PREFACE

There are few who do not feel more or less interested in knowing something of their own family history. The past history of a family may afford its descendants many a useful lesson, as for instance the mental and physical qualities of their ancestors. their chief pursuits and accomplishments. It is also useful in tracing legal kinship, and establishing the right to join certain societies. Of course we know that the family traits are considerably diluted, and often strengthened, by the long line of marriages, and we know that records do not bring down to us all of the hangings or jail sentences; nevertheless we like to read of the good deeds of our ancestors. Even Elder William Brewster's term in jail was in a good cause.

This is an informal and unskillful attempt to trace back the family lines of "Eight Brewster Cousins" who grew up together in or near Chagrin Falls, Ohio, in the nineties. It is hoped that this compilation will enable their children and grandchildren to trace their connection to the line of Brewsters listed herein, and to learn something of their forefathers and their pioneer efforts. There are many spaces for data to be filled in, and no doubt many mistakes have crept in, which we hope each one will complete or correct according to his own information, and send the items to the writer.

If each grandchild will fill in the record with the passing years, the volume will be worth handing down in the family through many generations to come.

In an effort to indicate the line of descent, we have underlined the name of the member of the family which is carried forward. We have repeated the list of forebears, the small numeral following the name indicates the generation and the small letter, the order of birth in that family. Thus, Seth Brewster^{7d}, indicates that Seth Brewster is of the seventh generation, and that he was the fourth child in the family.

THE BREWSTERS IN ENGLAND

It is not definitely known from which of the many famous lines of the family in England the first emigrants of the name to America were descended.

The name is an old one, and is said to have been derived from the occupation of its first bearers as brewers. It is found in the English records in the various forms of Brustere, Breuster, Bruster, Breustar, Breustere, Brewester, Brewstere, Brewster, and others, of which the last form is the only one known in America today.

Elder William Brewster's father, William Brewster, was appointed by Archbishop Sandys, in January, 1575-76, "receiver of the town of Scrooby and bailiff of the manor house in that place belonging to the Archbishop, to have life-tenure of both offices."

The William Brewster who later came to America was for many years postmaster at Scrooby, a little village on the great North road about fifty miles from London. Nowadays a postmaster has mainly to do with letters and parcels and money orders, but three hundred years ago he had to do almost entirely with horses. Letters then posted were mainly governmental correspondence, sent by members of the Court. He did not live in a little house on a side street. but had a grand mansion called Scrooby Manor with a large brick stable and his duty was to supply horses to all travelers who desired to hire them. He was appointed by the government and had what 300 years ago was considered a handsome salary, namely 2 shillings a day, besides what travelers used to pay him if they stayed for a night or so at Scrooby Manor on their journey. He was also responsible for the relays of horses on the post road. He held the position of postmaster from 1590 to 1607.

About 1602 his neighbors began to assemble at the Manor House for worship, where Brewster "did much good in promoting and furthering religion." He was opposed to the laxness and excesses of the clergy, and favored greater strictness of morals and doctrine. He and his friends organized a branch of the Separatists, or those who preferred the congregational system, whereby each charge would be responsible to itself alone. In the face of persecution, in 1607 he with his friends chartered a Dutch boat to take them to Holland, but through the treachery of the Captain they were seized and imprisoned for a time. A year later they reached The Hague, where Brewster spent most of his means in providing for his family. At Leyden, in 1609, he was chosen ruling Elder of the Congregation. He remained in Holland twelve years, supporting himself by teaching English and by the use of the printing press. He was engaged in printing secretly religious books proscribed by the English government. In 1619 their types were seized, and his partner was arrested. Brewster, however, escaped and in the same year with Robert Cushman obtained in London on behalf of his associates a land patent from the Virginia Company. In 1620 he was selected to accompany the advance guard to the New World.

ELDER WILLIAM BREWSTER IN AMERICA

The Pilgrims sailed from Delftshaven late in July, 1620, from Southampton on the 5th of August, and from Plymouth on the 6th of September, 1620. After a stormy voyage of ten weeks, they anchored in Plymouth Harbor, Nov. 21, 1620, and "there in the cabin of the MAYFLOWER, Elder William Brewster drafted the first written Constitution in the history of the world,--a marvel of clearness, brevity, and strength." At Plymouth he bore an important part in establishing the Pilgrim Republic, not shrinking from the severest manual labor, and "when the church had no other minister, he taught twice every sabbath, both powerfully and profitably, to ye great contentment of ye hearers." He took a prominent part in the affairs of the colony, and served in the Indian Wars under Captain Myles Standish.

