## PREFACE

BOURQUIN FAMILY of CAROLINA and GEORGIA

In the colony of Huguenots that came to South Carolina with Colonel John Pury in 1732 and settled at Purysburg, S.C. were two of the name of BOURQUIN, Henry Francois and Dr. John Baptiste, probably brothers. The following account will assist in placing many of the name and some of the collaterals.

## PREFACE, Second Edition, revised

Several years after the publication of the brief record of the BOURQUIN FAMILY in 1926 we discovered several records in private hands that caused us to make an exhaustive search of records in several places formerly unknown. A careful analysis of the land records of South Carolina and Georgia disclosed there were MARIE BOURQUIN, Widow, and at least FOUR children who came to South Carolina in 1732, i.e.:

JEAN BAPTISTE, HENRI FRANCOIS, ANNE MARIE and BENEDICT.

We felt that what had been published should be carefully revised and made to accord with new evidence. This has been done during the past ten years and it is believed every possible source of information has been exhausted.

While some changes in the original article were necessary they are

of a nature that does not disrupt the continuity.

To all those who have aided in any manner in making this record

complete grateful thanks are herewith extended.

This record is made upon titles, evidences deserving of credit and real documents taken from the Archives of the "Armorial General de France", manuscripts of the Cabinet des Titres in Paris, Archives of the Department de Nevers and the Library of the Chamber of Deputies, Paris, furnished from Paris in 1928.

The name BOURGOING, alias BOURGOIN and BOURQUIN, has been known in France since the XIV century as attest the ancient documents. The family possessed a Coat of Arms which belonged to JEAN BOURGOING, who was public Prosecutor at the bailiwick of Saint Pierre de Montiers. These arms are at the Cabinet des Titres and were registered at the Armorial General de France by an ordinance issued 8 June 1698.

Arms: Azure, a cross flory Or; escutcheon surmounted by

helmet around the neck a collar and medal Or.

Crest: A count's crown.

According to some manuscript notes preserved in the collection of Charles d'Hozier and in the archives of the Armorial General de France, the first items of the genealogy of this ancient house were engraved on a brass tablet sealed in the wall of Saint Martin's church in Nevers,

He married prior to 1691 Marie ..... born 16--, he apparently was deceased prior to 1730-32 as his widow and children migrated to South Carolina in 1732 with Pury's colony. These children form the basis for this record.

## 1 JEAN BAPTISTE (1) BOURQUIN

Born 1691 Switzerland, he married prior to 1714. His wife's name was Mary ....., and every indication surname was Lewis. Came to South Carolina in 1732 and settled at Purysburg. He had a grant of land 300 acres, dated 17 Mar. 1735, and 100 acres dated 16 Sept. 1738. One "Mary Bourquin" also had a grant of 100 acres on 16 Sept. 1738, it is not known if this is his wife or his daughter. He was a physician. He served 9 years in the Duke of Marlborough's army. (S.C. Hist. Mag. x-205) Several deeds extant where he sold and purchased land, etc. He died in 1784 aged 93 years. (S.C. Gaz. 30 Jan. 1784) No record of the death of his wife.

John Detheridge, Jr. (3): b 175-. Was of age or over 1 in 1774; one of the executors to will of Henry L. Bourquin Dec. 1774. Was devised land by said Henry L. Bourquin in 1774. On 16 July 1797 "John Detheridge, Gent. of Ebenezer, Ga., to Patrick Doyle, Merchant, of Savannah, Ga. deeds tract of land bounded by lands of Henry Bourquin (No. 11) originally granted to said Henry Lewis Bourquin, etc." (Deeds Liberty Co. Ga.) No subsequent record.

John Lewis (2): b ca 1727, died 1794 S.C. V

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Robert Lewis: b 173-. Only record of this man known is vi "On 11 Nov. 1761 Robert Lewis Bourquin granted 550 acres of land in Purysburg, S.C." No record of any disposition of this land and it probably reverted to the State.

#### HENRI FRANCOIS (1) BOURQUIN 2

Born 1693 Switzerland. He was married prior to 1719 to ..... no record of her name or parentage so far discovered. Came to South Car-

olina with Pury's colony in 1732. Was granted 300 acres of land 17 Mar. 1735 and 50 acres 16 Sept. 1738.

In 1747 John B., Henry F. and Benedict Bourquin and others peti-

tioned for 500 acres of land each in Georgia, all shown as inhabitants

of South Carolina; action postponed on account of the slave question.

On 5 May Henry renewed his petition for 500 acres in Georgia and this was granted before Sept. 1750 on which date he was a resident of Chatham Co., Ga. On 3 Apr. 1755 he asks for 1000 acres of land, postponed to June 1755 when he states he possesses 500 acres of land already laid out and hoped an addition having a WIFE & FOUR children & 25 negroes ..... also asks for a Lot in Hardwicke; both petitions granted.

