### FOREWORD

This Genealogy of the BOWNE FAMILY of Flushing, Long Island is derived from many sources. The early generations were compiled during a period of fifty years by the late Mr. Jacob Titus Bowne of Springfield, Mass. Much assistance was rendered him by the late Osgood Field and the late Thomas Stewardson whose researches both in this country and in England, materially advanced the work.

Through the influence and encouragement of the late Mrs. Josephine C. Frost who compiled the data for my own direct line from the Bowne Family, I was inspired to attempt this book. In 1915 Mrs. Frost and I went to Springfield to see the Manuscript of Mr. Jacob Bowne. After much persuasion he consented to allow me to copy his manuscript which was in my possession for a number of years. At his death he bequeathed the manuscript to the New York Public Library, where it now is.

My contribution has been the filling out of more recent data and bringing generations up to the present time, for which I am indebted to various members of the family for their information and interest. There are many lines which I have been unable to contact, this I regret but hope that some future member of the family may be able to supply the deficiencies. I wish to acknowledge the able assistance of Mrs. Ethel L. Fitz-Randolph for her work in arranging and typing for the printer.

#### APPENDIX I

## THE RODMAN FAMILY

## Benj. H. Smith of Germantown writes May 13, 1886:

I cannot make out any connection between William Richardson of Westchester Co. N. Y. and prob. also of Flushing, and the Henry Haydock & Margaret Bowne you refer to. There is a curious tie between this family and yours in another way.

The 1st Jno. Rodman of Barbadoes, had 2 sons Thomas<sup>2</sup> & John<sup>3</sup> The dau. of Thomas<sup>2</sup> (Anne) married Jno. Richardson, son of William and brother of Thomas (my gt, gt grand father): John<sup>3</sup> Rodman had a son Thomas who m. Elizabeth Scott, a grand dau. of Edward Wanton of Scituate Mass., and their dau. Katharine Scott m. a Henry Haydock in 1759. and another dau. Caroline m. Jas. Bowne; and Thomas Richardson<sup>4</sup> m. for his 2nd wife (his 1st wife Anne dau. of Benj. Newberry and sister of a Walter Newberry) Mary the dau. of Joseph Wanton and niece of Elizabeth Scott.

#### Memorandum by Mary B. Parsons of Flushing L.I.:

Dr. John and Thomas Rodman were born in England, and left that country to avoid persecution for their religious principles; they went first to Barbadoes, when Dr. John Rodman's wife whose maiden name was Scammon inherited an estate. After residing there several years Dr. John Rodman and his wife came to Newport, Rhode Island, about 1682. In the year 1688 he removed to Block Island where he was twice robbed by pirates: to his house, the women and children were accustomed to flee for safety in times of danger from these marauders, who on one occasion were restrained from accomplishing their work of death solely by his determined courage and resolute respect, as standing in the doorway of his house, he told them they should enter it only by passing over his body; after standing a few moments in mute surprise they quietly retired. About the year 1690 he removed to Flushing on Long Island, where he lived the remainder of his days and died in 1731, aged about 78 years. He was an eminent physician and surgeon, and successfully performed several very severe operations, the year previous to his death. He was a zealous sound minister of the Gospel frequently visited meetings abroad, and was particularly useful in discouraging a ranting spirit that appeared at that time. "He did abundance of good in his time and died beloved by all sorts of people" according to the simple record of the meeting to which he belonged.

Thomas brother of John Rodman came to Long Island in 1675, and died in 1727 in the 87th year of his age. He was a physician of much eminence.

Thomas son of Dr. John Rodman married Elizabeth Scott grand daughter of Edward Wanton of Newport. Edward Wanton was captain of the Training Band during the persecution of Friends in Boston and was present at the time of the execution of Stevenson and Robinson. He was so indignant at the severity of the Puritan Governor that he broke his sword, and bore testimony against its iniquity, for which he was whipped and fined. He retired to Scituate in the Plymouth Colony, became a Friend and established a meeting and was a preacher of great influence, much beloved by all sects. Elizabeth wife of Thomas Rodman and daughter of the above mentioned John Scott and Elizabeth Wanton had seven daughters all noted for their unusual personal and mental attractions. Anne their second daughter, wife of Caleb Field was the mother of Anne wife of John Bowne.

## THE MURRAYS OF MURRAY HILL

## From "Old New York" in the Evening Post, Dec. 10, 1873.

THE OLD HOMESTEAD AND HISTORICAL REMINISCENCES

Many pleasant stories have been written of the original Murrays of Murray Hill, but no evidence has yet been published that the Robert Murray of Revolutionary time was ever the owner of the farm which stood on the rise of ground now bearing the name. This link in the chain of descent of the title we will now supply, together with many other interesting facts connected with its history. The Murray Hill Farm, as originally held under a lease granted by the Mayor, Alderman and Commonality of the city of New York, to Mr. Robert Murray, formed a part of the common lands belonging to the municipality, and contained exactly twenty-nine acres, three roods and thirty perches of land. Robert Murray never perfected his title in fee-simple to the property, but held it under the lease up to his death.

