Allen Family.

Two brothers, Robert and John Allen, came to Virginia, from Armagh, Ireland, in 1736. Robert settled in Frederick Co., and John settled in Albemarle Co. John had a daughter Elizabeth, who married David, the fourth son of his brother Robert, in Albemarle Co. This record is of the Family and descendants of Robert, who settled in Frederick Co.

Among the Van Meter Grants in Frederick County, Virginia, is one to Robert Allen, May 21st, 1742, for 685 acres on the south side of Opequon run. This tract was west from the Bartonville section. In April, 1744, we have the first mention of a Jury in Frederick County, and Robert Allen was on the list of jurors. In the May term, 1744, Robert Allen's name was also given. In March, 1758, the court ordered Robert Allen, with two others, John Hite and Sam Pritchard, to mark a road from Col. Hite's through the town out on Stephen's Plantation. In 1788-89, roads were opened in Frederick County, Va., from Parkins Mill to Redd's Ford, with Robert Allen as Overseer, and from Opequon to the Forge, with John Allen as Overseer. These two, Robert and John, were the sons of the First Robert Allen. (See Cartmell's Shenandoah Valley Pioneers.)

(1) Robert Allen was born in Armagh County, Ireland, about 1695. He married Deborah Montgomery in Armagh in 1730. He died near Winchester, Frederick Co., Va. in 1769. His will was dated Dec. 19, 1765, and admitted to probate Aug. 1, 1769. (Will book 3, Page 499) Robert Allen and his wife Deborah Montgomery Allen had the following Children:

(2) John Allen, born in Armagh, Ireland in 1732. Died in Frederick Co., Va. in 1794. Will made May 13, 1794. Proved July 2, 1794. (Will book 5, Page 505.) Married Anne Polick, later spelled Polk, in Carlisle, Pa., in 1760. Anne was born in 1743 and died in Shelby Co., Ky., in 1805. John was buried at Opequon Church, Kearnsstown, near Winchester, Frederick Co., Va. After his death his Family went to Shelby Co., Ky., the last one moving there in 1798.

Military Service of John Allen.

The following is on record in Court Order Book No. M7, Page 84. At a Court continued and held for Frederick County on Friday, the 4th day of June, 1756.

"Present; The Right Honorable Thomas, Lord Fairfax, Thomas Bryan

Martin, Thomas Van Swearingen and John Lindsey, Gentlemen Justices.

"John Allen sworn Lieutenant of the Militia."

The Foregoing court order establishes the first military services of John Allen which is on record in Frederick County.

Now comes the certified Commission of this same John Allen eighteen years later, in 1774, as Major of Militia.

The following is the Court Minutes as recorded in Court Order Book No. 16—Page 366.

At a Court held for Frederick County the 2nd day of August, 1774.

Present; The Right Honorable Thomas, Lord Fairfax, John Hite, Charles Mynn Truston, Edmond Taylor, Warner Washington, Junia and Edward Snickers, Gentlemen Justices.

"John Allen, Esqr. Produced a commission from the Governor appointing him Major of the Militia which being read the said John Allen Esqr. took the usual oaths to His Majesties Person and Government, took the abjuration oath and repeated and subscribed the teste."

John Allen served through the Revolutionary War as Major of Militia.

During and shortly after the close of the Revolutionary War the Court passed upon a large number of claims of citizens, for property impressed and taken for the use of the Continental Army.

In 1782 such an order was entered to pay John Allen for four tons of hay so impressed; The Order is as follows;

At a Court continued and held for Frederick County the 18th day of May, 1782—

The Court proceeded to receive sundry claims of persons for property impressed or taken for public use, as follows:

"———To John Allen for 8000 pounds of hay for Continental use."

State of Virginia,

City of Winchester, to wit;

I, J. B. Beverly do hereby certify that the foregoing records are of record in the County Court of Frederick County, Virginia, in the respective books to which reference is made herein.

Given into my hand this 29th day of January, 1917.

(3) Thomas Allen, born in Armagh, Ireland 1734. Settled in Warren County, Va. Married Abigail Miller in 1765. Died in Warren Co., Va., in 1822. Served as Colonel in the Revolutionary War, and for gallantry was presented with a sword by his State.

