### PREFACE

### PREFACE

This book is intended primarily to be a genealogical record of the descendants of Charles Angel Sr., pioneer of Frederick (now Carroll) County, Maryland, and secondarily to record other facts found during the search for genealogical data. Originally it was intended to include more complete biographical sketches; however, time did not permit doing this. The writer regrets that the genealogy of several branches of the family must be left incomplete because of lack of time and the expense involved in continued search of records.

The writer's original effort was made during 1926 and 1927, when he made several visits to various parts of Maryland, searched court and other records, and interviewed several of the older members of the family, most of whom have passed away in the meantime. That effort resulted in the compilation of a fairly complete chart of the older members of the family then living in Maryland and their ancestors for several generations. At this time a tie-in was made with certain county records, which established the fact that these people are descendants of Charles Angel Sr., who died in 1810. These facts, however, did not establish the connection between the Maryland families and the descendants of Israel Angel Sr., Harrison County, Ohio, pioneer, the primary object of the search.

The above mentioned interviews resulted in the assembly of data on the several fragments of the Maryland family, and in each instance some data was included that tied in to one or more of the other fragments; in some instances to and including brothers and sisters of greatgrandparents. These data, when finally set up in chart form, showed the great-grandparents to be the same as the descendants of Charles Angel Sr. as recorded in his will; except that no one could account for his son John.

The success of the effort up to this point was due to the cooperation of the people interviewed in Maryland and subsequent correspondence with them. They were most cordial in receiving the writer and it is regretted that many of them are no longer with us.

Work on the Ohio branch of the family had been in process half heartedly for several years before the Maryland trips. Since that effort resulted in a failure insofar as tracing the ancestry of Israel Sr. was concerned, no more work was done until 1943. From 1943 to 1945 the writer had access to the Genealogical Section of the Library of Congress, the United States Census Records, the United States Archives, and the Library of the Daughters of the American Revolution, all in Washington, District of Columbia. Many hours were spent searching these records, with the result that it was definitely established that the Ohio branch of the family also was descendant from Charles Sr. of Frederick (now Carroll) County, Maryland. After a year of sparctime search work in Washington, the writer added data to the chart of the Maryland branch and compiled a chart of the Ohio branches. The writer's mother, Mary Angel Gruber, family, which was supplemented to some extent with data from census records, and other facts obtained through correspondence. In addition to supplying facts in which he and his family had recorded the dates of birth of his entire family, and other pertinent facts. A search of Harrison County, Ohio, records by several interested people resulted in the discovery of data which established the writer's mother in June 1944, when she added a great amount of detail from memory. Later checking proved the vast majority of the facts supplied by her to be correct.

The records of the John Angel Jr. family of Logan County, Ohio, were put together from fragments found in the census records supplemented by data supplied by Otto L. Angel and other members of that branch of the family, who were located through the kindness of Gerald S. Karr of the Bellefontaine, Ohio, Chamber of Commerce. Israel Sr. and John Jr. were brothers, a fact that we knew, and when we established the fact that their father was John Sr., we had our connection with the Maryland branch of the family and our connection with Charles Sr., pioneer of Maryland. Much information on the younger generations and considerable detail on the main chart still were missing at this stage. For the work on compiling the required facts, the writer is greatly indebted to his cousin Emma Schaad Kinsey, who worked incessantly over a period of more than two years, interviewing members of the Ohio branch of the family and corresponding with those living at a distance. Without her cooperation much of the detail on the younger generations would not have been made available. Many others also have contributed information.

Considerable time-consuming work on correcting the manuscript was done by the writer's sisters, Eunice A. Gruber and Alverna Gruber Baer, and a complete review of the final draft was made by the writer's uncle, William H. Angel. Their work has helped to make this a much better book and permitted them to add genealogical data that otherwise would not have been included. Their painstaking and time-consuming efforts are greatly appreciated by the writer. Acknowledgment of assistance given by others is made under a separate heading and in some instances in the text.

The records included in this volume are incomplete and no doubt errors will be found; however, all available leads were followed, by correspondence or otherwise, and what appeared to be the most authentic information, was used. A few items of information came in too late for inclusion or revision of tabulation. It will be greatly appreciated if errors and omissions are reported to the writer, who will attempt to keep a record of them. Should circumstances permit a revised and more complete edition at some future date, this information will be made available. This work has been done voluntarily and the writer assumes no responsibility for errors and omissions; however, he hopes there are few of either

### HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

In order to use this book with satisfaction it is necessary to know certain facts about the person whose record you are investigating. Just to look for the record of John Angel would result in your finding about twenty different records. Also, it is necessary that you understand the system used in compiling this record, if it is to be used efficiently.

Before attempting to look up the record of John Angel, you should have some facts whereby you can identify him; such as the approximate year of his birth, names of his parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters, wife, children,

birth, names of his parents, granoparents, promers and sisters, whe, chinaten, place of residence, occupation, etc. The year of birth may suffice but some of the other facts may be necessary for positive identification. In Part I are listed only descendants of the male members of the Angel and Angell families. Each male member listed in Part I is identified by a code of two parts, such as 3-2; which means "3" third generation. "2" family number two, and is that of Israel Angel Sr. The use of Sr., It., III, etc., has been found necessary in this record for the purpose of identification, because of the number of repetitions of several of the names from Charles Sr. down to the number of repetitions of several of the names from Charles 3r. nown to the present generation. In tabulating family data, the code for the head of the family becomes the "family tabulation number". In looking for the records of Israel Angel you find the family tabulation number in the index, then under the fourth generation look for the tabulation 3-2. Although 3-2 is a third generation number, it is that of a parent of the fourth generation and head of that family. Israel also is listed in the third generation with his father. John Sr., 2-1.

The generations tabulated herein will be found to be at intervals of between twenty and twenty-five years, and with this in mind it will be easy to determine approximately the generation in which the name you wish to investigate is listed. Take for example, John Angel Sr., born 1833, has a son John Wesley, etc. The supposed date of birth of Charles Sr. (our first generation) is 1740 and that of our example is 1833, an interval of 93 years: or about four generations; con-sequently we may assume that his code commences with 4-. Now refer to the index and list all John Angels whose codes commence with 4-, then examine each family tabulation having the same number as the codes taken from the index and see if one of them can meet the requirements of the John for whom you are searching. If you do not find your man listed under the fourth generation repeat the operation by checking in the fifth and third generations. Should this result in failure, either you do not have authentic data or the person of your search is not listed. Do not depend upon just a few morsels of information when com-

is not listed. Do not depend upon just a rew morsels of information when com-mencing your search; because some items you have may be incorrect or there may be an error in the book. See Note under Table of Family Tabulation Num-bers, at the end of Suggestions for Using Part II. The family tabulations in the book serve a three-fold purpose. First, they show the code, name, spouse and date of birth of the "Angel" narent of the family and such other facts as are available at this time. Second; they show the code. name, spouse, and date of birth of each child of the Angel parent, or such of these date are available. Third: they chow purposing the parent's created these data as are available. Third: they show, preceding the parent's record, the ancestry of the Angel (or Angel decendant) parent of the family. Data on ancestry of the Angel (or Angel decendant) parent of the family, or on the ancestry of the spouse of male members, may be found under the biography, when such facts have been found. A little study may be required on the part of the reader, in order to use this book with satisfaction. Have patience. The writer and some of his co-workers had an abundance of it.

In Part II are shown the families of the female descendants of Israel Angel Sr. 3-2, Hiram Angel 4-6, and others. Time does not permit including other such related families; also the continuation of this practice soon becomes so involved that it is no longer practical. The code used in Part II, comprises a number indicating the generation, (as in Part I) and a family number prefixed a number indicating the generation, (as in Fart 1) and a lamity number prenxed by a letter; A being used for the descendants of Israel Sr., B for the descendants of Hiram, and C and D for two other groups. Two indices have been prepared; one for the name Angel (and Angell) and another for all other names. The former contains only names found in Part I, but the latter includes the entire book. Where the name Angel appears in Part II the name is listed in the general index unless it also appears in Part I and is indexed there. In both Parts I and II, the ancestry record, such as "Rosetta 5-B1—Hiram 4-6—Isael Sr. 3-2—John Sr. 2-1—Charles Sr. 1-1", should be read as follows: Rosetta 5-B1 daughter of Hiram 4-6 son of Israel Sr. 3-2 son of John Sr. 2-1 son of Charles Sr. 1-1.

In Part I the name Angel does not appear in the ancestry record because it already appears in the family tabulation below, and it does not change. In Part II it is shown only when there is a change. The family name last preceding governs until another change is shown.