#### THE ROBERT MURRAY HOUSE

The original Murray Hill Farm was situated between lines beginning a few feet south of Thirty-third street, and extended northerly to the middle of the block between Thirty-eighth and Thirtyninth streets. It followed the line of the old Middle Road on the west, and the eastern or Kingsbridge Road on the east. At the lower end the plot was somewhat narrow, but at the northern line it extended from near what is now the line of Lexington avenue to a point midway between Madison and Fifth avenues. The Murray mansion stood a few rods back from the eastern or Kingsbridge post-road, and faced, as near as may be, the east. That is to say, its windows overlooked the road and the waters of Kip's Bay and the East River. The only record of the existence of this famous old house, its exact site, appears on the Ratzer map of the city of New York which was made in 1767. Ratzer was a lieutenant in the Sixtieth Royal American regiment. The old place was named "Belmont", and its site was known as "Inclenborg".

As the city extended out and overrun the farm, the old house will be remembered by many old New Yorkers as standing in later years directly on the line of Fourth avenue at the intersection of Thirty-seventh street. It was a square-built, old-fashioned twostory house, with broad verandas extending around three sides. It contained a broad hall and many large apartments, and was in all respects a well-to do home. It was destroyed at the opening of the Fourth avenue or Harlem Railroad, in the year 1834 or thereabout. There is no satisfactory information in regard to the time when this famous house was built, but on the evidence of the old map we know it occured several years prior to the beginning of the Revolutionary war.

#### ROBERT MURRAY

The first record we have of Robert Murray is in 1745, when it appears that he was a thrifty Friend, a miller by profession and married to an estimable lady of the same religious faith as himself. He was living then at Swetara, near Lancaster, in the state of Pennsylvania, and it was during that year that his son Lindley, who afterwards became so famous as a grammarian, was born. At this time Robert Murray's brother John, who succeeded to the ownership of the Murray Hill farm in later years, also lived at Swetara and worked at his trade as a cooper. Robert, it appears, made the flour and John manufactured the barrels in which it was shipped to market.

During this period Robert Murray made several voyages to the West Indies, in which he was very successful in a pecuniary point of view, so that eight years later, or in 1753, he settled in New York, and became one of the leading shipping merchants and importers. Whether Mr. Murray imported rum from the West Indies, which was a staple article of import for colonial use in those days, or teas from China, or general articles of merchandise, we have at present no means of knowing. We know, however, that his worldly wealth increased, and that he soon became a wealthy man.

Mr. Murray at this time resided on Queen street, at the corner of Beekman street. Queen street is now known as Pearl street. In or about 1760 Mr. Murray went to England to attend to his commercial affairs, and he found the climate so beneficial to his health that he remained in that country for several years, or until the beginning of the colonial troubles in 1775. His son Lindley went out about the same time, but returned in 1771, and from that time until the war began he occupied the paternal homestead in Queen street. Robert Murray was the father of twelve children, of whom five only were living when he returned to New York. They were Lindley, the grammarian; John, who was afterwards the owner of "The Grange"; Beulah, Mary and Susannah. A somewhat mythical story is told of Lindley Murray in regard to a leap which he is said to have made over Peck Slip during a morning walk. Peck Slip was then twenty-two feet wide, but that, although so related by the chronicler, was not the scene of the exploit. It appears that Lindley, early one morning, went down to the "Fly Market", in Maiden Lane to buy a pair of chickens. He then lived in his father's house at the corner of Oueen and Beekman streets. He made his purchase at the market and started for home, with the chickens in his hand. Arriving at Beekman Slip which then existed at the foot of Fulton street, he is said (and he also told the story himself) to have made a running leap, and cleared the slip at a bound. To have made the leap over Peck Slip he would have had to go a considerable distance out of his way, and it is improbable that he would have done so when an equally formidable opportunity for a leap was in his direct route. He was not at all injured by the leap, as some writers would have us believe but enjoyed fair health for many years afterwards.

Lindley Murray's friends all doubted his ability to make the leap as reported, and family tradition says after much bantering he was induced to repeat the attempt, proper precautions being taken to prevent injury to himself or a ducking in the water of the slip; but he always failed.

On the return of Robert Murray from England in 1775, as Lindley was residing in his town house, he went with his family out to his country seat "Belmont" at "Inclenborg", and here he lived during the continuance of the war. It is not definitely known what Mr. Murray's political principles were during the war; he was a Friend, and therefore a man of peace, and politic enough, it appears, to keep his thoughts to himself while the King's forces were in possession of the city. Mrs. Murray, however was an earnest patriot, but notwithstanding this she was respected by the royalists, and her table and parlors were often honored, if it could be termed an honor, with their presence.

Of the Murrays, Lossing in his "Field Book if the Revolution", speaks in substance as follows: In 1767, on the East River, near Turtle Bay, near which fronting on the Boston Road—an extension of the Bowery lane—was the elegant mansion of Friend Robert Murray, whose venerable lady, in September, 1776, rendered such efficient service to the retreating Americans by detaining the British Officers at lunch. Thatcher, in his "Journal of the Revolutionary Army", gives the following narration of this interesting incident:

"When retreating from New York, General Putnam, at the head of thirty-five hundred Continental troops, was in the rear, and the last to leave the city. In order to avoid any of the enemy that might be advancing in the direct road to the city, he made choice of a road parallel with and contiguous to the North River, until he could arrive at a certain angle, whence another road would conduct him in such a direction as that he might form a junction with our army. It so happened that a body of about eight thousand British and Hessions were at the same moment advancing on the road, which would have brought them in immediate contact with General Putnam and before he could have reached the turn into the other road.

