## FOREWORD by J. Whitney Bowen

All her life Fanny C. Bowen was interested in genealogy, and for the last thirty years she had been working on a compilation of the descendants of John Bowen, who lived in Tiverton in the eighteenth century.

At the time of her death in September 1940, her notes were practically completed, so I have attempted to gather them together and put them out in this book.

For the past eight years, Mrs. Leah H. B. Maloney has been assisting in the research, as Miss Bowen's health would not allow her to carry on alone, and without her cooperation the completion of the work would have been impossible.

Most of the statistics have been obtained from original sources. Vital records of the various cities and towns, old cemeteries and family Bibles, newspaper files, probate court records and reference works in various libraries and genealogical societies have been consulted.

John Bowen had two sons, Nathan and John, and for convenience the book has been divided into two parts. The first one concerns itself with the issue of Nathan, while Part Two is devoted to the descendants of John Jr.

I have used a system of numbering devised to prevent confusion in the different generations. In each part, each individual child is numbered consecutively from one in the order of its appearance. Then when that child appears as a parent in the next generation, its same number is used opposite its name in the left hand margin. The numbers in parenthesis immediately following a given name are the generation of the individual counting from John as first, and will serve to separate the direct descendants from those who are related by marriage. The Roman numerals following the consecutive numbers are simply the child's number in the family and have no reference to any other part of the book.

There are fourteen hundred and seventy-two direct descendants mentioned in the book.

So many people have furnished information that it seems unfair to single out any for special mention, but there are some whose assistance was of such importance that credit should be given. Among these are Miss Bessey Borden, Mr. Howard Cluny, Mrs. Charles S. Waring and Miss Lavinia Malcolm of Fall River, Mrs. Harry Howland Marks and Miss Susan Amanda Howland of Auburn, New York, Mrs. Ella Pilkington of Danbury, Conn., Mr. Charles Bowen Jefferies of Salem, Mo., Mrs. Bessie Dunn of Nunda, New York and Mrs. A. Preston Leeming of Providence, R. I.

While it is impossible to keep errors out of a work of this sort, care has been used to check the facts as accurately as possible. There are doubtless many omissions, because the people have moved all over the United States. I have left blank pages in the back of the book which may be used in bringing the data up to date, and I would be glad to hear from any one who can furnish corrections or additional information.

## THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN BOWEN, OF TIVERTON, RHODE ISLAND AND FREETOWN, MASSACHUSEFTS.

The first record of John Bowen is his marriage to Penelope Read Borden in Freetown in 1739. A thorough and painstaking search over many years has failed to find any record of the place or date of his birth, or any reference to his parents, although because of some names in the family and other evidence, it seems probable that he comes from the line of the original Richard Bowen, who came to this country from England in 1638, landed at Salem and moved to Rehoboth. Search to determine this is still being continued.

John Bowen owned large tracts of land in the section of Tiverton that is now Fall River and also in Freetown. His homestead farm extended from South Watuppa Pond on the east to Mount Hope Bay on the west, including the present Cambridge, Peckham, Palmer, Globe, Friendship and several smaller streets as well as a section of Stafford Road, 8 Rod Way, East Main, South Main, Broadway and Bay Street.

The house in which John Bowen lived is still standing (1941) on South Main Street, Fall River, on the west side of the street, a few houses south of Globe Corner but it is greatly altered and shops have been built out in front of it. The porch was removed many years ago and made into a blacksmith shop. The doors did not have to be enlarged as they were built wide enough for an ox team to be driven through with great logs for the fireplace.

There is said to have been long litigation over the will of John Bowen, as the Freetown property given to his son Nathan was more valuable than that in Tiverton given to his son John, and the latter was dissatisfied with his portion.

We learn from John Bowen's will that he had negro slaves, as he mentions his negro woman Experience, her daughters Freelove and Maria, her son Benjamin and another negro man Daniel. These negroes he ordered set free at his death and, in accordance with the laws of the land made provision for their future.

John Bowen is variously called in old records, "Esq.," "Gentleman" and "Yeoman." Certified copy dated Providence,R. I., "John Bowen served as Deputy from the Town of Tiverton in the General Assembly of said State from May 1757 To May 1759."

John Bowen was married first at Freetown, Massachusetts July 3, 1739 to Penelope (Read) Borden, born October 12, 1703, the daughter of John, Jr., and Mary (Pearce) Read of Freetown, Massachusetts. She was the widow of Stephen Borden (son of Joseph and Sarah (Brownell) Borden). He died August 30, 1738. Stephen Borden and his wife Penelope lived at, or near, the corner of North Main and Central Streets in what is now Fall River.

John Bowen married for the second time Sarah Gray, a widow. Below is an item taken from the Friends Records, which undoubtedly refers to Mrs. Sarah (Gray) Bowen. "Died at Tiverton, R. I., Mrs. Sarah Bowen, aged 91, for many years a public speaker among "Friends" - - April 23, 1799.

Bristol County Deeds Book 31, page 251. "Richard Bowen and wife Remember convey to John Bowen of Tiverton 40 acres of land in Tiverton, R. I. February 17, 1741/1742."

Bristol County Deeds Book 52, page 268, "John Bowen and wife Penelope of Tiverton convey to Stephen Borden all right they have in a saw mill and grist mill "which will of right fall to our son after the death of his mother my said wife." August 27, 1764."

John Bowen of Tiverton deeds to Nathan Bowen of Freetown for 225 silver dollars forty-five acres, partly in Tiverton and partly in Freetown, July 28, 1789.

John Bowen's will was dated May 10, 1789, proved May 5, 1800, recorded in Probate Records of Tiverton, R. I. Book 5, page 421, probated Taunton, March 2, 1802. John Bowen died Jan. 11, 1800, said to be 100 years of age.

## THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF JOHN BOWEN

of Tiverton in the County of Newport and State of Rhode Island, &c.

#### Yeoman: (May 13, 1789)

To all people to whom these presents shall come, know ye that I, John Bowen of Tiverton, aforesaid, being infirm as to bodily health, but through the mercies of God of a perfect mind and a sound memory, praised be his name, therefore, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing that the stroke of death is inevitable, and being willing to prevent trouble from arising among my wife and children do make this my last will and testament in manner folowing:

Imprimis:- I will and order that all my just debts and funeral charges be first well and truly paid in some convenient time after my decease, by my executors, hereinafter named.