### ABBREVIATIONS USED

- cr. Indicates that the information is from, or derived from, United States census records.
- es. Indicates an estimation of date or time.
- (?) Indicates a doubt as to accuracy.
- (Sr.) Indicates that the next generation shows a son of the same name.
- m. Is for married. Either date of or to whom.
- b. Is for born.
- d. Is for died.
- Dash in ancestry record should be read "son of" or "daughter of". This should not be confused with the hyphen in the code, as 3-2.
- " " Quotation marks indicate the name by which a person generally was called in instances where the first name was not so used.
- () Names in parentheses are nicknames generally used.
- () Dates of hirth, etc. in parentheses pertain to the name immediately preceding.

### SUGGESTIONS FOR USING PART II

The recording of data on the descendants of the daughters of a family becomes complicated and confusing regardless of how it is done, if continued through several generations; because new family names are added with the marriage of each daughter, in each generation. For this reason the descendants listed in Part II have been treated in a manner similar to that used in Part I. Each generation is identified by a code, and is listed in chronological order regardless of the family name. For convenience in referring to Part II the numbering of pages therein commence with **408**. **40**.

In the text of Part II the descendants of each daughter of the Angel parent have been listed to the last generation, before the lincage of another daughter has been commenced. This method permits treating each group as one family, regardless of the marriages of several daughters and the entering of new family names. This is done to prevent a scramble of names and to make it possible to show the ancestry for each family tabulation.

From the above information and a casual study of the text, it will be seen why no general effort was made to follow through on the feminine side of the family. Furthermore, time does not permit making the necessary search to include all these families.

The descendants of the daughters of Israel Angel Sr., 3-2 have been included for the reason that originally it was intended to include only this family; however, fortunate "finds" permitted compiling a more extensive record. The descendants of the daughters of Hiram Angel, 4-6, have been included because the data on this branch of the family was readily available and most of the work on this project was done by members of this family. An effort has been made to include data to show the ancestry of each person who assisted in the search for data. In instances of married daughters, whose names do not appear in Part II, the record of their children generally have been included in the biographical sketch of her father. This also applies, to a limited extent, in other instances if data were available.

In order to permit easy access to the records in Part II it is suggested that the following procedure be used:

First: Turn to the general index, find the name you want, and note the family tabulation number opposite the name. For example, Ira E. Wolfe, code 6-A146. From the first part of the code, "6-", we know that we have the sixth generation, and from the second part, "A146", that the name will be found in the tabulation of family A146. Or 6-A146.

Second: Look in the Table of Family Tabulation Numbers below, under the heading for the sixth generation and find the entry which covers the range including the code for the family name you want. For the example above it is 6-A141 to 6-A155. READ NOTE BELOW THE TABLE.

Third: Look in the left hand column of the table and see which section of Part II contains the family tabulation number. For Ira E. Wolfe this is section A4.

Fourth: Turn to the section and generation indicated by the procedure above and look for the name wanted. In this way you need search only a few pages at the most and you will find the record in either the family tabulation or the biographical sketch.

In some instances a name also may appear under the tabulation for the preceding or next generation of this family. For the code of the former look in the ancestry record above the family tabulation you have just examined, and for the code of the latter see the number on the left of the name of the person (or name of spouse) you found in the family tabulation.

Who the parents of Charles Angel Sr. were is a mystery, which the writer Who the parents of Charles Angel Sr. were is a mystery, which the writer probably will not solve; because considerable research will be necessary. That the family is German is proved beyond doubt in the biographical sketch on the following page, but the origin of Charles and his parents is not known. Charles could have been born in America or Europe and likewise his parents. The name Angel is found frequently in Maryland records a hundred years before the birth of Charles, and it is possible that some of these people are his forefathers. Immigration records show that Carl Philip Angel, age 20, entered the United States through the port of Philadelphia on September 2, 1734, from the Palatinas, on the ship Loyal Judith. This man could be the father of Charles Sr. Another fact should not be overlooked in making a further search; namely that the father

This man could be the father of Charles Sr. Another fact should not be overlooked in making a further search; namely that the father of Charles or an earlier generation may have entered this country under the name Engell, a possibility that the writer has not had time to investigate. Records in Baltimore and Annapolis may contain the information needed to identify the earlier generations; however, the records of Philadelphia and other ports of entry likewise could have the information. Definitely, we are not descendant from the famous New England Angell family, whose genealogy was so ably written by Avery Angell.

Charles Angel Sr., pioneer of Frederick County, Maryland, was born about 1740 and died in 1810. A study of the census records would indicate that his date of birth is between 1750 and 1755; however, these records are not available for periods prior to 1790, hence this estimate is based on incomplete data. His church activities in 1768 would indicate an earlier birth, probably between 1740 and 1745, or even earlier. His will was recorded on January 7, 1811 in Will Record Book No. 1, page 149, Frederick County, from which the names of his children and names of spouses of his daughters were obtained. The will also mentions Julia's son Michael Angel. He lived in Myers Election District, No. 3, and was an active member of the Dutch Reformed Church of Silver Run, Maryland, where in 1768 he was one of a committee appointed to purchase land for the purpose of erecting a church for that congregation. Also, a history of St. Mary's Reformed Church by S. C. Hoover mentions Charles. Records of Frederick County show that he voted in Fredericktown between November 9 and 12, 1796, where he was registered as a Democrat-Republican. During the period from September 4, 1770 to Septem-1740 and died in 1810. A study of the census records would indicate that his

In Charles' will this name is Flickner, but in the record of accounts in the office of the Registrar of Wills it is Flickinger. Frederick County Deed Record W. R. No. 8 page 39 for April 18, 1788, records a transaction between Charles of the first part, and Jacob, Michael, and Charles Jr. of the other part, pertaining to a part of three tracts of land called Owens Choice, Friars Delight, and Ohio. The records show that from time to time Charles owned many tracts of land, the deed record index of the above named county from 1762 to 1802 listing 34 transactions in his name. Whether or not he brought his money to America, inherited it, or made it in this country is not known. From the information included here it is evident that he lived in Frederick County at least 48 years. A study of the census records for Charles and his sons indicate that at least the sons most probably are natives of Maryland. It should be borne in mind that Carroll County was a part of Frederick County prior to 1836. From whence Charles came, the writer has been unable to determine; however, some clues exist, but lack of time prevents further search at present. Several members of the Maryland branch of the family stated that they were of the opinion that the family is of German origin, which the writer doubted for some time. In 1946 the writer made an examination of the original of Charles' will, filed in the Frederick County courthouse. His signature, plainly written, was Carl Engell, in what appears to be a modification of the German script. In several of the deed records his name appears in a similar manner, the signature probably having been copied by the recorder. From this information it is believed to be safe to assume that Charles or his ancestors came from Germany.

A search of county records made in 1927 was followed by interviews with several of the members of the Maryland branch of the family, who knew of their ancestry back to Jacob. Michael Sr., and Charles Jr., and in most instances their reports overlapped, thereby tying together the several smaller groups. This information, when compared to the descendants of Charles Sr. as shown in his will, coincided with the names shown there, except, that John was not mentioned by anyone. No one could account for him, and until the writer searched the census records it was not known that he had migrated to Ohio and was the father of Israel Sr., the writer's great-grandfather. Further facts about John Sr. will be found under the family tabulations 2-1, John Sr. and 3-2, Israel Sr.

Magruder's Maryland Colonial Abstract, Volume II, page 17, shows that Charles Angel served as executor of the will of John Gingling of Frederick County, Maryland, from September 4, 1770 to September 16, 1774. Also Scharf's History of Western Maryland, Volume II, includes the name of Charles Angel among the pioneers of Myers District No. 3, which includes the towns of Union Mills, Myersville, Silver Run, and Piney Creek Station. He states that the early settlers were almost entirely Germans from York and Lancaster Counties, Pennsylvania, or directly from the Palitanata.

John Sr. probably was born in Frederick County, Maryland, about 1762. The census records of 1790 for this county show that he had four children of whom at least two were under 16 years of age. In 1800 there were five boys under 10 years of age and three girls under 26 years old. Of these children we know that Charles, Israel, John Jr., Nancy, and Sarah went to Ohio with their family, and Andrew remained in Maryland. A study of the census records leads to the conclusion that John Sr. was born between 1760 and 1765, or about 1762. Statement of Mary Angel Gruber, in the Appendix, makes reference to George.