Nearly every ship which came from England brought books to Brewster, and at his death his library inventoried 400 volumes, 62 of which were in Latin. There were 98 commentaries or translations of the Bible.

"He possessed that happy attitude of mind which could accustom itself to all circumstances; destitute of meat, of fish and bread, even with his single meal of clams would return thanks to the Lord that he could suck of the abundance of the seas and the treasures hid in the sands."

He was accompanied by his wife Mary, and two sons, Love and Wrestling; also, a boy called Richard More. The rest of his children came over afterward. (The Pilgrims purposely chose such names as peace, love, patience, for their children, to emphasize their separation from the established church, which perpetuated the saints of the church calendar in naming children.) During their first winter in America, the Pilgrims buried half their number, leveling the graves and sowing grain over them in the Spring, in order to conceal their misfortunes from the Indians.

THE FIRST GENERATION

William Brewster¹ was born in 1566, probably in Scrooby, England. He enjoyed a healthy old age and was sick but one day, when he died on the 10th of April, 1644, 78 years of age. His wife, Mary, died April 17th, 1627. He survived all his daughters, leaving only two sons, Jonathan and Love.

Six children: Jonathan^{2a}, Patience^{2b}, Fear^{2C}, "A Child"^{2d}, Love^{2e}, Wrestling^{2f}.

(The name underlined indicates the line of descent; the figure indicates the generation, and the small letter indicates the order of birth.)

THE SECOND GENERATION

Love Brewster^{2e} (William¹), date of birth unknown. He came in the ship MAYFLOWER in 1620, with his parents and brother Wrestling. He married at Plymouth, May 15, 1634, Sarah Collier, of Duxbury, Massachusetts, who died at Plymouth, April 26, 1691. Love Brewster early removed from Plymouth to Duxbury, and "devoted himself to the cultivation of the paternal acres in Duxbury, forming there with his father a family home, where, in due time a portion of the estate became his own and his children's inheritance." In 1637 he served in the Pequot War, and was a member of Myles Standish's Duxbury Company in the military enrollment of 1643. Children: Sarah³⁸, Nathaniel^{3b}, William^{3c}, Wrestling^{3d}.

THE THIRD GENERATION

William Brewster^{3c} (Love^{2e}, William¹), was born in 1645, probably at Duxbury. He married Lydia Partridge, who died February 2, 1742-43. He was a farmer and extensive landowner, prominent in civil affairs. For many years he was a deacon of the

church at Duxbury. He died Nov. 3, 1723, at Duxbury. Children: Sarah^{4a}, Nathaniel^{4b}, Lydia^{4c}, <u>William</u>^{4d}, Mercy^{4e}, Benjamin^{4f}, Joseph^{4g}, Joshua^{4h}.

THE FOURTH GENERATION

William Brewster^{4d} (William^{3C}, Love^{2e}, William¹) was born May 4, 1683, at Duxbury, Mass. He married, May 20, 1707, Hopestill Wadsworth, who died March 25, 1773. They lived for a time at Wrentham, Mass., and then removed to the home of their son, Ichabod Brewster, at Lebanon, Conn. He was a farmer. He died Dec. 26, 1768, in his 87th year. Children: Oliver^{5a}, <u>Ichabod^{5b}</u>, Naomi^{5c}, Elisha^{5d}, Lot^{5e}, Huldah^{5f}.

THE FIFTH GENERATION

<u>Ichabod Brewster</u>^{5b} (William^{4d}, William^{3c}, Love^{2e}, William¹), second son of William⁴, was born Jan. 15, 1710. He married Lydia Barstow of Hanover, Mass., June 3, 1735. She was born in Scituate, April 23, 1717, and died at Lebanon, Conn., Feb. 6, 1815, in her 98th year. They lived at Pembroke, Mass., until May, 1743, when they moved to Lebanon, Conn., which was then only about a day's journey from the Indian frontier of hostile tribes. He bought a small farm, to which he added by purchases of land until he owned a large domain.

"Ichabod Brewster sustained a character of integrity and all the moral virtues that should adorn a Christian man. The benevolence of his heart was exemplified in his kindness toward his parents, whom he removed to his home in Lebanon, where he appropriated for their use the best rooms therein and where they continued in comfort until their decease." The home is one of the oldest still standing in Connecticut. He died at Lebanon, Conn., July 27, 1797, aged 87 years. Children: Bathsheba^{6a}, Lydia^{6b}, William^{6c}, Huldah^{6d}, Betty^{6e}, Prince^{6f}, Ichabod^{6g}, Hopestill^{6h}.

