INTRODUCTION.

The past few years have witnessed an increased interest in genealogical work. Writing a family history, once generally regarded as a pursuit of royal pedigree, has come to be a task, by no means uninteresting in many an unpretentious family. As a plain and comprehensive record of one's ancestors, not as incidental steps back to some more or less illustrious person, does a family history most truly serve its purpose.

This book is not a complete history of the Butts family. The record begins with Thomas Butts, who came to this country from Norfolk County, England, in 1660. To trace the genealogy of each of his four children would be a task most difficult to accomplish, and one which the duties of my profession would forbid me to attempt. The name of Daniel Butts, page 31 (the fifth generation from Thomas) marks the point at which this book begins to be a complete record.

It was my original intention, when I had traced the genealogy of all the descendants of Daniel Butts, to publish the work and to call it "Daniel Butts, His Ancestors and His Descendants." While collecting the data, I obtained incidentally considerable information about other branches of the family, and I decided to include it in my work in the hope that some other member of the family might take it in hand and try to complete the various lines. In order to make the title consistent, I changed the name of the work to "John Butts, His Ancestors and Some of His Descendants." John Butts was the first member of the family to settle in Dutchess County, New York. The additional matter

to which I refer will be found in the last part of the book; beginning on page 86.

This work contains no record of the immediate ancestry of Thomas Butts, the first member of the family to settle in America. "The Visitation of Norfolk" (Norwich, 1878) contains a genealogy of the Butts family on page 343. The same pedigree may be found in "Kent Genealogies" (London, 1830), page 257. Both of these works give generations of the Butts family extending through the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries. I have made no special effort to trace the ancestry of Thomas Butts, but have no doubt that he could be connected with the old English record to which I have referred. The family coat of arms which I have inserted is from "Kent Genealogies," page 257.

It remains to say a word about the sources from which my information relating to the family in America has been derived. While my father was still living, I frequently turned to him with questions about the family. His death and the extreme age of my great aunt, Mary Canfield, the only surviving child of Daniel Butts, impressed upon me the fact that those, from whom authentic information concerning the family could be obtained, were rapidly passing away, and induced me to collect and put in permanent form this genealogy of the branch of the family to which I belong. I have been fortunate in collecting my data while Mrs. Canfield was still living. She gave me much information that I could not otherwise have obtained. She died in May, 1898, before the book was printed.

My other sources of information have been, official records, family records, correspondence with members of the family and genealogical works. Of the last I would mention Munsell's "American Ancestry," Austin's "Genealogical Dictionary of Rhode Island," and the "Vital Records of Rhode Island" compiled by James Newell Arnold. A complete list of the persons to whom I am indebted is impracticable. Suffice it to say that I am grateful for the many favors I have received, and for the kind coöperation of the various members of the family who have furnished me with data. No effort has been spared to have the record accurate. Despite all care, however, mistakes are unavoidable, and I apologize for them in advance. Readers are requested to inform me whenever they notice any error. I have accepted nothing unless it came from a reliable and trustworthy source.

The system of arrangement of the work is exceedingly simple and needs little explanation.* The plan is the result of much study and thought by Mr. W. Ogden Wheeler of Sharon, Conn., to whom I acknowledge thanks for its use.

The spelling of the name is not uniform. In the old records we find both "Butt" and "Butts." Later all spell the name "Butts."

My brothers, Charles H. Butts and Elias N. Butts, have shared with me the expense of publishing this book.

Hoping that it will prove as interesting to my kindred as it has to me, I remain,

The following letters were received by me in answer to inquiries concerning the ancestry of Thomas Butts who came from Norfolk, England:

> IVY HOUSE, EATON, NORWICH, ENGLAND.

Allison Butts, Esq.,

August 23, 1898.

Dear Sir-I must apologize for not answering your letter ere this, but I have been away from home on a short holiday. I have the pedigrees of all the Norfolk families as they were in 1600 (with some additions by editors of the present century), taken from the MSS. in the British Museum. I find the family of Butts from 1552 to 1625, but no later. They were considered a family of some importance-one high Sheriff of Norfolk and Suffolk, another a Baronet and had estates at Garboldisham, Shouldham Thorpe and other places in this county, but they have apparently disappeared. If you desire the pedigrees from 1600 onwards, no doubt they can be found on searching the Parish Registers, but this would be a lengthy business and would cost anywhere between ten and twenty pounds. Although the name of Butts is no longer conspicuous, one of the family may have been made a peer and the family name covered by a title. I cannot give you the name of an expert in such matters (at the moment), but on inquiry, I am almost sure I could do so if you wish. I shall be pleased if I can be of service.