From a further study of the census records of Frederick County, Maryland, Harrison and Logan Counties. Ohio; and other records mentioned in the biography of John Jr. (3-3), it has been determined definitely that John Sr., 2-1, is the father of Israel Sr. (3-2). John Jr. (3-3), et. al. and that he migrated from Frederick County, Maryland, to Harrison County. Ohio, between 1800 and 1816. This is not more definite because the Frederick County census records of 1800 do not show the names in full: therefore we do not know whether J. Angel is John or Jacob; also the Ohio census records prior to 1820 are missing.

Harrison County Records of Deeds, Volume A, page 380, show that John Sr. acquired 100 acres of land from Leonard Kimmel on May 22, 1816, and by a deed recorded in Volume C page 431. John Sr. and his wife Margaret sold the same tract to John Jr. for \$1.000: the land being located about two miles west of Germano. John and Margaret also conveved to Israel, on November 21, 1822, as recorded in Volume C. page 183, a tract of land containing 160 acres, one mile northeast of Scio and two miles west of New Rumley, the deed having been witnessed by Catherine Angel (John Ir's. wife) and Sarah Shafer, daughter of John Sr. General Land Office files in the Archives Building at Washington show that John Angel of Harrison County. Ohio, on the 14th day of July, 1817, purchased the southeast quarter of section 26, township 13 in the 5th range of the Steubenville District, for \$320, and he was granted a patent on May 5, 1821.

War Department, Old Records Branch of the Adjutant Generals Office, Archives Building, show that John Angle served in the Captain Hatch Den's Company, 2nd Maryland Regiment foot troops, for three years. His name appears on rolls dated January 5, 1778, February 4, 1778, and March 18, 1778. Although the spelling is different, this may be John 2-1, as the writer's estimate of his year of birth could easily be off ten years. This of course has not been proved.

Nancy Angel married Jacob Riggle in Harrison County, Ohio, on September 25, 1821. No further information was found on this family.

Sarah Angel married Philip Shaffer (spelling found two ways in records) in Harrison County, Ohio, on December 2, 1819 and had two children, Solomon Schaffer and Peggy Schaffer; however, Philip died, probably in 1824, and his estate was appraised on August 23, 1824. On March 23, 1825 Sarah married Moses Markley, a widower with two children, Joseph Markley and Elizabeth Markley. This family lived near Harlam Springs, Carroll (then Harrison) County, Ohio. About 1835 they moved to an 80 acre farm about 2½ miles from Greysville, Monroe County, Ohio. Moses was born January 4, 1800, in Salisbury, Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and died January 26, 1872, at Greys-ville, where both he and Sarah are buried. Moses was a descendant of John Markley (1732-1810) of Brothers Valley Township, Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and was the father of six children; Joseph, Peter, Jacob, Mathias, Susannah, and Katherine. Joseph, son of John, laid out the town of Salisbury, Pennsylvania, and in

1814 moved to a 640 acre farm now occupied by the city of Ashland, Ohio. He had twelve sons, including Moses, and two daughters. Moses left Ashland County and settled near Germano, Harrison County, Ohio, where he married \_\_\_\_\_\_ Everhart and had two children. After the death of his first wife he married the widow Sarah Angel Schaffer.

The above facts about Sarah and Moses, and the ancestry of Moses, were obtained from a genealogical record of the descendants of John Markley of West Salishury, Pennsylvania, dated 1922, by Joseph M. Markley of Canton, Ohio. Joseph, a great, great grandson of John, most graciously loaned the writer a copy of this excellent book, furnished other facts, and did considerable record searching pertaining to the Angel family. Thanks a lot, Joe. The ancestry record of Joseph is quite unique and is included below:

Comparatively little information has been found on the descendants of this Comparatively little information has been found on the descendants of this branch of the family. Someone thought they went west or south; however, Jacob undoubtedly was born in Frederick County, Maryland, where Marriage Records No. 3 (male) from 1778 to 1865, record the marriage of Jacob to Juliana (spelling not the same as in later court record). The Deed Records of this county, Record Book-W R 8, page 39, indicate a transfer of land between Jacob, and Charles, Michael, and Charles Jr. for part of a tract of land called Ohio. The 1790 census records show that Jacob lived in Frederick County, and that his family, compared two male, members extend years or more of acce that his family comprised two male members sixteen years or more of age. and two females, ages not indicated.

Frederick County Administration of Accounts, Liber J R R No. 2, page 486, account of Ephriam Richmond administrator of the goods and chattels of Polly J. Angel, late of Frederick County, deceased, distributed sums of money received from Dawson V. Hammond, executor of the last will of Colonel Thomas Hammond, deceased, for the first liquidation made on November 22, 1876. This money was distributed as follows:

Julianna Angel, mother of the intestate, one third. To

Julia Rea, sister of the intestate, one third. Sophronia Gorsuch, sister of the intestate, one third.

The above records establish two facts: First, that Polly was the daughter of Jacob Angel 2-2, husband of Julianna, and that he had two other daughters, Julia and Sophronia. Second, that Polly's grandfather was Colonel Thomas Hammond.

Deed Record 17, page 562, Allegany County, Maryland, show that Polly J. Angel at one time owned 160 acres of land westwardly from Fort Cumberland and on the National Pike. This may account for the Ohio family tradition relative to Cumberland being the former home of Israel's ancestors.

### Michael 2-3 - Charles Sr. 1-1.

Michael Sr. probably was born in Frederick County, Maryland, about 1770, and died in 1820. J. Albert Angell related in 1927, that his grandfather, Joseph, youngest child of Michael Sr., and born about 1808, was twelve years old when

Michael Sr. was severely stung by yellowjackets, which resulted in his death. From the 1800 census records we find that at this time Michael's family resided in Frederick County, and there were three male members under 10 years of age, one between 10 and 16 years, one between 26 and 45 years, and two over 45 years of age; also two female members under 10 years of age, and one between 26 and 45 years of age. Assuming that Michael is the man between age 26 and 45, which corresponds with the senior female member, he probably was born about 1765 or 1770.

Mussion about 1705 of 1770. Michael was party to a deed recorded in Frederick County Deed Records, Book W R 8, page 39, dated April 1787, between Jacob Angel, and Charles, Michael, and Charles Jr., for part of a tract of land called Ohio. He married Marie Myers, according to information from Lizzie Birely and M. Naomi Adams, great granddaughters of Michael. Miss Birely told the writer that the familu is of the 1 where of hish and his birely told the writer

that the family is of the Lutheran faith and it is her understanding that they are of German parentage. This was confirmed by J. Albert Angell, who thought his great grandfather or earlier ancestor came from Germany. He also advised that in spelling the single and double "I" was used promiscuously.

Charles Jr. is believed to have been born in Frederick County, Maryland, about 1780, as estimated from the census records. The name of Charles' wife was given as Elgear Thomas but Frederick County marriage records show her name as Elenore. Census records of Frederick County do not include this man, unless he is the C. Angle shown in the 1810 record. This probably is Charles Jr., because, a study of the records of the Angle family, both before and after 1810, does not reveal any trace of them in this county. If the 1810 record is of Charles Jr., he had a family of two boys under 10 years of age, two daughters under 10 years of age, he was between 26 and 45 years old, and his wife was in the same age bracket.

Family tradition indicates that Andrew, a brother of Israel Sr. (3-2), John Jr. (3-3), et al., remained in Maryland when the family migrated to Ohio. Frederick County, Maryland, census records for 1820, 1830, and of Carroll County, Maryland, for 1840, show that he resided in Election District No. 7 (Westminster District) and that he had a family of three boys and four girls, that he was born about 1790, and that his wife was born within a few years of that time. Carroll County was formed from a part of Frederick County in 1836; therefore we presume that Andrew did not move during the years mentioned above

Scharf's History of Western Maryland, Volume II, page 864, describes the of Mt. Pleasant. The same volume, on page 244, under burials in St. Benjamin's (Kreiger's) Union Lutheran and Reformed Church Cemetery, records the burials of Barbara Angel, daughter of John Schaefer, born March 10, 1786, died January 18, 1832. Barbara married Frederick Boyers in 1807 and they had three

sons. In 1816 she married Andrew Angel, by whom she had six children. Records relative to the will of Charles Angel Sr., Liber G M E 2, page 144, November 12, 1827, Frederick County, Maryland, show that Andrew was a bondsman.

Mary Angel Gruber (-Hiram 4-6 - Israel Sr. 3-2 - John Sr. 2-1 - Charles Sr. 1-1.) stated that she had been told by her father, that Israel had a brother Andrew who remained in Maryland when the family went west to Ohio. She thinks that Hiram never saw his uncle Andrew.