Item:- I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Sarah Bowen, the use and improvement of one room in my house that is called the Store bedroom; also a provilege in the kitchen to wash and bake and in the cellar to keep provisions and sauce. Also, much of my garden as will be sufficient to raise roots and vegetables for her own use, together with the use of one bed, bedstead and bedding sufficient for summer and winter. Likewise a privilege in the orchard to have apples for her own use, summer and winter, together with run of three hers about the door. Also a privilege to the well for water, and to go to and from all parts of her improvements without molestation.

Also I will and order my two sons, namely Nathan Bowen and John Bowen, to provide four cords of wood cut and drawn to the door yearly and every year, for the use of my aforesaid wife, together with six pounds of good flax and six pounds of good sheep's wool for the use of my said wife. My meaning is that my aforenamed sons find and provide these aforesaid articles between these part and part alike. I further order my son John

to furnish my said wife one cuart of new milk per day during the grass season. Also, I will and order my two sons, Nathan and John Bowen, that they pay unto my said wife the sum of seven pounds ten shillings Lawful money, and that because specia at this time is scarce, my will is that said sum be paid in produce of such parts as she agrees to receive, which said sum is to be paid yearly and every year, it being the sum of money I promised in a written covenant I entered into with Sarah Gray before she became my wife reference being thereto had for further particulars. The true intent and meaning of all the above mentioned gifts and privileges and bequests to my said wife is, that if she doth not see fit to stay and improve the same, my will is that the above gifts shall enure to the use of my son John Bowen, excepting the articles of flax, wool and money or produce above montioned, and my will is that said sum of money be paid by my two sons equally between them: and the above men-tioned privileges and gifts, I give to my said wife so long as she remains my widow.

Item:- I give and bequeath unto my beloved son, Nathan Bowen, all my lands in the township of Freetown, in the County of Bristol, it being part of the first half share of land, bounded westerly by the County road, and to extend easterly to the Watuppa North Pond, together with part of the gore of land that is part of said half shaer, now included in the township of Tiverton, in the County of Newport, and all but six acres, adjoining the twenty-five acre lot, the said six acres to be taken off said gore the length of the twenty-five acre lot, supposing it to be nearly six rods wide at both ends, together with that piece of land that was laid out to George Borden for a tan-yard, as one of the heirs of Stephen Borden, deceased, reference being had to the committee's return for the bounds thereof, together with five-sevenths part of a saw mill and grist mill, together with one-half part of a storehouse now in the partnership of Stephen Borden, with all my right, title, claim and interest in the stream, called the Fall River, together with the four-sevenths part of the drift-way and landing place, at a certain place called the high bank, adjoining the Fall River beach, together with the dwelling-house my son now lives in, and the other buildings thereto belonging, together with five-sevenths of the utensils belonging to said mills, also, four silver spoons, two of which are marked J.M.M., and the others J.P.B., and one great chair, he having the choice of the two, also, one copper tea kettle which I give unto son Nathan, and to his heirs and assignees forever, he having and possessing what I shall in this my last will order.

Item:- I give and bequeath to my beloved son John Bowen all my homestead farm with all the buildings thereon standing which I purchased of Capt. William Read of Newport, and is the quarter part of the sixth lot in number in the first division in Pocasset purchase in Tiverton, together with my twenty-five acre lot being the first lot in number in the allotment of twentyfive acre lots in said Pocasset purchase, likewise the six acre lot I reserved out of the gore of land that I leave to my son Nathan. I give to my son John Bowen the said six acres adjoining the twenty-five acre lot, also two silver spoons marked J.P.B., the others marked J.M.M., one yoke of oxen, one cow, and all my swine, together with my farming utensils of what kind and nature scover, and all my household furniture exclusive of what I have heretofore disposed of or may hereafter, all of which I give unto my son John Bowen, his heirs and assignees forever, he doing and performing what I shall hereafter order.

Item:- I will and order that what stock I may have at my decease that I have not heretofore disposed of or shall hereafter, be sold by my executors hereafter named, and that the money arising from the sale be by them collected, together with what debts I may have outstanding, and applied to the use of paying my just debts, and if there be any suplusage remaining after my just debts be paid, the same to be divided equally between my said executors. Further I will and order that if my wife should be content to stay and enjoy the privileges I have ordered for her, then my will is that my son John shall find and provide a horse for her to ride when need requires; if she shall choose to leave my house them my will is that my son John provide for her the old mare that was mine to be at her disposal. Also two bushels of Indian corn and one bushel of rye, with one quarter part of the salt provisions that I have at my decease, to be delivered my said wife immediately after my decease.

Item:- I give and bequeath unto my grand-daughter Judith, daughter of my son John Bowen one spoon marked J.P.B., and one cow. Also my bed, bedstead, cord and furniture after my wife has done with it, the above articles to be kept by my son John until my said grand-daughter arrives at the age of eighteen years or to her marriage day, then to be delivered to her by my said son John.

Item:- I give and bequeath unto my grand-daughter Penelope, aughter of my son John, one set of calico curtains and my silver tea-spoons, to be delivered her when she arrives at the age of eighteen years, by my son John Bowen.

Item:- I give and bequeath unto my grand-daughter Elizabeth Bowen, daughter of my son Nathan, one oval table standing in my Store bedroom.

Item:- I give and bequeath unto my grand-son Richard Bowen, son of John, one silver spoon marked J.M.M., to be delivered him at the age of sixteen years.

Item:-My will is that my negro-woman, named Experience, be free Lt any time after my decease. Also I give unto her, said negrowoman, her bed, bedstead and cord, together with one iron pot, and one pewter platter, one spinning wheel and one snall cheat standing under my bed. Also, the use of my worsted combs during her life, she permitting my son John to use same for combing his own worsted, and after her to him, my said son John. Also, I give unto my negro-woman her daughter, called Freelove, and her child Maria, to be a free gift to the said Experience.

Item:- I give unto my said negro-woman Experience, the use and improvement of two acres of land on the twenty-five acre lot in the south-east corner thereof adjoining the pond. Also, a sufficiency of old decaying wood for her own fire. My meaning is that the use of the land and wood should be to the said Experience and her son Benjamin so long as they both or either of them live, and my will is that my two sons, Nathan and John Bowen, assist my said negro-woman in building a small house for her tolive in on said two acres, or otherwise as they can agree. Item:- I will and order that my negro-man Benjamin be free immediately after my decease, he doing and performing what I shall hereafter enjoin upon him.

