Profatory Note.

This "Sketch" is not, and was not intended as a Biography. This writer has not the necessary information, nor the ability in writing to write a biography of his grandfather. This writer' father was but six years old when his father died. Therefore he knew very little about his father of his own knowledge, and never told this writer very much. But Shadrach Bond's daughter Mary, who married Joseph B. Holnes was intimate with her father for years. Nearly all of the information this writer has of Shadrach Bond, was learned through conversations with his Aunt Mary Holmes.

Having no notes of those conversations, some things may have been given out of their order. Some of the information may not have been renembered correctly.

So this writer selected some principal things in his life and tried to write them so they would prove interesting to some of Shadrach Bend's descendants, and possibly to some others who may see them.

Sketch of the Life of Shadrach Bond.

Shadrach Bond was born in Fredrick, Maryland, about the year 1772. A few years later, his parents returned to Baltimere, Md., their former home. There Shadrach Bond claimed his.home until he was about twenty one.

When he was about sixteen, he joined the troop under George Rogers Clark, which was sent by the Governor of Virginia, to take possession of Terre Haute, Indiana, and Kaskaskia, Illinois, from the English. He returned to the East with Clark, and lived in Baltimore for a few years.

About 1791, he emigrated to Illinois, and settled in the Great American Botton, in Monroe County. Here he engaged in in farming, and, incidentally in hunting. he soon became acquaqnted with very many of the early pioneers, and took a prominent part in all community undertakings, whether civil projects or social gatherings.

Early in the nineteenth century, he was appointed Land Commissioner and Receiver of Public Monies by the United States Government for the territory that now forms the three great states of Indiana, Illinoisand Missouri. Through this Land Office work he became acquainted with almost all the inhabitants of these territories. It is said that he knew every voter in these three territories, could speak to eack one by name, and knew the given names of most of their wives, and could call many of their children by name. While getting acquainted thus widely, he unconsciously laid the foundations for his great work of leading in making Illinois a free state. Although his parents owned slaves, and he inherited some(later)from his parents, he was always a hater of slavery, and determined to hit it in every that he could. While in the Land Office, he continued his farming, and made some investments from time to time, until at one time he owned more real estate than any other man in Illinois.

About 1908 or 1909, the death of his parents ocueed him to make a visit to. Baltimore. He set free the slaves that came to him from the estate, giving nearly all, the property he owned to the State of Maryland, as a guarantee that . the freed slaves should not become a charge on the state.

While in Baltimore on this visit, he became acquainted with Miss Achsia Bond, (a distant relative,) whom he had never before seen, though both had lived in Baltimore at the same time for some years. Miss Achsah Bond's parents were then living in Nashville, Tennessee. 1810 Their acquaintance ripened into friendship, and they corresponded regularly after their return to their homes. In 1811, Shadrach Bond visited Nashville, Tennessee, and he and Miss Achsah Bond were masried. They visited Baltimore to see some of their relatives, and then came back to Illinois. One of the first things they did was to give a "Groon's Party," or, as it was then called, an "Infair". To this " Infair," he invited most of the families living in Indiana, Illinois and Missouri, and very many of them came, and camped out on the prairie near his home for days. Dancing, games, and races, common to those days, filled the time, and all was gaity and good will.

While in Baltimore on his wedding trip, he bought a large solid silver ladle, for use as a soup ladle, or to dip the punch at social functions. (The writer of this has that ladle now.)

A year or so after his wedding, Shadrach Bond was elected Delegat to Congress from the Territory of Illinois. As he needed a new suit of clothes, his wife, with the assistance of her Negro servants, theared some sheep. Then she washed, carded and spun the wool, and Jove it into broadcloth, from which she made him a suit to wear to ongress. Out of some of the cloth that was left, she made a cover or the family Bible, A small piece of that cloth is still with that ible, which this writer now has.)

When it was time to start to Washington to attend Congress, they rranged a party, consisting of Shadrach Bond, his wife, and severe, egro servants, all on horseback, and started on the long, long ourney, taking them six weeks to make the trip, and they camped out t night, both going and returning.

Besides his military experience under General George Rogers Clark, thadrach Bond joined the army early in the War of 1812, and was aptain of a Company during the entire War, being stationed in Washgton, D. C. to help in the defense of the Capitol.

Shortly after that War he took a leading part in the steps that ed up to the admission of Illinois as a Free State in 1818, and his lection as Governor. He was as much opposed to duelling, as he was jo slavery. Early in his term as Governor, two prominent men engaged in a duel on " Bloody Island, "opposite St. Louis, Missouri. One of the on was killed. The other man was arrested, tried, found guilty of Lurder, and sentenced to death. A desperate attempt was made to have aim pardoned, but Governor Bond refused all pleas, and ordered the sentence carried out.

Governor Bond lived for twelve years, after his term as Governor ad expired, in his home in Kaskaskia, Illinois, where his large home 348 ever open to all visitors. After his death, his widow, (Madame ond, as the French residents of Kaskaskia called her), kept up this ; ractice until her death in 1845.

Governor Bond's parents were Christains, members of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Whether he had ever joined the Church, this writer never learned; but he lived a onristian life, and read the Bible regularly. He was a total abstainer from all alcoholic beverages all his life, and such abstainers were rare at that time. This writer never learned whether or not he used tobacco.

Shadrach Bond became a Freemason in Baltimore, Maryland. After he became settled in Kaskaskia, Illinois, he transferred his membership to West Gate Lodge, at Kaskaskia Illonoise Later he became Master of that Lodge, and was then presented with a " Lamb Skin Apron", which cane down from him to this writer, who lately presented it to Shadrach Bond Lodge, No. 1044, A. F. & A. M., of Chicago, Illinois. A Grang Lodge of Masons was organized in December, 1821, and Shadrach Bond was elected the first Grand Master. He attended. every session of that Grand Lodge as long as it lasted. Its destruction was one of the results of the " Morgan Episode " in the United States. The attacks on Freemasonary became so fierce as to make it dangerous to be known as a Mason. Yet the Masons of Illinois held to their allegiance to Masonary until in 1828 it was deemed best for Masons to remain quiet until the storm blew over.So '' Lodge after Lodge in Illinois surrendered its Charter until in 1829, the last Lodge gave up, and of course, the Grand Lodge went out of existence. To the credit of Masonry in Illinois, after a few years, these same Masons organized new Lodges, secured new Charters, and began anew the building the great Masonic body of today. Shadrach Bond took part in this upbuilding, though it was so near the end of his life.

Shadrach Bond died in 1832, and was buried on his own land in Kaskaskia, Illinois. Shortly after the Civil War, when the Mississip River threatened to wash away the ground on which Kaskaskia stood his remains were remover to Chester, Illinois, and buried in Evergreen Cemetery there. Some years later, the State of Illinois erected a granite monument over his tomb.