"Most fortunately the British Generals, seeing no prospect of engaging our troops, halted their own and repaired to the house of Mr. Robert Murray, a Quaker Friend and a friend of our cause. Mrs. Murray treated them with cake and wine, and they were induced to tarry two hours or more, Governor Tryon frequently joking her about her American friends. By this happy incident General Putnam, by continuing his march, escaped a rencontre with a greatly superior force, which must have proved fatal to the whole party. Ten minutes, it is said, would have been sufficient for the enemy to have secured the road at the turn and entirely cut off General Putnam's retreat. It has since become a common saying among our officers that Mrs. Murray saved this part of the American army."

At this period the only houses near the Murray mansion were the Beekman seat, which stood a short distance above, near what is now the corner of First avenue and Fifteenth street, and the residences of Messrs. Watts and Kettletas on the bank of the river, below Kip's Bay. It was at Kip's Bay that the British forces landed when in pursuit of the Continental army. They took on their march a lane which led them near the Murray mansion. This lane led them to the Kingsbridge Road, and probably followed very nearly the present line of Thirty-eighth street.

Some romantic incidents have been related in regard to the Misses Murray, in which Miss Beulah and Miss Susannah figured conspicuously; and the brilliant but unfortunate Major Andre is said to have been particularly enamored with the last named young lady; but the account must be questionable, as Miss Susannah was only sixteen years of age at the time of the death of that officer, and altogether too youthful a maiden for a careful Quaker mother to allow to mingle in the gay company of the royal officers.

# The Murray House as Washington's Headquarters; Carriages in 1770; Robert Murray's Will

The Murray house is credited with having been the scene of other interesting events about the time of the evacuation of New York by the Continental army. A prominent writer says that General Washington made it his headquarters on the 14th of September, 1776, and that it was here that Captain Nathan Hale received his secret instructions which cost him his life. On this point, however, the evidence is very slight, and Mr. Abram Hosier, of this city, who has studied Washington's progress closely during the war, and has visited and procured sketches of all these so called headquarters houses, says it is highly improbable that he could have tarried at this house for any length of time on the day above mentioned, and having a victorious army of British and Hessions thundering in his rear. We have already learned of Putnam's hurried march on the following day, and his troops formed the rear guard of the army. It may be, however, that the historian has something more stable than mere tradition in support of his statement.

#### CARRIAGES IN COLONIAL TIMES

As we have already stated, Mr. Robert Murray was a well to-do merchant before the war, and was said to have imported somewhere about the year 1770, the first coach ever seen in New York; but this statement must be incorrect as we have before us a long list of colonial gentlemen who were owners of one or more "leather conveniences", as Friend Robert Murray termed his. Among the well known names of old New Yorkers in this list are Governor Cad. Colden, he owned a coach and post chaise or chariot; Chief Justice Daniel Harsmanden, who is credited with a coach, chariot and phaeton; and Recorder John Watts, who was satisfied with one coach. The other leading names are Adjutant General Oliver De Lancey, who afterwards succeeded Major Andre; Joseph Read, merchant; C. W. Apthorpe, loyalist; Roger Morris, colonel British army, and husband of Mary Philips; James De Lancey, member of council; the widows De Lancey, Walton, Chambers, McEvers and Lawrence, Mrs. Waddell, Andrew Elliott, officer English army; William Bayard, Nicholas Bayard, Philip Livingston, Robert Gilbert Livingston, Walter Rutherford, Gerardus Beekman, Gerardus William Beekman, James Beekman, Colonel Beekman, Nathaniel Marston, John Marston, Rev. Mr. Ogilvie, Rector of Trinity Church, Anthony Rutgers and Jacob LeRoy.

## ROBERT MURRAY'S SONS AND DAUGHTERS

Some time during the war the Misses Beulah and Susannah and Mary Murray were sent to England, and while there finished their education. The young ladies were presented at Court, and Miss Susannah, owing to her beauty and accomplishments, received marked attention from the Queen. On the return of the daughters to New York Miss Susannah was woed by one Captain Gilbert Colden Willett, of the King's loyal American forces, and the pair were married, it is said, in a clandestine manner. The marriage is said by some chroniclers to have greatly offended Mrs. Willett's father, and that he never forgave her, and in his will left the best of his property to her sisters; but this is not so, as we shall shortly show. Miss Mary also married a Willett, but of his antecedents or history we have no account, and it is highly probably that this is the Mrs. Willett who offended her father Friend Robert Murray. Beulah who was an accomplished and beautiful woman married a Hoffman, and her son Murray Hoffman, yet lives, an honored resident of our City.

John Murray, Jr. as we have already shown, settled in New York and resided for many years on his estate adjoining that of his father's on Murray Hill. Lindley Murray, the grammarian, during the war for a time resided at Islip, but after living there for about four years, and at this time coming to the conclusion that the British power was likely to be permanently established in New York, and that the practice of law, his original profession was completely superseded, he returned to the city and entered into mercantile pursuits. This was in 1780. He began business and used his father's credit abroad, and in a few years amassed a handsome competency. He retired from business in 1784 and went to England, where he became a permanent invalid, and finally died at Holdgate, near York, in 1826.

## ROBERT MURRAY'S WILL

Mrs. Robert Murray died some time near the close of the war, and her husband followed her a few years later, in July, 1786, aged 65 years. Mr. Robert Murray during the Revolution was senior partner of the mercantile firm of Murray, Samson & Co. By his will, which was dated, in the peculiar phraseology of the Friends, the 23d of 5th month, 1786, he gave to his son, Lindley Murray, his gold watch, and house and lot in Queen street.