(4) Robert Allen, born in Armagh, Ireland, in 1736. Died near Winchester, Frederick Co., Va. in 1791. Will dated November 15th, 1791, probated December 6th, 1791. The name of his wife was Martha. Robert was buried at old Opequon Church, Kearnstown, near Winchester, Va. He fought in the Revolutionary War as a private in the Conti-

mental Line, as shown in the Virginia Revolutionary Land County records on file at Richmond, Va. The following is a certified copy:

"This is to Certify, that it appears from a list in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers in the Virginia Continental Line during the Revolutionary War as settling their accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to the Act of Assembly passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 14th, day of October, 1783, in the name of Robert Allen as soldier, infantry, for sixteen pounds, which certificate appears to have been delivered to himself, and was given for service prior to the first of January, 1782.

Given under my hand at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 8th day February, 1834.

(5) David Allen, born 1738, at Frederick Co., Va. Married about 1764 Elizabeth Allen, daughter of John Allen, brother of Robert Allen (1) in Albemarle Co., Va. Elizabeth was born in Rockfish Gap, Albemarle Co., Va. David settled in Albemarle Co., Va., where he died in 1783. Four years after his death, his oldest son moved the family to Greensburg, Greene Co., Ky., in 1787. David was Licut. in the Revolutionary War when captured at Charleston. He served to the end of the war as Captain of an independent Company. He was a manufacturer of cutlery, and also a farmer.

(6) Rebecca Allen, born about 1740 near Winchester, Frederick Co., Va., daughter of Robert and Deborah Montgomery Allen, married John Givens, and the family moved to Lincoln Co., Ky., from Virginia. John and Rebecca Givens had a son Robert, mentioned in will of his grandfather, Robert Allen. This John Givens was probably the son of Samuel Givens who was a pioneer in Frederick Co. in 1736. John Givens was a Captain in the Revolutionary War from October 16th, 1777 to March 15th, 1782. In the list of Militiamen given as members of Capt. John Givens' Company appear the names of John Givens, Robert Givens, Samuel Givens, Sr., James Givens and Wm. Givens. Robert Givens, son of John and Rebecca Allen Givens, served in the Revolutionary War at intervals from 1777 to 1782 under the following officers:—Capt. John Lewis, Capt. John Givens, Capt. Richard May, and Capt. John Martin, according to Pension Declaration of Robert Givens, of Lincoln Co., Ky., September 24th, 1824. (See "Gleanings of Virginia History," by Wm. Fletcher Boogher.)

Robert Givens, son of John and Rebecca Allen Givens, was born May 22nd, 1759. Married Martha, July 4th, 1782. Martha was born

July 31st, 1761. Robert died October 26th, 1833, in Lincoln County, Ky. Robert and Martha Givens had the following children:

John Allen Givens, born August 31st, 1784.

James Givens, born January 22nd, 1786.

Rebecca Brown, born April 19th, 1788.

Martha Givens, born December 24th, 1790.

Sarah Mitchell, born June 14th, 1793.

Benjamin Givens, born April 14th, 1796.

Robert Givens, born September 6th, 1799.

Molly Givens, born February 27th, 1802.

John Allen Givens, born August 31st, 1784, son of Robert and Martha Givens, settled in Monroe County, Indiana.

(1) Robert Allen's first wife, Deborah Montgomery Allen, died, and he married Sarah, and they had one son;

(7) Benjamine Allen, born near Winchester, Frederick Co., Va. He administered his father's estate in 1769 with brother John.

(2) John Allen, eldest son of Robert (1) married Anne Polick (Polk) in 1760, and had the following children:

(8) Robert Polk Allen married Deborah, daughter of Robert (4), son of Robert Allen (1). Settled about 4 miles from Shelbyville on road leading from Shelbyville to Taylorville in Spencer Co., Ky. Buried in Allen graveyard on his old place called Allendale. Robert had 2 children, a son James and a daughter Asseneth. Asseneth married Mr. Bobb and died without issue. James moved to Houston, Texas, married and had 2 children. Lawyer and Circuit Judge.