Item:- I will and order that my negro-man Daniel be free immediately after my decease, he doing and performing what I shall heroinafter order, for as much as the estate which I may have at my decease is made subject by the laws of the land for all such as were born slaves and were subject to me during my life, therefore I would be willing to provide against any encumbrance of that nature, and for that shall, will and order the aforenamed negro-men, namoly, Benjamin and Daniel, do procure yearly and every year for ten years after my decease, twelve shillings in specie, each, and deposit the same in the hand of my two executors, and my will is that said money be, by my two executors, put out to use, and that the said money be applied to the use of the aforesaid negro men when sickness and misfortunes invade them and render it necessary that they should be assisted thereby.

Item:- Whereas, Elizabeth Gray, during a long series of sickness and infirmities, hath been my constant attendant, and hath rendered me great satisfaction thereby, I feel myself willing to manifest my thanks therefor, and do hereby order my executors to deliver her my low case of drawers standing in the chamber, and my calico wrapper gown, immediately after my decease.

Item:- All the remainder and residue of my estate, wherever it may be, I give unto my two sons, to be equally divided between them. Lastily, I constitute, make, ordain, and appoint my two sons, namely, Nathan Bowen and John Bowen, jointly and severally, my whole and sole executors, to this my last will and testament, and I do, hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannual all and every other or former testament, will and bequests, by me in anywise before this time made and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

> In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this Thirteenth day of the fifth month, and in the year of Our Lord, one thousand, seven hundred and eighty-nine. And declared by John Bowen to be his last will and testament.

He was Selectman of Freetown 1780-1781-1794 and of Fall River 1805 and 1808.

Nathan (2) Bowen married for the second time Nancy Read, the daughter of Joseph and Mary (Cornell) Read, who was born in 1770 or 1772 and died about 1830.

Nathan (2) Bowen's will is dated March 22, 1825, and was probated Feb. 7, 1826. It disposes of large tracts of land in and around Fall River. The Military record of Nathan (2) Bowen:-Private in Captain John Perry's Company Col. Abial Mitchell's Regiment enlisted July 27, 1780, discharged Oct. 30, 1780 served three mos. 5 days at Rhode Island. Company raised to reinforce Continental Army. Nathan Bowen appears with rank of Private on Muster and Pay Roll of Captain Henry Brightman Co. Colonel Hathaway's Regiment for service at Rhode Island by order of Council July 22, 1780, Enlisted August 3, 1780 Time of service - 4 days - Residence Freetown. Vol. 1. p. 110. Mass. Soldiers & Sailors.

#### THIRD GENERATION

After the death of his first wife Hannah Cook, Nathan Bowen married Nancy Read. He lived to be very old, and spent his last days in a house on the west side of North Main Street, a little way south of the property now belonging to St. Vincent's Home. Living with him there were his second wife, Nancy, and David Babbitt and family. David Babbitt had married for his first wife a daughter, and for his second wife a granddaughter of Nathan. A family tradition relates that John C. Borden, the husband of Amanda Bowen, a granddaughter of Nathan, had plied Nathan with New England rum, which was a favorite boverage at that time, and induced the old man to sign over much property to him. Nathan's will here appended disposes of large tracts of land in and around Fall River.

#### Will of Nathan Bowen

Be it remembered that I Nathan Bowen of Troy in the County of Bristol State of Massachusetts Yoeman, being Weak in body but of Sound and perfect mind and memory Blessed be the Almighty God for the Same do make and publish this my last will & Testament in Maner and form following that is to Say-----First I give bequeath and Devise unto my Beloved Wife Nancy Bowen the use and Improv't of two pieces and parsels of land Situated in Troy being part of my Watson Farm During her life bounded as follows. The first piece or parsle of Said land is Bounded easterly on the Maine Road leading from Fall River to Taunton Sutherly on and by a Wall between Bethsheba Sherman and the land to be Described Westerly by a Wall until it Comes to the Eleventh link or post in Sad Wall thence twenty Degrees north fourteen Rods and ten links to a Pear Tree thence westerly by the Cove and Taunton River Northerly partly on land Which I have Conveyed to my grand Daughter Hanah Babbitte together with the South Half of my Dwelling House above and below Alsoonne half of all the out Buildings door yard and privileges thereunto belonging Also the orchard lying North of the Chaise House-----Also one other parcel of Land lying North of the Roau bounded Westerly on land of Bathsheba Sherman Easterly partly on Land of Benjamin Brightman and partly on land of Mine Northerly partly on land of Hannah & David Babbitte and partly on land of William B. Canedy & others.-----Also I give to my Said Wife Nancy Bowen the Divaden or Divedens Which may be declared by the Committee of the Fall River Manufacturing Company from time to time upon One of my Shares in the Said Fall River Manufactory during her life.

Also the use and improvement of two Cows twelve Sheep and One Horse together with all the Household furniture and Indore Movables and farming utensils usually Kept on the Said Watson farm not Otherwise Disposed of Also the use of my Pew number twenty five in the Old Meeting House together with One Hundred Dollars in Money and what Provisions I may have on hand at time of my Dicease. And whereas my Said Wife Mancy Bowen is now in a poor State of health and Case it Should So happen that She Should be incapable of Improving her Estate With prudence and Discretion I do hereby Appoint my friend Enoch French to take

Care of her and her Estate and to Apply the proceeds and profits thereof to her use and for her Comfort So long as she remains in Such helpless State.

The Aforesaid gifts to my Said Wife is on Condition that She Relinquish her Dower in my Estate.

2 I give and Devise to my Daughter Bathsheba Sherman Widow and to her Heirs and Assigns forever a lot of Land Situated lying and being in Troy Aforesaid bounded Southerly on land that I have given to my Grandsons Nathan & David Babbitte Westerly on the Main Road Northerly a li to begin at Said Road so that it Will make Said lot of land twenty four Rods wide from thence to run east Twenty Degrees South until it Comes to a double Wall which is to be the North bounds until it Comes to a double Wall which is to be the North bounds until it Comes to a Wall with Posts and Rails being a little more Sotherly and from the East end of the Wall last Aforesaid to run east twenty Degrees South till it Comes to another pice of Wall near the Wood land, and from thence east twenty Degrees south by a Angle of Marked trees until it Comes to Benjamin Brightmans land thence Southerly by Said Brightman land thence South erly by Said Brightman land until it Comes to the land of the Said Nathan & David Babbitte Containing About forty Acres.

Also one other lot of land Situate in Said Troy bounded by a Wall until it Comes to the Eleventh link or Post in Said Wall thence west twenty Degrees north fourteen Rods and ten linke to a Pear Tree thence South fifty degrees west till it Comes to Sheffle Weavers land Southerly by land that I have given to Nathan & David Babbitte Easterly by the Said road Containing About four Acres more or less.