To his son John (who is the John Murray, Jr., brewer, afterwards owner of the "Grange" adjoining the Murray Hill farm,) he gave his wharf property adjoining Burnet's Key, which is at the foot of the present Wall street, and yet remains in the possession of the family. He further gave to his son John his house and lot in Queen street, wherein he formerly resided, and where John was then living, together with lots in the rear, fronting on Water street. For this concession John was ordered in the will to pay to the estate the sum of  $f_{2,4,000}$ .

He gave to his daughter Beulah the corner lot of ground on the northerly side of Burnet's Key and easterly side of Wall street, with buildings and appurtenances. He also gave to Beulah a lot of

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ground at the corner of Broadway and Murray street, described as near the Bridewell.

To his daughter Susannah, Mrs. Willett, who was unquestionably a favorite child, he gave a parcel of land and lots of ground on Golden Hill (Golden Hill is the present site of Gold street and John and Fulton streets); and also his leasehold estate in the farm on Incleborg, which, to use the words of the testator, "I hold from the corporation of the city of New York, and all the rights which then or might afterwards belong to the same." This clause in the will is the only record we have to show that Robert Murray ever legally held the title to the Murray Hill farm.

To his daughter Mary, who may have been the offender of which tradition speaks, he gave the sum of £1,500. This money was to remain in the hands of his son John and the interest applied to Mary's support. At her death, in case she left children the money was to be divided between them, share and share alike. His furniture he divided between his daughters Beulah and Susannah. After setting apart several sums for the support of charitable objects among the Friends, and £200 for promoting the manumission of slaves and the support of a free school for the education of negro children, he left the residue of his estate to his children, Lindley, John, Beulah and Susannah. He designated as his executors, his brother John, and his sons Lindley and John.

## The Descent of the Estate

Gilbert Colden Willett and his wife Susannah assumed possession of "Belmont" under the will and resided there for many years. We have seen minatures on ivory painted during the early years of their wedded life. Mrs. Willett appears as a veritable beauty. Her features were regular, and a wealth of dark brown hair hung in ringlets over a brow which was as intellectual as it was beautiful. Captain Willett appears like a dashing soldier of thirty, and just the man to run away with a Quaker's or any other man's daughter. In February, 1799, Gilbert Colden Willett purchased the estate in fee from the corporation, and, becoming embarrassed in his financial affairs, transferred the entire plot of twenty-nine acres, three roods and thirty perches to his uncle, John Murray, senior on the 13th of January, 1800. Mrs. Willett died at Coldenham, a little village up the Hudson and a few miles from its banks, in 1808.

The Murray Hill farm was now vested in John Murray, Sr., and it so appears on the old Blue Book and other maps from that time forward. John Murray Sr., was the head of the firm of John Murray & Sons. The sons were John R. Murray, and a son-in-law, Mr. William Ogden. In 1808 John Murray, Sr., died, and in his will the farm, or "Belmont", was divided among his children, of which there were four named, Susan Ogden, wife of William Ogden, Mary, John R. and Hannah L. Murray. Since that time the estate has been many times divided, and today the original bounds of the Murray Hill farm are almost unknown, but the name is yet retained, and not only extends over the area of the original plot but also over a large and exceedingly fashionable territory besides. That the town houses of the Murrays were first class we know from the records. Lindley Murray's house which was given to him by his father, was sold March 25th, 1786, for  $f_{2,200}$  to one Thomas Smith. That sum, in colonial times, represented quite a fortune.

We believe that there are no drawings in existence of any of the old Murray houses, as they were destroyed before the taste for historical research had been greatly developed in this country. Fortunately, during later years through the well-directed efforts of the New York Historical Society and the pens and pencils of such indefatigable searchers after facts of colonial history as Benson J. Lossing, Abram Hosier, Eliza Greator ex and others, much that is interesting has been preserved. In making searches in connection with our story we were greatly indebted for valuable aid to Mr. William H. Bell of the Register's office; Mr. Kingsland of the Comptroller's office; Mr. Traynor, of the Surrogate's office, and Mr. Sackersdoll, of the Department of Public Works. To Mr. George Manning Tracy, of Brooklyn, who married a daughter of Mrs. Gilbert Colden Willett, and who yet lives in the enjoyment of a happy old age, we are also under obligations for many items of interest in connection with the history of the Murray family.

#### From Lauriat's Boston Book Notes, November 1907:

Lindley Murray, the celebrated grammarian, was born in Swantara, Pa., in the year 1745. In 1765, after passing four years in legal studies, he was admitted to the bar, and soon afterward married. When the Revolution began he retired to a cottage on Long Island, N. Y., and spent four years in fishing, boating, and fowling. Going to New York in 1779, he entered into commercial speculation under the direction of his father, with such success that at the close of the Revolution, he was able to retire with a fortune to a beautiful place on the Hudson. Being attacked, however, with a muscular affection, he was induced to search another climate and sailed for England, where he settled near the city of York, and died there in 1826. His English Grammer was written for the use of a young ladies' school near York. It was first published in book form at York in 1795, and its success was immediate and extraordinary. Edition after edition was published in a few years. It was introduced into all the English and American schools, and made his name a household word in every country where the English language was spoken. His later years were devoted to the study of botany and his garden at Holdgate, in the variety and rarity of its plants, surpassed the royal gardens at Kew.