(9) Washington Allen lived about 8 miles from Shelbyville, Ky., on same road about 4 miles from brother Robert. Had a son Greenup, who married Deborah, sister of Col. Jack Allen of Nicaragua fame, his first cousin. Greenup was with John Morgan through Ky. and Ohio. Washington also had a son, Col. Preston Polk Allen, who was in the Mexican War of 1836-37. Also a daughter, Araminta, who married Mr. Blanton, and had 2 children living in Shelbyville. One married John P. Aller, Jr., nephew of Thomas Allen and Grandson of John Allen. The other a Mr. Clenpeter. Their names were Ann and Bettie.

(10) Thomas Allen married Anna Hornsby and had one child Mildred, who married Mr. Wilson. Thomas Allen lived about 10 miles from Shelbyville on adjoining farm with brother John, on Plum Creek, near old Plum Creek Church.

(11) John Allen lived on farm adjoining his brother Thomas. Had 3 sons, John, Dr. Joseph, Dr. Thomas, and 5 daughters, Deborah, Jane, Emily, Cynthia and Annie.

John was in the Civil War on Confederate side and died soon after the war. Married 4 times. Had daughter Millie married George Muster and lived at Jefferson, Ky., a son Dr. Thomas, and a daughter Susan, who married Henry Boteler of Eminence, Ky.

Dr. Joseph married twice but had no children. Buried at Danville, Kentucky.

Dr. Thomas was in Confederate Army as Surgeon in one of Morgan's Commands. Married twice, leaving 2 daughters by first wife. One lived at Louisville, Ky. and one in Henry Co., Ky. He and his second wife lived in Versailles, Woodford Co., Ky.

Deborah married Mr. Kincade, had 2 children living in Louisville, Kentucky.

Jane married Mr. Allen, had children living in Owensboro, Ky.

Emily married Mr. Nelson, had children living in Owensboro, Ky.

Cynthia and Annie never married.

(12) James David Allen married and had 15 children, 7 died in infancy and 8 lived to be grown and had families. Sons, Dr. Joseph, John Polk, Dr. James B., Robert W. J., and Thomas A. Daughters, Mary M., Louisa A., and Elizabeth D.

Dr. Joseph married 3 times. Had a daughter Sallie who married John W. Bell, who had a son Gen. James Franklin Bell of the Phillipines. Dr. Joseph had 3 children by his 3rd wife; Garnet, Drusilla and Josie. Garnet died. Drusilla married Mr. Smith and lived at Shelbyville, Ky. Josie married Mr. Harper and lived at Louisville, Ky.

John Polk had 4 sons, Walker, James, Baylor and John P. and 2 daughters, Bettie and Drew. Walker lived at Austin, Texas. James died. Baylor lived at Cincinnati, Ohio. John lived at Shelbyville, Ky. Bettie married Mr. Merriwether, lived on the old Robert Allen farm, called Allendale, and had daughter Susie who married Mr. Hennings and lived in New York City. Drew never married.

Dr. James B. married Frances Dixon and they had 2 sons, Dr. Joseph B. born 1849 and Henry D., of Morganfield, Ky., who was Congressman from his district for two terms, and 5 daughters, Drusilla, who married Dr. Jones, Georgiana who married Dr. Stone, Mary, Fanny and Sallie.

Robert W. J. had family but all died.

Thomas A. and family lived 9 miles from Shelbyville, Ky. He married in 1851 Miss Ford, whose parents came from Woodford Co., afterwards lived in Shelby Co., Ky. They originally came from Virginia. Had son James T. who died at the age of 26, and daughters, Sara D. and Jennie. Sara D. married J. A. Stanley and have 7 children; Allen, William, Lonnie B., James, Henry, Harold, and daughter Mary Jane. Mary Jane married W. C. Jones and has 4 children, Thomas, Stephen, Baylor and Jefferson Berry. The Stanleys lived about 4 miles from Shelbyville, Ky. Jennie married and lived with father and mother on farm.

(13) Elizabeth Allen married Harrison Taylor. Lived at Hardinsburg, Breckinridge Co., Ky. Had a granddaughter living in Louisville and one in Owensboro, Ky.

