The Coat-of-Arms of the British family of Blakey of the county of Suffolk is generally described as follows:

Arms.—''Gules, a chevron vair between two chevrons and three crosses crosslet fitches or.''

Crest.—"A dragon's head couped at the neck vert, gorged with a crown argent."

- Arms: Argent, on a fess gules, between three falcons rising azure, beaked, legged and belled or, as many bezants, each charged with a lion's head sable; on a canton vert, a harp or, stringed of the first.

The Name and Family of Blakey

"The name of Blakey is believed by some authorities to have been a corruption of the English surname Blackie or Blakie, which was the diminutive form of the well known surname Black, which originally had reference to the dark complexion, hair, or eyes of its first bearers. Other authorities believe that it was a corruption of Blakeley or Blakley, which was of local origin, being taken by its first bearers from their residence at a place of that name. It cannot be definitely determined, but it seems more probable that the latter theory is correct. The name is found on the ancient British and early American records in the various forms of Blackie, Blackey, Blakie, Blakes, Blackeye, Blakley, Blaky and Blakey, of which the last form mentioned is that most generally accepted in America today.

It is said that the family was seated in County Suffolk, England, in extremely ancient times, but the earliest known record of the line is that of one Walter Blakey, who resided at Huntingfield, in that County, about the middle of the fifteenth century and is said to have lived to be one hundred and five years old. His son Thomas, who is said to have lived to be ninety-six, was the father about the year 1489 by his wife a Miss Thinn of a son named Robert, who died in 1587, leaving issue by his wife Alice Saige of, possibly among others, Walter and Lyonell, both of whom were living in the year 1600. Of these last mentioned members of the family, Walter married Dorathye or Dorothy Talmage or Talmadge and probably left numerous issue by her, and Lyonell is said to have been Sergeant at Arms to Queen Elizabeth of England.

Unfortunately, the line of descent from this Suffolk line to the first emigrants of the name to America is not complete, although it is considered probable that the American Blakeys were descended from one of the younger branches of that family."

Annals of a Scotch-Irish Family—by William Whitsitt, Richmond College, Va., American Historical Magazine—Tenn. Historical Society Quarterly, April 1904:

"Churchill Blakey of Wales. A slight amount of confusion has crept into opening statements of the Blakey family records. The first of these affirms that 'Churchill Blakey, son of Churchill Blakey of Wales, married Miss Sally George', but the Register of Christ Church Parish does not sustain that item. Thomas Blakey of Cumberland, England, was the immigrant ancestor and not Churchill Blakey (of Wales). The tradition of a Wales connection arose from the fact that Margaret Jones, the first wife of Thomas Blakey, and the mother of Churchill Blakey, was derived from Glamorganshire in Wales. Thomas Blakey, the immigrant ancestor, is supposed to have contracted a fortunate marriage alliance. Capt. Roger Jones had come to Virginia in 1660 with Lord Culpepper, and was commander of a ship in the service of the government. He became the founder of a large and powerful family, and an account of them may be read in a work entitled 'Descendants of Roger Jones', by Judge L. H. Jones, of Louisville, Ky. Margaret Jones, the first wife of Thomas Blakey, appears to have been a sister of Captain Roger Jones and an aunt of his son, Roger Jones, Jr. This Roger Jones, Jr. about the year 1690 had married Mary, the daughter of Col. Wm. Churchill. Being a person of some consideration and position Mrs. Blakey was apparently appreciated by the family of Col. Churchill with whom she had thus become allied by marriage, and her first and only living child was called Churchill in honor of him."

Note:—As Dr. Whitsitt's version of the immigrant ancestor of this line has been widely quoted for years, it is given, tho not universally accepted.

No records have been found of descendants of Thomas Blakey and Margaret Jones in "Jones Genealogies". Nowhere have we found the name Roger or the name Jones, as first or second name of early descendants of Churchill and Sarah George Blakey. The record of birth of Churchill as son of Thomas and Margaret is given in both instances as Churchill the son of Thomas and Margaret "Blake". A Blake genealogy gives this item but doesn't give any further connection.

Dr. Whitsitt's article continues:

"The precise date of the arrival in Virginia of the BLAKEYS has not yet been determined. The Christ Church Register, p. 22, says that 'Robert Blakey and Jane Kid married 29th of Jan. 1683-4'. If Thomas arrived as early as Robert we may assume that they landed somewhere about 1680.

William Blakey, Gentleman, who figures in York (later New Kent) Co., Va., was a man of worship and a member of the House of Burgesses in 1657-8, but I cannot make out that he was connected with the Blakeys of Middlesex. On the 29th of July, 1647, he patented 300 acres in the county of York opposite the

Pamukee Landing place in consideration of the transportation of six persons into the colony. On the 29th of June 1655 he patented one thousand acres adjoining the former entry in consideration of the transportation of twenty persons into the colony. On the 28th of Nov. 1658, there was another entry of one thousand acres for a similar consideration and on the 12th of Feb. 1662, the above entries were all confirmed by Sir Wm. Berkeley, Governor of the Colony. This last entry seems to indicate that the restoration of the Stuarts in England had rendered the titles of lands in Virginia to a certain extent insecure."

Record of Jemima Douglas Oglesby, b. Jan. 21, 1792 (grand dau. of Churchill and Sarah George Blakey):

Thomas Blakey, his son, came to America, Middlesex Co. Va. 1686 m. —— Churchill, dau. of Col. William Churchill and his 1st wife. One son, Churchill, born to them. Churchill married Sarah George."

