeth, Henrietta, Robert, Joshua, John, Maria, Thomas and Miranda, children of Joshua Anderson, Jacob and Absolom Hall, of full age, Elizabeth, Ann, Mary Jane, Isaac and Baruch Hall and Martha Thomas Hall, infants, children of Ann D. Hall, (and by Ann D. Hall); Lydia, Eliza and Susan, children of James Anderson; and Isaac, son of Thomas Anderson, all of which can be found in Chancery Papers No. 143,788. When they were married Samuel and Elizabeth Anderson went to live on the plantation "Lugg Ox" near the Fork Bridge. This plantation was owned by Thomas Warfield, the husband of Elizabeth Anderson's aunt, Sarah (Anderson) Warfield. In 1835 they purchased part of "Providence" from the estate of Absolom Anderson Jr. and removed to the old house on the hill. Samuel Anderson was a cabinet maker and one piece of his work is now in the possession of Mrs. Temple of Boston, Massachusetts. He was also something of a botanist and had a wide knowledge of all the plant life in this section.

On 9 March 1846 Samuel and Elizabeth Anderson gave a lot of ground to Caleb White, William Gardner, John Gardner, Eli Gaither and Isaiah Waters, Trustees, for a church and a building was erected on a corner of "Providence", near Finger Board Hill. According to the original contract the building was thirty by twenty-two feet and had a ten foot gallery. It was completed with pulpit and with benches every three feet, for the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars. "Old Providence" Methodist Church was used for public worship until 1880. It replaced the octagonal log meeting house near Griffith's Mill where Francis Asbury had preached.

WATERS

John Waters of Yorkshire, England, came to America in 1635. Evidence is strong that he was a son of John Waters of Middleham and that he had been sent to America to settle the estate of his kinsman Lt. Edward Waters of Elizabeth City, Virginia. John Waters was living in Anne Arundel County, Maryland, as early as 1676, when he patented "Waters Adventure." John Waters was a carpenter, which in those days included both the designing and building of homes. It is believed that John Waters married (1) Susannah White, widow of James White. There are strong indications that Susannah became the mother of his son Samuel. As a widower he married Elizabeth Giles who was the mother of the rest of his children. The Waters family was Quaker. Because of their religious beliefs they remained peaceful planters and tradesmen and took little part in the civil affairs of the Province. John Waters died intestate in 1704.