- (14) Annie Allen died in Shelbyville, Ky., unmarried.
- (15) Cynthia Allen married Joseph Hornsby in 1808, at Shelby Co., Ky. Had 10 children, 8 sons and 2 daughters, as follows:
- Joseph Walker Hornsby, born 1809, died 1842.
- John Allen Hornsby, born 1811.
- Ann Marie Hornsby, born 1813.
- Thos. W. Hornsby, born 1815.
- Wm. J. Hornsby, born 1817.
- Robert James Hornsby, born 1819.
- Nicholas Lewis Hornsby, born 1821, died 1909. Married Madeline de Laoreal.
- Mildred Thornton Hornsby, born 1826.
- Henry Hancock Hornsby, born 1829.
- Dodridge Christopher Hornsby, born 1831, died 1917.
- Nicholas Lewis Hornsby married Madeline de Laoreal, October 16th, 1855, and they had 7 children, all born in St. Louis, Mo. as follows:
- Joseph Lewis Hornsby, born 1856. Married Louise Shaw, June 12, 1906, and they had a daughter, Marie Louise, born October 27th, 1907. Joseph Lewis was an attorney at law in St. Louis for many years, living in St. Louis in 1920.
- Madeline Hornsby, born 1861. Unmarried and living in St. Louis in 1920.
- Mildred Hornsby, born 1863. Entered Visitation Convent in St. Louis as a Nun in 1892. Living in St. Louis in 1920.
- Henry T. Hornsby, born 1865. Married Marie Handlan November 6th, 1909. In the iron business in Joplin, Mo. in 1920. No children.
- Lena Hornsby, born 1866. Died 1871.
- Edward J. Hornsby, born 1869. Unmarried in 1920. With Medart Patent Pulley Co., of St. Louis, Mo., in 1920.
- Octavia Hornsby, born 1871. Entered Visitation Convent in St. Louis, Mo. as a Nun in 1904. Living in St. Louis in 1920.
- Madeline de Laoreal Hornsby died in 1872, and on May 18th, 1875, Nicholas Lewis Hornsby married her sister, Adele de Laoreal and they had a son, Francis Evremont Hornsby, born December 22nd, 1881 at St. Louis, Mo. Married Lucina Denvir, September 26th, 1913. No Children. In the fur business in St. Louis, Mo. in 1920.
- (16) Deborah Allen married William Sharpe in 1786. Had children living in Shelby Co., Ky. Had sons John Allen Sharpe, and Dr. David Newton Sharpe born in 1798, who married first, Jane Simpson of Winchester, Clark Co., Ky. Had no children. Married the second time, Pauline Glass of Scott Co., Ky. in 1837. Died in Shelby Co., Ky., November 26th, 1857. Buried in Grove Hill Cemetery, Shelbyville, Ky. Pauline Glass was the grand-daughter of Samuel Glass who died in Va. Had a grand-son, David Newton Sharpe.
- (17) Martha Allen married her cousin Montgomery Allen (23) son of Robert (4) and grandson of Robert (1) about 1792. (See Mont-

gomery Allen (23). Buried in old "Dunn Grave Yard" at Bloomington, Indiana.

(3) Thomas Allen, second son of Robert Allen (1) married Abigail Miller in 1765, and had the following children:

(18) Deborah Allen (daughter Thomas (3)) born 1766. Married General Robert Spottswood Russell, of Lexington, Ky. Had a granddaughter, Josephine Deborah Russell, who married John M. Clay, youngest son of Hon. Henry Clay of Ky., and lived at Lexington, Ky. Had a daughter Anna Russell Des Cagnetts of Lexington, Ky. Deborah Allen Russell died in 1842.

(19) William Allen (son of Thomas (3)) born 1769 and died 1809, Married Sarah Meridith.

(20) Thomas Allen (son Thomas (3)) born 1774, died 1823. Married Catherine Branson.

(21) Rebecca Allen (daughter Thomas (3)) born 1777, died 1802. Married Rev. Wm. Williamson.

(22) David Hume Allen (son Thomas (3)) born 1781, died 1854. Married Sarah Griffin Taylor in 1808, eldest daughter of Col. Griffin Taylor. The family lived at Clifton, an old Southern Mansion, near Gaylord, Clark Co., Va. for many years. David Hume Allen and his wife had the following children:

Algernon Sidney Allen, born 1810. Died 1879. Married Annie Owen. Thomas Griffin Allen, born 1812. Died 1891. Married Mary A. Harper, and Thomas and Mary had a son Maitland Allen, who lived for many years at Clifton, but was living in Limeton, Va. about 1915, unmarried. Maitland Allen had in his possession the old Allen Family Bible, from which many valuable records were secured.

