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PREFACE.

This short contribution to family history, the fruits of leisure moments occurring in a busy professional life during the past ten years-requiring an extensive correspondence and much research among ancient records and documents-deals with facts rather than panegyrics. The object has been to put in enduring form the genealogical records of the family, a task which every decade renders more difficult, and which, in many instances, has proven not an easy one. No eulogies have been indulged in, and doubtless in many cases where members have filled positions of honor or of trust, no mention has been made of such facts, because those most interested have not thought it of sufficient importance to furnish the necessary data.

It will be readily seen that in a work of this nature, where so many dates are recorded, errors will creep in—are in fact almost unavoidable. And although great pains have been taken to verify all dates and other facts in the present work, doubtless it contains its share. This no one can possibly regret more than the author.

While the author is not one of those who consign

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to the "limbo" of the waste-basket, as totally unworthy of credence or consideration, all tradition, yet in this work, to unsupported traditions no weight has been given; and the following traditions, "that of three brothers who came from Ireland together, Thomas settled in Kittery about 1698, while of the others one went to Connecticut and the other South;" another, "that Thomas was a shipmaster and came to Kittery in his own vessel;" and a third, "that he came influenced by the advice of his friend John Wentworth," are only mentioned here because they are so generally believed. While either of these traditions are probable, there is no proof of any of them. They rest on the merest tradition.

Although it has never been questioned, and there is no doubt of its truth, yet in the absence of the exact date of his birth and parish records, positive proof of the descent of Thomas¹ Butler from the house of Ormond, and his right to the following arms, viz.: *Arms*, Or, a chief indented az.; *crest*, in a ducal coronet, Or, a plume of five ostrich feathers, Ar., thereon a falcon rising of the last—is impossible.

The author will esteem it a favor on the part of any reader who will send to his address, No. 42 East Sixty-sixth Street, New York City, the facts to correct any error or omission which they may discover, or any information which will help to fill any hiatus in this work.

DESCENDANTS OF THOMAS BUTLER.

I. THOMAS BUTLER was born about 1674. He signed an affidavit in 1733, stating his age to be fifty-nine years; this is all that is certainly known regarding his age. He was of that numerous family of Butlers descended from the house of Ormond. The exact date when he settled in Berwick is not definitely known; but that he was here as early as 1698 with his wife Elizabeth appears by the certificate of the birth of their son Thomas, contained in the town "Records" of Kittery, March 6, 1698.

Mr. Butler was a leading citizen of Berwick, and acted a prominent part in the affairs of the town for more than twenty-five years. Where he was educated is not positively known; but that he was a gentleman with fair pretensions to some degree of scholarly attainments seems evident from the fact of his ability, among other attainments, to teach the Latin language. In 1716 it was found difficult to engage a satisfactory teacher for the parish school, and one who could teach the Latin language, or, as expressed by one of the Board of Selectmen, one who "had the Latin tongue." So, in compliance with the following resolution, he taught the parish school until a satisfactory arrangement could be made with some other— "Voted, Mr. Thomas Butler to be schoolmaster until another be provided." There is no evidence that he ever received any compensation for his services as teacher, although he taught the school during the greater part of this year. He was at the same time one of the Board of Selectmen and Surveyor of Lands.

He was possessed of ample means for the times in which he lived, and maintained a style of living befitting one who numbered among his intimate friends and associates such well-known names as Governor Wentworth, Sir William Pepperell, Hon. John Hill, Captain Ichabod Plaisted, Humphrey Chadbourne, etc.

The following extract from the "Records of Kittery" show that he first received a grant of land, May 24, 1699, "at a legal town meeting held at Kittery, May 24, 1699. Lt. John Shapleigh was chosen moderator for the said day, John Heard, Joshua Downing, and Joseph Wilson were chosen to sit with y^e Selectmen, for to allow of all grants of land that be granted this day. Here follows a list of y^e several persons that had lands granted to them this day, with y^e number of acres. Granted Thomas Butler 21 acres."

