#### SECOND GENERATION-PETER AVERY.

2. Peter<sup>2</sup> Avery (*Myer*<sup>1</sup>) was bap. May 26, 1739, in the Dutch Reformed Church at Poughkeepsie, N. Y.; m. Mary Yaple. He was a farmer and cordwainer; enlisted in the militia in 1761, under Captain Isaac Terbush, in New York state; lived in Roane and White counties, Tenn.; d. in 1836, in White County, Tenn.

There is little actually known concerning Peter Avery, his wife, Mary (Yaple) Avery, or their parents. All of the long line of children and grandchildren had lived their lives, enjoyed the pleasures, suffered the disappointments and passed to their final reward before the thought of this little pamphlet.

A few records pertaining to the births and baptisms of Peter Avery and of a sister, Anatche, together with a record of the

second marriage of his mother, are yet preserved in the old Dutch Reformed Church at Poughkeepsie, N. Y. The last mention of his name found, is in a deed at Poughkeepsie, dated Nov. 13, 1800, when he purchased some land at Pawling, in the same county. He had a partner in the deal—Mr. Thadeus Fancher. In the baptismal records of the First Dutch Church at Poughkeepsie, is the following: "Petrus, bap. 1739, May 27. Parents, Meyer Every, Dorikas Frederiks. Witnesses, Jacob Bockhout, Zusanne Kankely". "Anatche, bap. 1742/3, Feb. 13. Parents, Emya Ephre, Dorakes Friedrick. Witnesses, Michaels Beels, Maria Le Roye." All baptismal records between 1745 and 1764 are lost, and no Avery baptisms appear from 1764 to 1773, when the record ends.

"Marriage; James Agmoedie and Dorcas Eyverie, Nov. 29, 1764". "Banns page 168". "Nov. 8, 1764, James Agmoedie, wid'r. bo. in Scotland, living near the Paltz, and Dorcas Frederick, wid. of Meyer Eyverie, living at Poughkeepsie."

The Paltz was just across the Hudson River from Poughkeepsie, where they lived and raised a family, and where Dorkas Achmody witnessed several baptisms of children of John Stevens and Susanna Avery, who probably was a sister of Peter Avery.

No record of the marriage of Peter Avery and Mary Yaple has been found, but her full name, together with a complete list of their children, was supplied by Mr. Madison Noble (see No. 60, vi), of Avrey, Ala., who stated that such a record was contained in his grandfather's old family Bible. His grandfather was Allen Avery, the youngest child of Peter and Mary (Yaple) Avery.

Peter Avery's name does not appear as a citizen of the state of New York in the first census of the United States, taken in 1790. There were then but two families of the name of Yaple in New York state, and both of these were within ten miles of James Anchmoedy's. Adam Yaple had four sons under the age of sixteen, and five female persons in his family at Marbletown, Ulster Co., adjoining Paltz on the north, in 1790. Christian Yaple had a son about sixteen years of age, and three female persons in his family in 1790 at Middletown, Ulster Co., to the

south of Paltz. It is therefore very probable that Peter Avery married into one of these families.

Mr. Morris H. Avery, of Dover, N. H., thinks that our line may have descended from John and Mary Avery who were at what is now Tarrytown as early as April 18, 1721. He states he has never found a positive record of but two of their children, viz., John and Richard. They may not have had any more, but he thinks this hardly probable. John was born in 1715 at Mamaroneck, N. Y., and Richard about the same time, making them about the age of Peter Avery's father, Myer.

There were Fredericks at Poughkeepsie who might have been related to Dorikas; they had previously lived at Kakeat, just across the Hudson River from Tarrytown; also Jacob Boeckhout, bap. Nov. 1, 1720, and Zusanna Cancklie, bap. Sept. 5, 1724, both in the Old Dutch Church at Tarrytown, and probably the same who witnessed the baptism of Peter Avery.

It does not seem likely that Peter Avery was in the Revolutionary War, as no mention of him is found in the New York records, but in a muster-roll of men raised and passed in the County of Dutchess for Captain Isaac Terbush, appears the following: "June 21, 1761. Peter Avery, enlisted June 20, age 22, born in Dutchess Co. Cordwainer by trade; fair complexion; grey eyes; fair hair."