William Temple Allen, born 1817. Died 1903. Married Elizabeth Bayly.

Arthur Montgomery Allen, born 1819. Died 1890. Married Jane Scott Tidball.

Mary Catherine Allen, born 1821. Died 1908. Married Gen. Carlos Butterfield.

Frances Thornton Allen, born 1823. Died 1909. Married Hon. Thomas Montague Isbell, State Senator.

Adgar A. Allen, born 1825. Died 1904.

Lucy Ellen Allen, born 1832. Died 1908.

Emma Allen, born 1834. Died 1854.

(4) Robert Allen, third son Robert (1) and his wife Martha, had the following children:

(23) Montgomery Allen (son of Robert (4)) born about 1770, married his cousin, Martha Allen, daughter of John Allen, (2), about 1792. He moved to Shelbyville, Ky. In 1803 he removed to Uniontown, and about 1815 moved back to Shelby Co. His wife Martha Allen, died at the

home of her son John, and is buried in the old "Dunn Grave Yard" at Bloomington, Ind. Montgomery was buried on a farm in Putnam Co., near Putnamville, Ind., 8 miles north of Greencastle, Ind.

(24) Deborah Allen (daughter of Robert (4)) married Robert Polk Allen, son of her uncle, John Allen (2). (See Robert Polk Allen (8).)

(25) Martha Allen, daughter of Robert (4) married Arthur Patterson.

(26) Anna Allen, daughter of Robert (4) married Mr. Sharp.

(27) Mary Allen, daughter Robert (4) married Mr. Hornsby.

(28) Elizabeth Allen, daughter Robert (4) married Mr. Taylor.

(29) Nancy Allen, daughter Robert (4) died unmarried. Buried in Allen grave-yard, Allendale, Shelby Co., Ky.

(30) Sarah Allen, daughter Robert (4) married Mr. Prendergast.

(5) David Allen, fourth son of Robert (1) and his wife Elizabeth Allen, had the following children, born in Va., Married and lived in Ky.

(31) John Allen (son of David (5)) born about 1765, married Margaret Moore, died in Green Co., Ky. in 1808.

(32) Robert Allen, (son of David (5)) born about 1766, married Maria McElroy, sister of Mary Eliza McElroy. Died in Green Co., Ky., 1809. No children.

(33) James (Joseph) Allen (son of David (5)) born in 1769 in Albemarle Co. Va. The first lawyer of Greensburg, Green Co., Ky. A brilliant scholar and statesman, and Brigadier General in the War of 1812. Married three times.

His first wife was Mary Eliza McElroy, whose mother was Margaret Irvin of Virginia. Her ancestor was Irvin, who lived near Philadelphia, Pa. during the Revolution of 1776, and was a wealthy farmer.

Mary Eliza McElroy was born in Virginia, and had brothers James, and William Irvin, and sisters Esther, Margaret and Maria.

Esther McElroy married Felix Grundy, and had one daughter, Johana Grundy. Margaret McElroy married Dr. Blythe, a Presbyterian Minister of Lexington, Ky. and had children, Margaret, Ebenezer, Eliza, Davis (a preacher). Maria McElroy married Robert Allen (32) brother of James (Joseph) Allen (33), and had no children. She married second Thomas Speed, born in Mercer Co., Ky., Clerk of Court of Bardstown, Ky. and had children, Thomas, John and Mary. Mary died in infancy. Thomas had children and John had two daughters, Louise and Rose. Louise married and was living in 1880. Rose died unmarried in 1895.

James (Joseph) Allen and his first wife, Mary Eliza McElroy had the following children; Theodotious Allen, Robert McElroy Allen, Maria Allen, married James W. Barret, Eliza James Allen, married William D. Barret, brother of James W. and Anne Barret. (See Barret Family.)

James (Joseph) Allen married the second time, Ann or Nancy Bar-

ret. sister of James W. & Wm. D., born February 14th 1786. (See Barret Family).