Bible Record of George D. Blakey:

"Churchill Blakey of Wales.

Churchill Blakey, his son, m. Sarah George."

George D. Blakey was thirty-three years old when his father died and had his version of "Churchill Blakey from Wales" from his father George, who was grandson of Churchill and Sarah George Blakey.

A search of Wales records reveals no Blakey families there. However, early records show many younger sons of English families of that day went to Scotland, Ireland and Wales, looking for better opportunities and finally crossed to America because older relatives had already settled here. It is possible a Churchill Blakey did come here by way of Wales because relatives Blakey and relatives Churchill from England were settling colonies over here. Whether a Churchill Blakey came here from Wales and married, probably, his cousin ----- Churchull, or whether as some descendants think, his father was Thomas and m. ———— Churchill, has not been determined but because of these family bible records and the item in William and Mary College Quarterly that "A daughter of Col. William Churchill married a Blakey," many Blakey descendants do not agree with the reasoning and conclusions drawn by Dr. Whitsitt in Amer. Historical Society Magazine that Churchill was son of Thomas Blakey and Margaret Jones.

It will be noted that the 1st son and child of Churchill is named "Thomas" and the first daughter is named Margaret. As we find no 1st name of Wm. Churchill's dau. and the Blakey whom she married it is possible it was a Thomas Blakey who married a Margaret Churchill.

If Churchill was a grandson of Wm. Churchill, thru his daughter and an unnamed Blakey then, until proof is established, we have no positive date of birth of Churchill but start with his marriage to Sarah George Nov. 30, 1710.

William and Mary Quarterly (An original copy published at an early date): "Col. William Churchill appears as deputy sheriff in Middlesex Co., Va., in 1674, thence he rose to be a member of the council in 1705. According to his own deposition and his will he was born in 1649-50 in North Aston Oxfordshire, England.

The arms of the family as represented in a wax seal attached to a deed of his son Armstead Churchill identify him as belonging to the family of Churchill settled in the counties of Devon, Somerset and Dorset during the reign of King John, Henry III and Edward I. He is generally credited with only one wife, Elizabeth Armistead, but an entry in order book of Middlesex Co. during the year 1683 shows that he was twice married.

I. THOMAS BLAKEY (Churchill'), oldest son of Churchill and Sarah George Blakey, b. Apr. 6, 1712 m. ANN HADEN (dau. Anthony and Margaret Douglas Haden).

The records of Albemarle Co. Va. (Deed Book 1, p. 33) show that on the 8th of Sept. 1748, Thomas Blakey of the county of Goochland, purchased of William Noland for fifty pounds, two hundred acres of land on Arthur's Creek of Slate River. The Surveyor's Book of Albemarle, 1,107 shows that on the 5th of Dec. 1749 Thos. Turpin, assistant surveyor, had surveyed for him two hundred acres additional which lay adjacent to the purchase made from Noland and he took out a Patent for this tract on 10th of Sept. 1755. In 1761 Buckingham Co. was formed from Albemarle, and thenceforth embraced his residence. He continued to reside here until his death. It was situated near Muddy Creek of Slate River and it is possible the family carried that name with them to Logan Co. Ky. where Muddy Creek was likewise found near their residence.

From Haden Magazine:

"First mention of Hayden Race is in a grant of land to Samuel Hayden by King John of England for distinguished service in the Crusades.

ANTHONY HAYDEN b. 1694, Hadden Hall, England, d. 1797. An officer under the great Marlborough, emigrated to America about 1720 and settled in North Carolina. Was for ten years Councellor of State. Owing to difficulties with the Governor of North Carolina he left the State and went to Virginia, always actively engaged in the service of his country. At the Battle of Point Pleasant he was Lieut. in a company and had four sons and two grandsons engaged in the same battle. He was at that time eighty years of age. This was his last battle, but his time and money and his pen were all devoted to the cause of the Revolution. In 1780 he negotiated one of the most important treaties with the Cherokees, the Chickasaws and the Choctaws. This was his last public service. He died at the age of 103, full of years and honors. This was the Anthony who changed his name to "Haden" when he came to America. His wife was Lady Margaret Douglas of the House of Drumlanrig, Scotland. Deeds show Anthony and Margaret Haden lived in Honover and Goochland counties in Va. in 1746."

Mrs. W. H. Rudder of Salem, Ind. (a Blakey descendant) has worked for years on the Douglas lines. She offers the following:

It is familiar tradition that our Margaret Douglas belonged to the Black Douglases of Scotland, the House of Drumlanrig. Some say her grandfather was James 2nd Earl of Queensbury.

"Sholto", name 1st given to Black Douglas."

Mrs. Rudder quotes a bit from history of Scotland: "Royalty vs. Nobility":---"After James II. confiscated the vast estate of the Black Douglas of Southern Scotland he rewarded services of northern followers by grants from these confiscated estates. The chief of these was the Earl of Angus (Red Douglas), kinsman by marriage to Douglas of Southern Scotland and from the difference of the family complexion led to the popular saying that 'the Red Douglas had put down the Black'. This once powerful branch of the Douglas (the Black), after their ancient holdings were wrested from them, had to take refuge in extreme southern Scotland and northern England."

The following from History of the House of Douglas: "Sir James Douglas, 7th Lord of Drumlanrig, revived the ancient rivalry between the Black Douglas whom he represented, and his own brother-in-law, the Red Douglas, Earl of Angus. This once powerful Douglas of Scotland had ancient privileges: 1st vote in Parliament; leading the vanguard in battle; carrying the crown at coronation. A single battle decided whether a Stuart or a Douglas should ascend the throne."