It is known that Peter Avery migrated from New York to what is now Roane Co., Tenn.,—probably known as North Carolina at that time,—but when, or by what route, whether by land or water, is not known. He afterwards moved to White Co., Tenn., where he and his wife lived, died, and were buried after having reared a large family, the members of which are scattered over the West and South. They appear to have been natural pioneers, following the frontier closely; they and their descendants helped to subdue the wilderness in nearly every state west of the Mississippi.

#### CHAPTER III.

#### THE THIRD GENERATION.

9. Henry<sup>3</sup> Avery (Peter<sup>2</sup>, Myer<sup>1</sup>) was b. Oct. 18, 1793, in Roane County, Tennessee; m. Nov. 25, 1819, in White County, Tenn., Elizabeth Greene (or Green), dau. of Rev. John and Rachel (Mackey) Greene. She was b. Nov. 10, 1798, in White County, Tenn.; d. May 6, 1846, near Calhoun, in Henry County, Missouri. In the family it has long been understood that she was a relative of General Nathaniel Greene of Revolutionary fame, probably a grand-niece. It was also said that her mother was closely related to Henry Clay's mother; they probably were sisters. Her grandfather, Jarvis Greene, was killed in the battle of Blue Licks, Kentucky, in which Daniel Boone fought, having a son and a brother killed in this sanguinary engagement.

Henry<sup>3</sup> Avery taught school in Tennessee before coming to Missouri, and married one of his pupils. He later became a Baptist minister, serving as far west as the Missouri-Kansas line and as far east as St. Louis County, and preaching many times to the Indians.

He and his wife were in the state of Alabama about 1821 or 1822, at which time both were seriously injured in a run-away accident. They moved from Tennessee to Missouri in the autumn of 1830, stopping for a time in Morgan County, Missouri, and coming on to Henry County—then known as Rives County about 1832, bringing a few slaves with them to assist in subduing the wilderness. These faithful old blacks and their offspring remained with the family in the homes prepared for them, regardless of Lincoln's proclamation of freedom, as long as they lived, faithful servitors, loving and cherishing their former masters, and beloved and cared for by them.

Henry<sup>3</sup> Avery built the first house of hewn logs in Henry County, the birth-place of the first white girl born in the county. Here, too, the first county court was held in 1835. Before coming to Missouri, Henry Avery served under General Andrew Jackson

in the Seminole Indian war, as well as in the war of 1812. He was a personal friend of "Old Hickory," making and using many quill pens for him; he corresponded with him for many years after coming to Missouri and while Jackson was President. He was Jackson's private secretary and a member of his staff at the time of the battle of New Orleans. He was a first lieutenant, but, being a member of the General's staff, he was entitled to the rank of major and was allowed a horse to ride, somewhat of a luxury at that time.

The good citizenship of his four sons and a score or more of grandsons and granddaughters is a fitting tribute to his strong moral character. He and his wife were buried in the old family burying ground on the farm where he first settled in Tebo Township, Henry County, Mo. He d. Sept. 26, 1845.

Jan. 17, 1843, in Henry Co., Missouri, Suphronia Caroline Williams, dat. of John Washington and Nancy (Lane) Williams. She was b. Dec. 8, 1826, in Simpson Co., Ky., and came to Missouri with her parents about 1835 or 1836. Her grandfather, John Williams, served through the entire Revolutionary War, enlisting when he was but 16 years of age and not returning home until he was 24, having participated in that memorable engagement at Yorktown and being present at the surrender of Lord Cornwallis.

After returning home, he was elected a member of the upper house of the Kentucky state legislature.

William Lane<sup>4</sup> Avery came to Missouri with his parents from Tennessee when about eight years of age, riding horseback almost the entire distance. He taught school for a time afterwards taking up the study of law, was admitted to the bar, and practiced for many years. He was active and energetic, identifying himself with public enterprises and improvements. He

was of a kind and lovable disposition, endearing himself to all with whom he came in contact. He was elected judge of the county court in 1852, which position he held until 1864. In 1870 he was elected judge of the Henry County court of common pleas, and in 1874 he was elected judge of the Henry County probate court, which position he held at the time of his death, which occurred March 2, 1875, at Clinton, Missouri. His body was buried in the old family burying-ground on the farm where his father first settled after coming to the state and where his happy childhood was spent. Both he and his wife were members of the Sardis Bethlehem Baptist Church.