James (Joseph) Allen married the third time Eliza Allen. He had a son John Rowan Allen of Lexington, Ky., who had a daughter Betty Buckner Allen who married Mr. Greer of Memphis, Tenn. and a son John Rowan Allen of Lexington, Ky.

James (Joseph) Allen died November 25th, 1836, being killed by a fall from his horse. (Usually omitted the name "Joseph" in his name.)

(34) Thomas Allen (son of David (5)) born about 1770. Died before 1787.

(35) Mary Allen (daughter of David (5)) born about 1772, married Samuel Moore, brother of Margaret Moore, John Allen's (31) wife. Living in 1833.

(36) David Allen (son of David (5)) born about 1774, married Patsy Barret. A Captain in Gen. James Allen's Co., War of 1812. Died in Green Co., Ky., November 14th, 1817.

(37) Benjamin Allen (son of David (5)) born about 1776, died before 1787.

(23) Montgomery Allen (son of Robert (4)) grandson Robert (1) and his wife Martha had the following children; and 2 others who died in infancy:

(38) Martha Ann Allen (daughter Montgomery (23)) born Feb. 14th, 1795. Died September 11, 1835.

(39) Robert Newton Allen (son of Montgomery (23)) born March 4th, 1797. Died November 11th, 1876 at Bloomington, Indiana. Buried in the Cemetery at the Brick Chapel Church, 5 miles north of Greencastle, Indiana.

(40) Malinda Polick Allen (daughter of Montgomery (23)) born February 1st, 1801. Married Daniel Warson about 1830. Died in Arkansas about 1862.

(41) James Madison Allen (son Montgomery (23)) born February 5th, 1809, died February 22nd, 1824.

(42) John Washington Allen (son of Montgomery (23)) born May 4th, 1804, Uniontown, Ky., died September 8th, 1852, Bloomington, Indiana.

(43) Thomas Jefferson Allen (son Montgomery (23)) born Oct. 19th, 1806. Died February 2nd, 1828.

(44) William Patterson Allen (son Montgomery (23)) born May 6th, 1811, died 1885. Married Catherine Wright of Putnam Co., Indiana, about 1830. Catherine died and he married Ruth Metcalfe Mahon, widow of Samuel Mahon of Shelby Co., Ky., September 18th, 1839. (See Metcalfe Family.)

(45) Cynthia Ann Allen (daughter Montgomery (23)) born June 7th, 1813. Married Anderson Osborn about 1835.

(39) Robert Newton Allen (son Montgomery (23) and Martha Allen.) married Elizabeth Talbott, April 9th, 1826 and had the following children:

(46) Sarah Ann Allen, daughter of Robert Newton (39) born at Greencastle, Ind., April 11, 1827. Married Joe Allen, May 24, 1849, at Greencastle. Died December 18, 1899 at Wichita, Kansas.

(47) Arthur Patterson Allen, (son Robert Newton (39)) born January 15th, 1829. Married Rachel Josephine Dodds, July 3rd, 1855. Died at Erie, Kansas, February 4th, 1917, having celebrated his 88th birthday.

(48) Martha Marie Allen, (daughter Robert Newton (39)) born January 1st, 1830. Died February 27th, 1838.

(49) William Edward Allen (son Robert Newton (39)) born October 15th, 1832. Died May 17th, 1853.

THE LITTLER FAMILY

Ascertaining that the Littler Family was originally from England, the English Records were searched, and much information was secured from the Visitations of the Harleian Society, and from the "History of Cheshire" by George Ormerod, published in London in

1819. All of the information obtained, however, was from the Records of Cheshire or Chester County. Littler of Vale Royal, County Chester, settled in that County since Edward I, 1272-1307.

(1) Robert Littler, of Wallerscote, married Elizabeth, daughter of Randall Farran of Atton, and Margaret, his wife. Robert Littler and his wife Elizabeth had a son.

Richard and Ann Bressy Littler had a son Ralff of Wallerscote, living in 1613, who married three times. His first wife was Elynor, daughter of Rauff Bryne or Bruen, who he married in 1566. His second wife was Mary Littler, daughter of Richard Littler of London. His third wife was Ann, daughter of Thomas Bronley of Hampton.