THE SIXTH GENERATION

William Brewster⁶^c (Ichabod^{5b}, William^{4d}, William^{3c}, Love^{2e}, William¹) was born Aug. 13, 1741, at Lebanon, Conn. He married first, at Preston, Conn., Nov. 4, 1761, Olive Morgan, who was born May 8, 1737. Children: Morgan^{7a}, Ruth^{7b}, Elias^{7c}, Seth^{7d}, Olive^{7e}.

He married second, at Lebanon, Conn., in 1775, Mary Starks, who was born in Lebanon, Nov. 23, 1747, and died Feb. 24, 1836. Children: Samuel^{7f}, Jerusha^{7g}, William^{7h}, Polly⁷ⁱ, Lucy^{7j}, Lovina^{7k}. William Brewster lived at Lebanon during his first marriage and later removed to Halifax, Vt. About 1787, he settled on a farm near Rome, N.Y., when that town was called Fort Stanwix, and lived there till his death. He died July 10, 1821.

THE SEVENTH GENERATION

Seth Brewster^{7d} (William^{6c}, Ichabod^{5b}, William^{4d}, William^{3c}, Love^{2e}, William¹) was born at Lebanon, Conn., Jan. 30, 1770. He married at Rome, N.Y., Oct. 11, 1792, Abigail Walworth, who was born at Guilford, Vt., Aug. 14, 1772, and died at Auburn, Ohio, July 29, 1847. He died in Auburn, Jan. 29, 1844.

They lived at Ellisburg, N.Y., until 1832, when they moved to Auburn, Geauga County, Ohio, and settled upon the farm that is now (1937) the home of their great granddaughter, Lucy Shackson. They were accompanied to their new location by their sons, Lyman, Jesse, Seth W., Hiram, and Calvin, and their daughters, Olive and Mary, one daughter, Eunice, having died in New York. These sons and daughters, with the exception of Seth W., who made his home in Chardon, Ohio, bought farms near the home of their parents, and northwest Auburn became a Brewster settlement.

THE EIGHTH GENERATION

Calvin Brewster^{8h} (Seth^{7d}, William^{6c}, Ichabod^{5b}, William^{4d}, William^{3c}, Love^{2e}, William¹) was born at Ellisburg, N.Y., Jan. 16, 1812. He was the youngest son of Seth Brewster, and came with him to Ohio when he was twenty years old. He married first, at Newbury, Ohio, Oct. 17, 1839, Betsey Burnett (daughter of Harry and Hannah (Wilbur) Burnett of Russell, Ohio) who died in Mantua, Ohio, July 14, 1845. They located at Mantua Corners, where Calvin kept a general store for several years. Children, born at Auburn: Edna⁹⁸, Calvin H.^{9b}. Children, born at Mantua: Betsey⁹⁰. When Betsey was three months old, the mother died. He married second, at Mantua, Ohio, Jan. 13, 1846, Wealtha Phelps Foster (daughter of Elikam and Wealtha (Phelps) Foster of Mantua, Ohio) who died at Chagrin Falls, Ohio, July 17, 1895. Children, born at Auburn, Ohio: Alta C.^{9d}, William D.^{9e}, Milton F.^{9f}, Harriet^{9g}.

Calvin Brewster spent the greater part of his life as a successful farmer on the Seth Brewster homestead. He was a great lover of home and family, and was active in church and community life. He died in Auburn, Ohio, May 17, 1867, survived by his wife and seven children. THE NINTH GENERATION

Children, born in Auburn, Ohio: Lucy Brewster Foster¹⁰⁸. Edna died at Cleveland, Ohio, Feb. 13, 1887.

THE NINTH GENERATION, SECOND BRANCH

Calvin H. Brewster^{9b} (Calvin^{8h}, Seth^{7d}, William^{6C}, Ichabod^{5b}, William^{4d}, William^{3C}, Love^{2e}, William¹) was born in Auburn, Ohio, May 13, 1843. He married at Newbury, Ohio, Dec. 7, 1867, Flora E. Chapman, daughter of William and Maria (Capron) Chapman. She died at Daytona, Florida, Mar. 12, 1937. His life was spent as a dry goods merchant in Chagrin Falls, Ohio, and he died there Nov. 17, 1885. Children: Ara Calvin^{10a}, Earl Henri^{10b}.