On 30 Sept. 1757 petitions by "HENRY BOURQUIN" show four grants of 500 acres each; TWO of these grants pertain to this Henry Bourquin, the other two pertain to another HENRY (2) BOURQUIN, his nephew No. 11. He asked for 500 acres on 2 May 1769 for 20 negroes for whom he had not obtained land, granted in St. Philip's Parish. On 4 July 1769 he again asks for 500 acres of land for 20 negroes for whom no land had been granted, this was granted in St. David's Parish.

On 5 Sept. 1769 Henry Bourquin states his grants of 1000 acres on 30 Sept. 1757 and 500 acres, St. Philip's Parish, he resigned rights to 1000 acres tract to son-in-law Henry Lewis Bourquin & 500 acres tract to son-in-law John Fox, asks said rights be confirmed to said parties.

On 5 June 1771 he states the 500 acres granted in St. David's Parish

time has lapsed and asks leave to take up the grant, etc. this was approved 6 Aug. 1771.

There does not appear any disposition of his lands in South Carolina excepting 50 acres in 1772, and the deduction is that said lands passed to sons-in-law John Keall and ..... Waldburger.

He was a member of the legislature from Little Ogeechee in 1764, 1765, 1768, 1769 and 1772. He deeded land to Horatio Marberry, etc. and said land subsequently passed to "Henry Bourquin, No. 11" in 1787. His wife was deceased before 1775; he dated his will 23 Nov. 1775 with Harriet Bourquin, Frances Fox and Katherine Rehm as executors. He died in 1778 and is buried on his plantation, a large slab marks this burying ground marked "Henry Bourquin, aged 85 years/ His Family Vault."

He does NOT name all of his children in this will and it appears he left no male issue.

## 3 ANNE MARIE (1) BOURQUIN

Born circa 1697 Switzerland. She evidently married in 1720's in Switzerland one ..... Villard or Viller. She was probably a widow when she came to South Carolina with her brothers in 1732. Her record came to light some years after 1926 and purely accidental.

The South Carolina land records show "Anna Maria VILLER" was granted 300 acres of land 16 Sept. 1738; and "Anne Mary VILLER" was granted 100 acres on the same date in Purysburg, S.C.

The next record of her is a deed in French recorded in Charleston: Ann Marie Bourquin to David Villard & others Deed of Gift, etc. Esq., Justice of the Peace for his

Majesty, for Granville county, Anne Marie Bourquin widow of Villard who declared that she intended to marry again and for this reason she wished to dispose of the property of which she gives to her son David Villard her plantation and all that in contains; Further she gives to her three children equal portions of all her movable possessions of

whatever they may consist without any exception and furthermore she

constitutes by these presents her eldest brother Doctor Jean Baptiste

Bourquin their guardian in testimony of which she has signed the pres-

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ent deed of gift in the presence of

Ann Marie Bourquin

Witnesses -

Henry Bourquin The present deed of gift has been passed Alex: Linder upon before me on the daye and year above mentioned. John Linder.

Recorded 3d May 1763 Examined

(Deeds ZZ-723 Charleston) per Wm Hopten, Public Registrar.

We have no information as to name of second husband; David Villard evidently was living in 1763 when this deed was recorded.

- iii David Villard (2): b ca 1727, was a minor in 1744. One

David VILLIARD was living in Beaufort Dist., S.C. in 1790; in this house were 2 males over 16, one male under 16 and 5 females; the head of the house owned 8 slaves. It is not known if this is David Sr. and his family, or if a son, DAVID JR. and his family. It definitely shows that David Sr. left descendants.

One Eliza VALLARD, b 8 Nov. 1787 Beaufort Dist. m prior

to 1806 John Huguenin; one William B. Villard, M.D., b 1810 S.C. was living in St. Peter's Parish, Beaufort Dist. in 1850, had a wife Harriet, b 1826 and children: Eliza, b 1844; William D., b 1846; Catherine, b 1848. Both of these probably belong to this family

## 4 BENEDICT (1) BOURQUIN

Born circa 1701-1702 Switzerland. He married prior to 1730 Jann Judah ....., born 170-; there is circumstantial evidence she was a daughter of Abraham Chardonell, who was also a member of Pury's colony.

They came to Purysburg, South Carolina in 1732. He was granted 300 acres of land 16 Sept. 1738. He was deeded 300 acres of land by Abraham Chardonell 24 Feb. 1747. This tract of land was conveyed by lease and release to William Elbert by Benedict Bourquin and his wife "Jann Judah" under date of 12 Feb. 1751; Jann Judah waives dower to this in 1753, (Deeds NN-211-14, Charleston.)