#### APPENDIX III

# THE FRANKLIN AND OSGOOD FAMILIES

[FROM THE MSS. OF JACOB T. BOWNE, VOL. 3, P. 79]

We are indebted to Osgood Field Esq. of London for the following interesting incident connected with the second marriage. When New York was fixed upon as the residence of the Commander in Chief of the American Army during the Revolution. Washington wrote to Hon. Samuel Osgood with whom he was on terms of intimacy, to procure a house there suitable to the position of the Commander in Chief. After due consideration Mr. Osgood came to the conclusion that there was no dwelling house in the city so desirable as the large one in Franklin Square, then occupied by the widow of Walter Franklin. This lady was a perfect stranger to him, but he called on her and stated his object. At some inconvience, but from motives of patriotism she gave up her house, and for some time it was occupied by Washington. On this first visit Mr. Osgood then a widower found Mrs. Franklin surrounded by her three little girls afterwards Mrs. DeWitt Clinton, Mrs. George Clinton and Mrs. John Norton, teaching them their lessons. This scene seems to have made a great impression on him. His call was repeated more than once and the acquaintance thus formed between them, resulted in their marriage.

### THE FRANKLIN FAMILY

From the autobiography of Mary Robinson Hunter. Mary Robinson Hunter was the daughter of Sarah Franklin and William T. Robinson. Mr. Hunter was our minister at Rio when this was written.

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# Rio de Janeiro, 6th December, 1845.

My mother's grandfather on her father's side was a wealthy farmer of the state of New York, born of an English father and a Dutch mother. They had a large family of sons, of whom my grandfather was the youngest, and two daughters. Of five sons I can speak, having known them all as a child, and all treating me with overweening love and indulgence. James, the eldest, followed the occupation of his father, and inherited the homestead. He married a lady of high breeding, who used to come down from the country once a year to visit the families of her husband's brothers, who were settled as merchants, three in New York, and one in Philadelphia. I well remember the awe her presence inspired among us children; the rustling of her silk, and her high heeled shoes making her figure more commanding and the reproach her never ending knitting cast upon us idle and indulged children.

Walter, John and Samuel resided in New York. They inherited large fortunes from their parents, which they put into trade, and the produce of China and other countries was wafted to our shores in their ships. Walter retired with an immense fortune from the firm lived in the style of a nobleman, and drove an elegant chariot. On an excursion to Long Island, driving by a country house, he saw milking in the barn-yard, where thirty cows had just been driven in at sunset, a beautiful young Ouaker girl. He stopped, beckoned her, and asked who occupied the house. With great simplicity, and without embarrassment, she replied, "My father, Daniel Bowne. Wilt thou not alight and take tea with him?" My uncle accepted the invitation, introduced himself, was well known by reputation. He conversed with the farmer on the appearance of the farm, on his fine cows, etc., but not a word about the fair milkmaid. Presently the door opened, and she came in to make tea for the "city friend" when her father said, "Mary, this is friend Walter Franklin from New York." She blushed deeply, finding he made no allusion to having seen her before. The blush heightened her lovliness. She had smoothed her hair and a fine lawn kerchief covered her neck and bosom. After three visits he asked her in marriage, and the fair milkmaid was seated by his side in the chariot, on her way to take possession as mistress of the most elegant house in the city, in Cherry Steet, near the corner of Pearl. She had a numerous family of beautiful daughters. They swerved from the simplicity of Quakerism, and became worldly and fashionable belles. The eldest, Sally, married a very wealthy man of the name of Norton, I believe of English birth, who was heir to an immense fortune, left him by a Mr. Lake, who lived near New York. The second, Maria, was the wife of DeWitt Clinton. The third, Hannah, married his brother, George Clinton. They all had children. Their mother was left a widow just before the third daughter was bornmy uncle Walter dying and leaving a rich young widow, and twenty thousand pounds to each of his daughters. His widow afterward married a very respectable Presbyterian named Osgood, who held some post under Government-commissary of the army in Washington's time, I believe. She had a number of children by Osgood. The eldest Martha married a brother of the famous Genet. My uncle Walter's house is now the Franklin Bank, named after its builder and owner.

I cannot remember the maiden name of my uncle John's wife, for it is of him I am now to speak, but when he married her she was a widow Townsend with one beautiful daughter. He owned and lived in a house the lower end of Cherry Street. Well do I remember the delightful parties assembled at his hospitable board, and now and then, as a great favor, taking turns with my brothers and sisters in going with my parents to one of uncle John's oyster suppers. He was of a joyous, happy temper, and loved to tease children. He used to tell me how he pitied me for being so homely, all in good humor and irony but it would wound my budding vanity. He had a large family of sons and daughters, all plain in person. His son Thomas is, or was, well known in

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New York as an active, flourishing man, where his sons have succeeded him—Marius, William, and some others, now on the stage of life. My uncle Thomas Franklin (great-uncle) settled as a merchant in Philadelphia, and left many children. His son Walter was an eminent lawyer in that city, and an accomplished, amiable man. Thus I have given an outline of my grandfather's brothers. His two sisters are now to be brought forward. Sally, the eldest married Caspar Wistar, of Pennsylvania, one of nature's noblemen—a farmer living on the Brandywine, of German parentage as his name designates. He lived in great luxury and hospitality, and had several children. His eldest daughter, Sally, married a mechant of Philadelphia, by name of Pennock.

Another and favorite daughter, highly gifted in intellect, married late in life a Mr. ——, and had two sons, one named Caspar. They married, I believe, two daughters of Bishop Onderdonk, but of this I am not quite certain one, I know married a daughter of his.

