Dear Cousin:

In 1890-91 I came into possessesion of the family record, as complied by my great aunt, Mary (Atwood) Hickok. She stopped with Jacob Atwood, 1750-1807, and his wife, Hannah, 1747-1837, and with Isaac Churchill, 1735-1825, and his wife, Maltiah, 1746-1825. The Churchill book gave Maltiah's parents as Joshua Bradford and Hannah (Bradford), killed by Indians, which was our family tradition, the it was hard to verify for a time. This line readily traced to John Wood, alias Atwood, through his daughter, Mary, and Major William Brad ford. I have included a summary of this line and the Indian story, the book I am about to tell of.

Our Atwood traditions all pointed to Plymouth, and, we were cousins in some degree, of Gen. David Atwood, of Madison, Wis. So mislead by our having an Isaac as ancestor, and knowing Gen. David included Isaac Atwood among his forebearers, he passed as our man until I got curious about details and we were lost, so far as name ancestry was concerned. Of course I had notes of much of the John line by then.

Consins in New York had, in print, an account of our descent from. Philip, so I patiently traced out that line, as Jacob did not belong where they had him, and, he did not belong at all.

Next, someone called my attention to Jacob of the Harman Line, so I went over printed genealogies and added to it, until I knew their Jacob was born 1762, etc.

Laura Atwood Bascom, of Shoreham, said to be the last of Atwood blood there, wrote me that her mother called Jacob Atwood uncle, and that her ancestor of Revolutionary times, was Francis, the Quaker. This sent me to Rhode Island, and I gathered much of what I call the Bristol Line. There was a Jacob Atwood at Smithfield, 1773, but he could not be connected.

Then we found a Francis Atwood at Killingly, Ct., in 1790, so I gathered the Connecticut Atwoods, which I call the Essex Line, but he was not of them. I had begun to publish long articles, and attracted many correspondents, so I came into possession of man scripts and collections of over 40 persons, many of whom had wish ϵ but who had passed ... -: " that hope unfulfilled. "

stracts of probates, and abstracts of deeds, in this country.

As one of the founders of a branch of our line in Clinton Co., N. Y., was Stephen Atwood, I turned to the Cape Atwoods and worked out this line farther than had been done before, but no Jacob. Then I turned to Plymouth again; deeds and probates pointed to Killingly, Ct., again, and at last we found Francis (Nathaniel 3, 2, John 1) on Friends' Records at Uxbridge, Mass., and, at Killingly, Jacob Atwood had married Hannah Churchill, which fact was also in her mother's probate in Plymouth Co.

It was little trouble to collect much of Joseph Atwood, son of Henry Wood, and I had pretty much of all the early Atwoods, with many lines to date, some 50,000 or more. But, my sight failed prematurely, when I had not made provision for old age, and I could not publish. But I had the habit, so kept collecting, arrangeing data in card indexes, and acting as a sort of clearing house for Atwood data.

<u>I</u> had corresponded with a photographer in England, and happened to mention to a cousin that I could get photographs of the old Atwood home, but price, for me, was prohibitive. She asked cost of negatives and sent it, assuming that I would publish. When negatives and proofs came, they were something fine, and I simply had to do something. In desperation, I summoned all my tact, and it seemed to me, some impudence, and detailed my hopes and the possibilities to two wealthy cousins, asking for funds to start publication. Each sent the amount requested, by return mail, though I was really unknown to them, so far as I know. Then I sent out a few circulars and became busy. I know now that I greatly under-estimated costs of publication, but still, orders came in to pay bills, so printers and photographers have no doubt they will be paid in full eventually.

I knew I could never publish a complete book at this time, so I promised five generations, so far as known, but changed names stopping usually with grand children of an Atwood. But some wanted their line to date, and, where several orders came from one branch, or someone paid extra cost, these were added, so we now have a little over 100 pages in all, printed pages having 17 inches in double column of 2 1-4 inches wide to a page, but these are printed on one side only of a light bond paper.

The photographs are mounted on a heavy, strong, dark paper, with special borders in blue-gray, and each labelled in a dull yellow. These photos include a map of the Atwood country south of London; general view of Sanderstead Court; closer view of main part; entrance, south wing, by Harmon Atwood, 1676; Coat of Arms, above entrance; Sanderstead Postoffice and village street; Sanderstead Smithy; Court Farm House, probaby birth place of John, 1582; Rectory; a fine view of Sanderstead Church, tower by Peter Atte Wode, about 1380; Church

rance with crowned heads of Peter's time; Ancient Lych Gate, r the canopy of which bearers once rested their sad burden as ct of funeral rites; and, enclosure south of Church, with tomb of fast of the Atwoods," though he must have forgotten the vourger cut from a photograph made for me in 1924 by the resident of the Court, at a time when shadows bring out the details in the Coat of Arms. Then an "engraving" 6 by 8, of my family record, 1203 to 1928, the earlier part of which belongs to mest of us.

Printing was done some weeks ago, and most of the advance orders have been filled. I have a few books made up, so I can usually fill an order on short notice. But, it is intended, once bills are paid, and these are not large, to use receipts to print further pages. For this reason, we use a loose leaf cover, enclosed at back and pages fastened with small, brass bolts. So if your branch sends enough orders, you can have your line to date, on new pages to be in book when it comes to you. I intend to add whole generations, and, all new pages will be sent free to former subscribers, except for cost of mailing. This book is unique in more than one way. I have been so closely engaged in its preparation that it did not impress me very much, but every letter received from a subscriber when his book came, was so full of praise that I begin to believe in it myself!

I think price was placed too low, considering the cost of real photos, but it will be continued so long as we can keep going at all with cash returns, price is \$7.50, plus postage, etc., which averages 35c.

I am instructed to send no books on approval, so long as I am working with the money of others, but I will agree to return to anyone ordering, his money, on receipt of the book again in good condition. But I do not believe anyone will send it back. Unless Libraries may not like omission of index, which is planned for this winter. And libraries may order on approval, and are expected to pay postage one way.

If someone asked me to buy such a book, I do not think I could afford it, but I hope you can and will. But whether you order or not, please send your family record; someone else may be needing just what you have, and I haven't full records by any means, though I probably have far more than anyone else ever collected of the various Atwood lines.

They tell me that \$7.85 is cheap for this sort of a book, especially with so many real photographs, for sales seldom reach over three hundred copies. But, so long as it is possible to do so, price will not be raised, though, if placed on sale in book stores, this will be necessary, as there is no margin from which to allow these a discount. And this price pays for future new pages for these are really paid for by the new orders, and we have plenty of the pages already printed to use in making up more books.

No one can, with certainty, tell just what the future holds in store, so, if you want to be sure of getting this book, I think it would be well to order at your early convenience, or without unnecessary delay.

May we have your order, and your family record? Or your family record, whether or not you order?