Douglas Coat of Arms:—Argent a man's heart gules ensigned with an imperial crown proper on a chief of azure three stars of the first.

"The Blakeys had been members of the Church of England for hundreds of years and the family of Thomas Blakey was perhaps still in that communion when he established himself in Albemarle in 1748. It is hardly possible to trace at this distance of time the process by which they were induced to quit the Church of England and attach themselves to the Baptist. It is probable, however, that David Patterson who married Sarch (Sally) George Blakey in April 1763, may have been the means of bringing this about. The Pattersons appear to have come from New Kent Co. and they may likewise have been members of the Church of England. The records of Royal Patents show that David Patterson, who must have been the father of the man who married Sarah Blakey, entered three hundred and thirty-seven acres on the north side of James River, in Henrico Co. on 22 of June, 1722. On the 27th and 28th of Sept. 1730 he entered three more tracts, two of them containing each four hundred acres and the third three hundred and forty-two acres, in Goochland Co., but yet adjoining the previous entry in Henrico. This was made possible by the fact that in the year 1727 Goochland had been formed from Henrico. These lands were situated on the waters of Great and Little Licking Hole Creeks, within the present limits of Goochland. On the 10th of Sept. 1755, David Patterson had also entered twenty-nine hundred and eleven acres in Albemarle on the north side of Appomattox River, near its headwaters, and on the 4th of July 1759 he had entered four hundred acres in Albemarle on branches of North Creek, near Piney Mt. The last two of these tracts fell within the limits of Buckingham when that County was duly organized in 1761. David Patterson, son of his father of the same name, must have inherited these and shortly set up his residence near the home of the Blakeys. When the marriage with Sarah George Blakey occurred all parties were in full odor of Church of England Orthodoxy. But Dr. Semple (Hist. Beal's ed. p. 283) reports that Patterson was 'part of the first fruit of the Gospel in these parts.' The conversion of Mr. Patterson could hardly have occurred before the year 1767 or later than 1770. He is believed to have been the leader of the Blakeys in the direction of becoming Baptists and it was likely thru his friendship and fellowship that Robert Stockton was invited to Buckingham, where he met and married Catherine Blakey."

DESCENDANTS OF GEORGE BLAKEY AND MARGARET WHITSITT

From Annals of a Scotch-Irish Family: the Whitsitts of Nashville, Tenn., by William H. Whitsitt, Richmond College, Richmond, Va.

"The Whitsitts are a numerous tribe in Ireland, where they bore and still bear the name of Whiteside, being most numerous in the counties of Antrim and Armagh. Nearly all of those who have contracted the name from Whiteside prefer to spell it Whitsett but the Nashville family have always insisted upon the form Whitsitt.

The advent of the Whitesides to the colony of Virginia in the spring of 1741 is proven by Royal Patents issued to William Whiteside, Vol. XX p. 162, and others in Albemarle Co. and the last one recorded was across the Blue Ridge in what was then Augusta but is now Rockbridge County.

William Whiteside, the immigrant, found a home in the midst of the stout Scotch-Irish colonists, who, coming down the Valley of Virginia, had crossed the Blue Ridge into Albemarle at and after the year 1737. His entry called for 'four hundred acres lying and being in the county of Goochland, on both sides of the South Fork of Mechums River'. He occupied that place from the 15th of March, 1741, until the 7th day of July 1767, when he sold it to Adam Dean for 250 pounds 'current money of Va.' The most important memorial of his residence of six and twenty years in this home appears in the fact that the South Fork of Mechum's River that ran thru his farm acquired the name of Whiteside Creek, which it has carried ever since on the maps of Albemarle.

Several of the Whitesides are mentioned in connection with the long French and Indian War from 1754 to 1763 in which Virginia bore the brunt of this as well as in the Confederate and Revolutionary Wars. William Whiteside of Augusta Co., was likely too far advanced to render Military service, but he is said to have performed some work for the Colony which paid him 11 s. 6d. for his services. (Hening Statutes at Large 7, 194). William Whiteside Jr. was a member of the Albemarle Militia (Hening 7, 203). George Washington commanded the forces of Va. in this long and painful struggle, which served as an excellent preparation for the great deeds which he was destined to accomplish in the War of the Revolution.

Following the close of the French and Indian War, William Whitsitt Jr. quitted his father's home in Albemarle and established himself in the new County of Amherst. On the 5th of Sept. 1763 he purchased from John Wade and his wife Elizabeth, two hundred acres of land 'on both sides of Davis's Creek, a branch of Rockfish River'. This estate is at present in Nelson Co. The indenture declares that the purchaser is already a resident of the county of Amherst and in it his name is uniformly spelled Whitsitt, but in one or two instances the 'i' of the last syllable has been left without dot above it.

The date is unknown. It may have occurred sometime before the Treaty of Paris has been duly signed by the Powers in Feb. 1763, he was united in marriage to Ellen Menees, the only daughter of James Menees, Sr., who resided near Amherst Courthouse. Possibly Whitsitt remained on this Davis Creek estate until the 7th of Sept. 1767 when he purchased a farm of three hundred acres from his father-in-law. William Whitsitt Sr. followed his son William to Amherst. Exact date unknown. On the 7th of July 1767, he sold the farm which he had obtained by patent on the 15th of March 1741, to Adam Dean for 250 pounds. In the indenture he is already described as 'William Whiteside, of Amherst'. His wife, Elizabeth, took part in the conveyance and signed the deed. It seems certain the immigrant Whiteside passed away in Amherst Co. shortly after the year 1770.