3 I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Susanah Sisson Widow five Dollars in addition to the Several Sums of Money and Other property which I have heretofore advanct to her to be paid her Out of my Estate by my executors hereafter named.

4 I give and devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Borden Wife of Jonathan Borden her Heirs and Assigns my Pew Number twentyfive in the Old Meeting House after the decease of my Wife Nancy Bowen.

5 I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ruth Bowen one Feather bed beding and Furniture belonging to the Same which she has now in her possession and one low Case of Drawes one Silver Spoon Marked I.R.M. one other Silver Spoon Marked I.R. M. Also a certain parcel of Land Situated in Troy Bounded beginning at the South east Corner of the lot to be Discribd by the Land of the Heirs of the late Abraham Bowen and Running Westerly by the Road that leads to Westport Seventy three Rods for a Corner thence Easterly partly by a Wall and partly by a Ditch Seventh three Rods to the Said Land of the Heirs of the Heirs of Abraham Bowen Diseast thence Southerly twenty-two Rods to the first Mentioned bounds at the Said Road Containing About ten Acres which includes two fence lots and a piece of parsture And in Case I do here after Sell the above Said ten Acres of Land and put the proceeds or Amount of Sales thereof into the Bank which is to be establisht in Troy or if the Same Bowen during her life.

be done by my Executor hereafter named who is hereby Autherized to do the Same and put the Money arising from Such Sale into Said Bank as aforesaid if he shall think proper So to Doe and the profits arising from Such Bank Stock I give to my Said Ruth

I give and Devise to my Grandsons Abraham Borden Richard Borden Cook Borden Ladowick Borden & Zephaniah Borden After the Decease of Daughter Ruth Bowen the parsels of land last above discribd on the Bank Stock that may be made upon the Sale of the Said land to them their Heirs and Assigns equaly to be Divided between them.

6. I give and Devise to my Granddaughter Hanah Babbitte Wife of David Babbitte one lot of Land Situated in Sad Troy east of the North Wattuppa Pond Containing Sixty Acres bounded west on the Blossom Road Northerly on land of William B. Canedy East on a highway Sotherly on my land Said Lot is twenty three Rods wide to have and to hold the Same to her the Said Hanah Babbitte her Heirs and Assigns forever.

7. Abraham (3) Bowen was Representative of Fall River 1804-1807-1808-1821. Selectman 1806-1807. He was Postmaster from 1816 until 1824 at the time of his death. Below is a copy of Abraham (3) Bowen's appointment as Post-master, the original of which is in the possession of J. Whitney Bowen.

To all who shall see these Presents, Greeting: Know Ye. That confiding in the Integrity, Ability and Punctuality of Abraham Bowen Esq., I do appoint him a Postmaster and authorize him to execute the duties of that Office at Fall River, in the County of Bristol and state of Massachusetts-according to the Laws of the United States and such Regulations conformable thereto, as he shall receive from me: To Hold the said Office of Post-Master, with all the Powers, Privileges and Emoluments to the same belonging during the pleasure of the Postmaster General of the United States for the time being.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of my Office to be affixed at Washington City, the eighteenth day of March in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen and of the Independence of the United States the fortieth.

There is some confusion caused by the various changes in the nomenclature undergone by the little village of Fall River in its early days. Fall River was set off from the Town of Freetown in 1803, but Abraham (3) Bowen who had visited Troy, N. Y. thought he saw a resemblance between the two places and in 1804 persuaded his fellow townsmen to change the name from Fall River to Troy. Troy it remained until 1833, but Fall River or "Falls River" seems also to have been used some time during this period.

Also a part of Fall River was in Rhode Island, the State line running not far south of what is now the centre of the City, but in 1862 the boundary was changed so the present city of Fall River, Mass., included what was formerly Fall River, R. I. and a section of Tiverton as well.

Abraham (3) Bowen resided at the north-east corner of Main and Bedford Streets and his farm extended from the Bay on the West to Watuppa Pond on the east. He was a promoter of one of the first cotton mills built in Fall River, the Fall River Manufactory, formerly called the White Mill, organized with a capital of \$40,000 and erected in 1813 and in the absence of banks the funds collected for this purpose (in the form of silver dollars) were kept in his tall clock. This clock is now in the possession of a descendant.

At that period there was no public house of entertainment in Fall River. Abraham Bowen's house was centrally located, and he and his wife freely entertained clergymen and other persons of consequence who had occasion to visit the town.

The Pocasset Manufacturing Company was incorporated in 1822 with Abraham Bowen one of the original stockholders.

Richard and Patty resided in the house on the east side of South Main Street next to the corner of South Main and Borden Streets. It was long known as the "Patty Borden" house, though of late years it has undergone extensive alterations and changes and is now (1941) occupied by stores and offices. In this house the children were all born and lived for many years. At that time Richard owned a very large portion of the territory lying south of the mill stream and extending to the Rhode Island line and from Main Street east to the pond, as well as a strip on the west between Main Street and the river. He died about the year 1824 and the commissioners who appraised his estate estimated the value of his land at \$2,000. At that time the village contained about 300 inhabitants and the whole town had less than 2,000. Six years later on the death of his widow, the same land was appraised at \$27,000.

Richard Borden left no will but in Bristol County Probate Records Vol. 62, p. 402, it shows a division of the estate was made June 28, 1825, and that on March 4, 1825, Sheffel Weaver, Joseph G. Read, and Nathaniel B. Borden of Troy were appointed appraisers of the estate. This is a very lengthy document and divides the property (\$3600) among his nine children, Abraham, Thomas, Richard, Ladwick, Cook, Hannah, Amy, Grinnell, Roanna Borden and Zephaniah. He gives \$400 worth of property to each of these children.

At the death of his father in 1824 James G. Bowen succeeded him as postmaster of Fall River and held that office until 1831. He was otherwise prominent in the business life of Fall River. At one time he was selectman of the town. James G. Bowen in conjunction with Dr. Turner erected a large dwelling house at the North West corner of Davol and Turner Streets. This was used for some time as a tavern and that section of the town became known as Bowenville. James Bowen had a gift for figures and it is related that people liked to put intricate problems to him which he performed rapidly in his head.

Abraham (4) Bowen was of a kindly and generous nature, intelligent and well read and in his earlier years he taught school for a time. He was very independant in his ideas and somewhat eccentric in his manner and this eccentricity became more marked after he was identified with the Second Advent Society. He was tall and spare in figure with brown hair, aquiline nose, and eyes of very dark blue. Mr. Frank W. Hutt in his History of Bristol County says: "Mr. Bowen took an influential part in the business and intellectual activities of his time. Engaged in a teaming business for a number of years, his more important commercial activity was as a member of the grain and shipping firm of Read & Bowen.