In 1924 Mr. Norton of Sanderstead Court kindly sent me several photographs, including two of the coat of arms, taken at close range when shadows brought out the detail. C. G. Attwood, 78 Bellevue St., Boston 32, made drawings from these, replacing the original stone work by an oak wreath, to be colored in pale autumn tints. You will notice the field itself is a conventional acorn. This is red. The lion is silver, as is crest and edge of field. The three acorns are golden, with base of crest red and gold. The hand itself may be flesh color or, black as if in armor. We have tried name scroll various ways, black on silver is as plain as any. The date tabs may be omitted, or last date changed to suit.

We have a few heavy sheets with this coat of arms in outline only, suitable for coloring, made by F. R. Atwood, Chicago, copy mailed for 85 cents. Or Mr. Attwood will color one for you, in artist's colors, details to your order, for \$4.85. These sheets are about 8 1-2 by 11 and may be mounted on a larger page for framing.

Orders may be sent to either E. F. Atwood, Sisseton, S. D., or C. G. Attwood.

These arms, with field sown with golden acorns, were those used by Attwood, whose family existed in Saxon times; with six acorns were in use in early Norman times. Crests are various, our branch, of County Surrey, using "cubit arm and battle axe, proper." Gloucestershire Atwoods used demi lady with golden scales and balances.

Essex, Devon and some other families of Atwood are entirely distinct, judging by arms used.

This book is incomplete. In most cases it stops with 5th generation and does not aim to carry "changed names" further than grand children of an Atwood.

New pages are to be issued each winter, according to present plans. What these are depends on orders, and reports of lines of subscribers. Special extensions here are because of past orders from several of same branch, or, because paid for specially. New subscribers may have their branch included on proposed new pages, on same general terms; and, as any "Line" shows sufficient interest, whole generations will be brought forward. In short, "profits" go toward expanding the book.

I have not all data in every branch; correspondence is solicited—additions AND CORRECTIONS are wanted, with sources cited that justify such corrections.

All subscribers in advance of publication are on our record books. One who gets a book in any other way, should at once report name and address. Then, as new pages are ready, each will be notified, with cost of mailing, when you get these pages without other charge.

There may be new photographs; you will be told of these, and I think price will be cut to wholesale cost and mailing.

It is intended that this book shall grow, expand, become more nearly correct and complete. Every one interested is invited to help, whether you buy a book or not. It is seldom I have to pay for search, but this is sometimes necessary and must be paid for by party most interested. Better enclose self-addressed, stamped envelope with every query, tho.

I do not see to read at all, but have over 50,000 Atwoods on card indexes, so data can readily be looked up, either there or in note books to which these refer, as Probates, Cemetery Inscriptions, Vital and Church Records, etc.

In a sense this is the first report of the "Atwood Clearing House" for Atwood data, and, we need more members. Tell me what you know and what you want to find out.

Forty years ago I set out to trace my own ancestry. Our Atwood traditions were of Plymouth, but the early guesses in family manuscripts would not stand comparison with official records. The line to Mary 2 (Atwood) proved readily, however.

Then I found, in a work by a "genealogist," that we were descendants of Philip. Getting official records of that line showed this to be a fraud, or possibly an error, tho I see no excuse for it.

Next a name identical with one I sought, was found in "The Atwood Family," untraced, so I patiently traced out much of this branch and definitely placed their man, who was NOT ours.

Then I began dragnet methods, asked in genealogical papers for data and gave data in return, centering on the Stephen Line, as we had a Stephen, but neglecting none. I invented a card index of my own and began special note books, as one contains only cemetery Inspections.

I found many had intended to publish, but never quite finished their research. (Of course no one ever does entirely finish such work!) but descendants loaned, or presented outright, to me one manuscript and collection after another, until I now have 42 such, including many old letters, etc.

Of course I found my man, but by that time I had by far the largest collection of Atwood data ever known, and had enlisted hundreds of helpers, both in America and England, including some real genealogists who do not wish to be named.

(I think I will name one, anyway, WILLIAM BRADFORD BROWN, NORTH ADAMS, MASS., is a descendant of Mary (2 Atwood) Bradford. I find he has abstracts of probates of R. I., Mass., etc., of many counties, many records from deeds, a thoro grasp of "Berkshire" (Western Mass.) records, etc. and I have never known him to make a mistake. But don't write him from curiosity; at least enclose a stamp; and expect to pay a reasonable fee for his services).

Correspondents began to insist that I publish a book but sight had failed me before I had made preparation for age and financing a book was out of the question. I had, however, some ideas on the subject. I wrote a cousin of being able to get negatives of photos of Sanderstead, etc., and she sent the price. Then I had to use them or send them to her. I summoned all the tact, finesse, and argument I had and asked two wealthy "cousins" for funds to start publishing. Each sent amount in full by return mail. Circulars brought in advance orders freely and have kept bills paid, up to this writing when we are three fourths along with printing.

Frankly, this is the only way I could get out any sort of book. A bound book costs far more, and in any case, sales are always limited, for a genealogy. (See Announcement page).

Five generations sounds easy, but the task was really immense. Printing prices were much less here, but I need an absolute superlative for slow to describe them! They could hear "30 to 50 pages" and promise readily, but were also surprised by the size of the contracts undertaken.

Then came calls—"I must have MY branch to date, isn't there SOME way?" So, as orders came, several from a closly related branch, or some one paid extra for printing, in they went, which added greatly to our work and that of printers.

This accounts for my own branch being included, for relatives ordered freely.

The John Line is less satisfactory to me, as it has not been in print before, as others have (in papers) and if I had it to do over, I should expand somewhat. As it is, some data is under Stephen Line, and some near close of Part 1, which should have been given with John 1.

The "Essex Line" is an afterthought, made necessary by descendants and must be one of my first objects of expansion and addition. If enough wish it, I shall take steps to get English photograph. The "Bristol Line," too, is by no means thoro, as few descendants were found, and official records are especially scanty.

Some branches of Harman Line are not worked out to my knowledge.

My own experience in having my Atwood ancestry shifted about by bad guessers, makes me critical of other such things, but books are full of them. No doubt I have also guessed wrong at times, say so, if you can prove it, and I'll thank yoù.

I think I shall make little further apology. It was a choice between what I have done, and doing nothing. In spite of defects, I hope many in some degree will find something here to please.

I didn't write for praise, fame, or money, but to do my best to please and to thank my many correspondents. Almost any one could do better

(?), if he could begin all over! But, honestly, don't you think that, aside from "this, that and the other," it is really worth while?

One more thing—the prestige of "Mr. John" Atwood, 1576-1644, led to respect for the name, and his kin folk lived pretty well up to the old gentleman's reputation, hence for generations, they were looked up to by townsmen.