Although Berwick was not set off to be a sepa-

rate parish from Kittery until 1701, yet a settlement of no insignificant importance was established where the village of South Berwick now stands at a very early date in the history of the colonies (in fact, an early historian of America states Berwick to have been the thirty-fourth town settled in New England), attracted here, no doubt, by the advantages afforded by the numerous and abundant falls in the Salmon Falls and Great Works rivers, yielding an abundance of water-power for saw-mills and grain-mills. Here was also the head of navigation for small vessels, all-essential, and affording ample means for the procuring, manufacturing, and transportation of lumber and ship-timber. And as the lumbering and timber interests were among the most important occupations of the State, at that time, this settlement promised to grow speedily to the proportions of a thriving village. It was here that this first grant of land to him was located, but he never occupied it as a residence.

He soon after acquired a large tract of land in South Berwick, to the east of the village, comprising the lands now occupied by the academy, Butler's Hill, those now covered by a part of the village, and the land owned and occupied by Hiram Butler at the present time. Here, just at the foot of this hill, which has ever since borne his name, he built for himself a substantial and spacious two-story double house, where he ever after resided and dispensed generous hospitality. This house has since been removed, and its site is now occupied by a more modern structure, the residence of Dr. Trafton.

As has been stated, Berwick was, by an act of the General Court, set off as a separate parish, with powers to elect selectmen and other officers for its local government, and to employ a minister for its church, and a teacher for its parish school; yet it was not until 1713 that by an act of the General Court it became a distinct town.

On the 12th day of August, 1712, Captain John Hill was elected "to represent this parish at the Great and General Court to be held at Boston, the 20th current, or at the next session relating to the division of Lower Kittery from this parish, &c." And on the 9th of June, following, the act was passed by the General Court, "Ordering that Berwick be a distinct and separate town, and shall have and enjoy all immunities and privileges as other towns do by law enjoy, &c. &c." This act was accepted and ratified by vote in legal town meeting held September 9, 1714, and at a legal town meeting held the following 22d of March, 1714/15, James Emery, James Grant, Elisha Plaisted, and Thomas Butler were elected selectmen of the town for the ensuing year.

The next year he was elected one of the Board of Selectmen, a grand juror, and schoolmaster. Besides other offices filled by him he served in the capacity of selectman from 1714/15 to 1726/27, inclusive, with the exception of three years, viz., 1717/18,

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1721/22.It was probably due to his being a good mathematical scholar that he was annually elected. surveyor of lands from 1713 to 1736, inclusive, when he saw both of his sons elected to that office in his place, and it was in this capacity that his character as careful and painstaking is most apparent. It was his custom to preserve copies of his surveys; and for this purpose he had a large sheepskin reduced to parchment, on which he made drawings of his surveys. These were continued by his son Thomas, and this chart has proved quite useful to surveyors of the present time as a reference for the purpose of verifying courses, where ancient landmarks have become obliterated. It was the property of his greatgreat-grandson, David G. Butler,⁵ of Great Falls, N. H., until recently, when it was borrowed for the purpose of verifying some surveys and never returned.

Although Mr. Butler did not become a member of the church until the 2d day of September, 1727, when he owned the covenant and was baptized, he was appointed to employ ministers of the church and given full powers to "settle with them as to their salaries." He was ever among the foremost in any measure tending to promote the interests of the community in which he lived. This is especially evinced by the interest he manifested in the schools, and in the improvements to the navigation of the river. For the latter he gave both time and money.

In 1720 we find him recorded as one of a committee elected to settle the disputes (which were long standing) arising between Berwick and Kittery in the division of lands (these disputes had lasted ever since the division of Berwick from Kittery). On March 3d, 1729/30, the town having voted to raise the amount of money falling to its share necessary for the maintenance of the agent of the house of representatives of this province at the court of Great Britain," and not being able to raise the money needed, until a new rate was taken, we find him, with his son Moses, John Hill, Humphrey Chadbourne, Elisha Plaisted, Peter and James Grant, and others, recorded as voluntarily making up the sum; to be paid them when the rate should be made and the money collected. During his life Mr. Butler was elected to office more than thirty-five He was owner of a considerable property in times. lands and in the mills in Quamphegan. His wife died December 2d, 1728, and was buried in the old burying-ground in South Berwick, and her headstone, the oldest in the grounds, is still standing, with the following inscription: "Here lies y^e body of Mrs. Elizabeth Butler, died December y^e 2, 1728."