"For a long period of time he edited and published a periodical entitled "All Sorts" and his editorial comments upon the fancies and foibles of his time were eminently illuminative and constructive. His death, which occurred January 24, 1899, removed from Fall River a citizen whose usefulness was by no means to be measured by the number of his years, even though he lived to a ripe age."

In 1842 The Gazette was published by Stephen Hart and Abraham Bowen. It lasted about a year.

Mr. Bowen married Sarah Ann Read, eldest of the nine children of Major Joseph Evans and Sybil (Valentine) Read. For the first few years of their married life the couple resided in a house owned by Mr. Bowen's sister, Mrs. Jason Archer at the south-east corner of Main and Franklin Streets but prior to October 1832, Mr. Bowen Built the house, still standing at 175 Rock Street. In this house his two younger children and his grand-daughter were born and in this house he and his wife continued to reside for the remainder of their long lives. It is now (1941) owned by his great grandson, J. Whitney Bowen.

Mrs. Abraham Bowen was a very industrious and capable woman of few words but strong character, nighly respected by all who knew her. She was born in a house, still standing (1941) in the northern part of Fall River on the east side of the main road not far from the Freetown line which was built by her grand-father William Valentine but spent the greater part of her youth on the farm where St. Joseph's Church and rectory now stand, her father having moved there when she was about seven years of age. Mrs. Bowen obtained her early education in the little red school house on the west side of North Main Street.

In their early married life they resided at the corner of No. Main and Franklin Streets, Fall River. In 1852 they moved to Wrentham but scree years after Dr. Archer's death Mrs. Archer returned to Fall River and bought the house at the corner of Broadway and Osborn. Mrs. Archer as a girl attended the Academy of Miss Saunders and Miss Beach in Dorchester, Mass. Her youngest sister Aldeberonto used to tell of riding up to Boston with her parents in a buggy to visit Jeannette at Boarding School. Mrs. Archer was a woman of strong character and was highly respected in the community.

Dr. Archer was educated at Brown University and Harvard Medical School and studied medicine with the celebrated Dr. William Ingalls of Boston. He settled in Fall River where he became a successful practitioner and a leading citizen. He took an active part in public affairs and was elected the first President of the Massasoit Bank. He was also the first city physician of Fall River. Dr. and Mrs. Archer were among the incorporators of the First Congregational Church in Fall River. In 1851 they removed to Wrentham and occupied the house which afterward for several years was the home of Helen Keller.

John (5) Jason Archer was educated at Brown University graduating in the class of 1866. Soon after he was appointed instructor of English literature in the Annapolis but an illness so impaired his sight, he was obliged to relinquish this position. Returning home Mr. Archer began the study of law and after admission to the bar began to practice in Fall River. He was associated with James F. Jackson Esq. in the firm of Archer & Jackson. Mr. Archer received the appointment of associate justice of the District Court and was prominent in educational affairs. Mr. Archer was aman of high character, superior ability and scholarly attainments and held a paratively a young man at the time of his death.

Aldeberonto (4) Bowen was educated at a private school for young ladies in Fairhaven. She is said to have been very beautiful at the time of her marriage. Mr. Fearing too was fine looking and they made a very handsome couple. Mr. Fearing was a wholesale dry goods merchant and importer in Boston, so the young bride went there to live and entered with zest into the fashionable life of the city, her vivacity and social graces fitting

her to take a leading part. For many years their home was at 42 Louisburg Square. Most of Mrs. Fearing's twelve children were born in Boston. After Mr. Fearing failed in health the family moved to So. Wareham, Mass. and took up their residence in the old homestead on Fearing Hill, where their youngest child was born. Mrs. Fearing retained her vivacity and love of company all her life. She kept open house at Fearing Hill, welcoming with true hospitality her friends and relatives. In her later years she often spent the winter with some of her children in New York or Brooklyn making nothing of the journey more difficult then than now even when well on in her eighties. She died in the old Fearing Homestead at the advanced age of ninety-three.

He was a director in the Union National Bank for thirty-five years and occupied that position at the time of his death. He leaves a widow and a daughter. His first wife preceeded him to the other world about twelve years ago. His home on Hartwell Street is now occupied by a great grandson of his sister Amey."

From the Fall River News Jan. 18, 1886. "Of this large family (Richard & Patty's) only one survives, Mrs. Hannah Cook, widow of the late William Cook who with her two daughters, resides at the old homestead No. 30 Third Street. She is now in her 83rd year (Jan. 18, 1886) and her memory retains many interesting facts and incidents connected with the early history of Fall River."

"Mrs. Cook was the first to discover the skeleton of the Indian which was buried in the sand bank. The site of which is now occupied by the building of the Manufacturers' Gas Co. and which has since been rendered famous by Longfellow in his poem entitled "The Skeleton in Armor." The discovery was made about 55 years ago. The skeleton is supposed to have been that of an Indian chief, as he was buried in a sitting posture facing the sun, a large plate of brass over his head, a bunch of brass arrows packed in moss at his side, and around his waist a belt composed of brass tubes, each about four inches in length strung upon thongs of cowhide. Other relics were also found with this skeleton. It was decided to preserve the skeleton and it was placed in a glass case, together with the various articles found with it and removed to the F. R. Athenaum where it remained, visited by thousands of the curious till the great fire of 1843, when the building was destroyed with all its contents. There are various accounts of the manner in which Hannah Cook came upon the skeleton but the most authentic and probable one is that she went out to the sand bank to secure sand for scouring knives and while thus engaged discovered the skeleton."

Cook (4) Borden was 7th in line from Richard Borden, one of the first settlers of Portsmouth, R. I. He lived all his adult life on Fourth Street where he built his house on part of the old Borden farm. He first worked for Frost and Gurney, the original lumber dealers in Fall River. In 1833 he wert into the lumber business for himself. He sold a piece of his inherited land west of Main Street for \$1200-for capital to start with. He was established first near Lindsey's Wharf, then in 1846 bought the present yard at Bowenville where the business has been carried on ever since, later by his sons and now by his great-grandson. Before the boundary line between Rhode Island and Massachusetts was changed, he was at one time a member of the Legislature of Rhode Island and was active in both Tiverton and Fall River town and city government. At one time he had interests in lumbering in Western Pennsylvania. He was an incorporator of the Saving's Bank in Tiverton in 1881-now the Citizens Saving's Bank in Fall River; an incorporator of Tecumseh Mills in 1866; of Chace Mills in 1871; President of Fall River Spool & Bobbin Co.; a director of Richard Borden Mfg. Co. The first treasurer of the street railway company; a member of Board of Investment of Union Saving's

Bank; President of National Union Bank 1874-1880; an active member of First Baptist Church. He was very fond of fishing and of wood carving.