My grandfather's second sister, Mary, married a Colonel De Lancey of French extraction. His father, I believe came from France. I remember him as a little girl; he did not love children, was of a morose disposition, and I trembled when I heard him approach, in a red velvet cap and brocade dressing-gown and slippers, when I was playing about, whilst on a visit to my aunt on Long Island. They had only one child, a daughter, beautiful in face and person, and with much French sprightliness and naiveté. She married at thirty a Mr. Staples of New York, and had, like her mother, but one child, a daughter.

I now proceed to my maternal grandfather, Samuel Franklin. While on a visit to his brother Thomas in Philadelphia, he became acquainted with and married Hester Mitchell, a young girl of an excellent Quaker family. One of her sisters married into another Quaker family, named Parish, of whom Dr. Parish, so justly celebrated as a skillful physician and a true Christian is a member. Another sister of my grandmother's was the mother of 110

the large family by the name of Marshall, in Philadelphia, several of whom are celebrated chemists and druggists.

My grandfather brought his wife to New York, and bought or built what was then a fine house in Pearl Street, a few doors from the corner of Beekman Street. Here his children were born. Several died in infancy; only three lived to grow up. My mother was the eldest, a beautiful brunnette, with brilliant eyes, curling hair, tall and graceful in figure. The second Abraham, married a very lovely woman named Ann Townsend, by whom he had thirteen children, now scattered about the world. The youngest, John, married a country girl of Long Island, named Charity Cornell, who was a good wife and a devoted mother to a large family of children. Mary, a beautiful girl, and said to resemble me in a most stricking way married a Mr. Bond I believe of Baltimore. My uncle Abraham died many years ago. My uncle John still lives in New York, but he must be more than seventy years of age. My mother grew and bloomed amidst the stirring times of the Revolutionary war, when the English were in possession of New York.

The Kitty F. Wistar to whom the following letter is addressed was born in 1768, and was the third child of Caspar Wistar and Mary Franklin, who was the fourth daughter of Thomas Franklin (born January 20, 1703), who married Mary Pearsall in 1726. The Sarah Robinson who wrote the letter was a Franklin who married Rowland Robinson, of the firm of Franklin, Robinson & Co., in the Eastern trade.

"Uncle Walter" Franklin was born in 1727, and the oldest child of Thomas Franklin and Mary Pearsall. His house was between Cherry and Queen Streets (now Pearl Street), and he was senior partner of the above firm.

New York, 30th of the Fourth Month, 1789. I feel exceedingly mortified and hurt, my dear cousin, that so many of my letters to thee have been miscarried. I have certainly written as many as half a dozen since thee left New York, although thou acknowledgest the receipt of but one, which almost discourages me from making another attempt, so uncertain is it whether it will ever reach Brandywine, but I cannot entirely give it up as I am assured they afford you some pleasure. I received thine of the 4th and was pleased to hear you are well and that my dear uncle and aunt talked of making New York a visit. I shall wish for a wedding in the family often, if it will bring such good strangers; so, my dear, insist on it, and do not let them disappoint us, we promise ourselves a great enjoyment in their company.

Uncle John's affair goes on rapidly and will soon come to a crisis, and he is as attentive a swain as thou wouldst wish to see, and as much delighted at the approaching event. Betsey and Polly are expected to-day, I hope they will be prudent, but no doubt it will be a great trial, they are all extremely averse to the match, and uncle has his hands full with them, thou may suppose. If I could sit but an hour with thee, my dear, how much I should have to tell thee, but it will not do to put all on paper, but so far I will say that the widow would have nothing to say to uncle John until he would be reconciled to cousin Tommy, in consequence of which he visits there and takes a great deal of notice of his three little granddaughters, a very pleasing event to all of us and does great honor to our Aunt, and endears her very much to me, she I think every way suitable to our Uncle and I have no doubt will make an excellent wife. Billy is now out on his journey to Vermont, he has been gone eight weeks, I have frequently heard from him during his absence but do not know when to expect him. Our dear little Eliza is now in the small pox and like to have it favorably, a favour which demands our gratitude, the rest of the little tribe are well. My little neice Esther, grows finely and her mother is as well as can be expected.

Great rejoicing in New York on the arrival of General Washington, an elegant Barge decorated with an awning of Satin,

12 oarsmen dressed in white frocks and blue ribbons went down to E. Town last fourth day to bring him up. A stage was erected at the Coffee house wharf, covered with a carpet for him to step on, where a company of Light horses, one of Artillery, and most of the Inhabitants were waiting to receive him, they paraded through Queen street in great form, while the music of the drums, and the ringing of the bells were enough to stun one with the noise. Previous to his coming Uncle Walter's house in Cherry street was taken for him, and every room furnished in the most elegant manner. Aunt Osgood and Lady Kitty Duer had the whole management of it. I went the morning before the General's arrival to take a look at it, the best of furniture in every room and the greatest quantity of plate and china I ever saw, the whole of the first and second storey is papered and the floors covered with the richest kind of Turkey and Wilton carpets. The house did honor to my aunts and Lady Kitty, they spared no pains nor expense on it. Thou must know that Uncle Osgood and Duer were appointed to procure a house and furnish it, accordingly they pitched on their wives as being likely to do it better. I have not done yet my dear. Is thee not almost tired. The evening after his Excellency's arrival there was a general Illumination took place except among friends and those styled Anti-Federalist. The latters windows suffered some, thou may imagine. As soon as the General has sworn in, a grand exhibition of fire works is to be displayed which it is expected is to be tomorrow, there is scarcely anything talked about now but General Washington and the Palace, and of little else have I told thee yet tho' have spun my miserable scrawl already to a great length, but though requested to know all that was going forward. I have just heard that William Titus of Woodbury is going to be married to a sister of Uncle Bowne, mother to Thomas Bowne, who I believe thee knows, Eliza Titus, her husband and Father and mother, spent the evening last Sixth day. Eliza is much altered since I saw her she is much thinner and plainer. Marie De Courcy too has been