The trials of Albemarle had been great but the trial of Amherst was to be still greater. On the 1st of Oct. 1781, eighteen days before the surrender of Lord Cornwallis, William Whitsitt disposed of his possessions, one hundred acres going to Charles Stewart for 60 pounds specie, and five hundred acres going to Charles Crews for 500 pounds in Virginia currency.

When William Whitsitt sold out at Amhurst on Oct. 1st 1781 he passed by Pittsylvania and sought a home in Henry Co. where he purchased from Col. Abraham Penn and his wife Ruth, thirteen hundred and fifty acres near the present town of Martinsville, on the 1st of April 1782, for 500 pounds. The Whitsitts kept their place in Henry Co. until Oct. 1790, when they turned their faces towards the setting sun and journeyed to the Cumberland Country. They arrived at the most perilous season of all. They had scarcely established themselves in their new homes before the Indians won two victories over the forces of the Government. The courage and ferocity of the northern Indians were enhanced by these successes and the southern Indians also concluded to undertake a general campaign. This befell in the autumn of 1792, when they encountered a serious repulse at Buchanan's Station. But they were not defeated and the entire section was filled with roving bands of bloodthirsty savages. They were not reduced until the summer of 1794, when the Nickajack expedition was sent against them."

JAMES MENEES, father of Ellen Manees who m. William Whitsitt Jr. is the immigrant ancestor on this line. He is supposed to have been born about 1710 and to have made his way to America with the Scotch-Irish migration after 1730. Arrived in America he married Mrs. Ellen Breathitt, widow of Raney Breathitt, whose maiden name was Miss Ellen Cardwell. The Cardwells are likewise a Scotch Irish family and Mr. Hanna's tables show a number of them residing in County Antrim. It is supposed to have been about the year 1738 when James married the widow, perhaps in Franklin Co. Pa., where the Breathitt's appear to have been established. 1653-1812 Middlesex Co. Christ Church Parish Register pub. 1897 by Colonial Dames give p. 162 marriage: Thos. Cardwell and Mary Blackly June 22, 1716. (Probably parents of Ellen Cardwell Breathitt Nenees). To quote Dr. Whitsitt: "Ellen Cardwell must have been a person of singular force and sweetness, if one may judge from the impression she left upon the Menees family who still delight to name their children in honor of this their first mother in America. He also states that the Breathitts retained an uncommon degree of affection for Ellen Cardwell and have continued for generations to call their children Cardwell, apparently in her honor.

McNees or McNeese is a well known name in Ireland, while the name Menees is not mentioned there. The name also appears most often, as does Whiteside name in County Antrim. It is possible William Whiteside and James Manees traveled from Antrim to America in the same ship.

Upon distribution of his estate to his children in 1767, the elder James Memees reserved a sufficient amount to maintain himself in comfort and credit. He lived in Amherst until Feb. 1782, when he went with his wife to reside in Pittsylvania Co. near his son Benjamin who then owned a farm on Turkey Cock Creek, not far from the border of Henry Co. Va. In Nov. 1783 he took up his residence with the Whitsitts near Martinsville, Henry Co. and remained with them until their removal to Tenn. in Oct. 1790, when he found a home with his grandchildren, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Breathitt until his death in 1792. After the 7th of Sept. 1767, the entire family of James Menees Sr. was settled about him on Rutledge's Creek, about a mile south of Amherst Courthouse. William Whitsitt had purchased three hundred acres from his father-in-law for 30 lbs. while the sons, James Menees Jr. and Benjamin Menees, obtained the like amount for the nominal sum of five shillings each. The difference between them must have been occasioned by the improvements on the portion occupied by Whitsitt being superior to those found on the farms of the two sons. There were scarcely ever seen more united, affectionate families. When James Menees Sr. sold out on 13th of Feb. 1782 he followed his youngest son to Pittsylvania where a deed of gift made by him on April 4th, 1783, described him as being of the County of Pittsylvania. Another deed of gift recorded in Henry Co. Nov. 12, 1783, describes him as still a resident of Pittsylvania.

James Menees Jr. was present at the battle of Guilford Court House on March 15, 1781 and it is likely he was still detained with his command throughout that year, but when he disposed of his Amherst property on August 5th, 1782, he is described in both deeds as James Menees of Henry Co. Dr. Whitsitt's article gives the following:-

"In some of the documents the Breathitt name is written both Breathhead and Breathet; in others it appears as Breathart and Brethett. In Kentucky it finally came to be written Breathitt but the Maryland branch have steadily preferred Breathed. Both of these branches were derived from the same immigrant ancestor John Breathitt. There can be little question that the original name was Branthwaite, which by degrees became Braithwaite.

Mrs. Bridges, a descendant of Isaac, assigns the arrival of John Breathitt the immigrant to America in 1740. The mother of John and Ranny Breathitt is reported to have been a Miss Ranney.

About 1740 John Breathitt of Pa. m. Miss Jane Kelley, a dau. of William Kelley, a well-to-do Scotch-Irishman who resided near Hagerstown, Md. This couple had twelve children. Of these only two are said to have married and left issue: William Breathitt who m. Elizabeth Dawson Whitsitt, and Isaac Breathitt. Raney Breathitt, brother of John m. Ellen Cardwell. No issue. After his death Ellen m. James Menees Sr., their dau. Ellen m. Wm. Whitsitt Jr.