And, there are many worthy repre-

sentatives of the name living today. Pride of ancestry that leads to study of the events they helped to bring about, that leads to more typical Americanism, is worth while.

For, Plymouth first and then all New England, contains the real beginnings of America. But, better have some pride in YOURSELF, lest your ancestral line become "like a hill of potatoes, the best part underground!"

EXPLANATION

Numbers .--- Each line has its letter: B is for Thomas, of Ipswich (from Bristol, Eng.); E, Thomas of Ct., (from Co. Essex, Eng.); H, Harman; J, John; P, Philip, S, Stephen; W. Henry Wood. J5 is 5th child of John; J51 is first child of that child. Each unit represents a generation. Hence 10, 11, 12, become x0, x1, x2, so a number is a sort of index. If children are numbered merely 1, 2, 3, prefix parent's number and you have whole index number. In later generations, I omit early part of numbers. In any number, drop last unit (and x, if it preceeds that unit), and have parent's number

Dates.—The first date after a name is that of birth, second date divided from first by a dash, is death date. In a few cases of death same year as birth, the year is not repeated. Other dates have an abbreviation before them.

Abbreviations.—b. equals born; d., died; m., married; m. int., or int., intention to marry (required by law once); bpt., baptized; G. S., grave stone inscription; ch., children; ch. rec., church record; Rev. is usually soldier of the Revolution, if time is wrong, it means a clergyman; dau., daughter; g. f., grandfather.

Parentheses.—One can omit all in a parenthesis, when remainder belongs together; in reading ancestry of the person married, this idea may clarify data.

Under parent, all children are given, usually with marriage of each. Further along, usually in order of seniority of their respective generations, one finds child's number again, often the first statements are concerning the person married and followed by their children, in turn, usually, the group of parents and children is preceeded and followed by a wider space between lines. Numbers are usually in order of their apparent size or value. In a few cases, units for children may be 1. 3, 45, 8, indicating possibility of other children between, where unit would naturally be found.

Location.—Once a town is named, usually that family were of that town until removal is mentioned, tho several generations may have passed. Sometimes we do not know, and if more recently, do not always give location.

Probate is always in the County in which the person resided, with often only the town given. Grave stones, same. Church records are naturally of the Congregational church and of town of that family, if not named otherwise.

Reference to sources is usually not given, unless unusual, or in connection with an item in dispute or perhaps in print and really an error there.

It is often necessary to look at parent's surname to be sure of child's last name, tho most are Atwood.

It might be well to mark all numbers in your line of descent, once you find them.

The blank pages are for carrying forward your line from where book leaves off, and for your family record. You can easily add other pages 7×10 if you wish to write more yet.

Where no doubt is expressed, the items are accepted or fully proved. But where doubt is expressed, the "fact" may be morally proved, or may be the best guess from data known.

Part I is paged 1, 3, 5, for photos on alternating pages, up to 31, then consecutively—contains English History and John Line.

Part II gives Philip Line and Henry Wood Line, omitting most Woods. Astwood is added here.

Part III is Stephen Line; Part IV contains Harman Line, with John, son of James 3. following.

Part V containes first, what I have of the line of Thomas of Ipswich; then Part Six the line of Thomas of Wethersfield, with only lines from Ezekiel 4 carried forward, as no more was reported when this was written. (See Announcement).

English History

The first mention I find of the name Attwood is of an "ancient family" at Wynolverley," Worceztershire. Indeed, legend says this family was originally of Gael-Brython stock. When armorial bearing came into use, this family took a red field, sown with golden acorns and bearing a silver rampant lion. These arms, with often a variation in the number of acrons, are to be found in several other English councies. In Suffolk, the acorns are six; in Surrey, three.

I find at least five other families with landed estates, named Atwood, whose arms show independent origin. But every Attwood in encyclopedias and histories at hand, who were of note as mathematicians, composers, lawyers, members of Parliament and professors im English Universities, are of a stock whose arms show them to trace from the family at Wolverley. More than half the English Attwood yeomanry were of this stock.

A. D. 1203, one Peter de Wyckhurst bought outright from the Abbey of Chertsey, the 40 acre Estate in Coulsdon Parish, County Surrey, now known as Hooley House. Wick means dwelling and hurst is a wooded knoll, so Peter may well have beem of "Wood House," and perhaps from Suffolk.

The owner of so small an estate would not naturally make much of a mark in history and we would not know his successor, except that William Attewode, in 1278, signed a surety bond, as a yeoman of this parish.

This is the first appearance of this surname in Surrey. The very next year finds Peter Atte Wode and wife Alice suing to record title to a 220 acre tract nearby, which is known today as Wood Place. Peter doubtless lived at Hooley House, for in 1313, he had the buildings and part of the land of Wood Place leased to one Roger de Eosco, or de Wood.

In 1318 William Atte Wode, wife Juliana almost surely son of the second Peter, sued to record tille to lands in Breckenham, a few miles to the northeast. By 1341 Sir William Atwood was Captain of the King's Guard and, on duty at Westminster Palace, where Parliament was sitting, stopped the Archbishop of Canterbury, because the latter insisted on the admission of a following of his partisans, not members. The Archbishop was a member, but the King commended Sir William.

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Two of Sir William's sons were Sergeants at Arms to the King. By 1345, the King had enrolled a vast army and invaded France. 1 believe a third son, Geoffrey, was also of this army and fell at the Battle of Crecy. I know Richard, William and Sir William were in this war. Sir William almost certainly fell in one of the earlier actions. Read any large history and note the loot taken from the French cittes. Perhaps Peter Atte Woode was also a soldier here, for he became a man of vast wealth, probably in part through inheritance.

Sergeant-at-Arms William was living in 1360; Geoffrey's estate of Hooley House was made to pay a fine because purchased by an ancestor, without first asking leave of the king, a sort of ex post facto scheme of the king to raise money.

Then, also 1346, Peter Atte Wode. wife Lawrance, sued to record title to a wide acreage in Surrey, including lands in Sanderstead Parish; the History of Sanderstead, by Gower. says Peter Atwood paid a fine on Sanderstead Manor in 1346; the author used papers of the then owner of the manor. But he covered too much territory.

When Ethelfleda, Queen of King Edgar, gave Sauderstead Manor to the Abbey of Hyde, it contained 18 hid(s or farms, but by the time of the Domesday Survey, they had parted with 13 hides. What Peter bought was the 13 hides not including the church and village. But Peter continued to live at Wood Place, being near to his new possessions, for in 1359, he was ficensed by his bishop to maintain a chapel of his own at Wood Place. This Peter was a close associate of William of Wickham; they were Forest Wardens together. Peter was Clerk to William as Justice in Eyre; and they were King's Commissioners together in rebuilding old Windsor Castle. But Wickham had many other interests. among other things becoming Bishop of Winchester and securing control of the lands of the Abbey of Hyde. The Brittanica credits Wickham with work done by Peter at Windsor, for we find (Rotolorum) com-

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mission to Peter alone, which seems to have 'been overlooked. Perhaps Wickham was influential in this as he had become Chancellor of the Exchequer. Perhaps Peter let William have the honor and in exchange got a lease in perpetuity of the Church part of Sanderstead Manor, for we can find no record of when the Atwoods got this, yet they had it about this time.

