FOREWORD

This book is intended to be only what the title implies, namely a "Supplement" to the Genealogy of the Blish Family published by my father, James Knox Blish, in the year 1905. My work started in 1937. Extensive references are made throughout this book to the original Blish Genealogy with the obvious intention of avoiding repetition of data included there.

Each name is given a distinct number, which appears first in the margin before the names of the children in each family. The number is repeated in larger type at the head of each family. The same number assigned to a name in the original genealogy is continued in this book. In order to fit new names into their proper sequence, letters are added to the numbers.

The number of the generation, counting from Abraham Blish as the first generation, is indicated by a small figure after the given name. A plus sign (+) before a name indicates that further records appear later on in this book.

Most of the data have been obtained from correspondence with members of the family, whose names appeared in city and telephone directories. Obviously the work is incomplete, and I welcome further correspondence in order that future generations will have more complete records. I would also like to have any errors and omissions called to my attention.

According to information passed down through the family, Daniel⁶ Blush was a stone mason and a farmer. He evidently was a very active and astute man, for he is reputed to have operated a tannery with his two sons, and the town clerk records in Burlington and Waterbury, Vt. disclose numerous real estate transactions in his name. His home located on Blush Hill in Waterbury is still known as the Blush Vomestead. It is a fascinating red brick structure with two fireplaces which have remained unchanged in over a century.

Van Rensselaer' Blush operated a tannery in Waterbury, Vt. until it was destroyed by fire. In 1860 he moved to Kansas, living for a short time in Leavenworth before settling in Topeka. His early work consisted of freighting goods from Leavenworth to Denver.. He was one of the first contractors for the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad, having built the road bed from Topeka to Albuquerque, New Mexico. In 1896 he moved to a farm near Silver Lake, Kan., 11 miles west of Topeka, where he lived until his tragic death on 17 Oct. 1904. He was struck by a train while crossing the railroad track. He and his wife, Augusta, are both buried in the cemetery at Topeka.

James Knox⁸ Blish was a man of high literary attainment and derived a great deal of pleasure in collecting good books, particularly first editions of well known authors. Not content with the works of Shakespeare on the market, he set about the task of inserting selected illustrations in a complete set. This work was finished to the binding stage before his death. His library at that time numbered some 2500 volumes. In the summer of 1906 he made an European trip, accompanied by his son, Matthew, and two friends. The countries visited were a source of considerable interest to him after his return. During the later years of his life he gradually gave up his active business connections and his law practice and confined his attentions to the First National Bank of Kewanee, of which at the time of his death he had been president for 26 years. He was a life-long Democrat and an ardent admirer of Woodrow Wilson. While Wilson was still a professor at Princeton University, he said of him, "He is my choice for President of the United States." For over a year before his death it was known that he was suffering from pernicious anemia, but his cheerfulness and calm never deserted him and it is felt that he always had a secret hope of recovery. The end came on 22 Feby. 1920 in his 77th year, and he was laid to rest beside others of his name in the Old Cemetery. Kewanee, Ills., the land for which was given to the town by his grandfather. The Henry County Bar Association paid tribute to him at a meeting held in June 1920 by the adoption of a memorable resolution, which read in part as follows: "He was capable, clear headed and abhorred injustice and unrighteous conduct. He was a man of fine sensibilities with pronounced literary and artistic tastes. He had the respect and confidence of the Court and of his fellow members of the bar." To this tribute his family can most devoutly add," As a husband and a father no man could have been more devoted, considerate and tender."

After the death of her husband Amy Mason (Rhodes) Blish converted the family home into a two-family house and occupied the upper apartment for several years. She later disposed of the house and moved into an apartment on West Prospect St., where she lived the remainder of her life. She experienced considerable pleasure visiting her three children and traveling to various parts of the west and south. Her health remained good until about five years before her death, which occurred on 13 Sept. 1944 at St. Frances Hospital, Kewanee. She passed quietly away following a short illness and is buried in the family lot in the Old Cemetery, Kewanee.

Elizabeth⁹ (Blish) Brookfield received her early education in the schools of Kewanee, Ills. Her main interests in high school were in literary and oratorical activities, and early in her teens she displayed unusual musical talents. After graduation from Kewanee High School in the Class of 1906 she entered Wellesley College. In her freshman year she was honored by election to the presidency of her class. The choice of a girl from a small mid-west town for this high office is striking evidence of her forceful personality and charm. Toward the end of her first year at college she had to decide between college and a musical education for the development of her rich contralto voice. She chose the latter and the next year was spent in study in Chicago and in New York. After her marriage and the establishment of a home in Kansas City, Mo. she continued her activities in musical circles. She was president of the Kansas City Musical Club for two years and president for one year of Mu Delta Chapter of Mu Phi Epsilon, national

musical sorority. She served several Kansas City churches as soloist and her ability led to many concert appearances and to her engagement as soloist in oratorio productions in and near Kansas City. In 1927 she began to complain of severe headaches and after extensive examinations by Kansis City doctors, which strongly indicated the presence of a brain tumor, she was taken to Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore where an operation for its removal was performed by the eminent brain surgeon, Dr. Walter Dandy. This left her partially paralyzed on the right side, but did not impair her many activities or dampen her indomitable spirit and for five years she bravely carried on her musical interests and family duties. Her great courage and her husband's faith through that long struggle were inspirations to all who knew them. Finally, however, the odds became too great and following further examinations and a decision that another operation would be fruitless, she passed away on 5 May 1932. She is buried in Forest Hill Cemetery, Kansas City, Mo. At her funeral service Dr. Charles Gray, pastor of Westminster Congregational Church, of which she was a member, said. "Her character was the ideal harmony, all the faculties she possessed working together. It is a great thing that God can create a soul like hers."

Arthur D. Brookfield graduated from Englewood High School in 1897 and from the University of Michigan with an A.B. degree in 1901. He played on the unbeatable Michigan football teams of that era. From 1901 to 1909 he taught at Culver Military Academy and in the high schools at Milwaukee Wisc.,, Kewanee, Ills. and Muskegon, Mich., serving as principal in the latter two. Although eminently successful in the educational field, he was called upon at this time to decide between a teaching profession and a business career, and in 1909 he and Mr. Frank Goodenow formed the Goodenow-Brookfield Knitting Co. in Kansas City, of which he was secretary-treasurer until 1918. From 1919 to 1932 he was successively secretary, sales manager and vice president of the Cowden Manufacturing Co. of Kansas City. In 1932 he organized the Unitog Co. for the manufacture and sale of industrial uniforms, and served as its president until 1950 and as Board Chairman until his death. The company has grown into one of the leaders in its field. He served in World War I as an Army Captain in the Quartermaster Corps. In 1940-41 he was president of the Kansas City Rotary Club, Commander of the Military Order of World Wars, Kansas City Chapter in 1945-46 and in 1947-48 he was president of the Boys' Club of Kansas City. His sudden passing occurred aboard a train enroute from Florida to Kansas City on 21 Mar. 1955. Burial was in Forest Hill Cemetery, Kansas City, beside his wife.