The above dates of birth are from Israel's note-book, mentioned later; however, some do not agree with dates given by his descendants. The writer prefers to accept the dates of the note-book.

According to family tradition, Israel was born near Cumberland, Maryland; however, all records found during the writer's current and previous searches indicate that the family lived in Frederick (now Carroll) County, Maryland, from 1790 to 1800, and possibly until 1815 or 1816. Allegany County (including the City of Cumberland) was formed from a part of Washington County in 1789. Because Israel was born in 1795, and his father's name is recorded in both 1790 and 1800 census of Frederick County, there is little argument in favor of Cumberland, 95 miles farther west in the wilderness. Furthermore, search of records of Maryland, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia (then Virginia) in the vicinity of Cumberland reveals no trace of the family. The census records of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, for 1850 show that Israel was born in Maryland. A study of the above and other records mentioned heretofore indicate that he came to Harrison County, Ohio, with his parents between 1800 and 1816.

Family tradition further refers to a townsite on land that is supposed at one time to have belonged to Israel's father or earlier ancestor, with Cumberland again having been mentioned. This has been investigated with considerable care and there is no indication that this city could qualify. (The writer has had considerable experience in searching of land title and court records and personally made the search). Although Charles Sr., Israel's grandfather owned considerable land at various times, he operated in Frederick (now Carroll) County; however, among the many tracts of land he owned from time to time were four lots in the town of Winchester, now Westminster, and one in New London, which to some extent meet the requirement. All the other tracts once owned by Charles Sr. have not been investigated; therefore, it is possible that some other village or even one of the smaller cities, or a subdivision of one, may be located on one of the tracts formerly owned by lsrael's father or more distant relative.

Polly J. Angel. daughter of Jacob Angel (2-2), a brother of Israel's father, at one time owned 160 acres of land on the National Pike westwardly from Fort Cumberland, Maryland. This is in Allegany County near the City of Cumberland and may be responsible for the Cumberland story. See family tabulation 2-2 for more details about Polly's case.

A small note-book, containing notes by Israel Sr. and members of his family that was handed down to his son Hiram and by him to Charles F., whose widow Ellen gave it to the writer's mother, has supplied considerable information. One entry is 'I. Israel Angel was born on Sunday, March 29, 1795'', indicating that the entry is in Israel's handwriting. The dates of birth of his children are recorded in different handwriting, and other than Israel's, probably that of the mothers of his children. He also recorded his marriage to Annie as being on February 1, 1818, and someone recorded the date of Israel's death as September 21, 1850.

The Harner family, including Israel's first wife, came to Harrison County, Ohio, from Fayette County, Pennsylvania, before Ohio was admitted to the union. Israel and Annie were married in Harrison County, Ohio, by John Wagner, J.P., on February 1, 1818, and had eight children, the youngest being John, who was born only a few years before his mother died.

Harrison County Deed Records Volume C, page 138, show that John Angel (Sr.) and his wife Margaret, conveyed to Israel on November 25, 1822, 160 acres in the southeast quarter of Section 26, Township 13, Range 5, of land directed to be sold at Steubenville. This tract is about 2 miles due west of New Rumley and is the birthplace of several, if not all, the children of Annie Harner Angel. Joseph and Hiram were born on McGuire's Creek near New Rumley, and it is the writer's opinion that this is the above described place.

Israel also acquired a tract of land in Section 31, Township 11, Range 4, containing 103 acres, from Henry Harner and Barbara his wife, by deed dated November 27, 1929, and recorded in Volume F, page 170. A deed of trust covering this land and recorded in Volume F, page 428, also mentions Susanna and Catherine Herner. He also owned land in Lee Township, Carroll County, at one time.

Henry and Barbara Herner (Harner) were the parents of Annie (Nancy), Catherine (Katy) not married. Sallie (m. Stinger), Susanna (m. Haggay), Mary (m. Lowmiller), Bill (drowned). Barbara (m. Adam Shawher December 22, Mary (III. Lowinner), Bir (movine), Darbara (III. Attain Shawier December 24, 1816), Margaret (III. Adam Snyder April 24, 1823), Henry, and Joseph. Joseph was born in Fayette County, Pennsylvania, on May 11, 1800, came to Ohio when he was a small child, married Rebecca Salmon on March 12, 1835, and died in Jewett, Ohio, on January 15, 1900. Records show that Samuel Harner married Casandra Cox on November 1, 1821 and that Rachel Harner married John Tyler on December 2. 1819. On April 5 (or 6), 1836. Israel married Mary M. (Mollie) Stonebrook in

Carroll County, Ohio, and in 1837 moved his family to Tuscarawas County, Ohio. Here he acquired a farm in Jefferson Township, about a mile and a half from Philipburg, now Stonecreek, on the road past the brick works to Oldtown Valley and later known as the Adam Regula place. Here Israel and Mollie raised a family of six children, the first born being Susan, who died in childhood and was the first to be buried in the Philipsburg cemetery, and Maria later was buried nearby. Israel died on September 21, 1850 and is buried near Susan and near the southeasterly corner of the cemetery.

The census of 1850, for Tuscarawas County, shows that he was horn in Maryland in 1795, that he owned real estate valued at \$700. It is apparent that Israel dld not acquire much wealth; however, he left to his children the will to work. Soon after Israel's death, Mollie returned to Harrison County.

John Jr. was born in Maryland, probably in Frederick (now Carroll) County, in 1797 and migrated to Harrison County, Ohio, with his parents between 1800

and 1816. He was born in the afternoon and when the moon was full. His will was probated August 20, 1875 in Will Record B page 514, Logan County, Ohio, Jefferson County, Ohio, Vol. I, marriage records show that John Angel was married to Catherine Hendricks on April 17, 1822, by John Shorber, J.P. The 1830 census records of German Township, Harrison County, show John Angel with three children under 10 years of age: whereas the 1820 census for the state of the state o Green Township of this county record John Angel with three children between 16 and 26 years of age; therefore the latter record undoubtedly is of John Jr.'s father, and John Jr. is one of the children between 16 and 26 at home in 1820. (John Jr. was married two years later). The 1850 census for Harrison Township, Logan County, Ohio, show that John Jr. was born in Maryland, was 53 years of age and that his wife Harriet was born in Virginia and was 38 years old, indicating a second marriage. This is verified in Logan County Ohio, Marriage Record Book A, page 247, which shows that John Angel and Harriet Smith were married on June 27, 1844. Earl Smith gives the date as June 25, 1844. Marriage **Record** Book C contains the names of spouses of John's daughters as shown above. The years of birth above, where month and day are not indicated, were computed from U. S. Census records.

From information handed down by Hiram (4-6—Israel 3-2) his father Israel had a brother John, a small man, who came on horseback from Indiana to visit their home. Logan county is not far from the Indiana line. Also it was reported that John lived near Bellefontaine, Ohio, which is verified by the Logan County census records of 1840 and 1850. This then ties in John Sr., John Jr., and Israel as father and two sons. Furthermore, real estate transfers in Harrison County include a deed dated July 8, 1824, from John Angel Sr. and his wife Margaret, to John Angel Jr., recorded in Book C, page 431, it being the same land John Sr. acquired on May 22, 1816 from Leonard Kimmel. On June 18, 1833, John Jr. and Catherine executed two deeds in favor of James Anderson Jr. and James Anderson Sr. respectively. They were recorded in Deed Record Vol. F, pages 445 and 446, indicating that John Jr. moved to Logan County after June 1833.

From the above deed reference and 1840 census records of Logan County, it is evident that John Jr. moved from Harrison County between June 1833 and 1840; furthermore, at least three of his hovs were born in the latter county and quite probably all of Catherine's children. This is verified helow

The 1850 census show an appraised value of John's real estate as \$6320, indicating that he owned a very good farm and was a prosperous man of considerable means. Here his entire family is listed, and the records indicate that Harriet was born in Virginia and all the children in Ohio; John Jr. was shown to be a farmer; John III, a carpenter. Both 1860 and 1870 census records include his name and that of Harriet; his real estate in 1860 was appraised at \$15,000, and 1\$8,000 in 1870.

Otto Angel, grandson of John Jr. 3-3, remembers the home of his grandfather and states that is was a very fine house built of guarried stone. He reported that in 1946 during a visit with his cousins. Nancv Angel Ketchele and Frances C. Angel Kallam, in Toledo, Ohio, he was shown some excellent photographs of John and his stone house.