On 1 Mar. 1747 he was one of several petitioners for 500 acres of land in Georgia, all postponed on account of the slave question. On 5 May 1749 he renewed his petition and was given 350 acres to be adjoining the 500 acres of "his brother" Henry F. Bourquin. On 27 Sept. 1750 he petitioned for 500 acres near the place he before had land granted him, etc. It appears that one Samuel Marcer, assistant to the Board, had

told the surveyor on the previous grant to leave 500 acres vacant be-

tween Henry Bourquin and Philip Delegal and by so doing Benedict found

himself pushed into a swamp with no high ground for a house or barn and

declined to take it. This was investigated and found said Marcer had

been accustomed to accumulate land by this method for some time. On con-

sideration the Board found Benedict had been ill used and that his Circumstances (having lately met with heavy misfortune) were not so well as eighteen months previous and <u>having a numerous family</u> grant him 200 acres of said reserved land, reserving the other 300 acres to be given if he should appear deserving and of ability to improve same & if not to be disposed of otherwise.

They evidently removed to Georgia during the year 1750. On 2 June 1752 he renewed his petition for balance of 300 acres of land and it was granted. This land was adjoining the 500 acres granted to his brother Henry F. Bourquin in 1749.

On 5 Oct. 1756 Benedict Bourquin petitions for 450 acres of land, states he possesses 500 acres and desires an additional tract, having a WIFE & EIGHT CHILDREN and 17 negroes, asks 450 acres situate between Great Ogeechee and Midway.

Benedict Bourquin was awarded first prize and one half of third prize for planting the greatest number of white mulberry trees on his plantation, this in the year 1757-1759.

This appears to be the last definite record of this family in this

county excepting his eldest son, Henry, who subsequently shows up in possession of most of this land, this is HENRY BOURQUIN, No. 11. It has seemed strange that such a large family should disappear so completely from the records and from the scene of action. Knowing this section to have been at times subject to the ravages of YELLOW FEVER it is plausible to surmise that this family may have been one of its victims.

They may also have removed from this county though there is no evidence of record of this name in Georgia for this period that is not fully accounted for. Neither does this name of Bourquin appear in any of the northern states for 1790 though it is known some of the Purysburg settlers did migrate north.

There were eight children living in 1756 exclusive of the eldest, Henry.

11 i Henry (2): b 1730 Switzerland, died 1799 Georgia.

ii Andrew (2): b ca 1736 South Carolina. This name appears to be for his grandfather's side as it is foreign to the Bourquin side. The only record so far discovered of him in Georgia is "Andrew Bourquin" was granted land in Greene County, Georgia in 1787. (Ga. Land Rec.) There were Bourquins living in Louisiana in 1929-30 from whom no information was obtainable and it is possible they are descendants of this man.

v John B.: b 17--. Is mentioned in a land record but it is

of doubtful value as the date evidently has been confused

with the original petition of Dr. John B. Bourquin of

South Carolina. (White's Hist. Coll. Ga.)

5 BENEDICT (2) BOURQUIN

(John B. 1.) Born circa 1716 Switzerland, came to South Carolina with his parents in 1732. He married prior to 1745 Jane Judith, daughter of Henry Francois Bourquin, born 1719 and first cousins. Resided in South Carolina to about 1755-56 when they moved to Chatham County, Ga.

He petitioned for a Lot in Hardewick June 1755, this was rejected. On 5 Oct. 1756 he again petitioned for Lot in Hardwicke and was granted No. 113 on condition he take out the grant within 7 months and register same within 6 months.

On 28 Mar. 1758 he appears to have had a grant of another Lot in Hardwicke. On 4 July 1769 Benedict Bourquin states he has 6 negroes and desires and asks for 300 acres of land situate on Little Ogeechee River about one mile from John McLean, this was granted.

It appears he made another petition about 1769-70 for 150 acres of land in Christ Church Parish which is not of record. He died intestate Sept. 1770 and the following item is evidence of his petition for the land above mentioned:

"5 Feb. 1771 Petition of Jane Bourquin, states that Benedict Bour-

quin, decsd, had ordered 150 acres of land in Christ Church Parish which

was not completed and asks that grant may pass to her son, Benedict, a

minor child of sd Benedict Bourquin;" granted conditional on 6 months registration.

On 5 Mar. 1771 petition of Jane Bourquin states her husband Benedict Bourquin, left 8 negroes to his children for whom no land has been

granted and asks in TRUST for Benedict and Francis, her sons, 400 acres near William Austin, etc.; granted.

The following item is taken from an Auditor's Journal, Revolutionary payments to Continental troops for service in East Florida:

November 4, 1783. The United States Dr. to Jane Bourquin for supplies of forage for public service: 0-9-1 pounds. (Arch. Ga.)

Jane Judith survived him many years and was legatee in will of Henrietta B. Jones in 1788 who calls her SISTER, etc.