Next we find a Peter with wife Pentronilla coming into possession of Guildford Manor, far to the southeast in Surrey, and being called as a member of Parliament in 1384. In 1434 John Atte Wode, wife Isabella. leased Coulsdon Manor for 20 years. as a suitable headquarters for his wide holdings near by. I judge that during this 20 years he built the first Sanderstead Court, though Peter had built the church there about 1380, according to church legend the lower part of the present tower being his, and some of the material used in the entrance, in-cluding the crowned heads. The church was rebuilt, enlarged and its orientation changed in 1830. (Under the floor were many bones of those of the families of former owners and those were simply covered where they lay with cement.)

John was "Knight of the Shire" in 1459, which means he was called to Parliament. This Parliament deposed King Henry VI.

We find nothing of the next John until his death in 1525, leaving a will made just before his death. I hardly think you will find any will in existence that shows so queer a thing, for he had four sons that were named John. However the will of his wife, Denes, made five years later, shows that one John was called Hewson and she names a Richard not in the other will.

John the Elder evidently had estate and inherited quite a flock of sheep at Woodmanstone, where we find the will of a John Atwood several years later, (1529) with some five children not named. (Peter 1346 bought land, Woodmanstone.) Henry got Wadden manor, in Croyden John Hewson got Sander-Parish. stead Manor. John (Richard) seems to have had only personal property. The next two were not yet 20; Edward got the Beckenham lands (See Sir William) and John the Younger got the lands and buildings at Coulsdon. I think this was the family possessions for centuries, and help to prove the line of descent. But we are only concerned with him of Sanderstead. Agnes, daughter of John

and Denes Atwood married John Ownstead, Sr. and had John, Ann, who became Mrs. Knapp, and Joyce, Mrs. Holloway. It is likely that John Hewson Atwood became keeper of the King's Falcons, John Ownstead was Sergeant of the Queen's Carriages, under Elizabeth.

Henry VIII confiscated the church lands far and wide, his sweeping orders took the church part of Sanderstead, which he gave by letters patent to one of the Greshams, in 1539, as Sanderstead Manor, though we now know that the Atwoods remained undisturbed in possession of most of the manor, with country headquarters at Court Farm, while they lived in London most of the year, in the parish of St. Martin of the Fields.

There was much confusion in use of name Wood and Atwood all through this period; indeed, it did not cease in America until some time after the year 1700. He of 1525, signed John Wood, his wife wrote, both he and she were Atwood.

John Hewson settled certain Sanderstead Manor lands on his youngest son Thomas, who died in 1569; Robart Atwood died in 1568. John (Hewson) Wood died in St. Martin's. 1562, while Margaret had died in 1558. A Chancery suit includes statement that Court Roll in 1547 show Nicholas Atwood to have then been the heir of Sanderstead Manor. Yet it was not until 1592 that John Ownstead perfected his purchase from the Greshams of the church part.

John Ownstead had married twice; Jean Oliph. heiress of her father, a Knight and, after her death, Margaret, widow of the rich London merchant, Simon Lawrence. He thus came into possession of much wealth, but had no children, so he willed his part of Sanderstead Manor and estate at Warlingham, to his consin Harman, eldest son and heir of Nicholas Wood, or Atwood. This Harman left it to his son iHarman, who left it to his sister Olive, who built the Rectory. Harman 2d either rebuilt the whole Sanderstead Court by 1676, or at least built the entire south part. The estate then reverted to the children of the elder John, son of Harman 1st, for Harman had two sons named John as also two brothers called John. So George Atwood came next into possession, succeeded by his son John, who died childless in 1761. Then the estate went to Mary (Atwood) Wigsell's heirs. It was Atwood Wigsell, in 1795, who was the last



male owner with Atwood blood. Then the estate went to a cousin who had no Atwood blood, really named Taylor, but who took the name Atwood Wigsell. Next heir was his sister, a Mrs. Arkwright. Today, the old estate has but 100 acres about the old Manor House, the rest of the original 3000 acres being cut up in small pieces for the villas of a London suburb. The ancient bridle paths of even 20 years ago, among the leafy woods, are gone and the winding country roads and lanes have given place to paved boulevards and the ceaseless spread of a mightier London.

Sic transit gloria mundi! A few years more and even the pictures possible today might have been lost to us forever.

It is related that a Harman befriended Tyndall while he was translating the Bible into English; and. that two of the ladies Harman, attached to the court of Henry VIII. were at one time in grave danger for the expression of their religious views. Rev Peter Harman was the priest at Sanderstead in the time of John and Denes. When we recall that preference was given to relatives in church appointments, we may suspect there may have been an earlier Atwood-Harman marriage. St. Martin's has the nam's of many Harmans n the parish register. James Harman, from county Oxon. was barber to Henry VIII. Some of you may have seen the Harman 'arms" quartered with the Atwood arma, bet von must excuse me from having any use for them. Dickens calls Henry a blot of blood and grease on English history; these socalled arms were barber tools and the sign of Venus. Real arms were granted for service in the field or to distinguish the estate of the owner when in military array. The arms of a barber is a travesty, but there may be other arms from an earlier estate.

Nicholas Atwood, or Wood, was born before 1539, hence probably at Sanderstead Court. His brass relates that he served Queen Elizabeth after the second year of her reign. 'His position was undoubtedly that of Assistant Sergeant of the Queen's Carriages, with his cousin, John Ownstead as Sergeant.

Jan. 30, 1569, at St. Martin's he married Olive Harman, 1548--1603, daughter and heiress of James Harman. Most of their children were haptized at St. Martin's but John and Derick, "gcmelli," Feb. 4, 1582, are on the parish register of Gatton and Sanderstead. When in the country, they resided at Court Farm and here one night when roads were especially bad and the Queen returning from one of her trips, she spent the night at Court Farm. The Greshams held the Court iself but were Catholic, so Elizabeth preferred to stop with Nicholas.

Nicholas died May 10, 1586, in Sanderstead and was buried in St. Martin's, May 14, according to the two parish registers, though his brass says he was buried May 12, in Sanderstead Church, evidently a guess of his grandson, Harman 2d.

Olive married second in 1590, at St. Martin's, William Marleville, whose probate we find the next year. Her monument in Elstree Church, Hertfordshire, names her Atwood children and shows she married third, John Buck and had a son Oliffe.

