Part II

In Part Two no effort has been made to write a complete history. It is simply a record of Vital Statistics followed by a brief sketch of the activities of each family. These sketches were prepared, and in general, completely written by a member of their family. With their splendid cooperation it has been possible to make the Statistical Record 100 per cent complete.

That the family originated in Wales and came over to England with Edward the First, at the time of the conquest or submission of that country to England is the conclusion of Rev. Josiah Brewer who in his journeys to and from Greece, (where he was interested in education and mission work) corresponded with, and looked up the old families. He found them rugged men of means and standing with all the facial characteristics and old family names of their English and American descendants.

That the Brewers of earlier days were a pious folk is evident by the frequent recurrence of that name in the records of the Congregational Society of Tyringham, now Monterey, Massachusetts. Among the names of those who formed a fund for the permanent support of that Church is found that of Josiah Brewer, next to Samuel Townsend, contributing the largest amount.

DANIEL BREWER
Roxbury, Mass.

The first of the present family, according to "American Ancestry", was Daniel Brewer, who was born in England in about 1596 and emigrated to this country in the vessel "Lion" in 1632 and settled at Roxbury with his wife Joanna, who died at Roxbury Feb. 7, 1689, aged 87 years. He died early in 1646.

Capt. John Brewer I, of Cambridge, Mass., was born in 1624 and died in 1708. He is judged by Hinman, in his "Catalogue of the First Puritan Settlers", published in 1853, to have been the son of Joanna and Daniel. By his first wife Ann he had a son, John, born Nov. 8, 1642, and a daughter, Hannah, born Jan. 13, 1644. Upon the death of his first wife he married again in Oct. 23, 1647, Mary Whitmore, of Lynn, Mass., by whom he had three children:

John Brewer 2, of Sudbury, the son of Capt. John and Ann, was born Nov. 8, 1642, and died Jan. 1, 1691. He removed to Sudbury with his father's family and married Elizabeth, daughter of Henry Rice, who lived at Sudbury, and had nine children:

LIEUT. JOHN BREWER
Weston, Mass.

Lieut. John Brewer 3. according to Bond's "History of Watertown", was born Sept. 29, 1669, and resided first in Sudbury, afterwards settling in Watertown Farms, later known as Weston. According to the Watertown records he married July 5, 1693, Hannah Hones, but there is little doubt but that here is an error and that it should be Mary Jones; otherwise Hannah died very soon and he then married Mary. He died May 5, 1709, aged 40, leaving widow Mary, and is buried in the oldest cemetery in Weston, the one on Central Avenue, opposite the head of Concord Street. At the time of his death inventory of the estate showed 533 L. 3s. 6d., including a farm and 216 acres of other land, a saw mill and a grist mill. His widow was licensed Jan. 1, 1617, to keep a public house.

CAPT. JOHN BREWER
Tyringham, Mass.

Capt. John Brewer 4 was born, according to Bond's "History of Watertown" in 1697 and married Hannah Merriam in Weston Oct. 9, 1718. She was born in Lexington Apr. 16, 1701, and was the daughter of Robert and Abigail Merriam. He died Dec. 31, 1765, at Tyringham.

The family removed to Tyringham, according to Stebbins' "History of Tyringham", in Aug. 1739, with the families of Isaac Garfield, (one of the ancestors of the family of the late President Garfield), Thomas Slayton and John Chadwick. The town of Tyringham, Berkshire County, Mass., was established Mar. 6, 1762; prior to which time it was known as new Plantation Number One.

At Tyringham Capt. Brewer 4, erected a house a little south of Twelve Mile, or Brewer's Pond, in 1881 renamed Lake Garfield, for the President who when a student at Williams College often visited relatives in that vicinity. Here, in accordance with a contract made with the proprietors, by which he received certain grants, he erected on the site of the present Langdon Mills, several mills which he operated very successfully for a number of years. Capt. Brewer's house - the first frame house erected in the Township, was one among those houses which were fortified when the French and Indian War began in 1744 and in it was placed a garrison of soldiers by the Provincial Government. (Holland and Fields Histories of Berkshire County,)

John Brewer 6, was a corporal in Capt. William King's company of Minutemen, Col. John Fellow's regiment, which marched April 21, 1775 in response to the alarm of Apr. 19. He also was a sergeant in Capt. Noah Longston's company of Col. John Ashley's 1st Berkshire regiment, entering this service April 26, 1777, to march to Saratoga by order of Gen. Gates. Also on July 8, 1777, he marched to Kingsbury by order of Brig. Gen. Fellows and also, on Aug. 17, 1777, marched to Bennington. He also served as second lieutenant in Solomon Jackson's company of Col. Ashley's regiment from Oct. 13, 1781, to Oct. 20, 1781, on an alarm at the northward.

DANIEL PORTER BREWER
Portland, Ill.

Son of Daniel and Electa (Langdon) Brewer was born in Berkshire County, Mass., Nov. 18, 1809. He died in Portland, Ill., Dec. 12, 1902.

February 15, 1834, he married Emeline Hollister, who was born in Berkshire County, Mass., May 13, 1813. She died Nov. 19, 1894.

Mr. Brewer was a tailor by trade which he followed until his removal to Portland, Ill., in 1837. Transportation was not as simple 100 years ago as it is today but at that it would seem as though Mr. Brewer chose the hard way in making the trip. The family, consisting of himself, Emeline, his wife, their year old son, Fernando, and a young lady who was his assistant in the tailor shop, obtained passage on a boat on the Erie Canal. After making their way across New York State they contacted the Ohio River and were taken to Cairo, Ill. by boat. From there a Mississippi River boat took them to Rock Island, Ill. Mr. Brewer left his family there and made his way on foot thirty miles to the home of Cuy Wray in Portland, Ill. Mr. Wray gladly loaned him a team of horses and wagon to drive back to Rock Island and bring his family to the Wray home.

The family stayed with the Wrays until the completion of their log cabin on land they purchased about a mile away. This cabin exists today, a part of the house built later by Mr. Brewer, and was occupied by their grand daughter Mrs. Charles Mulcay until the present year of 1950.

FERNANDO NATHANIEL BREWER

Son of Daniel Porter and Emeline (Hollister) Brewer was born in Berkshire County, Mass., July 23, 1836. He died Feb. 21, 1934.

He was married Feb. 12, 1863 to Cordelia Frary, daughter of Marvin and Eliza (Wight) Frary. She was born in Prophetstown Dec. 20, 1842 and died Jan. 21, 1913.

Mr. Brewer attended the first school established in Whiteside county and remained at home until he was twenty-six years of age, working the old homestead farm on shares with his father for five years.

Shortly after his marriage he purchased a farm three miles north-west of Lyndon. Later purchases increased his holdings to four-hundred acres. He engaged in general farming making a specialty of raising Durham cattle.

When the old Settler's Association was organized he was chosen one of the directors-- a position which he held during its entire existence; was a director of the Whiteside County Fair Association, and served as Supervisor and Assessor and in other positions of trust in Lyndon Township.

In 1891 his son assumed the management of the farm and he purchased a home in Prophetstown and retired. Mr. and Mrs. Brewer held membership in the Methodist church.

The last years of his life Mr. Brewer lived with his daughter, Mrs. George Fisk.