William Breathitt, after disposing of his home in Henry Co. in 1793, established himself in Campbell Co. Va. on the highway between Lynchburg and New London, where his distinguished son John Breathitt was born. About 1799 the influence of his wife prevailed and, disposing of his remaining possessions in Va. he set out for Tennessee. On 16th of July 1795, he had purchased military land warrants from William and Joseph Porter for one thousand acres in Maury Co. On the 21st of Aug. 1800 he sold this tract to his brother-in-law, James Whitsitt and removed to Russellsville, Ky.

George D. Blakey, a slave owner and an outspoken and determined Union man was forced to flee from his home in Russellville, Ky., when the rebellion took place and seek refuge within the Federal lines. After the rebel forces were driven back in Tenn., he returned to his home only to find his wife and daughter and little grandchildren had been ousted and their comfortable home converted into a hospital. The statues of Mr. Blakey's political gods, Franklin, Jefferson, Jackson and Clay, which he had placed in the vestibule of his home at considerable expense were in 1861 despoiled by rebel hands.

During the war of the Rebellion, when the result was in doubt and the great struggle was for very life, Congress passed an act authorizing the enlistment of slaves in the Army, stipulating that the slave so enlisted be henceforth a free man and that his loyal owner be entitled to compensation not exceeding \$300 for each slave enlisted. Under this pledge thousands of slaves rushed into the Army and bore a conspicuous part in crushing the rebellion. Commissioners were appointed by President Lincoln in several States—George D. Blakey being one of three in Kentucky—to award the promised compensation but scon a cry was raised in Congress that compensations were being awarded to disloyal men and the law was suspended by act of Congress and in that condition it stands today. The Government was true to its pledge of freedom to the slaves but faithless and false to the owners.

George D. Blakey was a presidential elector and one of a committee sent to notify Lincoln of his 2nd nomination. He was author of a series of articles, sixty-two in all, entitled "Men Whom I Remember" published in Russellville Herald, Russellville, Ky. 1879-80 and re-published by that paper twice since, on request of subscribers. Recently a photostatic copy was made of the old store ledger of 1807 containing these articles and other speeches and news-paper clippings saved by him, and placed in Kentucky Historical Building of Teachers College, Bowling Green, Ky.

It is clear from the will of Joseph Anthony dated Sept. 24, 1785 that Winifred m. Joseph Blakey after the death of her father."

Notes furnished by Mrs. Edgar L. Smith, Washington, Ga. (Genealogist) from Wilkes Co. Records:

"Jan. 7, 1800 Minutes of Inferior Court 1799 to 1801 p. 14, Joseph Blakey, dec'd. Bolling Anthony and John Carter appointed administrator. p. 50, same book. Bolling Anthony appointed guardian of Betsy, Thomas and Nancy Blakey, orphans of Joseph Blakey dec'd. John Freeman and Wm. Triplett Sect. Aug. 1, 1800.

Sometimes after 1800 James Anthony was one of the administrators of the estate of said Joseph Blakey dec'd. (James and Bolling Anthony were brothers of Winifred Anthony). Wilkes Co. Records, deed XX p. 206 May 4, 1807 Bolling Anthony and John Carter adm's. of estate of Joseph Blakey dec'd of Wilkes Co. of the one part to John Jackson of Wilkes, consideration \$800.00—329 acres on the waters of Hardin's Fork of Fishing Creek whereon said Joseph Blakey lived and died, adjoining Drury Williams and John Harris. Test. F. L. Thurmond.

Morgan Co. Ga. records: Deed C, p. 15, James Anthony of Jones Co., Thomas Blakey and Nancy Blakey of the one part to Wm. Swift—a lot drawn by the orphans of Joseph Blakey located in Baldwin Co. lot no. 94-5 dist. Jan. 10, 1811. (Betsy Blakey seems not to be included in this. May have come of age or may have died)."

Winifred Anthony Blakey probably married John Carter after the death of Joseph Blakey, and not Christopher Carter, (as given in Anthony data in connection with Churchill Blakey and Agnes Anthony lines)

Wilkes Co. records show John Carter as administrator of children of Joseph Blakey and a record of the death of John Carter 1816 who left widow Winifred.

None of this is proven further than records quoted.

The first book of marriage records of Wilkes Co. Ga. was burned.

He was invited to Buckingham, where he met and married Catherine Blakey."

The Stockton line down to the Elder Robert Stockton, from files of W. W. Charters, Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio. From Elder Robert Stockton to completion of Garnett line, furnished by Mrs. J. W. Bybee, Peoria, Ill., who states that Robert, John and Richard Stockton, brothers, moved to State of Va. before the Revolution.

References of Mrs. Bybee: Bible of Robert Stockton; Amer. Hist. of Stockton Family; notes of Henry Eubank; Bible of Joseph Stockton; notes of Betty Irby 1898.

References of Mr. Charters: The Stockton Family of New Jersey and Other Stocktons, by Thomas Coates Stockton M. D. San Diego, Cal.; Semple's Hist. of the Rise and Progress of the Baptists in Va., Baptist Pub. Soc., Philadelphia; Hist. of Albemarle Co. Va., by Rev. Edgar Woods; and other sources. Mr. Charters' research reveals: There is no evidence that the Stocktons of Albemarle are related to the Stocktons of New Jersey who have been the prominent Stockton Family in America: Richard "The signer", Commodore Robert Feild Stockton, and others. It is probable that Davis Stockton, the founder of the Albemarle branch, was a brother of Robert Stockton who founded the Pennsylvania branch of Stocktons; that is, they were born about the same time, both settled in Lancaster Co. Penn. and among their descendants a tradition of relationship survives.