in town a fortnight, she made her home at Uncle Osgood's, but was a great deal among us all, she is about making a little tour into Connecticut on a visit to a friend Lucy Ball with Joseph Bull, who is now in town. Our Families are all well, Hetty is still with us Rowland and the girl's love to you. Accept mine, my dear cousin and write soon, to thy affectionate cousin.

[FROM LAMB'S HISTORY OF NEW YORK CITY, VOL. II, P. 330]

Samuel Osgood (b. at Andover Mass. Feb. 14, 1784 d. in New York, Aug. 12, 1813) was graduated from Cambridge with the highest honors in 1766: he studied theology, but losing his health, became an importing merchant. In 1774 in view of the disturbed relations with Gt. Britain, he abandoned business, and was immediately sent to the Essex Co. Convention, and thence a delegate to the provincial congress of Mass. He took part in the battle of Lexington but was shortly elected to the state Legislature, and left the army thinking he could serve the country best in a civil capacity. From 1780 to 1784 he was a member of the Continental Congress, and from 1785 to 1789, first commissioner of the U.S. Treasury; the bonds required for this last office were so heavy that he was about to decline the appointment rather than ask his friends to become security, but the Legislature of Mass. came forward in a body and became his bondsman, an honor never accorded to any other private individual. With the organization of the new government he was made the first Postmaster-General of the U.S. He subsequently held several positions of great trust in New York, where he resided until his death. He was distinguished for integrity, piety and public spirit, and for scientific and literary attainments, wrote several volumes on religious subjects, and was the author of a work on chronology. He was the son

of Peter Osgood, descended from John Osgood of Wherwell, England, who sailed for Boston in 1638. He married Martha Brandon, in 1775, who died childless in 1778. Eight years afterwards he married Maria Bowne, the widow of Walter Franklin, whose father Daniel Bowne, and whose mother was the sister of Governor Winthrop of Mass. She had three daughters at the time of her marriage to Mr. Osgood, Maria Franklin first wife of De Witt Clinton; Sarah Franklin, who became Mrs. John Lake Norton: and Hannah Franklin, who married George, the brother of De Witt Clinton. The children of Samuel and Maria Bowne Osgood were: Maria Brandon Osgood second wife of the French Minister, Citizen Edmond Charles Genet, and mother of Mr. George C. Genet, of New York-(the first wife of Genet was Cornelia Tappan Clinton, the daughter of Governor George Clinton): Julia, who married her cousin, Samuel Osgood; and Susan Maria who married Moses Field of New York-great grandson of Benj. Field and Hannah Bowne, daughter of John Bowne, the first of the Bownes in this country-and was the mother of Judge Maunsell B. Field, Assistant secretary of the Treasury under Chase."

#### AN OLD NEW YORK FAMILY

Some interesting reminisences by a correspondent in England

#### To the Editors of the Evening Post:

I have read the interesting communications which have appeared in your journal under the heading, "An Old New York Family." Perhaps unintentionally on his part, the first letter of your correspondent "Champlin" conveys the impression that Walter Franklin married one beneath him in station. It is partly to correct this view that I shall feel obliged if you can find space

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in your columns for the following statements concerning some of the individuals spoken of in that letter and their families by another grandchild of Walter Franklin's wife.

Walter Franklin was the son of Thomas and Mary Franklin, of Harrison's Purchase, Westchester county, N.Y., where he was born—according to the style of the Friends—on the 11th day of the 10th month, 1727. I am not prepared to speak of his more remote ancestry; but I have a vague idea that he was descended from an early settler on Long Island. His first wife, Maria was a daughter of Daniel Bowne and Sarah Stringham of Rocky Hill, Flushing, and was born there on the 4th day of the 1st month, 1754. The marriage took place at that town on the 12th day of the 5th month 1774, when the bride was not at "sweet sixteen", but in her twenty-first year.

The lady was fourth in descent from John Bowne of Matlock, Derbyshire, who left England with his father Thomas in 1649, and settled at Flushing two years later. In 1661 he built the house there—now standing and occupied by one of his descendants—in which he entertained in 1672 George Fox, "the Apostle of the Quaker's", to whose faith he had been converted a few years earlier.

I will not dwell on the persecutions he suffered for his convictions—his arrest, fine, imprisonment at New Amsterdam and banishment to Holland by Stuyvesant, and his release by the West India Company, who reprimanded their Governor for his tyranny —for these are matters of history; but I would say that his diary, his letters to his wife, and the touching discourse he pronounced at her funeral "amongst Friends when met together to accompany her body to the Ground\*\*\*\* at the Peele meeting place, London, 2d of 12th mo., 1677"—all of which are preserved at that Mecca of American Quakers, the old house referred to—show that John Bowne was a man of education and of exemplary piety. His first wife, whom he married in 1656 and from whom Mrs. Franklin was descended, was Hannah, daughter of Robert Feaks and Elizabeth, whose maiden name was Fones. Her mother, the wife of Thomas Fones of London was a sister of John Winthrop, Governor of Massachusetts.