Three sons Theodore, Philip, and Jerome C. Borden succeeded their father at his death but after a few years, Theodore and Philip retired and Jerome carried on until his death in 1930. Management then passed to Richard Cook Borden Hartley, great-grandson of the founder who is at present head of the business.

Originally the business was located at the foot of Central Street but in 1846, to accommodate his growing lumber trade, Cook Borden purchased the present site, a large tract on the water front at Bowenville.

Christopher (5) Borden was born in that part of Tiverton, R. I. that later became the town of Westport, Mass. on land that had been occupied by his ancestors for generations. He was reared amid agricultural pursuits and attended the neighborhood schools, continuing his studies at the Friend's School, Providence, R. I. He became associated with and later succeeded his father in the conduct of the farm and in the lumbering business. Although occuping the same farm, Mr. Borden lived in two states and three towns, Tiverton, R. I., Westport, and Fall River, Mass. owing to the changes in boundary lines. Mr. Borden was much in public service, was a member of the Town Council of Tiverton; frequently served as Selectman of Westport; was a member of the auditing committee for years and held other minor offices. He possessed the confidence of his fellow citizens and was frequently called upon to settle estates. Mr. Borden was a man of cheerful and genial disposition. His political affiliations were first with the Whigs and later with the Republican party.

## Schooner Mary W. Bowen.

This schooner was one of a fleet of coasting vessels owned by a group headed by Joseph A. Bowen, and managed by him. It included the schooners William O. Snow, Lizzie H.Brayton, Marguerite and Fanny C. Bowen. Mr. Bowen was primarily interested in these vessels to bring bituminous coal from Chesapeake Bay ports to his coal plant at Fall River, but in addition they did considerable outside business and were a familiar sight in every seaport from Pensacola, Florida to Portland, Maine.

The Mary W. Bowen was built in Bath, Maine in 1900. She was one of the first five-masters, and at the time of her launching was one of the largest schooners afloat. She was 246 feet long, 46 feet wide, gross tonnage 2135, drew 25 feet of water and carried 3500 tons of coal.

She was commanded, until his retirement, by Captain Whitman Chase Jr., of Taunton, one of the ablest of the sea captains that this section of the country produced. Her career was uneventful until 1915 when she was blown offshore by westerly gales while en route for Norfolk without cargo. Given up for lost, she turned up a few weeks later at San Juan, Porto Rico with several sails gone, a mast damaged, the galley destroyed by fire and the captain's leg broken. After a thorough refitting, she was sent to Huenos Aires to take advantage of the fabulous foreign freights which were prevalent during the first World War. On her return from South America she was sold to New York parties and sent abroad. She was sunk by a German submarine near the Azores on her first woyage across.

Fanny Corey Bowen, the compiler of this record, was born in the Abraham Bowen homestead at 175 Rock Street, Fall River, and shortly after moved next door to 187 Rock Street where she lived the rest of her life.

She was graduated from the Fall River High School in the class of 1886 and Smith College in the class of 1890. She was a member of the Quequechan Chapter D. A. R., the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities the New England Historical Genealogical Society, the Fall River Historical Society, the Smith College Alumnae Association, and the American Association of University Women.

Her interests in life were largely centered about historical and genealogical studies and in this connection she was known to a great number of people all over the country with whom she had corresponded for many years. In addition to her genealogical notes she had collected much information about the histories of old New England houses. Her hobby was farming, which she carried out at her summer residence, Juniper Farm in Warren, R. I., where she had built up an excellent herd of registered Jersey Cattle. She died at Warren on September 5, 1940.

Joseph (5) A. Bowen and Fanny M. Corey were married in the house built by Jonathan Corey in 1836 on the corner of Main and Spring Streets where Steiger's store now stands (1941). Joseph A. Bowen was a man of sterling integrity, strong will, tireless energy, keen insight, and benevolence.

The History of Bristol County by Frank W. Hutt 1924 says: "Entering the world of men and affairs as a young lad, Mr. Bowen acquired sanity of judgment and breadth of wisdom with every experience and up to the end of his long life he felt a keen interest in public events and exercised a guiding hand in the conduct of the large coal business he had developed. The inspiration of his worthy career still lives in the memory of all whose privilege it was to know him.....As a young man Mr. Bowen attended

both public and private schools of his native city but from his eighth year spent much time in his father's printing office where he was employed when not engaged with his studies. In the year 1849 he became a student at the Fall River High School thereby entering the first class of that institution. In 1856 he engaged in an independent business as a coal dealer......He built and managed a fleet of sea-going schooners and in order that he might bring coal direct by ship to his own yards in Fall River he had extensive harbor dredging done at his own expense. That was the initial movement which re-sulted in harbor improvement at Fall River, the immediate and also the permanent benefit derived from his efforts counting largely in the recognition of this city as a pro-gressive and enterprising civic center...In addition to his many and important business responsibilities, Mr. Bowen found time for notably efficient and valuable local public service. He was elected a member of the Common Council in 1862-3 (also 1864-5) and of the Board of Aldermen 1869-70. As chairman of the committee to consider the advisability of establishing a city water system, he rendered service which is still benefiting the community. He not only "reported favorably" and used his energy and his ability to arouse the interest and cooperation of others in securing an adequate water supply but when this measure was adopted, served as a member of the first board of water commissioners in which capacity he took an active and efficient part in the construction of the city water supply system. For two years he was president of the Fall River Board of Trade.....and was interested in a large number of industrial enterprises.....Mr. Bowen's acquaintance was wide, both within and without the city and he was sought for leadership and counsel as long as he lived. Energetic, clear sighted, benevolent and kindly in spirit, his friends were legion and his influence for good unbounded. His pleasing personality and his sterling qualities of character won and held the regard of all who were associated with him in his varied activities. During the greater part of his lifetime he was identified with the Central Congregational Church and he gave his hearty support to its work."

Grace (6) Hartley Howe was educated in the schools of Fall River and Vassar College.