Otto stated that his aunt Ella (Angel Smith) told him that some of his father's people at one time lived near Harrisburg. Pennsvlvania. His mother, (Martha Conley Angel), told him that her brothers and sisters at one time lived in Pennsvlvania near New York state, but she did not know about the Angel family. He also thinks that the Hendricks and Smiths (families of the wives of John Ir. 3-3) migrated from Virginia to Pennsvlvania and from there to Ohio. He advised that John Jr. at one time sold out in Logan County, Ohio, and went to Iowa, but he soon returned to Logan County; also, that he lived in Indiana for a short time.

Eliza and William Millner had three children as follows: (1) Charles Millner, who married Nellie Rawson, had five children—Fay Millner, Roy Millner, Mahel Millner, Helen Millner, and Ora Millner; (2) James W. Millner, who married Lillian Apline had no children; (3) Arminaugh Millner, who married James Coen, had four children—W. O. Coen, Harry Coen, Bertie Coen, and Maud Coen. Maud Coen married Ora Dow and has given considerable assistance to Otto Angel (5-55) in compiling data on the family of her great-grandfather. John Angel Jr. (3-3).

Mary Angel and Robert McCoid had two children: (1) Belle McCoid, who married Henry Arnold; and (2) Lena McCoid, who married Everet Wickersham.

Ellen Angel and Thomas A. Smith (a tailor of Bellefontaine, Ohio), were married Aug. 7, 1862, and had two children: David E. Smith, born Apr. 11, 1863; and Harriet Jane Smith born Feb. 4, 1867 (not married). David E .Smith married Elizabeth Burns on April 15, 1882, and had four children; Edna Smith, born June 6, 1883; Thomas "Earl" Smith, born July 16, 1888; Harry Smith, born July 16, 1890; and Helen Smith, born May 1, 1896.

Katherine Angel and William Hartzler were married May 14, 1865, and had a son, Harry Hartzler (deceased), whose family live in Chicago. Thomas Earl Smith stated in a letter, that there were two sons: Carl Hartzler and William Hartzler Jr., and a daughter now residing in Roseland, Illinois. Harry may be the first or middle name of either Carl or William, Jr. This name also has been given as Hartzell.

Thomas "Earl" Smith supplied a considerable amount of data on this family, and all the data on the family of Ellen Angel and Thomas Smith. He lives in Ellicottville, New York. Thanks, Earl. NOTE: The writer is greatly indebted to Gerald Karr Smith, secretary of

Charles probably was born in Maryland and migrated to Ohio with his family. There is little information available about Charles and Eye. They

family. There is little information available about Charles and Eve. They were married in Harrison County, Ohio, by John Wagner, J.P. The marriage record shows Eve's name as Muntz or, may be. Murtz. Census records of Maryland and Ohio, for 1820, do not list Charles, but the record of Green Township, Harrison County, Ohio, for 1830, list Eve as head of the family, show her age to be between 20 and 30, that she had two girls under 5 years of age, one boy and two girls between ages 5 and 10. With two children under five years of age, in 1830, Charles must have died some time between 1827 and 1830. If Eve was between age 20 and 30 at this time, she was born between 1800 and 1810, probably about 1805. Harrison County, Ohio. Court of Common Pleas records of November 12, 1833, show legal action by Eva Angel vs. Rachael Angel, Jonn Angel, Mary Ann Angel, and Caroline Angel, relative to dower interests. These defendants un-doubtedly are her children. Apparently Charles died without leaving a will; con-sequently, the estate had to be settled in court. Other records show that the estate was administered by Jacob Riggle, a brother-in-law of Charles, and John Angel, probably his faher.

George Sr. was born in Maryland in 1792 or 1793, according to census records of 1850, 1860, and 1870, of Carroll (formerly Frederick County, Maryland, and at that time he lived in Election District No. 1 (Taneytown). The 1850 records also show that his wife, Catherine, was 48 years of age and born in Maryland, where their children were born. All ages were given in these records, which also show that George owned real estate appraised at \$3400, and that the name Angel was spelled both with one "!" and with two. Names of the members of this family, and of the brothers and sisters of George, including their husbands and wives, were included in information supplied by Margaret C. Adams (daughter of George) and her daughter M. Naomi Adams (--b. Oct. 8, 1883), who married Franklin J. W. Horich (--b. Apr. 8, 1880). Margaret and Naomi lived in Waynesboro, Pennsylvania, and later in Camp Mill, Pennsylvania, where Margaret died at the age of 95. Franklin held a prominent position with the Pennsylvania Department of Highways, in Harrisburg, for many years. He and Naomi were married August 22, 1931. War Department Records Branch, Old Records Section, United States Archives, Washington, District of Columbia, show that John received a land grant for military service in the War of 1812. The application, dated April 17, 1871, states that he was 81 years of age, a resident of Harney, Maryland, served as a private in Cantain Louis Weaver's Company of Maryland Malitia in the war with Great Britain, was drafted on September 4, 1814, for thirty days, and was honorably discharged on September 20, 1814. His cousin John, 3-18, served in the same unit during the same period of time. According to the above military record, John was born in 1790; whereas from the 1850 census records we compute his date of birth as 1798. The latter is more likely to be correct for the reason that at the age 52 he would be less likely to make an error than at 81; however, it is possible that the census records are incorrect. All records found spell name with one "I".

Ann Eliza, born in 1834, was interviewed by the writer in 1927. She then was 93 years of age and related some facts about her family. She was a slender woman and unusually spry for her age. Her daughter, Mrs. Grant Boone, supplemented the information given by Eliza, and referred the writer to other members of the family for further information.

Samuel Washington Angel served in the Union Army during the Civil War and was killed in action a short time before the end of hostilities.

Susan Buffington had a sister Catherine married to George Garner, a sister Lizzie married to \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ Hendricks, and a brother David Buffington. After the death of Catherine and \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ Hendicks, Lizzie married George Garner. David Buffington married Susan Angel, 2–3. The United States census records of 1850 and 1860 for Carroll (formerly a part of Frederick) County, Maryland, include the ages of these people, thereby indicating the years of their births, show that all are natives of Maryland, and that John was a farmer. The genealogy of the Buffington family is in preparation by Jesse H. Garner, 625 Kalsey Ave., Cameron, Mo.

Lizzie Birely, daughter of Susan Louise Angel and Thomas Birely, has been exceedingly cooperative and supplied complete data on the descendants of her grandfather (John), the names of his brothers and sisters, and those of his father (Michael Sr.); also, she furnished much information that served as a check on other branches of the family and as a tie-in between these branches. Thanks, cousin Lizzie.

Hannah Angell married John Feeser (-b. Oct. 28, 1823, -d. May 26, 1902.) on January 20, 1846, (license dated Jan. 12) in Carroll County, Maryland. Hannah and John had a daughter, Martha Ellen Feeser (-b. Sep. II, 1848, -d. Apr. 17, 1920), who married Jacob M. Birely (-b. June 9, 1844, -d. Apr. 20, 1914), on January 4, 1866.

Martha Ellen and Jacob had a daughter, Daisy Alice Birely (--b. Aug. 14, 1871, --d. Feb. 21, 1947), who married Robert A. Kemp (--b. Feb. 10, 1865, --d. Mar. 4, 1942,) on April 27, 1892.

Daisy Alice and Robert had a daughter, Martha Almira Kemp (--b. Aug. 5, 1897), who married William R. Slemmer (--b. June 4, 1891), on August 14, 1920.

Martha Almira and William had a son, William R. Slemmer Jr. (--b. May 19, 1921), who married Carol Kathleen Steppe (--b. Aug. 16, 1922.) on September 12, 1943. This couple has a son, William Raimond Slemmer III, born August 8, 1944. These excellent facts were supplied by Martha Kemp Slemmer.

M. Naomi Adams Horich advised that Michael Jr. is a brother of her grandfather (George Angel) and that he married Eliza Shriner. Lizzie Birely and J. Albert Angell also identified Michael Jr. Census records for 1830 show Michael as residing in Election District No. 6 (Manchester), Frederick County, Maryland, and having one daughter under 5 years of age, one son and one daughter between 5 and 10, and he and his wife between 20 and 30; which would indicate that he probably was born between 1800 and 1810. The 1840 census shows him living in District No. 10 (Taneytown), with two sons under 5 years of age, two daughters between 10 and 15, one son between 15 and 20, he between 40 and 50, and his wife between 30 and 40. From this it would appear that he

was born about 1802. Thomas, 4-46, is shown in the 1860 census with Ephriam 4-62 as being 22 years of age; therefore, it is assumed they are brothers.

It therefore is not probable that he served in the War of 1812.