The date of his death I have not been able to find. He was living and elected to office as late as 1736, which is the last public mention I find of him.

THOMAS,² first child of Thomas¹ and Elizabeth Butler, was born March 6, 1698, and baptized August 14, 1720. He is first mentioned in the town "Records" of Berwick in 1725, when he was elected constable. In 1735 he was elected surveyor of lands, and continued to be elected to the latter office for several years. He held other offices of the town. His occupation was that of a manufacturer of and trader in timber and lumber.

Mr. Butler was a large landowner, and had a considerable property in the Quamphegan Mills. He inherited the homestead of his father, "Butler's Hill," where he lived and died. He is described in old documents as gentleman. He bequeathed his property according to the following will:

"In the name of God, Amen. I, Thomas Butler, of Berwick, in the county of York, Gentⁿ, the twelfth day of February, 1759, being very sick and weak of body, but of perfect mind & memory. Thanks be given unto God.

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"Therefore, calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will & testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent christian burial at y^e discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, demise & dispose of y^e same in y^e follow^g manner and form.

"Imp^e I give to my well beloved wife all my household goods & personal estate.

"I give to my beloved son Moses Butler one third part of my homestead with half the house thereon; and also one third part of a lot of Land at Blackberry Hill, he paying one third part of the following Legacies or Bequests when he shall arrive to the years of twenty-one.

"Item. I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Butler thirteen pounds six shillings & eight-pence.

"Item. I give to my daughter Olive Fippenny Forty Shillings.

"Item. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Sayward Forty shillings.

"Item. I give to my grandson William Goodwin the son of my daughter Mary Dec^d twenty Shillings.

"Item. I give to my beloved son Samuel Butler,

whom I likewise constitute, make & ordain my sole Executor of this my last will & testament, the two thirds part of my homestead, and half my dwelling house & Barn, the two thirds parts of a lot of Land at Blackberry Hill, also all my right in the Mills in Quamphegan & privilege, and ten acres of timber land in the woods, he paying y^e Two thirds parts of the above Legacys and all my just Debts & funeral charges."

CAPTAIN MOSES,² third child of Thomas¹ and Elizabeth Butler, born July 13, 1702, is first mentioned in official life in 1730 in connection with the seizure of logs belonging to certain of the inhabitants of Berwick, by the King's surveyor of woods.

As early as 1668 the Governor of Massachusetts had reserved "all white pine trees of twenty-four inches in diameter at three feet above the ground for the public use."

In King William's reign a surveyor of woods

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had been appointed by the Crown, and an order sent to the Earl of Bellomont to cause acts to be passed in his several governments for the preservation of the white pine trees, and in 1708 a law was made in New Hampshire prohibiting the cutting of such white pine trees as were twenty-four inches in diameter at twelve inches above the ground, without leave of the surveyor, who was instructed by the Queen to mark with the broad arrow all such trees as were or might be fit for the use of the Navy and to keep a register of them. The rigid execution of the office of Surveyor-General had always been attended with difficulties; and the violent manner in which Major Dunbar proceeded with alleged trespassers raised a spirit of opposition on such occasions.

The statutes for the preservation of the woods empowered the Surveyor to seize all logs cut from white pine trees without a license; and it rested on the claimant to prove his property in the court of admiralty.

Dunbar went to saw-mills, where he seized and marked large quantities of lumber; and with an air and manner to which he had been accustomed in his military capacity, abused and threatened the people. That class of men with whom he was disposed to contend are not easily intimidated with high words, and he was not a match for them in that species of controversy which they denominated swamp law." The frequent and arbitary seizure by the "Surveyor-General" "of both logs and lumber wherever found, and the contemptuous manner with which he met all remonstrances coupled with the trouble and expense of proving property when once seized, and often at a distance from the place of seizure, finally aroused such a spirit of resistance that we find the following on record : "At a legal town meeting held at Berwick, April 18, 1729, voted money shall be raised of this town for the defending any person or persons belonging to this town of Berwick who have had any logs seized by the surveyor which were cut within this township."