She dated her will 23 Feb. 1799 and names the following: Son: Benedict

Son: Henry, 20 shillings

Daughter: Mary Ann, 20 shillings

Son: David Francis, 20 shillings

Granddaughter: Ann Sophia, daughter of sd David Francis, etc. Executor: Benedict Bourquin; witnessed by Benj. Raynes, Mary S. Raynes and Sarah McKinley. (Wills B-53, Savannah, Ga.)

This will was presented for probate 11 March 1799, note the following item which shows the Executor, son Benedict, was NOT slow in execut-

ing the will.

Georgia Gazette, 14 March 1799 (Thursday)

"Died last Monday'se night at Little Ogeechee aged 81 Mrs. Jane Judith

Bourquin, widow of Mr. Benedict Bourquin."

The following abstract of a deed is of interest ...... Whereas Benedict Bourquin the Elder died intestate Sept. 1770 leaving widow,

several children and considerable estate. The widow died in 1799 devising 1/3 of her estate to her son Benedict, etc. On 4 Apr. 1800 to adjust matters it is decreed that Benedict Bourquin shall dispose of 2 negroes bought by his mother and Ann Sophia Bourquin shall have ..... etc. Signed by Henry Bourquin, Mary Ann McKnight, Benedict Bourquin, David Francis Bourquin and Peter LeFitte; witnessed by Donald McLeod, William Gibbons and Shadrach Butler; "Done at Little Ogeechee 4 Apr. 1800." (Deeds Lib. V-368, Savannah, Ga.)

On 5 Oct. 1800 we find re-settlement of estate of Jane Judith Bourquin the following:

"The executor of Jane Judith Bourquin, letters of dismissal from the heirs at law: Mary Ann McKnight, daughter of Benedict Bourquin, the Elder; Henry Bourquin and David Francis, sons of same; Peter Samuel LaFitte, Esq., in right of his wife, Jane Judith, late Jane Judith Papot, daughter of James Papot and Susannah his wife, the daughter of Benedict Bourquin, Senior, both now deceased" ..... Witnessed by Shadrach Butler and Stephen S. Williams. (Lib. W-43-45) There was another adjustment made in or about 1802 reclaim of a child of Mary Ann McKnight, etc.

## Children:

- i Daughter: b 174-, no record.
- ii Judith: b 1747, was legatee, provisional, in will of James

Papot, brother-in-law, and was a witness to this will, 3

Jan. 1784. She died after 1784. No further record.

iii Susannah (3): b 1749-50, married ca 1766 James Papot, b

1742-3; she died prior to 1784, he died May 1784 at Savannah, Ga. They had:

- 1 Jane Judith Papot (4): b 1767-8, married 5 June 1787 Peter Samuel LaFitte. See Some Huguenot Families of South Carolina & Georgia, Davis, 1926.
- iv Henry (3): b 175-. Very little is definitely known of him. He is mentioned in the Power of Attorney of 1809 and 1811 as an heir of Henrietta B. Jones, etc. but did NOT sign this paper. Was summoned as a witness with his brothers in a case in Liberty Co., Ga. in 1815, did not testify. "He is stated to have been taken ill while returning from a trip to Milledgeville, Ga. and to have made a nuncupative will in favor of one Thomas E. Lloyd; died on the road and was buried by roadside instead of having his body returned to Savannah, etc." This story is TRADITIONAL, we have no evidence to confirm it in any manner. #### HENRY LEWIS (2) BOURQUIN 6

(John B. 1.) Born 172- Switzerland, came to Purysburg, South Carolina with his parents in 1732. He was granted 100 acres of land in Purysburg, S.C. 24 Aug. 1743. He was a physician, no record of where he attended school or how he obtained his degree. There are several records of business transactions in Georgia, etc. He removed to Savannah, Ga. before 1763 and the following is found in Georgia Gazette, 2 June 1763:

"The subscriber gives notice that he hath opened a shop in Mrs. Campbell's house near the church in Savannah where he will practice physick and surgery; he will particularly cure the burstedness or rupture of the gut and others."

Signed. Henry Lewis Bourquine

Also advertises to sell various articles such as sugar candy, Jordan Al-

monds, raisins, butters, cordials, etc. In the Georgia Gazette 29 Dec.

1763 appears: "On Tuesday December 20th was married Dr. Henry Lewis

Bourquin to Miss Harriet Bourquin of Little Ogeechee."

On 2 May 1769 he petitioned for land stating he had been many years

in the Province and had no land granted him, has a wife and 4 Negroes & asks 350 acres in Great Ogeechee between Smith and John Milledge, granted, conditional.

On 6 June 1769 he petitioned for land, states the 350 acres last granted was not to be found, etc., and asks 250 acres adjoining Henry Bourquin and within 2 miles of Robinson; granted conditional.