Children of Nicholas and Olive were:

Harman, 1570—1653, married first, Elizabeth, daughter of Simon Lawrence and had John, Owentead, Olive and Anna; Elizabeth died 1604 and he married Joan King and had Susan, King, Harman, Thomas. Olive and John. Joan died 1640 and his will was proved by his widow Joan in 1653.

Oliver, 1572, died by 1686.

Alice was the third child, dates not found; her younger brother was John Wood, leather seller in London; William Mullins' will, 1621, shows forty pounds in the hands of Goodman Wood, and, that Mullins dealt in boots, shoes, etc., and I suspect Alice Atwood of having been the wife of William Mullins, who with his wif? Alice came on the Mayflower and died 1620-21.

Susan, 1675, was Mrs. Urmston by 1622.

Johannes, 1676--1644, married Ann Lee; had no children at death. Became a merchant in the old sense: among financial backers were Robert Cole, James Bunce, John Cr w, William Friend, Elizabeth Browne, and John Buck. He probably was in jail for debt at one time and in 1635-6, came to Plymouth, where he is earlier of record because of business dealings with John Doane. It seems possible that William Crowe, who eventually inherited John Atwood's property, was a son of the above John Crowe and his mother may have been a Lee. This John Atwood has many pages in Bradford's History. It is at least a coincidence that his younger brother,

John Wood, alias Atwood, the leather seller, at one time was trustee for Henry Sewell of Newbury, New England and in the settlement part of the property went to John [Herbert, and, that William Crowe's sister married a John Herbert.

Nicholas, evidently born next, died in 1602.

Thomas, born 1579, was living 1643, evidently unmarried.

Jacobus (James), born 1580 was evidently living 1603, and not living nor had heirs, by 1643.

Johanem and Derick, born 1582; Derick died 1583.

Richard, born 1584, died at Elstree, about 1603-4.

Johanem was our leather seller John, for in 1631, he sued his brother Harman for lands their father Nicholas had settled on his youngest son, Richard. The latter had died, so John, now being youngest son, saw a chance for himself. Whence evidently comes the various Atwood traditions of the American ancestor being disinherited, or having best right to estate in England but never claiming it.

John Wood married Joan Coleson in St. Martin's July 25, 1612 and two children were baptized at St. Martin's; Harman, Oct. 3, 1613 and John, Dec. 24, 1614. I think they then moved to Chancery Lane, London. There is absolutely no doubt that Stephen was brother of these, and but little doubt of Henry.

Anna, 1604, living 1653, not married.

Susannah, 1606-1659, unmarried.

King, 1606—1674, wife Elizabeth Brook; had Susan 1639, married Joseph Till; Harman, 1641, had son Harman who died by 1680; and Joane, married Rev. John Sheppard; King was Rector of Sanderstead for years.

(Harman, 1608-1676, heir of his father; never married.

Thomas, 1610-1659, had wife Joane and children; Susan, 1639;

Thomas, 1641; and Sarah, 1642. Olive, 1613-1681, built Rectory.

John again, 1615-1675, unmarried.

Books differ; the above data of Harman of Sanderstead and descendants is from parish records, then probates.

Philip Atwood came from London, 1635, aged 15, as proved by two of his depositions in middle life. He was joined at Bradford by descendants of Harman of Boston and may have been a cousin. Harry Wood, Sanderstead parish, had daughter Phyllia in 1616. But I have found no Philip in the Sanderstead kinship, while there are several in the family at Bristol, England.

John Wood, alias Atwood, came to Plymouth, 1635-6, evidently with his uncle, John Atwood. Abigail Atwood Shurtleff 1755-1826, left a record that her great grandfather, John Atwood, had two brothers, Stephen and William. I do not know where she got her information, but I am about as far in years from my great grandfather and it took many years to make a good guess at even one brother. Still she may have had information closer to John than I had of my man. She was right about Stephen. There was a William at Charlestown, called as a Juror about 1653, with family unknown. Here Elizabeth Atwood was admitted to church 1633 and we do not know her. There were stray Atwoods who perhaps belonged to William; as, Francis had daughter Hannah baptized at Haverhill 1691: a widow Mehitable Atwood at Braintree who could not quite be his; Ebenezer at Bradford, married around this time, etc. But also Thomas, son of Thomas of Ipswich evidently had children, as Edward of Middle-The two named William horo Wood at Yarmouth absolutely were not Atwood. The close association of John, Stephen and Henry tends to prove Henry a brother also. Stephen and Henry first appear at Plymouth 1641. John already had some land. Twice this year the three got land adjoining. Each was Wcod, alias Atwood. They were propounded freemen together and admitted together in 1647. In 1648, they received a joint grant of land. Each, in turn, was in charge of the herring weir. When Stephen decided to settle in Eastham, Henry went along, but returned to settle in Middleboro. while John settled in Plympton, the part now Carver. On the whole I am satisfied that Harman, John, Stephen and Henry were 'brothers and perhaps also William of Charlestown, and probably one or more unidentified wives of others were their sisters. Emigrants often include half a tribe. That is one reason for our loose leaf plan, we are never done in genealogical research. (See Stephen line for more detail.)

Richard Masterson was of Scrooby, England and at Leyden married 1619, Mary Goodale, of Leicester, Eng. Sarah and Nathaniel were born in Holland. The family came to Plymouth in 1629, on the second trip of the Mayflower. Richard died in the summer of 1633, where now is Windsor, Ct. (See Bradford.) Mrs. Masterson became the 2d wife of Rev. Ralph Smith, deeds, Smith to John Wood, show Sarah had become wife of John Wood. It is possible that the Woods fol owed the Smiths for a time, after Smith sold his land to Plymouth on ceasing to be its settled minister. At least, we do not find dates of birth of the earlier children of Johr. and Sarah.

J1. Mary was evidently the oldest; she died Jan. 6, 1714-15. Married Dec. 11, 1661, Rev. John Holmes and 2d, about 1678, Major William Bradford.

J2. Sarah died about 1685; married John Fallowell.

Their son Joshua 4 Bradford, June 23, 1710 m. Felb. 17, 1736, his 2nd cousin, Hannah Bradford.

As Joshua and Hannah Bradford are among my own ancestory and their story was pieced together by my efforts I publish the story here. Hannah 4 was born Apr. 10, 1720, to Elisha Bradford and his 2d wife, Bathsheba La Broche, dau. of Francis. Elisha was son of Joseph Bradford (William and Alice) 1630-1715 and Jael Hobart, May 25, 1664, of Rev. Peter, of Hingham.