Also, "Voted sixty pounds shall be raised forthwith to defray the charges of carrying on that affair."

This was not only a delicate affair, but one of vital interest to this community, so dependent on the timber interests, which were among the principal occupations at this time, and especially at this juncture, when the case had been tried in the courts, and the findings of the court recorded against the claimants, and the difficulties were further enhanced by complaints both openly and covertly of the administration at Boston accusing the Governor of failing to bring to punishment such as were found cutting timber without a license. The next August, the following appears on the town "Records : " " At a legal town meeting held at Berwick, August 3, 1730, voted Capt. Elisha Plaisted, Benj. Libby, Joseph Chadbourne, John Thompson, Moses Hubbard, and Moses Butler, a committee in this matter, &c." Mr. Butler was chosen by this committee to represent them in these matters, and to attend at the General Court in Boston. He seems to have been successful in this undertaking, and by vote of the town was paid his expenses, and in 1733 was elected to the board of selectmen of Berwick, and continued to be re-elected annually till 1737. He was also chosen surveyor of lands in 1734, and continued in this office until 1756. He was selectman again from 1747 to 1756, being this year chosen moderator of town meeting.

The date of his first commission as Captain is not known, but it must have been before 1740, as this year we find Capt. Moses Butler voted one of a committee "to set off a parish from Berwick." When it was resolved to fit out an expedition to Cape Breton against the Fortress of Louisberg, in 1744, Berwick was among the first to catch the spirit, and here as elsewhere the enthusiasm ran very high; and Capt. Butler was among the first to recruit his company, which was the seventh company of the first Massachusetts regiment (under the command of Sir Wm. Pepperell), which he commanded during the remarkable siege and capture of this strong fortress, sharing with his men alike the deprivations and hardships of a winter siege and the joys at the closing victory. His commission in this service is dated February 5, 1744. The following is a copy of a letter from Sir William Pepperell to John

Hill, Esq., communicated by N. J. Herrick, Esq., to the N. E. Hist. Gen. Register, and published in the July number, 1869:

DEAR SIR :--- The day last past I heard that Capt. Butler had enlisted in Berwick his fifty brave sol^{drs}. This news was like a cordial to me, to hear that Berwick, Brother to Kittery, my own native town, had such a brave English spirit. I received last night a letter from y^e Honor^{ble} Committee of War, who write that they thot there was upon our making up five or six companys of our brave county of York men. Y^e full number that was proposed all enlisted, & more, so that there will be a number clear^d off, but you may assure yourself that our brave county of York men shall not be clear^d of without Speak to Capt. Butler to hasten they desire it. down, for I have some Enlisting money sent me for him. I am sorry that some of your Commission Officers in your town seem to be uneasy because they had not had y^e offer of a commission in this Expedition; I understand you spoke to them; did they expect that at this time I should have waited on them? I think if they had y^e least inclination to have gone, I think it was their Duty they owed to God, their King & Country, to come and offer theirselves. My love to ye Lady and all inquiring Friends.

I don't doubt in y^e least but the Commission Officers in Berwick are Brave, good men as any in this Province, and would willingly venture their lives with their coll^{*}, &c. I believe that nothing would now hinder them but their business in going on as ye intended Expedition, therefore I excuse them willingly; please to tell them all I sincerely value & love them, & that if there should be occasion for forces to be sent after us I don't doubt in y^e least but they will be ready to come when their business is over. I beg all their prayers.

He was in Louisberg, July 4, 1745, when he with other members of his company signed a power of attorney to Lieutenant Peter Grant to receive their bounty money.