When Mr. Howe's close association with Franklin D. Roosevelt as friend and adviser brought him into national prominence, Mrs. Howe also became intimately assoicated with the Roosevelt family and assumed a leading position in political and social circles. After the death of her husband Mrs. Grace Hartley Howe was appointed July 15, 1936 acting postmaster of Fall River upon the recommendation of President Roosevelt and on May 25, 1937 this appointment was confirmed. Mrs. Howe became the first woman to have charge of the Fall River Post Office, She is a member of the Quequechan Chapter D. A. R., of the Fall River Woman's Club, Fall River Historical Society, the American Association of University women, and chairman of the Bristol County, Chapter of the Foundation for Infantile Paralysis Inc.

Louis McHenry Howe was a native of Indianapolis, but his family moved to Saratoga Springs, N. Y. when he was a boy of seven. He was educated in the schools of Saratoga including the Yates Saratoga Institute. An attack of typhoid fever when he was sixteen prevented young Howe from atriculating at college but his father took him to Europe three years in succession and over there he studied, traveled and recovered his health. This he thinks did him more good than a college education.

The elder Howe entered the newspaper field in Saratoga as editor of the Saratoga Sun and local correspondent of the New York Herald and at an early age Louis took over the job as New York Herald correspondent for Saratoga and that section of the State.

His entry into the newspaper field brought him into contact with many of the political leaders and it was his interest in politics and his intimate knowledge of reaction among the farmers and dwellers in the towns and villages of the farming region that some years later made him campaign manager for Franklin Delano Roosevelt, candidate for re-election as State Senator.

Roosevelt was the first Democratic Senator to have been elected in Dutchess County in many years and after his fight with the Democratic organization of New York his second nomination was looked upon as a complimentary ges-The very day he was nominated both he and ture. Mr. Roosevelt were taken ill with typhoid. The doctors ordered absolute quiet Mr. Roosevelt must know nothing at all of the campaign. Howe managed it for him. Practically ignoring the city of Poughkeepsie he put all his efforts into the surrounding country districts. Election night was the first time Howe was permitted to get in touch with the candidate since his nomination and he then had the satisfaction of calling up Mr. Roosevelt and telling him that he had been returned by a larger majority than his first election.

Howe went back to the Herald for a year but his thoughts were with the young man whose life he has helped to mound and when Fres. Wilson appointed F. D. Assistant Sec. to the Navy, Louis Howe went with him as his Secretary and it was not long before he became Assistant to the Assistant Secretary.

At the Democratic Convention in 1920 F. D. R. was nominated for the Vice-Presidency. Howe accompanied him on his speaking tours. He knew that the Democrats had not much chance for success that year but in the nomination and campaign he saw a means of making the country better acquainted with Mr. Roosevelt.

Suddenly, however, came a catastrophe, Mr. R. was attacked with infantile paralysis and it looked as if the best of plans were wrecked. "I was visiting the Roosevelts at Campabello, N. B. when he was stricken, " Mr. Howe is quoted as saying. "I had resigned my job in the Navy and was on the point of entering commercial life but that changed everything. As soon as Mr. Roosevelt recovered the question arose as to what he should do.....The doctor said if he ever were to fully recover he must continue active. Accordingly I put my other plans aside and went to live in his house and to do what I could to help him keep on with his career."

Howe took over most of the work of reorganizing the Boy Scouts, a job which Roosevelt had promised to do.

He wrote thousands and thousands of letters signed by Roosevelt to almost everybody, almost everywhere, keeping Roosevelt in touch with politicians, business leaders, farmers, educators, economists.

Louis Howe, an idealist a believer in progressive government made up his mind early in life just what sort of man should be President of the United States. He had found, he believed, that man and proceeded to devote his life to electing him.

President Roosevelt is quoted as saying,

"It is very rare to find a man who is a participant in political activities who does not aspire to either position or power of some sort, consciously or unconsciously. L. H. is, and always has been the exception to the almost universal rule. With him I think it started because of a desire to experiment in the practical application of political theories he had worked out of large experience in politics as a journalist. Then came the very wonderful personal friendship between him and myself. His unselfishness and intense interest make him a very definite asset to the cause of liberal and honest government."

When F. D. R. became a candidate for the presidency, Howe worked tirelessly but unobtrusively for his chief and was referred to as the nerve center of the campaign. He had never figured at a National convention until that in Chicago which nominated Roosevelt. When Mr. Roosevelt became president, Howe entered the White House with him as chief Secretary and remained at the side of his friend until a protracted illness became so serious as to render further activities impossible.

Mr. Howe died in Washington, D. C. April 18, 1936 and was buried in Fall River, Mass., President Roosevelt attending the funeral.

Mr. Howe was frequently referred to as the "Assistant President without portfolio." The Boston Globe of April 21, 1936 said "A few men in American history are credited with having made a President but only in this particular case has the "Warwick" asked absolutely nothing for himself. It is difficult, perhaps impossible, to find a parallel in the story of the world. Here was a character of tremendous force, equipped with a keen brain who had spent a quarter of a century raising his friend to the highest political position on the planet and sustaining. him there. To what degree Louis Howe was responsible for the career of Franklin Roosevelt no one can say, but everyone may be sure that the invalidism of the dynamic secretary made a tremendous difference which his death will greatly increase."

John (2) Bowen Jr. was left in the will of his father John Bowen Sr. "All my homestead farm with all the buildings thereon standing which I purchased of Capt. William Read, of Newport, and is the quarter part of a sixth lot in number in the first division in Pocasset Purchase in Tiverton, together with my 25 acres lot, being the first lot in number in the allotment of 25 acre lots in said Pocasset Purchase, likewise the 6 acre lot I reserved out of a gore of land that I leave to my son Nathan. I give to my son John Bowen the said 6 acres adjoining the 25 acre lot, also two silver spoons marked J.P.B., the other marked J.M.M., one yoke of oxen, one cow, and all my swine together with my farming utensils of what kind, and wheresoever, and all my household furniture, exclusive of what I have heretofore disposed of, or may hereafter." John Jr. undoubtedly occupied the homestead farm bequeathed to him. It was situated in what was then Tiverton, but is now Fall River. The house is still standing, (though greatly altered on the outside) on the West side of Main Street, a little south of Globe corner.

### FOURTH GENERATION

According to tradition John (2) was dissatisfied with his portion considering the Freetown property left his brother Nathan (2) more valuable, and there is said to have been long litigation over the will.

This would seem to be borne out by the records which show that the will was proved in 1800, but was not probated until 1802. However, there seemed no doubt but that Nathan retained the Freetown property and John settled

down on the farm, and many descendants of the latter continued to live in that section of Fall River originally included in the farm of their ancestors.