Of the Albemarle family, the Rev. Edgar Woods says: "Among the earliest settlers in the western part of the county who came, as is said under the leadership of Michael Woods, was a family named Stockton. Though their name has entirely disappeared they have in a number of ways left their mark behind. They consisted of several branches. They erected perhaps the first mill in that section of the country. The north fork of Mechum's River still bears the name of Stockton's Creek, and the south fork in early times was called Stockton's Mill Creek and the first name by which Isreal's Gap was known was Stockton's Thoroughfare. The famous abbreviation of D.S. is also ascribed to the head of the family. One story recites that Michael Woods and Davis Stockton landed at Williamsburg and came to the wilds of Goochland together, that arriving at D.S. they advanced in different directions, Woods continuing straight forward to Wood's Gap and Stockton bearing to the left along the foot of the mountain towards Batesville and that as a memorial of the place where they separated, Stockton carved his initials on a tree. While their landing on the eastern shores of Virginia is contrary to all the best traditions, there may be truth in the rest of the narration. Both were patentees of land, and they may have gone from the foot of the Ridge to Williamsburg on business; on their return, the separation would naturally have taken place at the point mentioned as Wood's home lay at the mouth of Wood's Gap and the Stocktons were settled along Mecham's river, the south fork as well as the north."

DAVIS STOCKTON, the founder of the Albemarle family of Stockton, came from the north of Ireland and settled first in Lancaster County, Pa., and then in Goochland Co. (Later Albemarle Co.) Va. His first entry of 400 acres on Ivy Creek was made on March 12, 1739 (adjoining the land of his son-in-law Adam Godylouch NJS.), and in 1741 he patented 800 more on both forks of the Mecham's. Altogether, the family connection obtained grants of nearly 4000 acres in that section(w). In 1747 he, with 56 other citizens signed a subscription list for the support of Rev. Samuel Black as pastor. Davis was one of seven to subscribe the maximum of 1 pound sterling (W.p362). On Nov. 8, 1758, he received from one Thomas Langford a recorded receipt in full for all bills, bonds, back debts and accounts, and all contracts and agreements that "ever was" between the two (NJS.p 234, says in error that he died 1769; W.p.395 says 1760; D.p.31 gives record of the inventory of his estate on Jan. 8, 1762.

His wife, Matha Chapman, was born March 1692. Her parents were Robert and Rebecca Chapman "late of the township of Chesterfield Co. of Burlington province of West Jersey". After the death of Davis 1760 she married Samuel Arnold and after his death she gave power of attorney in Sept. 1765, to her "trusty friend and Loving Son, Thomas Stockton to receive all gifts and legacies" from her deceased father. Later on, Jan. 8, 1771 she deeded personal property "for the support of my frail body" to Thomas (D.34). In both cases she made her mark instead of signing her name. Children of Martha and Davis Stockton: Richard, Samuel, William, Thomas and Hannah.

RICHARD STOCKTON (Davis¹) obtained a grant of land in Goochland Co., July 23, 1745, three months before his brother Thomas. Subsequently he obtained other tracts in the same county (NJS.). On June 26, 1751, a deed was recorded from Richard and Agnes his wife (both made their marks) of St. Anne Parish, Albemarle Co. to the Rev. Samuel Black for 400 acres on both sides of Stockton Creek. Richard's name was signed Richard R. and his wife Agnes A. (D.32). Again on May 12, 1764, they sold 400 acres to David Kinkead (D.33). On Jan. 2, 1764 he witnessed the sale of 400 by Adam Goudilock to Thomas Stockton (D.33). He died in 1775. Will made on July 21, 1775, probated in Oct. Court 1775 (NJS.236). Children of Richard and Agnes A. Stockton:—Thomas; John m. Mary Morton of Va., where he lived until his death, after which his wife moved to Ky. 5 sons and 6 daughters; Robert m. Catherine Blakey (see No, 9); David; Richard m. Miss Copeland in Va., sons Copeland and Preston Stockton; Nancy m. Mr. Shields; Margaret m. Mr. Puliam; Sarah m. Mr. Ross; Winneford m. Mr. Rundels; a dau. m. Mr. Wilkey; Jemima m. Mr. Sharp; Elizabeth m. Mr. Lockhart; Deborah m. Mr. McMahan.

ROBERT STOCKTON (Davis¹ Richard²) was called "The Elder". Prior to 1797 he moved to Henry Co. Va. with brothers John and Richard. He founded several churches in the Strawberry Association (S) and emigrated to Barren Co. Ky. 1799. Preached the gospel for over fifty years. He was Soldier of the Revolution; taken prisoner at Battle of Brandywine; released by American soldiers.

In 1683 patented 260 acres of land on south side of Graden Creek in Gloucester Co. between the lands of John Smith and John Daggs (grant b.7p259). In 1692 he purchased from John Baker of Gloucester 600 acres lying in Essex Co. He lived and probably died in Gloucester but his sons John and Thomas moved to this tract of land. John moving there immediately after the purchase. In 1704 John Sr. is listed as owning 250 acres in Gloucester Co.