It seems likely that Joshua removed his family to Meduncook, Me. 1756; during the winter he saved a local Indian chief from drowning; Joshua signed petition in 1757 for protection from Canadian Indians; a fort was built and manned on Garrison Island, about a mile from his house. Children: Cornelius, Dec. 10, 1737, Feb. 10, 1790 m. Patience Davis. Sarah. Oct. 16, 1739, married John Davis. Rachel, June 26, 1741—Apr. 28, 1823, m. Ebenezer Morton May 27, 1765. Maltiah and Mary, Mch. 16, 1744; Maltiah m. Aug. 1, 1765, Plympton, Isaac Churchill, 1736-1826, and Maltiah, d. same year. Joshua, Apr. 2, 1746, m. Martha Jameson. Hannah, Mch. 9. 1748 m. 1st, Ebenezer Sherwood. Joseph, Mch. 19, 1751 --Nov. 1811, m. Abigail Starling. Benjamin, May 28, 1753. Elisha, Oct. 15, 1755-Sept. 23, 1835, m. From nine traditions of their descendants, carefully compared with such records as exist, I get this:

Joshua did not take refuge in the fort, as most settlers did. His brother Benjamin was at the fort, however.

Sarah may have been married at this time and not present.

Very early on May 2:2, 1758, the parents arose and by sunrise, Joshua had finished breakfast and was engaged in pounding corn for meal,

with a home made mortar and pestle, near the door. Hannah, with Winslow in her arms, was probably waiting on the two older boys at the table. Perhaps Rachael climbed through an opening in the gable and over a shed roof and escaped unseen with one of the smaller ones. Maltiah stood near the foot of her parents bed, holding litle Elisha. Hannah and others were in a trundle bed. Maltiah said she dropped at the first sight of a painted face, through the open door, and crept under the bed with the child. The Indians, from Canada, had been sighted from the fort and an alarm fired, as had been previously arranged, but the noise Joshua made, drowned the sound. The officer at the fort, wishing to note the exact time, for use in his report, took out his watch-he had not put it away until the Indians came out of the cabin, one and one half minute from their entrance, dragging two struggling boys. Joshua was struck down at once and Hannah almost immediately. I believe Winslow was also killed. Maltiah crept farther under the bed, bumping the child's head; he cried and in desperation she crept out "to die with the rest." But through the open door, she saw the coming soldiers-out she went at top speed. The Indians were already leaving, but three of them turned after her, throwing their tomahawks, when they could not overtake her with safety to themselves. One struck her in the back, making an ugly wound. the scar of which she carried all her life. But she kept on and a soldier caught her and the child when she did fall. As the tumult died away, Hannah fearfully uncovered her head and looked. Her father lay on the floor, She crept to him and he almost whispered "run, run." She did so, but when the soldiers Joshua and arrived they found Hannah dead. The French paid more for prisoners than for scalps, so Cornelius and, I think, young Joshua, were carried to Canada. A descendant of Carpenter Bradford insists it was Benjamin who was carried away with Cornelius. 1 think this comes from the fact that Benj. (4) Bradford eventually went to New Brunswick. He had lost all his seven children in one month with a throat disease; one born later; he reared Elisha and probably some of the others. Maltiah went to her mother's sister, Deborah Sampson, at Plympton and El'sha, after

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the Revolution, drifted to Conn. From 1786 to 1800, Elisha lived at Pitsford and Maltiah at Chittenden, Vt., perhaps 8 or 10 miles apart, with some three rough valleys between and I think they never met, for the Elisha tale says his only sister was killed by Indians at time parents were.

Genealogies of Northern New York attach Atwoods here to the Templeton branch of the Philip Line because each has Isaac, Joshua and Philip, when fact is there was one of each name at both Templeton and Warwick, with no Jacob found in either place. See Philip Line. Atwoods of Warwick, Mass., are

Atwoods of Warwick, Mass., are previously found at or near Killingly, Ct., and are of Francis 4 or Ebenezer 4 of the John Line. No room for all evidence, but; Laura Atwood Bascomb, 1845—1926, told me her ancestor of Revolutionary period was Francis the Quaker, and that her "mother called Jacob Atwood uncle, tho he was not exactly "uncle." Her line proved to be; Lovicy, Thomas, Joshua, Francis 4, while Jacob was Lovicy's great uncle, unless she meant Jacob, Jr. Note the "family gathering."

"Rob Roy" (Donald, Patrick, Duncan, Dugald Ciar Mhor), who helped her father escape from Edinboro Castle at a time when the name Mac-Gregor was still almost equivalent to conviction, for the clan had fought to retain the lands they had held for eight hundred years, instead of recording titles, as required by a new law, etc. Silas Reynolds m. 1798, Didama Leonard, 1778---1821, dau. ERRATA. In Bradford—Atwood, Jael Hobart's dates are: 1643— 1730; date given was of marriage. In children of Joseph 5 Bradford, read Abigail, not Abifail.

The St. Dustan records, mage 23, spell the name Attwood in each naming of Herman, who seems to be of an older branch. J5562. Life of Ephraim Cutler by his daughter Julia, says Leah (Atwood) Cutler d. Nov. 3, 1806, aged 42.

"Sarah" is doubtless a misreading for Leah in ch. rec., Killingly.

J5166. Jane Otis, as wife of Atwood, was reported Zaccheus from a D. A. R. record, and I believe is not true. History of Hardwick confuses Zaccheus, S., and Jr., while only latter had wife Hannah. Vital Records of Yarmouth give Chloe Hovey, b. Sept. 4, 1753, to Samuel and Elizabeth (Colson) and m. Dec. 3, 1772, Zaccheus Atwood (he was then 20); she d. Nov. 28, 1832, at Barre, Mass., aged 79. Hence Chloe was mother of all his children, and undoubtedly his only wife. (See also Bridgewater Vital Records.)

A strong and detailed tradition comes from a descendant of Lucinda Atwood, b. 1825, that as a child sne recalled visiting her gt. gr. mother, Chloe Atwood, then aged, whom she recalled as a lively little Frenchwoman, widow of a Rev. soldier. Lucinda is given as dau. Charles and Susan (Maxfield), unchallenged, this would be Charles, son of Zaccheus, Jr.

But another branch of this family gives Charles as son of Thomas and Susan (Maxfield), and some records here, Wilmot, N_{ℓ} H., are from family Bible, I believe.

Lucinda m. Ebenezer Cram Knowles, moved 1855, to Northfield, Minn., and, 1886, to Mapleton, Oregon. (Had sisters Maria (Vanderford) and two, Mrs. Shirley of San Fernando, Cali. Brother Charles. Data wanted.

John Wood, alias Atwood

the Shurtleff-Atwoods Among was a record, source now unknown, that John Wood was of Saugus (or Lynn), returned to England, and then came to Plymouth. Wood Point, Lynn, is said to take its name from him. It is significant that John Wood, alias Atwood, (b. 1582), leather sellerof London, has no English record that we can find, after 1631. A thoro search in England fails to show his probate. As he was trustee, or mortgagee (?), for Henry Sewell, of Newbury, New England, it is also fairly possible that this was he of Lynn.