Sir—Your letter to the Librarian British Museum has been handed to me for reply, as I am an experienced searcher and have been employed for many years at the B. M. in this kind of work.

I find that the family of Butts is one of the oldest in Norfolk, but a branch also settled in Suffolk. I mention this because there is a much better history of Suffolk than of Norfolk, which, tho' it is in manuscript only, gives much longer and fuller pedigrees and much more information than any history of Norfolk. I have looked at every pedigree in both counties, but I find it quite impossible to locate your Thomas Butts, tho' there were Thomas Butts, but they are too early except one who died in 1600. One member of the family became the first wife of Sir Nicholas Bacon, father of the great Francis Bacon; one member of the family was Dr. Henry Butts, D.D., Master of Benel College in 1626. In 1632, being to preach before the University on Easter day, he was found hanged in his bedroom. Whether he was married or left children is not known, but his property (as was the custom in those days) was forfeited to the Crown.

There are a number of pedigrees and a large amount of information of the various families of Butts in Dary's Suffolk (MS.), but I have read it carefully through and find no trace of your Thomas. This is also the case with the Norfolk Butts. I remain,

The following from "Hakluyt's Voyages," Vol. III, pages 168 and 169, will be of interest :

In 1536, Master Hare of London went on a voyage to Cape Breton and Newfoundland. Among his companions was "Mr. Thomas Buts, the sonne of Sir William Buts, Knight of *Norfolke*, which was lately living and from whose mouth I wrote most of this relation." They returned to St. Ives in Cornwall about the end of October. "From thence they departed unto a certain castle belonging to Sir John Luttrell, where M. Thomas Buts and M. Rastall and other gentlemen of the voyage were very friendly entertained; after that they came to the Earle of Bathe at Bathe

and thence to Bristol, so to London. M. Buts was so changed in the voyage with hunger and miserie that Sir William, his father, and my lady, his mother, knew him not to be their sonne until they found a secret mark, which was a wart upon one of his knees."

The following extracts are taken from "Notes and Queries," a genealogical publication, to be found in the Congressional Library at Washington, D. C.:

Bishop Butts was a descendant of an ancient family, inheriting property extending through many generations, from before the time of Edward II to James II, situated at Shouldham Thorpe, Norfolk, in the church of which place are many monuments of the family. (Vol. II, page 17.)

It is now indeed long since I requested a reference to the passage in Camden, from which, according to E. D. B., it would appear that a William Butts was one of the Knights slain at Poitiers in 1356, when fighting in the van of the army with Lord Audley. I found a table of descent commencing with a Butts said to have married a daughter of Sir William Fitzhough, Knight. His son is called Sir William Butts, Lord of Shouldham Thorpe, County of Norfolk, and of Coughton County, Chester, slain in the battle of Poitiers, with a reference to Camden.

The next in descent mentioned is William Butts (and Ursula Ellis), of Shouldham Thorpe. This William is the first mentioned in the Visitation of 1619. His wife was a Kervill, and from him to Leonard Butts who sold Norfolk property to settle at Bromley, Kent County, the line is complete. Leonard Butts married Jane, daughter of — Leonard, of Suffolk. He signed the Visitation pedigree of 1619, and, as I suppose, died without issue. (Vol. VIII, page 435.)

A merchant family of this name flourished in the city of Norwich during the thirteenth century and the two following centuries. Members of it were repeatedly called upon to represent their fellow citizens in the frequent Parliaments of the period.

They were altogether people of great wealth, conservative and of

influence in the native place. The last who held office was John Butts, Esq., Sheriff in 1456 and mayor from 1462 to 1471. He died in 1475. After this there is no more mention of the name. The next publicity occurs, as far as I know, in reference to Sir William Butts, of Ryburgh, the physician to Henry VIII, who died in 1545.

(A note in fine print at the bottom of the page reads as follows:)

"Sir William Butts, who was slain whilst fighting in the van of the English army commanded by Lord Audley under Edward, the Black Prince, at the battle of Poitiers." (Vol. IX, page 149.)