Archives records of the Adjutant Generals Department include an Abraham Angel who enlisted July 20, 1814, at Milford, New Jersey in Captain Reynold's Company, 27th Infantry, and continues on the rolls to August 31, 1815, in Captain Bliss' Company, 6th Infantry, and shows that he was born in Sparta, New Jersey. Altho it is the writer's opinion that Abraham was born in Maryland, there is no proof, and the above could be Abraham 3-14.

Census records of 1830 for Frederick County, Maryland, show a Jacob Angle living in Election District No. 6, who probably is Jacob 3-15. This record shows a boy and a girl under 5 years of age, another girl 10 to 15, and Jacob as being between 20 and 30. The 1840 census for Carroll County, Maryland (Carroll formed from a part of Frederick County in 1836), District No. 1, show him as having one girl under 5 years old, one boy and two girls between 5 and 10, one boy between 10 and 15 and another between 15 and 20; Jacob as between 30 and 40, and his wife between 40 and 50. A study of the above data would indicate that he was born about 1802.

Mr. Francis B. Sappington Jr., great grandson of Jacob, has supplied data on this branch of the family including dates of birth and death, names of Jacob's wife and her parents. It will be noted that Jacob was born in 1804, and the estimate given in the paragraph above is 1802, which would indicate that the system of estimating used by the writer is reasonably correct. Mary Cox Angell was the daughter of Leonard and Elizabeth Cox.

J. Albert Angell of Taneytown supplied most of the family's names in 1927

J. Albert Angell of Taneytown supplied most of the family's names in 1927 and advised the writer that the spelling of the family name varied in different branches of the family, both the single and double "!" being in use. He said Joseph was the youngest of Michael Sr.'s children and when twelve years of age Joseph lost his father as the result of being badly stung by yellow-jackets. He gave the names of Joseph's brothers and sisters as George, John, Jacob (went to W. Va.), Michael, Polly (Baumgartner), and Julia; also that Sallie Harner Angell's brothers and sisters were Samuel, Joavid, James, Abra-ham, Eliza, Anna, and Hettie. Hiram was born on a farm on McGuire's Creek near New Rumley in Hiram was born on a farm on McGuire's Creek near New Rumley in Harrison (now Carroll) County, Ohio. In 1837 his family moved to Tuscarawas County, Jefferson Township, near the village of Philipsburg, now Stonecreek, Ohio. Hiram, then a lad of eleven, accompanied his parents; however, his mother had died before he left his former home, and in 1850 the census records show that he with his brother Joseph and sister Barbara Ann were living with the family of Jacob Roser, an uncle by marriage. On April 19, 1845, Hiram was confirmed by The Reverend D. Sparks, in the Philipsburg Evangelical Lutheran Church, built in 1840 on the hill one half mile north of Philipsburg, and remained a member of the congregation until his death. He married Caroline Hahn, daughter of Jacob Hahn and Elizabeth Ritter, an active member of the German Reformed Church.

Hiram and Caroline commenced houskeeping on the Toland farm on Oldtown Valley in Tuscarawas County, on a side road past the old Bill Angel (Aunt Cass Angel) farm on the Oldtown Valley Road about four or five miles from Stonecreek. They later lived on the John Meese farm on the same sideroad, but two farms nearer to the main road. Rosetta, their first child, was born at the

former place, and Elizabeth, Nancy, and Mary at the latter. About April 1860, Hiram bought the Hoffman or Ridgway farm, of 100 acres, about two and a half miles northwest of Stonecreck, where the other children were born and the family grew to manhood and womanhood. Here the children received their training and were educated in the one-room school standing adjacent to the farm, later known as the Angel School. Hiram was a

standing adjacent to the farm, later known as the Angel School. Hiram was a hard worker, as were his children; consequently their farm was well kept and productive. He belonged to the Republican Party and was elected to serve as Justice of the Peace in 1876, in which capacity he served until 1881. On February 5, 1889, Hiram moved to the village of Stonecreek to retire, and built a hone on a lot acquired from Dan Wherley across the street from the English Lutheran and German Reformed Church, where both he and Caroline attended. Not contented with a garden, Hiram always kept a horse and mode alwest delity tring back to the home form or to auchers pace Bearsenille, in made almost daily trips back to the home farm or to another near Ragersville, in which he owned a half interest, with the writer's father. He lived in Stonecreek until his death and Caroline remained there several years thereafter. When she became too feehle to live alone, she went to her daughter Elizabeth in New Philadelphia, where she died. Both Hiram and Caroline are buried in the Stonecreek Cemetery.

The writer, as a boy, spent many days with Hiram going back and forth from the farms and working with him, and profited greatly by this association. He was a man of fine character, a strict disciplinarian, but sympathetic when the occasion required. He once went to the county seat to transact business at the bank and the cashier counted out a number of bills and shoved them across the counter to Hiram, who counted them deliberately, then turned to the banker and said "Mr. \_\_\_\_\_\_you made a mistake". The cashier replied "I don't make mistakes". Hiram said, "Yes I know-but you made one." The banker cursed and said, "I tell you I don't make mistakes", to which Hiram replied, "Yes, but you made one this time. You gave me a hundred dollars too much." (Cashier's reply censored).

Caroline was a tiny woman, extremely active, and was known by all her friends and many relatives as Aunt Caroline. She was a very sympathetic person and always gave a helping hand when neighbors were in difficulties. Her cooking was known throughout the county and her dinner table seldom was without extra plates. Both the German Reformed and the Evangelical Lutheran ministers were frequent Sunday guests, as were many friends and relatives. The writer had many a "drumstick" from her table. John was the youngest son of Israel and Annie, and probably was born on McGuire's Creek near New Rumley, Harrison County, Ohio, on a farm Israel acquired from his father on November 25, 1822. Israel sold a farm in this county on December 5, 1833, because of financial difficulties. It is not likely that Israel moved to Tuscarawas County before this time;

It is not likely that Israel moved to Tuscarawas County before this time; consequently it is believed that John was born in Harrison County. Roy Angel, grand-son of John, advised that "The old folks and John was born the night the stars fell." Israel's note-book records John's birth as being in 1833 and has an entry "December", which later was corrected to read "November", either 11 or 13, it being difficult to determine which is meant. The writer communicated with the staff of the United States Naval Observatory, Washington, D. C., and was told that the meteor shower of 1833 occurred from November 12 to 14. From this information it would appear that November 13 erebable is the correct dute of his birth probably is the correct date of his birth.

John's carly days were spent on a farm near the village of Philipsburg, Ohio (see Israel 3-2), where he learned to be a farmer and became proficient at blacksmithing. He worked at this trade for some time at Germano, near his birthplace. but the glow of the forge was too severe for his already weakened eyes; therefore, he discontinued working at his trade. Being a lover of horses, John trained himself as a veterinarian (horse doctor, in those days) and was frequently called by neighborhood farmers. After their marriage, John and Isabelle migrated to Indiana where John

again returned to farming. An amusing story is told about their trip west on the train. John owned a highly prized squirrel rifle, which he was carrying along as luggage. During the long trip he became restless, so entrusting the precious rifle to Isabelle, he walked back through the coaches to talk with some of the passengers but he remained away longer than his bride thought he had intended. Becoming somewhat alarmed, but remembering her promise to care for the rifle, she started back through the train, rifle in hand, and with anxiety in her countenance, when she was stopped by a trainman, who asked where she was going. Becoming irritated by the interference she replied sharply, "I'm looking for my husband". It required a bit of explaining on her part before she convinced the conductor that her intentions were peaceful. To many of the family Isabelle was known as "Aunt Eby".

John was an ardent Union man and living near the Kentucky-Indiana border, after the Civil War, he frequently became involved in serious discussions with the Kentuckians; consequently, he soon returned to Tuscarawas County. Ohio, and bought a farm on Frys Valley, now owned by his grandson. His low crowned black hat and chin whiskers proclaimed his affiliation with the Dunkard Church, and his verbosity on Election Day proved why it was desirable for him to return to Ohio from the Kentucky horder in the early post-war days. Uncle John's black hat is one of the writer's lingering memories of his boyhood days. John was an impressive man of most excellent reputation and it was

a pleasure to know him. Donald B. Angel and his father supplied much data on this family. Thanks, D. B.