His son John, 1614-1675, probably came via Yarmouth, (see Henry, page 1, and note under "Luke and Abigail,") and thence to Plymouth 1635-6. We had land at Plymouth, 1636.

In 1639, John Wood was in charge of the herring weir at Plymouth; apparently was careless in the distribution, for which he received a small amount per thousand, for he was "presented" by the General Court, reprimanded and directed to make restitution.

He was later constable and both grand and petty juror at times, so this was nothing serious. The fact, that Mr. John Atwood, his uncle, was held in such high esteem may have helped to make the Atwood name one that was regarded as marking the owner as one of superior qualities in Plymouth and New England.

Any stray records that will shed more light on these early records. will be most welcome.

Note. At end of Stephen Line, I give some other stray Woods.

Henry was never alias Atwood until his probate record. March 7, 1675-6. All grandsons, except by Joseph 2, were Wood and perhaps some descendants in Orange Co., N. Y., given later. Henry married, April 28, 1644, Abigail Jenney, who was living in 1690. John and Sarah (Carey) Jenney came on the Little James, 1023, with children, Samuel, Abigail and Sarah. For some reason. Jenney objected to our Henry and put a provision in his will that Abigail should live a year at the minister's, when if she still were of the same mind she might marry Henry Wood. As they were married without obeying this provision it seems likely Jenney gave his consent just before his death. Henry was one who bought considerable land of the Indians at Middleboro. Children-

Astwood-Atwood

These are on some records as Atwood but are properly Astwood—come from Stanstead Abbey, Hertfordshire.

John Astwood was born 1609, died in London, 1654-5. Came to Roxbury,, on the Hopewell; 1635; to new churgh in Boston, 1638, with wife Martha. To Milford, Conn., 1639, where he married, 1640, Mrs. Sarah Baldwin, who d. 1669, naming his dau. Hannah in her will. He was Captain, member of legislature. assistant governor, 1643-4. Commissioner in forming United Colonies, then their agent in London, 1653. His will seems of record, both countries, son Samuel, executor. I judge latter removed to New Jersey. Hannah was wife of Stephen Freeman by 1669, he of the Roxbury Freemans. Freeman children; Hannah, Mary, Martha, Sarah, Samuel, John, Stephen; Mrs. Astwood was born Bryant and m. 1st Sylvester

Baldwin.

James Astwood came "3 mo., 1638" to Roxbury, but was of Boston church, with wife Sarah by 1641; had wharf right there 1651; constable there. Will Sept. 16, 1653, children James (1638), John (1641), Joseph (1643), Sarah (1646), (there was a John, 1640, and Mercy, 1647, apparently d. early); widow declined executorship as she intended to return to England. Estate L923-18-03, but debts larger. Ordered estate in England sold and find an estate of James Astwood, in Coventry, Eng., probate same year. I judge these did not return to New England.

John and James Astwood had brothers, William, at Abutley, Eng., and Robert, who probably never left England. John left his mother two rooms in his house during life.

Stephen Line

Stephen was invariably Wood at Plymouth in all early records, but almost always Atwood on the Cape. Some of his sons were entered on records at times as Wood, but descendants finally all used the name Atwood.

The following are notices of Stephen Wood, alias Atwood, which have come to my notice:

1641, August 16, Stephen and Henry Wood, 8 acres each at Loute Pond, Plymouth; John receiving additional grant of 6 acres. he having been there since 1636. Dec. 31, Henry and Stephen, garden plot. These records indicate Stephen was born by 1620 at the latest, as he would naturally be of age to receive iand.

1643, John. Henry and Stephen Wood able to bear arms, Plymouth.

1643, Stephen Wood in charge of herring weir at Plymouth.

1647, May 7, John, Henry and Stephen Wood propounded Freemen; admitted June 1, 1647.

1648, Stephen "Atwood" is on list of freemen at Eastham, though likely not a resident yet.

1648 John, Henry and Stephen Wood joint grant of 3 acres next to former grant at Loute Pond.

1650, June 4, Stephen Wood, Grand Jury, Plymouth; October 2, on petty jury. He had been on petty jury, Oct. 4, 1648.

1650, June 3, Constable by Plymouth, to be sworn in at Eastham.

We find no record of Stephen's earliest grants in Eastham, but 1654 he had a meadow grant at Eastham which seems an additional grant. In 1655, Eastham, feeling the need of a "common store" arranged for inhabitants to contribute voluntarily and Stephen assessed himself 16 shillings.

In 1655, the inhabitants of Eastham were set off in groups of five, for the propagation of cattle; one group consisted of Thomas Prince, Nicholas and Mark Snow, Stephen Atwood and Thomas Atkins.

In 1654, Plymouth appointed Stephen Wood surveyor of highways for Eastham.

In 1673, Eastham and Stephen Atwood made an agreement; Eastham took his land. with his "new room and chimney." and granted him a tract on the Billingsgate road, with until October to move the rest of his buildings; they also paid him thirty pounds and each inhabitant was to give him one day's labor, provided it was not demanded in planting time or harvest.

In 1680, one Stephen Atwood was one of five specially delegated to put a stop to Indians cutting timber, gathering pine knots and running tar on the common lands of Eastham; the Indians were allowed one week in which to remove results of past labor.

He died in February, 1693-4.

Wood, alias Atwood." Jonathan's children were all by Abigail Atwood; after her death ne removed to Taunton and married Mrs. Elizabeth (White) Hall; he was deputy marshall here several years.

In May, 1665, George Barlow was arrested for frightening Abigail Pratt in her house at Plymouth; he was put under bonds by the General Court, but

later released. So their residence in Eastham did not last long.

I have an original manuscript, dating about 1890, which copies faithfully "The Atwood Family" (1888), but, at end of data of Joshua 3 (John 2, Harman1), part is erased, including reference to stone on Copp's Hill. This Joshua was published to Elizabeth Atkins, was m. to her by Cotton Mather in 1723, and, Elizabeth, "wife to Mr. Joshua Atwood," d. 1768 and has stone on Copp's Hill. He was a BOSTON shipwright, signed deed of father's estate here 1729, and his children are in City Hall records, Boston. This early writer made the mistake that identity of names, without further history in printed book, meant the author knew no more, hence identity of persons followed. Of course others have come to accept these conclusions-to them I wish to say my alleged line is in print. edited by a "genealogist" of note, with much less justification.

The alleged twins, Joshua and Sarah, are some misunderstanding of Provincetown records, tho I left numbers for them. Joshua Atwood, who in 1721 recorded mark of his whale lance at Truro, is not identified. The wide intervals between children is hard to explain. henry Wood of Leyden, Etc.