Elizabeth Jones Bowler 1733. (Will Book 4 p. 395, dated Oct. 20, 1730 says Elizabeth Jones and John Edmonson, James Jones, dec'd.) (Will book 5, p. 268 dated Feb. 19, 1733-4 says Anthony Garnett and wife Elizabeth receive ¹/₃ of the negroes belonging to the estate of Robert Jones dec'd and Elizabeth receives her dower rights in slaves and other property of the estate). Also Essex Co. deed book p. 15-16 deed of lease and release by Anthony Garnett and Elizabeth his wife of St. Ann's Parish, to Susannah Boulware, by which they convey all dower and interest of Elizabeth as widow and relick of John Bouler, brother of Susannah. Elizabeth is described therein as the dau. of Robert Jones, dated Aug. 20, 1733. In 1750 Anthony was living in St. Mark's parish, Culpeper Co. (deed b. 25, p. 32-34 Essex Co.) Anthony Garnett and Elizabeth his wife convey 400 acres in St. Ann's Parish to Dodson. Anthony is supposed to have moved to Culpeper Co. (then Orange about 1741.

Proof that Anthony was son of Thomas: (Deed b. 28, p. 115 Oct. 27, 1758, Essex Co.) Anthony Garnett and Elizabeth his wife of Culpeper, to Richard Moell of Essex, two tracts of land, one of 150 acres that descended to said Anthony as Heir-in-law of his father Thomas Garnett dec'd, and the other 30 acres which said Anthony bought from his brother John. Anthony purchased Orange Co. (or Culpeper Co.) land 1741. Deed b. 5, p. 57. Deed by Butler Spottswood of Orange Co. et al executors of will of Alexander Spottswood of Orange by which they conveyed to Anthony Garnett 150 acres in St. Mark's Parish, to have and to hold said lands unto Anthony Garnett and his assignees for and during his natural life and the natural life and the natural lives of Robert and Thomas Garnett, his sons, and for and during the natural lives of the longest liver of them. Dated Dec. 20, 1741. Deed b. 24, p. 132 Essex Co. Deed dated June 15, 1747 by John Garnett of Essex to Anthony Garnett of Orange, conveying 30 acres more or less, described as "all that dividend or parcell of land within the bounds of the said John Garnett, lying and being on the south side of the road that leads to the range being about 30 acres more or less" and also all the right and title John Garnett may have in 100 acres now in possession of the said Anthony Garnett which formerly did belong to Anthony Garnett, dec'd uncle of the said Anthony and John Garnett, parties to these presents, by the last Will and Testament of John Garnett, late of Gloucester Co. dec'd. (This establishes Anthony as grandson of John of Gloucester).

Saffell in his record of the Rev. War mentions Anthony Garnett as a private in Company of Col. Dan Morgan's Riflemen. In 1778 the men left in this company were incorporated with Potterfield's Company. Whether all or part of this service can be credited to Anthony, son of Thomas and grandson of John has not been established. The date of Anthony's death is not known. It is thought to have been about 1803 and that he was probably buried in a small family burial lot on the Horse Shoe farm near the site of the present buildings. After the war his son became a Baptist but Anthony is said to have remained Vestryman and Lay reader of St. Mark's Parish from 1758 until his death. There were many marriages and intermarriages between the two houses as late even as 1811 when Alexander (Oglesby) Attkisson married his cousin Jemima Douglas Oglesby. In Scotland they were loyal to their King. In America the family was divided; some fought in American Revolution, others were loyal to their King. In the War between the States some wore the blue, some the gray. The breach thus formed was never healed. Descendants of both sides were in the late World War.

According to Dr. Whitsitt (American Historical Magazine Vol. IX): "GEORGE is apparently the person whose name is mentioned by the William and Mary Quarterly, Vol. IX, p. 41: Among the Middlesex Marriage bonds are the following: George Blakey bond to m. Catherine Shelton, Dec. 31, 1743. Security, Robert Daniel. Perhaps he was still a resident of Middlesex though not of Christ Church Parish when he married Catherine Shelton. In the register of the Parish p. 104, the following entry appears to refer to her: Catherine, dau. of Ralph and Mary Shelton b. Jan. 26, bapt. Mch. ye 17, 1719."

Hard by in the county of Madison lived Mr. James Blakey, a scholarly man, with his father-in-law, Capt. Angus Rucker, the Revolutionary veteran drawing the round pension of \$1,200 a year, albeit he was up in the nineties. Capt. Rucker's estates were large and his revenues so abundant that he could have his household live after the hospitable ways of old. His grandson and namesake, Angus Rucker Blakey, had recently graduated at the University of Virginia, and was the Commonwealth's Attorney both of the county of Greene (for twenty-four years) and of Madison (for twelve years.) In this way, through a friendship formed with the young attorney, the most energetic and progressive young merchant in the county, Alfred D. Almond, met his future wife, Miss Jane Allen Blakey.

A few years since, from the rectory of Trinity church, Lime Rock, Connecticut, close under the Berkshire Hills, came a request from an eminent authoress, the compiler of a popular volume of poetry, asking the writer of this article for some information concerning his birth, parentage, education, and life work. He gave her succinctly the facts sought, and you may judge his surprise when from the heart of New England, whence least expected, there came this response: "Your letter in reply to mine has reached me, and, now that business has had its turn, allow me to disclose my identity to you. I am a Virginian. I was born at Madison Court House. I have a very vivid recollection of having known Miss Jane Allen Blakey when I was a child. To me then she was the incarnation of physical loveliness, and I still think she was one of the most beautiful women I have ever seen in all my life." In a subsequent letter she wrote: "Beautiful as she was in form and figure, she was none the less so in character and mental endowments. I well remember her as the teacher of a class in the Sabbath-school, and how she was admired and beloved by all who knew her."

