PREFACE

This booklet was started at first to include only my mother's family, but others as well as myself became interested, and it now includes many branches. The object is to save the story of the older Bonhams, who are fast leaving us. A few years hence and these stories could not be obtained. Some of the older ones have already died during the two years taken in making this collection. Others have not answered letters of inquiries, but every Bonham name obtainable was requested to write. Some letters have not been used because the same information had been furnished by an older member of the same family.

No attempt was made to write a book on the Bonham family and no statement was given out to that effect. Possibly these collections may be the means of starting someone to write a book on the family. Several have reported that their Bonham parent had intended to write a family book, but in no case did they complete the task. The leiters herein have been rewritten several times in order to have them correct and to include as much Bonham information as possible.

Quotations from books concerning the Bonhams are given only on the authority of the book. Note the year the book was printed. The tradition in the family is quite uniform, and it is only necessary to read to get the facts as to the origin of the Bonhams.

It was impossible for the writer to bring each family up to date, but each one can add a page containing their record. The collecting of this information has shown that many families do not keep any regular record. Additional information, particularly of the older Bonhams, is requested by the writer.

Many of the living only think of to-day. Pray, think of yesterday--of the dead and their pioneer hardships, their religious character and persecutions, and give those of to-morrow--the future generations--the origin of the Bonham character upon which to build.

If this collection should be the means of saving the story of the older Bonhams, then it will have accomplished its object.

M. L. Bonham, Anderson, S. C., writes:

Tradition has it that three brothers named Bonham came from England to Virginia early in the 17th Century, about 1636. But the first of our ancestors of whom we have any authentic information is Nicholas Bonham, who came from Barnstable, Mass., about the year 1679, and with others settled the hamlet of Bonhamton, N. J. He married in Mass. Hannah Fuller, a descendent of one of the Pilgrims. From them was descended Absalom, Bonham, who was born at Bonhamton in the year 1739. At the beginning of the Revo-lution Absalom, who had married Jemima Harker was living at Frederick City, Md. but he enlisted from New Jersey and became Brevet-Major in the Establishment of that State. Absalom and his wife Jemima Harker had: Elizabeth, Malachi and James. Elizabeth married Mr. Dorsey of Baltimore, and their descendants are still in that city." Malachi went west soon after the Revolutionary War, and his subsequent history is unknown. James moved to S. C. some years after the Revolution and settled in <u>Colleton District</u>, where he married Hannah Witsell, had: John and Ann. After the death of his wife he moved to. Edgefield District and settled near Red Bank Church in that section, which is now cut off and formed into Saluda County. He married about the year 1795, Sophie Smith, daughter of Capt. Jacob Smith and his wife Sallie Butler, sister of Capt. Jas. Butler, progenitor of the Butler family in South Carolina, To this union of James Bonham and Sophie Smith, were born Sarah, who married Col. John Lipscombe, Simeon, who married Miss Wardlaw of Abbeville, S. C.; he moved to Alabama where he died; Jacob, who died at the age of four years; Malachi, who married Martha Ford of Colleton, S. C., moved to Alabama and then to Texas where he died in 1861; Elizabeth, who died at the age of eighteen, unmarried; James, who was killed at the seige of the Alamo, in the war for Texan independence; he was pever married: Julia, who married Dr. Bowie, of Abbeville, S. C., who moved to Alabama: Milledge Luke, the youngest child, was born Dec. 25, 1813, within a mile of the site of Saluda Court House, S. C., which was then a part of Edgefield District. He married Nov. 13, 1845, Ann Patience Griffin, daughter of Col. Nathan L. Griffin, a distinguished lawyer of Edgefield, S. C., and his wife Nancy Butler. To this marriage were born Sallie Butler, who died at the age of sixteen; Richard Griffin, who died at the age of thirty-eight, unmarried; he was at the time of his death Solicitor of the fifth judicial circuit of S. C., Sophie Smith, who married Col. Robert Aldrich of Barnwell, S. C., who is now judge of the second judicial circuit: James, who died at the age of thirty-two, unmarried; he was prominent as an educator and lawyer: Milledge Lipscombe, who married Daisy, daughter of Judge Alfred P. Aldrich of Barnwell, S. C. He was Adjutant General of S. C., and is a lawyer at Ander-son, S. C. Annie Elizabeth, who resides in Columbia, S. C.; Julia Ellen, who married Dr. Geo, E. T. Sparkman of Georgetown, S. C., she died in 1906; William Butler, who married Dr. George Construction of the start of the the start of the the start of the star Marie Graves of Orange Co., Va. He was a lieutenant in the U. S. Army, serving with distinction in the Phillipines, and died in 1903: Thomas Seymour, residing in Manilla: Patience, who married Gadsden E. Shand, a leading architect, of Columbia, S. C.,: and Frank Pickens, now in California."