Henry Wood, Leyden, Holland, in 1611 in connection with John Robinson, William Jackson and Reynulph Tickens, bought, for 8000 florins, a house and garden, south of and opposite the Belfrey of the Peter's church, presumably the meeting place of the Pilgrims, to hear the lessons taught by the pastor, Robinson. In 1614, Henry Wood and Roger Wilson were guarantors for Isaac Allerton, made freeman of Leyden. Dec. 8, 1617, Henry Wood was witness, betrothal of Henry Jepson and Jane Paul, while Mary Wood, thought to be his wife, if found witnessing another betrotnal in 1615.

When it came to consideration of the American settlement idea, Henry Wood opposed and is recorded as voting "No." It is true he sold his house in 1629, but I find no record to show that he went anywhere, but the changing order in England, and the departure of the last of his church associates in 1629 for Plymouth, indicate that he returned to England.

Dr. Fuller's will, in 1633, speaks as

though he did not know where Henry Wood was, but directed that a debt contracted in Leyden should be paid to Henry if demanded. The only Henry Wood we have been able to find on a passenger list for America in those days was aged 20, came to Virginia in 1635. It is possible this Henry came to Plymouth. Courtright's Pilgrim Fathers does say that Henry Wood, aged 20. came to Plymouth in 1633 and was of Yarmouth in 1639, but we are unable to find any such facts of record. William Wood, from Saugus (Lynn) came to Sandwich in 1639--William Wood died in Sandwich 1639 and William Wood was town clerk of Sandwich 1640-had wife Jane 1644. One of these was made freeman June 1, 1639, while the name is on deed conveying land there in 1653. Sandwich births include Merriam Wood, May 8, 1648, died the next day, and Mary Wood born March 29, 1649. But those who have made a special study of Wood and Atwood families for years, see no connection of any American colonist of these names with the Woods given above.

Harmon Line

Joseph Atwood, great grandson of Harmon of Boston, had married Sarah Chresdee, a reputed English heiress, who fled to escape a suitor approved by her parents, but not by herself. A little after the French and Indian War Joseph visited England, perhaps to see about his wife's inheritance, perhaps because of the hope of securing Sanderstead Manor for the American line. for the last male Atwood of the Surrey line, John Atwood, died unmarried in 1761. He probably got neither fortune but it is related that he brought back from Sanderstead a parchment genealogy which showed that Harman of Boston was son of John, the son of Nicholas. This parchment is lost but older members of his branch told Charles Atwood, who collected the data for "The Atwood Family," published 1888, what they recalled and that this Harman came to America. No English book shows so much, but perhaps Joseph and the then owner of Sanderstead used family papers, now lost (or not found by us), and this parchment was made at that time. At any rate, I have no doubt as to the line of descent, though I have many more copies of original records than were known to Charles Atwood.

John Atwood, born 1582, was a leather seller. Thomas Buttolph brought Harman to Boston in his service, 1642, Buttolph being a glover and leather dresser. Harman became a cordwainer, or maker of leather goods, mostly footwear. In 1643, Harman was witness of a deed at Plymouth, F. Billington to John Atwood, (his uncle, bapt. Johanies, while John, 1582, was bapt. Johanem.)

We are unable, after thorough search to find in Somerset House, the probate of John, b. 1582, and it seems fairly possible that his estate, entirely personal, was settled up by Harman and that he took their shares to his brothers John, Stephen and Henry, for each of these seems to have had some small wealth. (John Wood came in the service of Rev. Joseph Hull, sailed Mch. 20, 1635, with John aged 20; settled Weymouth. Unless this John can be otherwise placed, he may well be John Wood alias Atwood of Plymouth, 1636).

Harman was admitted to be townsman of Boston, Dec. 26, 1642. In 1644 was member of Ye Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company; admitted to church, Feb. 26, 1644 and became freeman in 1645. Married Aug. 14, 1646; Ann Copp. dau. William Copp (d. 1669) and Judith (d. Mch. 25, 1670, age 67 stone of Copp's Hill, "Goodeth"). Copp, cordwainer, left bequests to grandchildren, John and Sarah Atwood.

Harman d. June 2, 1651 and estate was admitted to probate Oct. 8, same year, Ann Atwood, Adm. Estate amounted to L34.03.00. Ann m. 2d Thomas Saxton and sold Harman's house in 1657; d. 1659. Children:

He left a long and carefully drawn will, estate going to wife Mary during life, but property so she could, in her judgment, allow shares to any child that married; but, as often happens in such careful instruments, full of lawyer's jargon, at her death estate went "to my children then surviving." Hence, if the Atwood parent of any grandchild died before the death of the widow Mary, that grandchild had no right of inheritance.

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I have collections and manuscripts, 1848 to 1872, and old letters of grandchildren (and their children) of John Atwood who d. Jan. 1, 1812, at Weare, N. H., aged 97 years and 7 months. All state that James 3 Atwood was married that he and wife died. leaving son John, who was reared by his uncle John and aunt Hannah. But every effort to find a record, in town or church, deed or probate, to place James wife, has proved unavailing. Gilbert Atwood, in 1870, made a thoro search. This winter Luther Atwood went over every source we could think of and only succeeded in proving that every past guess was wrong. Charles Atwood went over same ground and in a letter now in my possession, states that family name and the persistent tradition make this descent very probable. I have done my best to attack it, with no

success. Absence of names; Philip, Oliver, Thomas, Elijah, Andrew, Nathaniel, Barnabas, Stephen, etc. among early names, and, the use of names common to Harman Line, is of some value as evidence. Every other known John of anywhere near the right age to be married in 1734, is accounted for. Hence this tradition stands as morally proved.

Hssex Line

Thomas Atwood, son of Thomas, was born at Bromfield, County Essex, Englang in 1610. He was a physician but became a soldier under Cromwell, being Captain in a regiment of Dragoons. At Marston Moor was struck in the mouth by a partly spent bullet, according to undisputed family tradition. I think published statements that he first lived at Plymouth, after coming to America, are based on fact that there were at least three others of same name, in eastern Massachusetts, in the 17th century. He may have landed here and even have been here a year or two, but the first authentic record of him is at Hartford, Ct., 1644, if reported correctly. By 1663 he was of Wethersfield. He an nephew Edward began the first shipyard on the Connecticut, building staunch and swift vessels for the West Indian trade. Captain Edward was lost with his ship on a voyage, with an Atwood ship. Wonder how Atwood Cay, in the Bahamas, got its name! Physician's bills left by Thomas show an extensive practice over a circuit of many miles. He married about 1667 a 17-year old girl named Abigail and died in 1682. At one time he and members of his family had stones at Wethersfield. A descendant reported seeing them, already much weather-worn, and when in later life he decided to copy the inscriptions, the stones had wholly disappeared. He had dim memories of a coat of arms on Thomas' stone, including a swan, presumably the crest. The Bromfield Atwood arms were: Silver field with azure "Fesse raguly," bearing three fleur de lis.