The Manor of Wallerscote was given by Adam de Wringle to the nuns of Chester, who continued capital lords to the dissolution. The township consists of a single house with the land annexed, and contained no road which is reputed a highway. The Littlers held this Manor as mediate lords under the nuns, and after the dissolution, became its possessors. Their name is local, from the Hamlet of Little Over, and frequently occurs in the early deeds as "Lutelovre" in the Ledger Book of Vale Royal, dating back to Edward I, 1272-1307. Ralph Littler, the younger, and his sons, Richard and William, in 1637, sold this place, called the Manor of Wallers-

cote, to Hugh Cholmondeley, of Knights Grange, esq., second son of Sir Hugh Cholmondeley, the younger, and ancestor of Earl Cholmondeley. Robert Lord Cholmondeley, of Kellis, son of Hugh, was possessed of the Manor in 1671, and it was then held under him by Ralph Littler, a lessee, and in the 17th Century it was the property of a family of the name of Wade. Wallerscote Hall was an old timber mansion, used as a farm house in 1819.

In the History of Chester, by Geo. Ormerod, we find that in the city of Chester, in the church of the Holy Trinity, there is a monument to Johannes Littler, with the following inscription:

"Johannes Littler was alderman and Justice of the Peace of this city. Was Mayor in 1603, and died on the first day of April, 1619."

Littler coat of Arms: Argent, a chevron Sable, between three squirrels sejant Gules.

From the records of the Maryland Historical Society of Baltimore, Md., of the Early Virginia Emigrants, 1623-1666, we find that Richard Littler came to America in 1647. This Richard was very likely the son of Ralph and Prudence Prestland Littler, born in 1607, making him 40 years of age when he came to this country. As this Richard Littler is the only Littler given in the list of Emigrants coming to this country that the author could find, he may have been the ancestor of the first Littler of which we have official records in this country. According to family tradition, the first Littler was associated with William Penn, remaining with Penn and his party at Philadelphia until after the treaty with the Indians.

With reference to the Littler Family of Virginia, much reliable information was secured from "Shenandoah Valley Pioneers and their Descendants," by T. K. Cartmell. The following items of interest are secured from this source:

"The Littler Family was one of the old English Colony that secured a minor grant Nov. 12th, 1735, for 1,735 acres. This grant was to John Littler and Thomas Rees, and the survey describes the tract as extending by the Yorkshireman's branch, sometimes called Littler Run, and a similar grant embraced land where the Stephenson station is, and of Kenilworth prior to 1800. John Littler died in 1748, and had sons John, Samuel and Nathan."

"1743, by order of the court, it was ordered that a road be made from John Frost's mill to the main road, between John Littler's plantation and John Milburns. It was ordered that John Littler, Wm. Dillon and Joseph Burchham lay off the same. Their report was as follows: 'We have laid off the road from Cap. Frost's mill, thence to Buffler-lick, then to the the back side of John Bosser's field, then to David Shriners, then to the usual ford, thence to the east side of Wm. Frost's plantation, thence along a good ridge by a course of marked trees, to Mathias Elmores, then along said

Elmores creek to the head, and the best convenientst way that can be had, by widow Dillon's, and by the said marked trees, to the main road leading to Rappahannock, between John Littler's and Milburns."

"In 1752 a new road was opened from the courthouse to Littler's old place, and from Smith's to John Littler's, and from Geddings plantation to Littler's Mill. From Mill Creek to Littler's old place.. From Littler's old place to Opequon. From Stephen's Mill to Mary Littler's."

"In the list of Justices of court of Frederick Co., 1795 to 1813, is the name of Elijah Littler."

The earliest official court records of the Littler Family in the United States, that the author has been able to find up to the present time, are of Samuel Littler, who settled at Nottingham, Chester Co., Pa., receiving a grant of 500 acres when the plot was laid out in 1701.

(1) Samuel Littler married Rachel Taylor, May 31st, 1707, at Nottingham, Pa. Rachel Taylor was the widow of Thomas Taylor, and daughter of John Minshall, of Great Britain. Samuel Littler died March 12, 1727, and buried March 14th, 1727, at Nottingham, Pa. His will was dated March 8th, 1727, and probated May 30th, 1727. Samuel Littler and Rachel Taylor were members of the Society of Friends, and the following records were secured concerning their marriage:

At Concord Monthly Meeting, 3-12-1707; Samuel Littler requested a certificate to Chester Monthly Meeting, in order for marriage with Rachel Tailler: Andrew Job and John Kingsman are appointed to inquire respecting his clearness.