Thomas Butts came to America from Norfolk, Eng., May 18th, 1660, and lived at Portsmouth and Little Compton, R. I., which were then in Massachusetts and a part of the Plymouth Colony.

- 1662, Nov. 16, Portsmouth. He bought four acres of Richard Hart.
- 1666, Oct. 1. He bought of Richard Bulgar two acres in Portsmouth for a cow and 10 s. in wampum.
- 1668, Nov. 20. He deeded William Earle seven acres.
- 1668, Nov. 20. He bought of Ralph Earl of Dartmouth a quarter of a purchaser's share of Meadow and an eighth share of upland in Dartmouth.
- 1682, Oct. 31, Little Compton. He and James Case were to be sent for to the next Court to give reason for their being and continuance at Punckateest without liberty first obtained so to do from this government (Plymouth Colony Records, Vol. VI, p. 98).
- 1685, Oct. 27. He was granted a division of land in Dartmouth purchased of Woosamequin and Wamsutta.
- 1696, Mar. 13. He sold to Edward Gray of Tiverton, land in Little Compton for 70 pounds.

He died in 1703, leaving a Will which was proved Feb. 2, 1703, and is recorded in the Probate Office at Taunton, Bristol County, Mass., in Book 2, p. 71.

The Will is as follows :

WILL OF THOMAS BUTT.

In the name of God Allmighty, Amen. This being the last will and testament of me, Thomas Butt of ye town of Little Compton, within the County of Bristoll in New England, Cooper, being very sick & weake of body butt of perfect memory and well in mind thanks be given unto Allmighty God for his manifold graces & merceys bestowed upon me and calling to mind the mortallity of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to dye, and for the true settlement and divission of what I am seased of at this present to my beloved wife Elizabeth Butt, my children & grand children, to prevent law suits or any controversye that may after my decease arise amongst them about the same, do make & ordain this to be my last will and testament, that is to say and be understood princably and first of all I give and recommend my spirrit unto God that gave it me and my body to the dust or earth from whence it was taken. And as touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with all I divid & dispose of the same truly & senceerly in manner & form following, first & after all my just debts be truely & duely payd by my executrix after mentioned withall injoyning her to perform without any senister reservation.

Be it known for the true love & tender affection I have & bare to my beloved wife Elizabeth Butt who hath been a tender beloved wife to me, do constitute and appoint her to be my sole executrix of this my last will & testament to see it truely performed with and by the advice, approbation & consent of my two overseers (with her) of this my last will & testament their names inserted in the conclusion of this my will.

Ittem, I give and bequeath freely & absolutely unto my eldest son Zacheus Butt & to his wife Sarah Butt & to my granddaughter Sarah Butt & to my grandson John Butt the son of Zaccheus, and to my grandchild Mary Butt & to my grand child Abigail Butt and to my grand daughter or child Elizabeth Butt all which children or grand children before mentioned being the children of my said son Zacheus Butt & Sarah his now wife, I will and bequeath unto my said son and Sarah his wife & children before mentioned the two and thirtyeth part of a purchase right or share of land lyeing & being within the Township of Dartmouth within the County of Bristoll aforesaid, to them their heirs or assigns forever, provided that if either of my above grand children decease before marriag or without issue that then their part or that part of said land by me willed unto them shall be equally divided amongst the survivors of them or their heires without fraud or deceit and my son Zaccheus Butt not to intermeddle or concern himself with his wives part of sd. land without her consent or leave "sealed."

Ittem, I give and bequeath unto my grand son John Butt, the son of Zacheus Butt ten acres of wood land lyeing & being within the Township of Dartmouth within ye County above sd., to him his heires & assignes forever without reservation.

Ittem, I give & bequeath to my beloved son Zacheus Butt the eighth part of the last divission of land lyeing & being within the Township of Little Compton, within the County absd. being part of the 24 acre lott formerly belonging to Thomas "Purrkin."

Ittem, I give and bequeath unto my two sons Idido Butt & Moses Butt thirty acres of land lyeing & being within the Township of Little Compton & on the north side of William Earle house where it now standeth.