There is still what remains of a small cemetery on the east side of Main Street, a little north of Globe Corner, on what was formerly known as Bowen Hill, but march of progress has surrounded and almost obliterated this relic of the past. It is known that descendants of John Bowen Jr. were buried here, but most of the stones have been removed or destroyed, and in recent years an inverted ash can has concealed one that remains.

This is (1941) still in place in the front yard of 1210 South Main Street.

Perry Howland married Mary (3) Bowen. A certificate of citizenship signed by the collector of the port of New Bedford, represents Perry as an American seaman, aged 15 born in Westport. After his marriage he lived for several years near Fall River. In the spring of 1814, he with his family and his father's family accompanied by Richard Bowen, who married his sister Olive emigrated to Cayuga, N. Y. and settled in Scipio, with other related families. Perry's team was a pair of horses, which he sold on reaching his destination, and soon went to work at his trade of shoemaking. After his father's death he bought the homestead, and lived on it the rest of his life.

The following letter was written to her parents by Olive Howland, daughter of Perry and Mary (Bowen) Howland. To Perry Howland Sherwood's Corner Cayuga County, New York

Cayuga County, New York Tiverton, 9th mo., 9th. 1833

Esteemed Parents:

We arrived in safety at Fall River, the fifth day after leaving home. Nothing unpleasant occurred during our journey, otherwise, than learning on our arrival at Newport that the stage for Fall River had left and that in order to reach there that day, we must proceed to Bristol Ferry and there wait from eleven till four o'clock when the steamboat from Providence would arrive and convey us to the wished for port. We acted accordingly, Uncle Howard's was the first stopping place who we found by inquiry, lived near the Bridge factory. Uncle John's family who board with his brother-in-law, William Cudworth Jonathan Borden's family and Richard Borden's. Richard lives in quite a retired place and to get there without going agreat ways round, we had to climb over stone walls and follow a narrow path bordered with whortleberry bushes. Aunt Hannah was our guide.

Our next place was Aunt Wilcox's who lives where she did when you were here, then to J. Borden, Abram Bowen's. A. B. arrived only the day before us having visited Michigan, Ohio, Va., Penna., Md. His health is much imporved. After leaving Mich., the Agve Fever he says gave him a good shaking. John Wilcoxhas been sick about three weeks with the lung fever, his recovery is very doubtful. Today Humphrey was brought home from New Bedford, where he has been learning blacksmithing, sick with the same fever. The rest of our friends as far as I know are well. It is however, quite sickly in Fall River particularly with children. J. Tallman has married a second wife, a Miss Bowen from Warren. He is in Fall River, but has not com-menced housekeeping. D. Wilcox has two little girls, the oldest for which they call Adeline, the other is not named. The drowth here is very great. The Globe factory has entirely stopped and about half the spindles in Fall River. There has been a few showers since our arrival, but scarcely water enough fell to lay the dust. J. Wilcox is just what I expected him to be, though I think more ready to wait on us than I anticipated. He has taken us to Mount Hope. We had a delightful ramble over the ground once trod by King Philip, also to Newport to see the Jewish Synagogue Cemetery, Fort Adams. The fort is indeed a great curiosity to one who never saw any preparations for war. Its lofty battlements and dark subterranean passages, produce in the mind a feeling scarcely realized in any other situation. We intend going to Providence fifth day. Philip Allen, or Jeremiah W. is to accompany us. We have not heard particularly from A. Shearman but from what we can learn he has the care of a lottery in Providence. Amy Ann says if Eunice inquires whether she is home-sick tell her "I spect not." And tell her also that we easily pass for Quakers and she would soon consider herself one

were she to see the sleeves and ruffles of the Fall River girls. Extravagance in dress exceeds anything I have seen before, that is among the laboring class. The excitement concerning E. K. Avery still continues. They have had his image hanging in the village since the 4th of July till the second evening following our arrival when it was taken down, dragged through the streets, followed by hundreds of spectators, hallowing and shouting. He is now in Bristol in full fellowship with his brethern. The Rev. Mr. Graham is in Fall River delivering his lectures on temperance with respect to tobacco. I think no place can need it more for you scarcely see a man or aboy pass on the street without a cigar in his mouth. Any Ann is in some measure becoming a grahamite by taking water instead of tea, for most places we have visited they use black tea which is very disagreeable to her. The story is current here that Pardon Cookis going to move back this fall, but I hardly know how to credit it. His friends appear much pleased but here think they had better stay where they are. Peaches are quite plenty here where there are trees, but very few apples are seen. Flour can be bought at \$6.00 per barrel, though mostly it is \$6.12 or \$6.25. We have not heard from our company since we parted at Newport. Ann Eliza White was seasick almost the whole of the journey and A. Case after we left Albany. But the motion of the boat even through Hurlgate or at Point Judith had not the least effect on us. Amy Ann joins me in love to you, to those who inquire after us ----

Capt. Nathan Davis spent the larger part of his life on the water. His father was engaged in the coasting business and at the tender age of ten years, Nathan commenced going on the Taunton River, at seventeen he became master of the sloop "Mary", commanding her some five or six years. .Soon after this in company with Capt. Joseph Simmons he built the sloop "Ranger." A few years later Capt. Davis built the sloop "Temperance" and this was probably the first vessel of any kind in this country which was christened by having a bottle of juice water broken over its bow. It is a remarkable fact, well worthy of mention, that he, and five of his sons, each commanded the "Temperance" and she proved to be one of the most profitable sloops that ever sailed.

Capt. Nathan Davis was a deacon of the First Baptist Church of Somerset, Mass., and one of the pioneer temperance men of this section.

Clarissa (Bowen) Davis was a woman of high character, a devoted wife and mother and one of the most capable women of her day in the community. In cases of need, she was always ready to assist, and having reared a large family herself she was particularly skillful in caring for the sick. She was one of the strongest temperance advocates in the town, and much credit was due her for the position the town took on that question during her life time.

He was a man devoted to his family, was a collector of curios, very fond of music, and himself a talented performer on the violin. He had in his home a collection of violins, a number of which he had constructed himself.

Clifford (7) Milburn Holland (589). The Holland Tunnel under the Hudson River, connecting traffic link between New York and New Jersey was named for him, as he was Chief Engineer of the New York New Jersey Tunnel Commission in charge of the work. He was one of the most distinguished engineers in America and it was his life's ambition to see this tunnel completed. However, but two days before a three foot hole was blown through the last remaining partition of rock, he died at Battle Creek, Michigan on October 28, 1924, through overwork. The tunnel was completed in 1926, two years after his death. He resided in Brooklyn, but is buried in Somerset, the home of his forefathers.