R. C. Bouham, Concord, Tenn., writes: There was a Bonham who lived in or near the Shenandoah valley, Va., during 1861-5, who had a daughter Emma. A Federal officer, a beau of hers, and another officer, on a visit at her father's house were attacked by six of Mosby's men. It was a hot fight and the Mosbys lost two killed and two wounded. I heard of the incident of Miss Emma and the federal officer as rc-ported from a camp fire of the G. A. R., but I do not remember where now. I want to hear from that section very much, but I do not know any address that would aid me.

Mosby's Rangers, Williamson, 1896, page 361. When Eastham and Bolling reached the top of a hill, in view of the resi-dence of Col. Spurring their horses, they galloped on, but before they reached the gate, which led to the stable, they heard a pistol shot and saw Charles Wiltshire fall. He was at the stable door with his pistol pointed in the door. Then several shots were fired in rapid succession, and as they went through the gate they met Gill and Orrick, both of whom were wounded. Ferris had come out from the stable, and unharmed by the shots of Eastham and Bolling, secured Wiltshire's pistol and mounted Wiltshire's horse while his orderly, in obed-ience to his command. mounted, and leading Ferris's horse, the two started for the gate. By this time Bolling also was wounded, but he with Fastham started to follow the retreating Federals. In the road Bolling siezed the orderly and pulled him from his horse. Ferris turned on Eastham, who fired, inflicting a slight wound and then raised his pistol to knock him from his horse, but Ferris avoided the blow and set off in the direction of his camp, followed by Orrick and Bolling.⁻ Eastham endeavored to cut him off by getting around in his front, but he made his escape. Eastham went back to look after Wilt-shire but was told he was dying, and a young lady handed up his belt and holsters. Just then Orrick and Bolling came riding up, shouting, "Get out quick, Ridley; the Yankees are coming "—"Come on, old Steamboat; we must get out of this," said Eastmat, as he gave a touch of the spurt to his horse, to which his comrades had given the title, and the three Rangers started on the homestretch. Wiltshire died Apr. 4th. Mrs. Rose Bonham Perry, Exira, Iowa, writes: I recall the incident which happened at Col. D. S. Bonham's (my father's) place, though I was just ten years old. My father wrote following memo in 1881, two years prior to his death, at 'lay Center, Kansas.'' James Bonham, b Mch. 8, 1709, in what was then known as the Rye Valley, Wythe Co., Va., where my father, Capt. Nehemiah Bonham, lived until I was about 9 years old, when he sold out and moved to Blount Co., Tenn., near a place called Big Springs, where he followed farming and wagon making, until the War of 1812 broke out. He was elected captain of the militia and set up their place of drill at the Big Springs. It eserved till the war of 1812 had an English lion as a guard. As the war approached father had the lion taken off and a steel guard put on and it figured as an implement of war, and is now (1881) in the hands of my brother Frank. The War of 1812 brought a change of things in regard to the settlement of the acquired territory. In 1818 I was married to Jane Ford, and in October my father with his family and my wife's people started for Missouri. The most of us went by keel boat, but on account of dry weather we could not get through until April. 1819. In the fall of 1834 I moved from Missouri to the territory of Wisconsin and bought land just west of where the county seat, Lancaster, Grant Co., was located. From the time I settled in Wisconsin until 1 left the state in 1872. I served as justice of the peace 27 years, and with the same time I served a number of times as county and town commissioner, and several times as assessor.''

Joseph Scott Bonham, Rigby, Idaho, writes: "As to the sword held by Uncle Frank Bonham, he always told me it was handed down as an heirloom from Col. Bonham of England who fought under Prince Rupert in the war of Charles I against Oliver Cromwell. It was easy to double the point back to the hilt. In inspecting it after I grew up it always struck me as an honorary presentation by the govern-ment, rather than a weapon that had been designed for battle."

Edmund J. Bonham, Topeka, Kansas, writes: "I think J. S. Bonham is mistaken about the sword being pliable, as it is a rather short heavy sword designed to be used as a weapon and its hisis a rather short heavy sword designed to be used as a weapon and its his-tory as an implement of war dates back to the time of Cronwell's Round Heads. He has in mind a sword that Uncle Frank used to tell us about being in the family in England many years ago, but not grandfather's sword. On the death of grandfather in 1845, the sword went to Uncle Martin, grand-father having lived and died at his house. When Uncle Martin died in 1851, the sword went to uncle Frank, upon his death in 1892 the sword went to the eldest son, Wn. N., of Bakersfield, Cal. Upon his death a few years ago it went to J. A. Bonham, son of Uncle Martin, who was only six years old at his father's death, and was raised by Uncle Frank, grew to manhood right in the family with the sword.