On 5 Sept. 1769 he was assigned 1000 acres of land granted to Henry Bourquin by the said Bourquin his father-in-law. He appears to have had another grant in 1772 which is not recorded but appears in the following deed in Liberty Co., Ga.: 16 July 1797 John Detheridge, Gent. of Ebenezer, Ga., deeds to Patrick Doyle, Merchant of Savannah, Ga. a tract of land bounded by lands of Henry Bourquin (No. 11, son of Benedict) originally granted under date of 6 Oct. 1772, etc., said land was bequeathed to John Detheridge by Dr. Henry Bourquin in will dated 5 Dec. 1774 in Savannah."

He is listed among "Patriots" 10 Aug. 1774. (Ga. Land Marks, p. 643.) He appears to have had another grant of land in 1774 not recorded but which is covered by a deed shown in his brother's record when he

gave bond for sale of this land to John Shick, etc.

Henry Lewis Bourquin, Archibald Bulloch, Noble Wimberly Jones and

7 others were chosen Vestrymen, 6 Apr. 1774.

He dated his will 5 Dec. 1774 and died soon thereafter as it was

admitted to probate 23 Dec. 1774 by his widow Henrietta and John Dether-

idge; see further of this in record of No. 10 Harriet Henrietta Bourquin.

## 7 JOHN LEWIS (2) BOURQUIN

(John B. 1.) Born circa 1727 Switzerland came to South Carolina with his parents in 1732. He married ca 1750 Margaret Jane, daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth Dunham, born 173-. She was generally known and used the name of "Jane"; Margaret appears in two records but these are not of a nature or of a date that would evidence he had more than one wife.

He was witness to a deed 12 Feb. 1751. (Lib. NN-211 Charleston) He was a Justice of the Peace in 1768. (Wills 1765-69)

He was "Cited" by court to administer estate of Mary Ann Munger, Sept. 1771, as "nearest of kin", St. Peter's Parish, S.C. (Prob. ct. rec.)

He served in the Revolution as Lieutenant Colonel. Return of Granville Co. Regt. of Foot, Commanded by Lt. Col. John Lewis Bourquin. (Rev. Rec. S.C. Hist. Com.) His wife, Jane Bourquin, furnished supplies to Continental and Militia in 1780. (See S.C. Indents Lib. W, No.321; and

Lib. 0, No.253.)

On 15 Dec. 1789 John Lewis Bourquin, Sr. and wife Jane, of Granville Co., S.C. deeded to John Shick, of Chatham Co., Ga., 500 acres of land in St. Paul's Parish ..... originally granted by George I (<u>SIC</u>) 1774 to Henry Lewis Bourquin before whose death he made bonded for title to John Shick, said John Lewis Bourquin, Sr., brother & heir at law of

Henry Lewis Bourquin, confirms title, etc. (Deeds A2-1, Richmond Co.)

He died at his home at Oaklette Creek Sept. 1794 after a visit to Charleston. (S.C. Gazette 22 Sept. 1794.) Jane, his widow, survived him and died sometime between 1801 and 1809.

## 8 KATHERINE (2) BOURQUIN

(Henry F. 1.) Born 172- in Switzerland, came to South Carolina

with parents in 1732. She was married circa 1751 in South Carolina to

a Mr. Waldburger, born 17 -- , and probably John, said Waldburger was de-

ceased before 1775 and died in the late 1760's. She married (2) some-

time before 1775 Dr. Frederick Rehm, of Purysburg, S.C.

She was legatee in her father's will of 1775 and also in her sis-

ter's will of 1788. Dr. Rehm is listed as Justice of the Peace, Savan-

nah, Ga. in 1783 where they evidently settled after 1775. Dr. Rehm prodeceased her as she died in 1795 and her estate was administered by her two sons, Jacob and John B. Waldburger at Savannah, Ga.

In 1805 Henrietta Hoskins now Almy caveats she was nearest relation to Henrietta B. Jones, etc. She was apparently a widow again in 1811 when she signed the Power of Attorney as "Henrietta Hoskins" heir and relation of Henrietta B. Jones. No further record and no children known,

#### SUZANNE (2) BOURQUIN 9

(Henry F. 1.) Born 172- Switzerland, came to South Carolina with her parents in 1732. She married circa 1750 John Keall, of South Caroli-Not much is known of this family. They were both apparently deceasna. ed before 1775.

## 10 HARRIET HENRIETTA (2) BOURQUIN

(Henry F. 1.) Born 173- probably in Purysburg, South Carolina, moved to Georgia with her parents and married (1) 20 Dec. 1763 No. 6, Dr. Henry Lewis Bourquin, 1st cousins. She was one of the executors to her father's will in 1775. She has proven an important character in this record and we will burden the reader with some detail.