Itt, I will that my wife Elizabeth & my son Moses Butt shall build ann house upon the abovesd. thirty acres of land which house shall be sixteen foot square which may in time be tennantable & fence in a field & lett it out & the rent thereof shall be for my said

wife & son Moses and they shall hereby be oblidged to maintaine Idido Butt dureing his lamenes but if it should please God to restore my said son Idido to his former health & of his lamenes

that then the said house that "they" build & thirty acres of land shall be Idido Butt his heires & assignes forever, but provided that my sonne Idido Butt shall or doth decease without lawfull issue that then what is above mentioned given to him & his heirs shall return to my said sonne Moses Butt & his heires & assignes forever, my wife Elizabeth Butt haveing her equal part in said house and land dureing her natural life.

Ittem, I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Butt my now dwelling house and all the land thereunto belonging to be at her despose dureing her life, allwayes provided she remaineth unmarried and after her decease the above said house & land afore mentioned I will give & bequeath unto my said son Moses Butt his heires or assignes forever, it being a thirty acre lott be it more or less as first surveyed.

Item, My will is that after my wives decease my daughter Hephzibah Earl shall have a cow delivered to her for her own use.

Ittem, I will & bequeath unto my grandaughter Sarah Butt, the sum of five pounds to be paid to her at her day of marriage in money or equivolent.

And all the rest of my land or estate be it here or elswhere with my maid servant called by the name of Ann Dier and an Indian man called by the name of Pope I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Butt her heires or assignes as firmely to all intents & purposes in law as might be recorded or written according to law without reservation. Appointing my trusty and wel beloved friends Aron Davis, Jun. and Joseph Wilbore of Little Compton to be my overseers of this my last will & testament with the advice of my sd. wife to see it performed.

Ittem. I will and request the authority for the time being to ayde and assist my said executrix & overseers in the performance of this my last will to be fullfilled according to my true intent and meaning, makeing null & voyde all former wills or testaments by me made before the sealeing hereof confirming all sales, gifts, grants by me given before the sealeing hereof if leagle not any wise interposeing this my last will & testament. To the confirmation of this my last will and testament I have hereunto sett my hand & seale in Little Compton this twenty-eighth day of December in the

year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred & two & signed sealed in the presence of

John Butts, of Tiverton, R. I. (son of Zaccheus), married (Ist) Susannah Wodell, December 11, 1712, and (2d) Abigail Moon, widow, January 29, 1724. He had five children by first wife and seven by his second, the births of all being recorded at Portsmouth, where he moved. It is not my purpose to include the family record of the descendants of Zaccheus Butts, as the ancestral line of Daniel Butts is through Moses, a brother of Zaccheus, and John, a son of Moses. I make the above reference to the family of John, son of Zaccheus, so he may not be confounded with his cousin John, whose family record is given at page 23.

Some time after his marriage, John Butts moved from Rhode Island and settled in the easterly part of what is now the town of Washington, Dutchess County, New York, then called Crom Elbow Precinct. Oct. 4, 1748, he purchased a tract of land containing 200 acres of Isaac Thorn, one of the early settlers of that County. This original deed is now in the possession of Mr. J. DeWitt Butts, of Rochester, N. Y., and by his courtesy I am able to insert a copy of it. (Mr. J. DeWitt Butts is a great grandson of Aaron Butts, who was one of the executors of the will of John Butts.) John Butts owned this land with other land adjoining until his death, and it is mentioned in his will, a copy of which is also inserted. It

is located in the east part of the town of Washington, Dutchess County, N. Y. The locality has long been known as "Butts Hollow."

The easterly line of the land purchased from Isaac Thorn is the division line between the towns of Amenia and Washington. By his will, John Butts divided his lands between his sons Thomas and Aaron, and it has since been further changed—parts taken from and added to.

The principal parts are now (1898) owned by the heirs of Cyrus Duncan and the heirs of Jesse Green. The Duncan farm is wholly within the boundaries of the Thorn land, its northeast corner being the northeast corner of the Thorn land. There is a tradition in the Butts family that John Butts took this land in payment of wages for carpenter work in building a house for Isaac Thorn at the rate of an acre of land for a day's work. The Thorn house was located near the village of Mechanic in the Town of Washington, and is referred to in the history of Dutchess County published in 1882, as follows:

"There were three brothers of the Thorns, of whom Isaac was the oldest, and, we are led to think, the possessor of the most land. He built a gambrel roofed house upon the hill east of the Brick Meeting House."



DEED FROM ISAAC THORN TO JOHN BUTT.