The following extract from a letter of the celebrated Captain John Underhill of our early colonial history to John Winthrop, Jr., dated Southold, 12 April, 1656, announces John Bowne's engagement, and gives the writer's opinion of him. "Hannah Feke is to be married to a veri gentiele young man of good abiliti, of a loveli fetture and good behayior." A few years later Captain Underhill married Hannah's sister Elizabeth; but by a previous wife he had a granddaughter, Hannah Underhill, who was united to Thomas Bowne and was the grandmother of Mrs. Walter Franklin. The Underhills, who were an ancient family of high standing and large possessions, and had been seated in Warwickshire and Staffordshire for more than two centuries before Captain Underhill, then in the Netherlands, was chosen in 1630 to drill and command the Boston militia.

I have said that the Bowne emigrants came from Matlock; but the family were before that at Bakewell, about ten miles distant. This is shown by their pedigree in the Warwickshire Visitation of 1683, beginning with Robert Bown, or Boun, as the name is there spelt, who had a son Richard, described as of Bakewell, in the first half of the fifteenth century and time of Henry VI. One branch removed to Warwickshire, and hence the pedigree appears in a visitation of that country. Another settled at Matlock, and is described as of "Hulme." This place is named in the will of Thomas Bowne of Flushing, dated there in 1675, in which he leaves his estate in England to his son John and speaks of "Pellet Holme." A letter before me from the rector of Matlock, dated in 1873, says: "There is a place called "The Holme" in this parish, which formerly belonged to the Bownes. I am not in a position to say if the Bownes were descended from the great historic family of Bohun-commonly pronounced Boon and frequently spelt Boun or Bown; but mention that the arms assigned to the Derbyshire family in the pedigree are those of the powerful Earls of Essex, Hereford and Northampton, differenced by three escallops on the "bend." It seems from this as if they claimed descent from the lords of Bohun and Carentan in Normandy and from "I viel Onfrie" de Bohun, who accompanied the Conqueror.

Setting aside this claim as matter of conjecture, I think I have shown that Mrs. Franklin was descended in the male line from a good old visitation family, whose right to coat armor was formally recognised by heralds, and that she inherited the blood of the Winthrops of Groton and the Underhills of Warwickshire, and I have no hesitation in saying that in point of family she was fully her husband's equal, if not his superior.

Before closing this communication I should like to say a few words of Mrs. Franklin's second husband, Samuel Osgood.

He was a son of Peter Osgood and Sarah Johnson, of Andover, Mass., where he was born on the 3rd of February, 1747-8, and was fifth in descent from John Osgood of Wherwell, near Andover, Hampshire, who sailed for New England in 1638 and settled at the place there named after the town near his old home. The Osgoods had been seated at Wherwell and the neighboring parishes of Over and Nether Wallop from the early part of Henry VIII.'s reign, and probably for some time before. Samuel Osgood first married Martha Brandon, a lady of good family, in 1775. She died childless in 1778, and on the 24th of May, 1786, he was united to Maria, widow of Walter Franklin. I would mention as a curious circumstance that their oldest child was named Martha Brandon after Osgood's first wife.

After taking his degree at Cambridge Osgood studied for the ministry, but abandoned this career from failing health and by the advice of his physician. At the outbreak of the Revolution he commanded a company of minute men at Andover, and he appears to have taken part in the first action of the war, the running fight when the British retreated from Concord, which is usually called the Battle of Lexington. In a modest sketch of his life he says: "On the 19th April, 1775, I marched with them (i e, the minute men) about twenty miles to Lexington, and from there to Cambridge, about fifteen miles, in pursuit of the British troops."

It is traditional in the family that the sword of the first British officer who surrendered in the war was handed by him to Captain Osgood, and I have been told they became fast friends from that day.

Shortly after, General Ward, Commander-in Chief of the American forces, appointed Osgood one of his aids, with the rank of colonel. While in this position he was elected to the state Legislature, and, believing that he could serve his country best in a civil capacity, he left the army, notwithstanding the offer of the command of a regiment. Colonel Osgood afterward held many offices. He was member of the Massachusetts Board of War; State Senator for Essex county; delegate from Massachusetts to the Congress of the United States; first Commissioner of the United States Treasury, corresponding to the present Secretary of the Treasury, etc., etc. It was when appointed to this last office that the state of Massachusetts became his security, as stated by your correspondent "E".

His portrait may be seen in one of the large paintings by Trumbull at Washington. A minature of him by an unknown artist, but of excellent workmanship, in the writer's possession, represents him with powdered hair, coat of the color of lavender, buff waistcoat and ruffled shirt. Among the papers he left at his death were letters from Washington, Franklin, Adams, Jefferson, and nearly all the leading men of his time. Unfortunately they were divided among his children and are mostly lost. It has been mentioned that one of his daughters married Moses Field, of New York, who was her fourth or fifth cousin, although neither was aware of it at the time. His great grandfather, Benjamin Field of Flushing, married Hannah, daughter of John Bowne, the emigrant.

I will close with an anecdote of Washington, who often had

the Franklin children at their old home while he lived there. One of these, the late Mrs. George Clinton, told the writer that she had often seen him take out his handkerchief before getting into his carriage and pass it over the horse, and if it was in the least degree soiled the groom was reprimanded.