In 1748 he was chosen to answer a petition executed against the town and received £13 6s. Sd. for his services at the General Court at Boston, and May 22, 1749, he was chosen "Representative of Berwick to the General Court at Boston, a selectman, and surveyor of lands. He was at the siege of Quebec, in 1754. He made his will September 10, 1756, which was proved the 13th of December following. He willed property to his wife Mercy, to children Moses, Thomas, Charles, James, John, Elizabeth, Sarah, Mary, and Love Butler. He married Mercy Wentworth, of Dover, N. H., and had

SAMUEL³ BUTLER, fifth child of Thomas² and Mehitable, baptized May 19, 1734, and died July 15, 1799; married to Lydia, daughter of Nehemiah and Mary (Wentworth) Kimball, of Dover, N. H., May 4, 1757, by the Rev. Jeremy Belknap. Lydia died May 13, 1802. He inherited by his father's will two-thirds of the homestead where he lived and all his property in Quamphegan mills, besides other property. Mr. Butler was an extensive timber and lumber manufacturer and merchant. He was selectman of Berwick, and held other town offices. In 1772 he is recorded chosen "Moderator of town meeting." With others he signed a petition opposed to certain "oppressive and unconstitutional laws of the British Parliament for 2

raising a revenue tax in North America." They had

MAJOR ICHABOD³ BUTLER, sixth child of Thomas² and Mehitable Butler, baptized in Berwick, January 9, 1736/7; was a soldier in the war for independence.

MOSES³ BUTLER, seventh child of Thomas² and Mehitable Butler, baptized in South Berwick, Feb. ruary 28, 1741/2, died September 21, 1823. He married, December 18, 1764, Keziah Nason, died July 28, 1824, and moved to the neighborhood in Berwick known as Cranberry Meadows. At the breaking out of the war for independence he evinced a lively interest in the cause of the colonies, and was among the foremost in all measures to promote the interests of freedom. He entered the service with his brother, and served until its There is no evidence that he was educated close. to the law, although he acted in the capacity of attorney for many years. In manner, though genial, he was dignified, and was said by those who knew him personally to have been one of the most elegant gentlemen of his day. He was a strict observer of the Sabbath, and seldom absent from his seat in church on Sunday. Bountiful in his charities, it was his custom, which he maintained as long as he lived, to invite to his table all of the worthy poor of the parish on Christmas and Thanksgiving Day, and if any were too feeble or ill to be present on that occasion they were not forgotten. He was one of the few in Maine who owned slaves, and his kind treatment of them is evinced as well by the fact that two of them remained with him after emancipation as long as

he lived as by the testimony of his friends. He was fond of riding in the saddle, and at the age of eighty would mount his spirited horse from the ground without any aid. Their children were:

Shortly after this he took the office of the Hon. Augustus Haines, District Attorney of the United States. He subsequently formed a law partnership with the Hon. William Pitt Fessenden, which was afterward continued with the sons of Mr. Fes-In December, 1875, he formed a partsenden. nership with Charles Libby, prosecuting attorney for Cumberland County, and afterward Mayor of Portland. Mr. Butler was county attorney from 1859 to 1865, was twice Representative in the State Legislature, once in 1859,

and again at the time of his death. He was twice Mayor of Portland, Me., from 1877 to 1879, holding that office at the time of his death, and was chairman of the commission appointed to report on the condition of the Portland & Ogdensburg Railroad with reference to the city's interest therein. Mr. Butler was a careful and sagacious lawyer, with an eminently judicial mind. He ranked among the ablest jurists in the State. As Mayor of Portland his services (coming at a time when a lawyer of experience and sagacity was felt to be necessary) were believed to be particularly valuable, and gave unqualified satisfaction. The following short extract from the address of Judge Symonds in the Supreme Court upon the presentation of resolutions show his habits as a close student and industrious lawyer. "Mr. Butler was a man of great practical ability. He had the tastes and habits of a student, but the volume in his hand was usually a law-book. He was diligent in his reading, and kept pace with the works of the latest authors, and with the proceedings of the courts. In matters of recent interest and importance he was thoroughly equipped. He was a man of experienced and disciplined sagacity, a wise councillor, and prudent in the management of affairs." On October 9, 1879, while conducting a case in court, Mr. Butler suffered an attack of paralysis, and died on October 21, 1879. He married, in 1850, Olive M., only daughter of John M.