In January, 1848, Alfred D. Almond and Jane Allen Blakey were pronounced man and wife by the Rev. William Buckner Lewis, the bride's cousin.

Mrs. Gregory writes that her father Downing Lemuel Smith b. 1846, d. 1924, great grandson of Frances Blakey Bush, lived near Jane Allen Blakey Almond in Stanardsville, Green Co. Va. and thought that Jane was a nephew of Frances Blakey Bush, which adds to the evidence that Churchill, father of James D. was brother of Frances, both children of John and Jean Blakey.

The following is given here in the belief that this WILLIAM BLAKEY is also son of Churchill and Mary Clark Blakey, mentioned in will of Churchill, given above. Record incomplete and not proven.

Dr. Whitsitt's article states: "This Robert appears to be the

fifth child and youngest son (of Churchill and Sarah); the only one of them that remained in Middlesex home, but as he early moved from the limits of Christ Church Parish the Register makes no further mention of him. It is not known who he married, or how many children he left behind. The name of only one of his children, Churchill, has been recovered. The Middlesex records show that on the 15th of Oct. 1772, Churchill Blakey gave bond to marry Ann Chowning (W. and M. Q. VII, 193)".

Index to Wm. and Mary Quarterly Jan. 1934, p. 24:

"Churchill Blakey executor for will of William Chowning, King and Queen Co., 1808. Case called in Supreme Court, Newby's Administrators vs. Blakey. William Chowning (d. 1786), had a dau. Ann, who m. Churchill Blakey".

Wm. and M. Q. ix.41. Will of Churchill Blakey was proved in Middlesex Court June 27, 1814, and the names of his children were as follows: Jane Healy Blakey; Robert; Henry; Ann, wife of Thomas Kidd; Elizabeth; Catherine Chowning; Frances; Lucy.

Christ Church Parish Reg. p. 199: "William Chowning, son of Churchill and Ann Blakey b. Jan. 30th, 1775. On p. 303: William C. Blakey and Jane Healy (married) Jan. 28, 1802. These two items compared with the list given above must render it clear that Jane Healy Blakey was widow of William Chowning Blakey, deceased."

Dr. Whitsitt continues: "A well informed writer in W. and M. Q. Vol. ix,41, says that Robert Blakey, son of Churchill Blakey was captain of the Middlesex troop in the war of 1812. He married Frances D. Roan, dau. of Thomas Roan of Middleberry in Middlesex Co., Va., on Oct. 12, 1808. He was the father of John Chowning Blakey (died in 1859), who was the father of Hon. Thomas E. Blakey, of Essex Co., member of the present State Senate of Va. The latter writes that his grandfather Robert Blakey had a brother named Churchill Blakey, d. in infancy, and that he also named one of his sons Churchill, who likewise died in infancy."

The following construction is made from records above, records of Christ Church Parish, Middlesex, and from notes furnished by Mr. C. C. Chewning of Urbanna, Va., a personal friend and admirer of Mr. Robert Blakey, a former resident of Middlesex and senior by many years of Mr. Chewning.

Dr. Whitsitt states: "While it has been possible to recover the above notices of the sons of Churchill Blakey the first, I have not had the fortune to discover any items concerning his daughters Betty, Jane, Sarah, Susanna and Catherine. They were among the younger children and apparently none of them had married prior to the date when their mother Sarah George Blakey removed with them out of the limits of Christ Church Parish. Here is a wide field for research. There must be many people in Virginia and other States who bear the blood but not the name of these Blakeys".

CHURCHILL BLAKEY b. about 1750, and CELIE WHITE.

Connection of this line with Churchill and Sarah George Blakey descendants has not been established but is thought to exist. Material furnished through efforts of Maurice Wilson Blakey, Greenville, S. C., with assistance from relatives who furnished bible and family records.

A letter from Miss Mary E. Blakey (Dolly) gives the following: BEN F. BLAKEY, son of William and Mary, b. April 19, 1831, d. Feb. 5, 1861, m. Amanda M. Gaines, b. July 26, 1830 d. Oct. 18, 1910. Res. Saloma, Ky. Issue: Mary E. Blakey (Dolly) b. Jan. 17, 1861, never married; Joe Blakey, residence not given; and other children, all now dead. The letter also states that a daughter of William and Mary married Mr. Ramsey and had a son Hewlitt Ramsey living at Buffalo, Ky. Nothing more has been learned of this line of Ben F. Blakey.

Records furnished by Mrs. Blair give Ann Ball as dau. of Robert Ball and his 2nd wife Margaret (Peggy) Montgomery d. June 13, 1834, and that Ann Ball is half sister of Barilla Hall who m. Wm. T. Chewning Sr. (See Ann Thomas Blakey No. 6.)

Green Co. records do not support this but suggest the probability that Robert, mentioned in Court record, may have been son of Robert Ball and wife Margaret Montgomery, and that Robert Ball (1776-1866) probably married three times: Ann Webb, issue: Barilla; Margaret Montgomery, issue: Robert; Mariah, issue: Elizabeth and Ann. The deed mentions Elizabeth, Ann and Robert, but states only that Elizabeth and Ann are children of Mariah.