Dr. Bourquin died before 23 Dec. 1774, his widow and nephew, John Detheridge, executed his will on this date. On 14 Aug. 1779 there is a marriage agreement between Henrietta Bourquin, of Christ Church Parish and William Jones, of Savannah, Attorney, and John Fox of said Parish; Henrietta Bourquin, daughter of Henry Bourquin, decsd, owns land under will of said Henry Bourquin, her father, bearing date of 23 Nov. 1775, Plantation called "Good Hope", at Acton, said Parish, of 481 acres and buildings, etc. Said will directed division of all estate 1/3 to daugh-

ter Harriet Bourquin, she to have first choice, etc. (Deeds C-189)

This was her second marriage, Jones was previously married and had

children at date of this marriage. The will of Henry F. Bourquin was not

RECORDED until 1783.

Auditor's Journal for Revolutionary payments shows: (Ga. Arch.)

1783. To Henrietta Jones for Boat hire & forage to purchasing

Agents ..... 25-7-8 pounds

They went to Wales before 1788 and were in London in Aug. 1788 when she made a will, viz:

Abstract of Will.

Henrietta B. Jones, wife of William Jones, Atty. at Law, formerly of Falgarth, Co. of Brecon, South Wales, now on a visit to London, but shortly bound on a voyage to New Providence, Bahama.

Refers to marriage agreement and settlement with William Jones 14 Aug. 1779 when she was the widow of Henry Lewis Bourquin, etc. ..... Estate to be divided into 3 parts: 1/3 to husband and 2/3 to SISTERS, JANE JUDITH BOURQUIN, KATHERINE REHM and FRANCES FOX.

Bequests made to the following persons:

To William Henry Bourquin, son of John Lewis Bourquin, of South Carolina. (See Nos. 14 and 23)

Nephew; Jacob Waldburger, Atty. at Law. (See No. 8) Henry, son of my nephew Henry Bourquin. (See No. 17) John Bourquin, Jr., son of John Lewis Bourquin. (See Nos. 7-14)

Sophia Stull, wife of .... Stull, of South Carolina, Planter (See Nos. 7-15)

Mary White, Spinster, of Little Ogeechee. (See No. 7)

Niece; Henrietta Hoskins. (See No. 8)

Nephews; John Keall and Lewis Keall; John Fox and Bartholemew Waldburger. (See Nos. 2-8)

Niece; Mary McNich, wife of John McNich, Planter, of South Carolina. (See No. 8.)

William Jones was named Executor to this will. Henrietta died 11 Aug. 1797 in Nassau. (Ga. Gazette) Jones married (3) prior to 3 Sept. 1798 Margaret ..... He made a will 3 Sept. 1798, this is quite a long will and only items of interest quoted:

"All monies which came to my hand in consequence of my marriage with my late wife, Henrietta Bourquin Jones, namely eight hundred and twenty pounds Sterling, with a bond of Jacob Waldburger for three hundred pounds, like money and the interest due or to grow thereon, I will and direct may be equally divided between the nearest relations of my sd wife ......"

My son: Gabriel Edward Jones, lands in Wales, etc.

My granddaughters: Marie Theresa Wemyss

## Henrietta Bourquin Wemyss

My wife: Margaret .....

Jones was executor to will of his wife Henrietta, he apparently made no effort to probate same. He died 20 May 1799. After his death

the will of Henrietta B. Jones was presented for probate 28 Oct. 1800 at

Savannah, Ga. at which date appeared Zachariah and Henrietta Hoskins who

claimed "Nearest Relation", they with Edward Hardin were appointed ad-

ministrators, etc. In 1805 John H. Morel applied for letters of admin-

istration; Zachariah Hoskins was deceased and Edward Hardin requests to

be relieved as Henrietta, "now Almy", has failed to make proper re-

turns, etc. This appears to the final on this will.

About 1809 certain heirs of Henrietta B. Jones had drawn up a Power of Attorney to a lawyer in Nassau to secure from the estate of William Jones the portion of Henrietta B. Jones mentioned, etc. We have not seen this paper nor a copy thereof but have been informed the paper dated 1811 is a duplicate of it. This instrument is not on record at Savannah, Ga.

In 1811 a Power of Attorney was drawn to William Kerr, Attorney at Law, Nassau, for procedure against the estate of William Jones, late of Nassau, etc. for the money which was to be divided between nearest relations of Henrietta Bourquin Jones. We whose names are mentioned claim and are entitled to receive the said sum ......

Mary McNich, of South Carolina, Widow.

Henrietta Horskins, Chatham Co., Ga., Widow. Children of Catherine Rehm, S.C., decsd, who was a SISTER of sd Henrietta B. Jones. John G. Williamson, Executor and representative of Bartholemew Waldburger, child of said Catherine Rehm, and executor to her last will, etc.

Peter Henry Morel & Mary Lloyd, widow, children of Mary Morel, late widow, decsd, who was a SISTER to said Henrietta B. Jones. William B. Bulloch and John G. Williamson, representatives of John Morel, late of sd County, and child of said Mary. Henry Bourquin, Benedict Bourquin and David Francis Bourquin, lawful children of JANE JUDITH BOURQUIN, decsd., who was a

SISTER of the said Henrietta B. Jones.