TO ALL PEOPLE TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING, &c.-Know ye that I, ISAAC THORN, of Crom Elbow Precinct, in the County of Dutchess and Province of New York, for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds current money of New York, to me in hand paid before the ensealing hereof, well and truly paid by John Butt, of said Crom Elbow Precinct, house wright, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and myself therewith fully satisfied, and thereof and of every part and parcel thereof do exonerate, acquit and discharge him, the said John Butt, his heirs, executors and administrators, by these presents. Have given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do freely, fully and absolutely give, grant, bargain, sell, aliene, convey and confirm unto him, the said John Butt, his heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of land, situate in said Crom Elbow Precinct, containing two hundred acres, being a part of the twentysixth lot in the Patent called the Great (or Lower) Nine Partners in the first and general division. Butted and bounded as follows, viz:—At the northeast corner with a stake and heap of stones, which is the northeast corner of said twenty-sixth lot, and from thence running south two degrees and forty minutes, east fifty-seven chains and fifty links with the east line of said lot to another stake and heap of stones; then west one degree and forty minutes, north thirty-four chains and seventy links to a stake and heap of stones; thence north two degrees and forty minutes, west fifty seven chains and seventy links to the north line of said lot; then east two degrees, south thirty-four chains and seventy links to the first mentioned corner; and it is butted north by the twenty-fifth lot, and

east partly by the twenty-ninth and partly by the twenty-eight lot in the Patent aforesaid, and south by Jacob Haight's land, and west by Samuel Stafford's land. To have and to hold said granted and bargained premises, with all the appurtenances, privileges and

commodities to the same, belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him, the said John Butt, his heirs and assigns forever to his and their own proper use, benefit and behoof forever. And, I, the said Isaac Thorn, for me, my heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant, promise and grant to and with him, the said John Butt, his heirs and assigns, that before the ensealing of these presents, I am the true, sole and lawful owner of the above bargained premises, and am lawfully seised and possessed of the same in my own proper right as a good, perfect and absolute estate of inheritance, in fee simple, and have in myself good right, full power and lawful authority to sell and dispose of the same in manner as above said. And that he, the said John Butt, his heirs and assigns, shall and may from time to time, and at all times forever hereafter, lawfully, peaceably and quietly have, hold, use, occupy, possess and enjoy the same, by force and virtue of these presents, free and clear, and freely and clearly acquitted, exonerated and discharged of and from all, and all manner of former and other gifts, grants, bargains, sales, leases, mortgages, wills, entails, joyntures, dowries, judgments, executions and encumbrances of what name and nature soever, that might in any measure or degree obstruct or make void this present deed.

FURTHERMORE, I, the said Isaac Thorn, for myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant and engage the above granted and bargained premises, with all the appurtenances unto him, the said John Butt, his heirs and assigns, against the lawful claims or demands of any other person or persons whatsoever to warrant, secure and defend by these presents.

I, John Butt of Charlotte Precinct, the County of Dutchess and State of New York, Carpenter, being at this time in a good degree in health of body, and a sound disposing mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, that is:

First :—I will and order that after my decease, my body be entered in a decent and Christian-like manner at the discretion of my executors hereinafter named.

Secondly:—I will and order that all my just debts be paid by my executors within some convenient time after my decease; also I give to my son Gershom Butt ten pounds; likewise to be paid by my said executors; also I give to the heirs of my son Moses Butt; also I give to my daughter Susannah, the widow of Nathan Weller, the sum of twenty shillings all current money of New York, to be paid by my said Executors in the space of one year after my decease; also I give to my two other daughters, Ruth, the wife of Joseph Brownell, and my daughter Sarah, the wife of Joseph Barns, all my indoors household goods and furniture, excepting one feather bed. which I give to my son Thomas; also I give to my son Thomas a piece or parcel of land located and set off from my farm, beginning at the northeast corner of my farm to the southeast corner of my farm, thence westerly across the two hundred acres, which I bought of Isaac Thorn; thence northerly to a hollow or gutter; thence down said gutter to the Great Brook or run of water; thence easterly down said brook to a walnut sapling standing on the east side of said brook; thence northerly to the barnyard; thence along said barnyard fence to the orchard fence; thence along said orchard fence until a hard maple tree bears due north

therefrom or from the aforesaid course; thence due north to said tree and to a small run of water; then along said run of water as the brook runs to my son Gershom's lands; thence easterly to the first mentioned bounds. Also I give to my son Thomas all and