The census records of 1860 for Martin County, Indiana include John and Isabelle in Lost River Township, Halbert Bluffs Postoffice, and show that John was a farmer, had real estate appraised at \$600 and had two children; that Mary E, was born in Ohio, and John Jr., age six months, was born in Indiana; date of census is August 20, 1860. His record was not found in this state in 1870, and it is reported that this family returned to Ohio about 1864. Other members of the Angel family lived in Indiana about the same time; including John's sister, Barbara Ann Heckler, and his brother Joseph. John's daughter Ellen and Charles Shoop had three children: Edith Shoop

Israel Jr. was the eldest son of Israel Sr. and his second wife, Mollie. He was born in Jefferson Township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio, about one mile from the village of Stonecreek (then Philipsburg), on the road then leading past the brick yard to Oldtown Valley. During his boyhood Israel Jr. moved to Jewett, Ohio, and later to Steubenville, Ohio, where he was a member of Zion Lutheran Church. Anna was the daughter of David Ryder and Elizabeth Holseapple.

Israel Jr. served in the Union Army during the Civil War as a private in Company G, 51st Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry, having enlisted at the age of eighteen at Canal Dover, Ohio, on September 19, 1861, for a period of three years. On December 31, 1863, he was mustered in by reason of re-enlistment as a Veteran Volunteer. He was again mustered in on January 11, 1864, in his former unit, at Shell Mound, Tennessee. The latter report shows that he was a farmer, had brown eyes, dark hair, dark complexion, and was five feet six inches tall. On September 30, 1864, he had a six-day pass to permit him to visit his brother (Henry) who was in the general hospital at Chattanooga, as a result of having his arm shot off by a cannon ball. On May 15, 1865, he was given a thirty-day furlough to visit his mother, who was sick and had no one to care for her. The request stated "He has always been a good and faithful soldier". The last record found is that for a furlough dated June 7, 1865. He probably served in all the battles in which his company took part, a total of seventeen. His army records are in the War Department Records Branch, Old Records Section, Archives Building, Washington, D. C. He was a member of Stanton Post, Grand Army of the Republic.

Henry was the youngest son of Israel Angel and Mollie Stonebrook and was born in Jefferson Township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio, about a mile east of the Village of Stonecreek, on the road past the brick works to Oldtown Valley.

Henry and Margaret Elizabeth lived in Germano, Harrison County, until about 1884, when they moved to Oldtown Valley and later to New Philadelphia, where both died and are buried.

Information secured from the War Department Records Branch, Old Records Information secured from the War Department Records Branch, Old Records Section in the Archives Building, Washington, shows that Henry served in the Union Army during the Civil War. He enlisted at Port Washington, Ohio, Feb. 18, 1864, for three years, was a farmer, had hazel eyes, dark hair, light complexion, and was five feet six inches tall. A hospital card shows that he was single, age 20, native of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, a private in Company G, 51st Ohio infantry; that he was admitted to the hospital November 9, 1864, G. Sist Onio infantry; that he was admitted to the hospital November 9, loog, and had his right arm amputated because of a cannon ball wound received at Lovejoy Station, Georgia (in Israel's records it is given as the Battle of Jones-boro), on September 2, 1864. He was given a Disability Discharge June 30, 1865. He probably was in eight battles before receiving his wound. Jesse is buried in East Avenue Cemetery, New Philadelphia, Ohio.

Margaret Elizabeth, Henry's wife, was a relative of the Lowmillers who married Henry's sisters, Catherine and Elizabeth, but was not of the same family. Her brothers and sisters were: Alphines, -b. 1837; David, -b. 1838; Joshua, --b. 1840; Sarah Ellen, -b. 1843; Mary, -b. 1844; Andrew, --b. 1847; John Henry, --b. 1851, and are recorded in Margaret's Family Bible.

William Schaad was born near Marshallville, Wayne County, Ohio, where his family settled upon arrival in this country. William was the son of John Melchoir Schaad and Elizabeth Surbeck. Elizabeth was born March 7, 1818, in Oberhallau, Schaufhausen, Switzerland, which also was the birthplace of her husband. Their children were Frederick, John Melchoir, John Conrad, Elizabeth, Anna Louisa, and William. All except William were born in the same place as their mother.

Nancy, a slight, kindly woman, was born on Oldtown Valley, Tuscarawas County, Ohio, and later moved with her parents to a farm about two and a half miles northwest of the Village of Stonecreck (then Philipsburg) where she learned the requirements of a good and useful housewife. Prior to her marriage she worked in New Philadelphia, Ohio, where she again resided after her husband retired. Although a rather frail woman, she lived to be seventy-eight years of age and was buried in the city where she last resided.

Daniel was the son of Peter Gruber Jr. and Catherine Stegner, and the grandson of Peter Sr. and Barbara, all horn in Prussia, except Catherine, who was a Bavarian. H. Zink, of the German Reformed Church. Here both held membership for many years, and where their children were baptized and attended services.

Mary was born on the former John Meese farm on Oldtown Valley, about five miles east of Stonecrcek, but spent her girlhood on a farm her father acquired about two and a half miles northwest of this village. Like her sisters, she learned early in life how to cook and perform household duties under the strict supervision of her mother, who insisted on the best. In the prime of his life he was killed at a railcoad crossing, in Baltic, Ohio, while driving home from town with a friend. Katherine was the daughter of Janna (Jennic) Hahn (sister of Caroline Angel) and Peter Tasch, both horn in Germany and came to America with the Hahn family about 1852. See Hiram Angel, 4-6, in Part I. Jennie wanted to migrate with the family but did not want to leave her boy friend; consequently her father, Jacob Hahn Sr., solved the problem by paying the passage for young Peter. Later Jennie and Peter were married and lived at Dresden, Ohio, where Katherine was horn and where her mother died and was buried. Katherine

There are Elizabeth C. and Elizabeth, half sisters, in this family. The parents of these children lived in Weirbach by Fishbach Trier, Rhenish Prussia, Germany. Presumably they are buried in Germany and it is believed that the children were born there. The Ritter family is believed to have owned the Ritterburg Castle in Germany, according to information from Mary Angel Gruber, granddaughter of Elizabeth C. Ritter, 3-DI. . . . Ritter was married twice and there were children by both wives. It is not known which wife was the mother of the last two children listed. John Adam Becker, 5-D76, of Independence, Missouri, wrote the following in a letter dated October 23, 1936: "The post office address of the Ritters, Hahns, Yosts, and Millers was Weirtach by Fishbach, Rhenish Prussia, Germany. I visited the town in 1907 and met representatives of each of the families. I was there but two days and made

and met representatives of each of the families. I was there but two days and made no effort to trace the ancestry of anyone. I was primarily interested in visiting the old home of my mother.

#### FOURTH GENERATION

This family came to Ohio about 1852, from Weirbach by Fishbach, Rhine Inis family came to Onio about 1932, from Weiroach by Pisnoach, Rhine Province, Germany, where Jacob Sr. was a blacksmith and operated a ten-acre farm. Jacob Jr. came to this country first in order to avoid military service; however, after being away from his family for some time be became homesick and requested that someone from his home join him in this country. Everyone had some excuse for not making the trip and when it appeared as though the request would not be granted, Caroline, a tiny eighteen year old sister said "I'll go." In 1850 she, Caroline Ritter (later Mrs. Peter Goettge), and a Jewish boy by the name of Hanibal, all from the same town, made the trip to see Jacob Jr. Their reports of this country were so good that two years later Jacob Sr. sold out in Germany and migrated to America.

Jacob Sr. settled on upper Oldtown Valley in Tuscarawas County, Ohio, about two miles east of the village of Philipsburg, now Stonecreek, on a tract of land later known as the John Goehler farm and now owned by Lewis Buehler. Elizabeth died about two years after they came to America, and is buried in the Stonecreek Cemetery. She had a fair complexion, light blue eyes, and an abundance of black hair. The 1860 census for Tuscarawas County show that Jacob Hahn, age 62, born in Germany, lived with the family of Hiram Angel, Jacob's son-in-law. Jacob is buried with his wife in the Stonecreek Cemetery. Elizabeth C. had a half sister also named Elizabeth, who married Johann Miller.

Most of the information on this family was supplied by Mary Angel Gruber, granddaughter of Elizabeth C. Ritter, and daughter of Caroline Hahn. See tabulation 4-6 of Part I.

# APPENDIX

#### ANGEL FAMILY INFORMATION

Relative to my grandfather, Israel Angel, his parents, brothers and sisters as received from my father, Hiram Angel, son of Israel.

Father (Hiram) as a child recalled an uncle John, whom he thought lived in Indiana, and who used to come on horsehack to visit Israel; also, there was an uncle Andrew, who likely remained in Maryland. John also was believed to have moved to near Bellefontaine, Ohio, at one time. Sister Rosetta used to say there was an uncle George who went to one of the southern states, some folks thought Georgia.