George Allen, representative and executor of Mary Ann McKnight, decsd., who was a child of Jane Judith Bourquin.

It will be noted this paper was never completed and does not bear any date save 1811; has no witnesses, and was not signed by all of those mentioned. This paper was found many years later in an old safe; we have photostatic copy of original which was in hands of Mrs. J. S. Canon, of Savannah, Ga. in 1930.

This document is given as above merely as evidence of relationship of certain persons in this record. Apparently no effort was made by the signers of this paper to secure OTHER near relations who are known to have been living at the time. We have no information as to whether the

matter was ever settled. Savannah court records show nothing.

Henrietta died leaving no children.

#### HENRY (2) BOURQUIN 11

(Benedict 1.) Born 1730 Switzerland, came to South Carolina with his parents in 1732. Removed to Georgia about 1750 where he married .... ....., no record of her name discovered.

On 30 Sept. 1757 he was granted two tracts of 500 acres each in the Ogeechee District and in February 1758 he petitions for land, states he possesses 1000 acres of land and having a wife and FIVE children desires 500 acres on south side of Sapola River, granted conditional to grant being taken and registered in 7 months, etc. He appears to have had another grant of land, a small tract, 1 Nov. 1770.

On 1 Mar. 1778 in Chatham Co., Ga. the Oath of Abjuration taken by William O'Bryen, Jno. Jenkins, Henry Cuyler, James Maxwell and HENRY BOURQUIN, Esqrs.

He furnished supplies to the Continental Army operating in East Florida and was paid 9-15-9 pounds on 13 Apr. 1784. (Arch. Ga.)

He was conveyed land 19 Oct. 1787 by Horatio Marberry and his wife,

said. land originally granted to Henry Bourquin, decsd, (uncle) consid-

eration 6 pounds sterling, etc.

His wife died prior to 1798-99. He died 1798-99 and his estate ad-

ministered by his son, Benedict Bourquin. Bond for \$1000 was made by

Benedict and Henry Bourquin to Edward White dated 28 Feb. 1799. John J.

Bourquin was a witness to this bond. (Prob. rec. B-54, Savannah, Ga.)

On 12 Feb. 1801 John Neville, of South Carolina obtained a judgment for \$8000 against the estate of Henry Bourquin; to satisfy the judgment the Sheriff siezed 500 acres of land near Turkey Hill, etc. This land was sold at public auction and appears to have been bought in by Henry Bourquin, one of the bondsmen, and a son of the deceased. (Deeds V-340 Savannah.) He had five children living in 1757. References are Ga. Land records; Col. Rec. Ga.; deeds; administrations, etc.

## 12 BENEDICT (3) BOURQUIN

(Benedict 2, John B. 1.) Born 1753 South Carolina, moved to Georgia with parents 1755-56. He purchased 300 acres of land in District of Little Ogeechee from Elizabeth Wallington under date of 10 Jan. 1790. (Deeds R-430) His father's estate was never administered and

was evidently in his hands till the death of his mother in 1799 when he administered and made division of the property according to her will. He married late in life, 8 June 1807 Hametal Fay. In a Court in Liberty Co., Ga. 12 Sept. 1815 he was a witness re William Carr et al, and states his age as "62 or thereabouts;" Henry and David F. Bourquin

also appear as witnesses in this case, etc.

He signed the Power of Attorney, re estate of Henrietta B. Jones in 1811. He dated his will 17 Apr. 1818, died 6 Dec. 1821 aet. 68; will probated 8 Jan. 1822 by Hametal Bourquin, Thomas Johnson and George Anderson, executors: he provides that wife is to have all of estate, with provision that no future husband to have any part of the same. Should she marry, estate to be divided among nephews, sons of David F. Bourquin. She married (2) Thomas Johnson, a lawyer, prior to 1823.

(Wills B-165-66-67, Savannah, Ga.)

## 13 DAVID FRANCIS (3) BOURQUIN

(Benedict 2, John B. 1.) Born 8 May 1759 Chatham Co., Georgia. He served in the Revolution in Pulaski's Legion. He, Sheftall Sheftall and Peter Dondee were captured and taken aboard a British ship. He was insulted by a British officer and promptly picked up a chair and knocked him down, he was in turn struck down by a sabre blow which cut his cheek bone in two. He is listed in Georgia Roster as "Major" and probably did not reach this rank till the early 1780's.

Executive Council 28 Mar. 1783 appointed Justices of the Peace for

Little Ogeechee District: D. Francis Bourquin and Dr. Frederick Rehm.

He married (1) 3 July 1783 Elizabeth Fox, of Savannah, Ga., (S.C.

