Lieut. John Andrews<sup>1</sup> was probably born in England about 1621. His ancestry, place and date of birth and time of coming to America have not been discovered. He married Jane, dau. of Stephen Jordan of Newbury, Mass., carpenter and farmer. He lived in that part of Ipswich called Chebacco, now Essex, Mass. Soldier in the Pequot Indian war 1637. He was fined and imprisoned for resisting the arbitrary measures of Sir Edmond Andros, Colonial Governor of New England, 1687. Lieut. in the Training Band 1683.

Born in Ipswich, Mass., July 30, 1751.

- Enlisted May 12, 1775, in Capt. Abraham Dodge's Co., Col. Moses Little's Regiment. Promoted Sergeant January 1, 1776.
- Served in the Continental Army from June 22 to December 5, 1780, in Capt. Cummings' Co., Col. Jacob Gerrish's Regiment, which was detached from Essex and Suffolk Counties to reinfore the army commanded by Gen. Washington, under resolve of Oct. 9, 1789.

Service in Mass. troops.

Granted pension for one year and eight months service.

# Joanna (Burnham) Andrews, wife of Amos Andrews.<sup>5</sup>

Mrs. Andrews was a descendant of Thomas Burnham, one of three nephews of Capt. Robert Andrews, the owner and master of the good ship "Angel Gabriel," 240 tons burthen and carrying 14 guns. She sailed from Bristol, Eng., June 4, 1635, and touched at Milford Haven, in Wales, June 22. She was wrecked on the coast of Maine, August 15, 1635, but the crew and passengers were saved.

Capt. Andrews and his nephews came to Chebacco (now Essex, Mass.) and settled. John and Thomas remained in Chebacco, but their brother Robert went to Boston and later to Dover, N. H. Thomas married a Tuttle, and he had a son John, who had a son David, who had a son Westley. Westley Burnham married Deborah Story. They had a daughter Joanna, who married Amos Andrews of Ipswich, Mass. (See additional data on page 8.)

"At the age of 100 this remarkable woman was able to keep her own separate domestic establishment in the house of her grandson, and attended to her own wants. From that time her decay was as gradual and marked in retrogressive order by the same stages, as an infant's growth."—*History of Gloucester*.