Israel is supposed to have been born in Maryland, near Cumberland. Father often said he understood that there now is a large city on the farm formerly owned by his forefathers, which we always thought as being in Maryland and probably his grandfather's.

He also told us that an uncle drowned in the Tuscarawas River opposite the south side of New Philadelphia. He was trying to fasten a bell to a cow, got tangled in the rope and was dragged into the river. I am not certain whether this uncle was from the Angel or Harner side of the family, but I am of the opinion he was from the Angel family.

Israel's first wife was Annie Harner, but always was called Nancy. Her family came to Ohio before it was a state.

In the Cleveland library I read about Israel Angel, Charles Angel, and Sarah Schaffer, who later married a Markley.

#### Relative to the children of Israel and their families.

Israel's first wife was Annie Harner, by whom there were the following children: Margaret, Mary Magdalene, Catherine, Joseph, Hiram, William, Barbara Ann, and John. The second wife was Mollie Stonebrook, whose children were Susan, Elizabeth, Mary, Israel, Henry, and Maria.

The wife of John was named Julian (from her tombstone) and was known as aunt Eby. Both team and Barbara Ann (Heckler) lived in Shelby, Indiana, during the Civit Witt, Margaret (Peggy) married Jacob Roser by whom she had the following children: William, Susan, Nancy, and Samuel. They married Esther Overholtz, William Brewer, \_\_\_\_\_ Graham, and Emma Maurer, respectively.

Mary Magdalene (called Polly) married Adam Snyder by whom she had the following children: John, Hiram (who became an oil prospector), Sam. Tillie (or Matilda), Marie, Joe, and Charles.

Catherine married John Lowmiller by whom she had the following children: Tillness, Meulenburg, Elias, Sanford, Nancy, Ratia, Abby, and Amos.

Barbara Ann married Daniel Heckler by whom she had the following children: Benjamin, Catherine (married Andrew Hawk), Margaret (married William Lenhart), Marie (married Bob Clutz), Danny (died young), and John (died young). This family lived in Shelby, Indiana, during the Civil War. Daniel served in the Union Army and died from drinking poisoned water.

Joe's wife was a Getzman, Henry married Margaret Lowmiller, Maria and Susan were not married and both are buried in the Stonecreek, Ohio, Cemetery, Susan having been the first to be buried there.

Israel also was buried in the Stonecreek Cemetery in the southeasterly section of the original portion, and his grave is marked with a flat stone of the type generally in use at that time. Adam Angel, son of Joseph. told me that Mr. Custer of New Philadelphia had a farm in Illinois and that we have cousins there.

Elizabeth married William Lowmiller, Mary's husband's name was Dinger. William married Catherine Mccse, Joseph was older than Hiram, Israel Jr. and Henry served in the Civil War. Israel's first wife, Annie Harner, had a brother Joseph and a sister Katie. Joseph was a very old man when he died.

Hiram and John at one time visited their birthplace on McGuire's Creek in Harrison County, Ohio, near New Rumley.

Hiram was confirmed Apr. 19, 1845, by Rev. Sparks, in the Lutheran Church on the hill at the cemetery north of Philipsburg (now Stonecreek), Ohio, He married Caroline Hahn, who came to Tuscarawas County, Ohio, from Germany. Her family also came to this country and lived on the Goehler farm on Oldtown Valley; at the foot of the hill across from the Burrier farm, on the road leading from the southerly end of Stonecreek village to Oldtown Valley. Her mother lived only two years after coming to America. Her brother Jacob settled in Nebraska and lived to be over 90 years old. Most of his family later went to Washington state.

Israel left a small note-book in which are recorded the dates of birth of each of his children, his birth and marriage dates, and other information. This book at the death of my father, Hiram, was given to my brother Charles, and upon his death it was given to me by his widow, Ellen. I, in turn, gave it to my son Walter W. Gruber Sr., hoping it may be preserved for those who find it of interest.

Israel, in his later days, lived on what was known as the Adam Regula place on the road leading from Philipsburg, past the brick works, to Oldtown Valley, it being the third farm past the railroad. Hiram probably was no longer at home when Israel lived there. Hiram, William, and Barbara Ann kept house together for some time before either of them was married. Where, is not known.

#### Relative to the Hiram Angel family.

Rosetta was born on Oldtown Valley on the Talan or Tolan farm, which is on a side road past the John Meese farm about four or five miles from the village of Stonecreek and off the Oldtown Valley road toward New Philadelphia. This side road is to the cast of the main road past the Bill Angel (aunt Cass Angel) farm, the Meese place being the third farm from the main road and the Talan farm a short distance farther. Elizabeth, Nancy, and I were born on the Meese farm.

When I was six months old the family moved to the Hoffman, and later the Ridgeway farm, two and a half miles northwest of Phillipsburg, which father bought and where the family was raised. It now belongs to Howard Angel, grandson of my uncle William.

#### MEMO TO MY SUCCESSOR

I hoped that in the future some of our descendants will be interested in the genealogy of the Angel family and from time to time revise these records. If I may, I would like to say just a few words to those who may find time to take up the work where I leave off.

The way of the genealogist usually is not casy, in fact, it is tough even with good support from others in the family. You will write many letters and get few replies and still fewer helpers, information given in good faith may be in error and you will find that the bulk of the work must be done by yourself. If you are fortunate, as I have been, the burden will be lighter; but you will spend hours in searching and trying to fit together the blocks of the jig saw puzzle; because, you alone know just what to look for and where a morsel of information may fit.

The records here submitted have been worked out the hard way, and I trust that these few remarks may be of help to some one in the future. The first work to be done is to compile all available data into a chart or other suitable form. This may be in the form of charts of several branches of the family with no connecting links. Some may belong to another family, but you must search for the connecting data and bit by bit join the fragments together into a larger chart. Do not discard anything until the entire job is completed, likewise, during your search take all data that could possibly apply to your work. Go in with au open mind and do not jump at conclusions.

In order to get the information you need from other members of the family and their friends, several interviews may be necessary from time to time as the work progresses, and new facts bring up new questions. If you can get to Washington, the United States Census Records may contain much information for you. These records, however, are not made available until they are over fifty years old and, unless you know definitely where your party lived at the time the census records were compiled, you may spend considerable time searching. During the past few years the writer searched, page by page and line by line, more than one hundred census books, varying in volume from five hundred to twelve hundred pages each. Census records, commencing with the year 1850, list each member of a family and indicate his or her age and place of birth; however, prior to that time, only the name of the head of a family was recorded, followed by the number of male and female members within certain age brackets.

Other sources of information are records of wills, marriage licenses, deeds, court proceedings, etc.; also church records, tombstones, histories of towns, counties, states, and records in state or national archives. A very desirable procedure is to follow the work on the preliminary chart with the census records search, then other records and further interviews and correspondence. The analysis of data at frequent intervals saves much extra search work.

It is hoped that someone who has the time and means, some day will trace our forefathers back to Europe. As stated elsewhere, it appears that Charles Sr. 1-1 or his ancestors came from Germany.

Pennsylvania German Pioneers by Ralph Strausburger, 1934, on pages 335 to 338 in Lists 97A, 97B, and 97C, shows that one Carl Angel age 20 (also shown as Carl Philips and Carl Philip), was imported from the Palatinas in the ship Loyal Judith, with James Cowey as master, sailing from Rotterdam, and that Carl took the oath of qualification to the Government on September 2, 1734. This man may or may not be our Charles Sr. or his father; however, if either, he probably was the latter. Also Charles Sr. or his father may have entered this country under the name of Engel or Engel; even Engle is possible and all names should be born in mind in making a search.

#### NOTES ON THE INDEX

The numbers used in the index are the family tabulation codes, which may be compared to paragraph numbers. These codes, in Part II, carry a capital letter prefix to the part after the hyphen; consequently it can readily be determined whether your reference is to l'art I or Part II. The number preceding the hyphen designates the generation; which may easily be located by rapidly turning the pages, or by the method outlined under Suggestion for Using Part II, in the introduction. The family number, the part of the code after the hyphen, may then be traced with ease, if you remember that they appear in numerical order under each generation. For name of spouse of a member of the Angel family, search the general index.

Information may be found in both the family tabulations of the parents and their children. For index entries such as Harner family 3-2, or Gribble family Section B1, it will be necessary to search an entire family tabulation or an entire section of several pages. An entry such as Fox, Charles etal. 7-B5, indicates that other members of the Fox family are mentioned in the paragraph.

It is recommended that you read carefully the page under the heading "Suggestions For Using Part II", in the Introduction, and that you use the Index to Family Tabulations immediately after it.