every my alive stock, together with my dwelling house, barns and I have and also I give unto my son Aaron all the resiouthouses. due of my lands. Also I give to my son Thomas all my farmer's tools and utensils, excepting my cart which my sons Aaron and Thomas shall use between them as they shall agree; and also I give to my sons Aaron and Thomas all my carpenters and joiners tools to be equally divided between them. And also I will and order that my son Thomas, his heirs, shall always allow and permit my son Aaron a cartway through his land where it shall be most convenient for them both; and also I will and order that my executors do collect all my just debts for their own use in some convenient time after my decease and also I will and order that my two aforesaid, daughters Ruth and Sarah shall have all my within-doors household goods and furniture as above said, equally divided betwixt them, excepting the feather bed given to my son Thomas aforesaid.

And Lastly I nominate, constitute, make and appoint my two sons above named, Aaron and Thomas Butt, executors of this my last will and Testament, and hereby revoking and making void all former wills and Testaments and desire that the same may be so accepted and taken.

But little is known concerning this Moses Butts. He died in early life. It will be noticed that his father (John) in his will makes a bequest to "the heirs of my son Moses Butts," showing that Moses was dead when his father made this will (June 26th, 1783.) A copy of Moses' will is appended, and it will be noticed that his children were both minors when the will was made and he provides for a disposition of his property to his brothers and sisters in case his children "die before they should come to age."

WILL OF MOSES BUTT.

I, Moses Butt of Charlotte Precinct in Dutchess County and Province of New York being at this time weak in body and a sound and disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body do make, ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth, viz ;—Impremis that after my decease my body be interred in a decent and christian like manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and in some convenient time after my decease all my debts due unto me be called in by my Executors and all my grain to be sold, only a sufficient supply for my family and so much of my live stock to be sold with the grain as will pay all my just debts. Item. I give and bequeath

unto my beloved wife Mary the remaining part of my estate during her widowhood as the children comes of age. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Butt the whole of my land with allowing his mother her thirds during her natural life. I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah Butt the sum of eighty pounds to be paid by her brother Daniel when she comes of age. Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary one-third part of my movables after the children comes of age and I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Butt and to my daughter Hannah Butt the remaining part of my movables to be divided equally among them and if my son Daniel Butt and Hannah Butt should die before they should come to age or leave no issue, then I give and bequeath unto my brothers and sisters all my estate, except my household goods, them I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife to dispose as she see fitt and bequeath unto my brother John Butt, the sum of ten shillings and to my sister Susanna, twenty shillings and the rest of my estate to be divided among the rest of my brothers and sisters, to Gershom, Aaron and Thomas Butt and to Ruth Brownell and Sarah Barnes to be divided equally amongst, and last I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my esteemed friends Aaron Butt, Joseph Barnes, Mary Butt, all of Charlotte Precinct, to be sole executors of this my last Will and Testament reserving disannulling and making null and void, all former and other Wills and Testaments heretofore made by me, ratifying, allowing and confirming this and no other to be the last Will and Testament.

Daniel Butts and his wife Isabel were married at an early age.

They afterwards moved to the town of Greenbush, Rensselaer County, N. Y.

They resided there until 1795. In a deed dated April 13, 1795, executed by Daniel and his wife Isabel, conveying 130 acres of land in the town of Washington to Seth Higbee, they are described as residents of the town of Greenbush, Rensselaer County, N. Y. The land conveyed by this deed is located in Butts Hollow and adjoins the land owned by John Butts on the west. It is probably the land devised to Daniel by his father Moses. He again removed to Dutchess County (probably about the year 1800) and settled in the northerly part of the town of Stanford near a place called Cold Spring. He purchased of David Lapham a farm containing about 160 acres. About 1811 he built a large and substantial mansion. It was the largest and most substantial house in the vicinity for many years. It is yet standing, having the same general appearance as when erected. A good picture of it is contained in this book. Aunt Mary Canfield informs me that she well remembers when the house was built. She was then about eight years of age.

After Daniel's death, his son George purchased the shares of the other children in the farm.

The farm passed out of the family several years since, and is now owned by Leonard Porter.

Daniel Butts was fatally injured by being thrown from a horse and died from such injuries.

He and his wife Isabel are buried in the old Cemetery near Mc-Intyre, Dutchess County, N. Y.