Gazette 19 July 1783) a daughter of Benjamin Fox, born 17--. He signed

the will of James Papot in 1734 as Justice of the Peace. Elizabeth died

11 Mar. 1788 and he married (2) Mrs. Ann Semmes, born 17--, she had a daughter at the date of this marriage. He administered the estate of Benjamin Fox in 1790. (Deeds H-329-340) Ann Bourquin died 1792-3 and he married (3) 20 July 1794 Margaret Thornton, born 1778 San Domingo.

He was legatee in his mother's will in 1799; signed receipt to executor in 1802, etc. He signed the Power of Attorney of 1811 as heir and relation of Henrietta E. Jones, etc.; was a witness in court, Liberty Co., Ga. 12 Sept. 1815 re William Carr et al and states his age as "51 or 52" (note decrepancy with actual date). He dated his will 13 June 1818 and died 11 Jan. 1825 aet. 66. (T.S.) His executors were son Edward and Stephen S. Williams, who did not present this will for probate until 5 Mar. 1832. Names: Wife, Margaret and children: Edward, Benedict, Eliza, Charlotte and Robert; grandchildren: Margaret, Clenky and Stephen B. Williams, children of Stephen S. Williams and daughter Ann Sophia, etc. (Wills, B-211 Savannah, Ga.).

Margaret survived him some years, made her will 16 July 1832 in which she names: daughter Charlotte Hobkirk; daughter Elizabeth Wilson; sons, Benedict and Robert H. Bourquin. She died 6 Sept. 1832 aet 54,

T.S. This will was not offered for probate until 20 Mar. 1848. (Wills B-256 Savannah, Ga.)

## 14 JOHN LEWIS (3) BOURQUIN, JR.

(John Lewis 2, John B. 1.) Born 1753-54 Purysburg, South Carolina. No record of Revolutionary service so far discovered. He married (1) prior to 1778 Mary Elizabeth ....., some indication her name was EDDINGS, born 175- S.C. She died 1785 and he married (2) prior to 1788 Susannah, widow of Michael Garvey and a daughter of David and Rebecca Stoll, born 23 July 1758 S.C. He was a member of the legislature from Granville County and died in 1799.

On 3 Jan. 1800 Susannah G. Bourquin, widow, of St. Luke's Parish, S.C., and relict and executor of John Lewis Bourquin, Jr., gives freedom to a slave; witnessed by M. Lucia Garvey and Arthur Bohn. (Deeds V-21, Savannah, Ga.) Susannah was living in 1810 no subsequent record.

#### GARVEY EXCURSUS

John Garvey and Judith, his wife, and his sister Sarah Garvey were in Charleston, South Carolina prior to 1741. They apparently came from San Domingo, it is not definitely known if they were Huguenot Refugees.

St. Helena Parish records disclose the following: Judith Garvey, wife of John, died Dec. 27, 1741.

Sarah Garvey, Spinster, from West Indies, married Apr. 19, 1744 Charles Pury. (This is a son of Col. John P. Pury, the founder of Purysburg, S.C.)

One "David Stoll" furnished supplies to Continental and Militia in 1783, Stub Entries to Indents, Lib. V, No. 335. This record undoubtedly pertains to this man as his father, David, died in 1771 and known Stoll records do not show any other David Stoll living at this time. Resided Beaufort District, S.C. The following is from Charleston Gazette 23 Dec. 1797: "Died in the 35th year of his age, at his seat on May River on the 11th inst. David Dixon Stoll, Esq. A member of the house of representatives of this state.

The fortitude with which this worthy man bore his last illness of thirty days continuance was truly admirable. Through every stage of the disease his countenance and deportment were more than philosophically placid and serene. His life, luminous with virtue and piety was succeeded by a peaceful and triumphant death which he was fully persuaded would usher him into a glorious immortality. The deeply affected widow, his aged and venerable mother, and only sister unitedly mourn their ir-

reparable loss, of one who was inestimable as a husband, son, and a brother, and a friend.

The church, of which he was a most worthy and useful member and of-

ficer, laments the loss of one of her strongest pillars, and brightest

ornaments. Indeed, without exaggeration, it may be avered that the vi-

cinity in which Mr. Stoll lived, the state, the legislature, the coun-

try, the world, are much the poorer for the dissolution of this worthy and active member of society, this respectable citizen, this eminent christian."

Sophia survived him some years and was living in 1810.

He made a will dated 4 Feb. 1819 leaving all estate, real and personal to Thomas Edward Lloyd, Attorney, Savannah, etc., named as executors; Thos. E. Lloyd, James Morrison and William Bulloch; <u>Witnesses</u>: A. B. Fannin, D. Willford and G. W. Denton. This will is drawn up in full legal form. He died before June 1819 as this will was sworn to in

open court and Thomas E. Lloyd qualified as executor 24 June 1819.

(Wills H-67; Adms. B-145 Savannah.)

He is buried in the family plot on the plantation and grave un-

marked. There are only three graves in this lot that have stones stand-