4-9-1707: Samuel Littler's certificate signed.

At Chester Monthly Meeting 4-31-1707; Samuel Littler of Nottingham, belonging to Concord & Chichester Monthly Meeting, declared intentions of marriage with Rachel Taylor of Middletown, widow, and he produced a certificate of clearness from other engagements.

5-28-1707: Samuel Littler and Rachel Taylor declared the continuation of their intentions and no obstruction appearing were given liberty to accomplish their marriage. Joseph Baker and Ephraim Jackson were appointed to have oversight of the marriage.

WHEREAS Samuel Littler of Notingham in the County of Chester and Province of Pensilvania, Husbandman, & Rachell Taylor, Widow of Thomas Taylor & Daughter of John Minshall of Great Britain, the sd Rachell Taylor Living in the Township of Edgmond, in the aforesd County and Province,—Having Declared their Intentions of Taking Each other In marriage before Severall Publick meetings of the People of God Called Quakers in & belonging to Chester monthly meeting According to the Good order used among

them, whose Proceedings therein, after a Deliberate Consideration thereof and having Consent of Parents & Relations Concerned and nothing appearing to obstruct weare approved by the said meetings. Now these are to Certife whom it may Concern that for the full accomplishing of their sd Intentions This 31st Day of the 5th month in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seven They the sd Samueller Littler & Rachell Taylor appearing in a Publick assembly of ye aforesd people & others Mett to Gather for that End & Purpose in the Publick meeting House in Middletown in the County aforesd, he the Said Samuel Littler Takeing the Said Rachell Taylor by the hand Did in solemn manner openly Declare that he Tooke her to be his wife promising through Gods assistance to be unto her a faithful & Loving Husband untill Death should Seperate them—and then & there in the sd assembly the said Rachell Taylor did in Like manner Declare that shee Took the said Samueller Littler to be her Husband Promising through God's assistance to be unto him a faithful & Loving Wife untill Death should Seperate them; and moreover they the sd Samueller Littler & Rachell Taylor, she according to ye Custom of marriage assuming the name of her Husband, as a further Confirmation thereof did then & there to these presents set their hands the day and year first above written.

Thomas Taylor, the first husband of Rachel Minshall, was the son of Thomas Taylor of Worthenbury in Flintshire, Wales, and of Frances Yardle (Yardley?), his wife, and was born 5th Mo. 4th, 1675; was married 11 Mo. 9th, 1700, and died 6 Mo. 15th, 1705. The marriage took place at Philadelphia Meeting.

Rachel, widow of Samuel Littler, was married May 3rd, 1728, to Thomas Oldham of Nottingham. Rachel died in July, 1762.

(1) Samuel and Rachel Littler had the following children born at Nottingham, Chester Co., Pa.:

(2) John, born March 28th, 1708, married Apr. 5, 1728, to Mary Ross, daughter of Alexander Ross, a Friend. Moved to Win-

chester, Va., and died there in 1748. Will dated Aug. 30th, 1748. Probated Dec. 6th, 1748.

Alexander Ross, a Friend, is said to have come from Ireland to the neighborhood of Chichester in (now) Delaware Co., Pa., where he married, in April, 1706, Katherine Chambers. By deed of Dec. 11th, 1713, in which he was styled of Radnor township, joiner, he purchased 150 acres of land in Whiteland, Chester Co., but sold this in the next year, and in 1716 removed to the Nottingham settlement. The births of his children were recorded by New Garden Monthly Meeting, as follows:

Alexander Ross was taxed in West Nottingham township 1718-1730. Nov. 23rd, 1732, he with Morgan Bryan and others obtained a grant of 100,000 acres of land in what is now Frederick Co., Va., from Gov. Gooch and Council. One account states that they obtained 70,000 acres on the Opeckon River, near Winchester. Many Friends and others flocked thither and a Meeting was established there in 1734 or 1735, and in 1736 a Monthly Meeting called Hopewell, of which the records were unfortunately burned in 1759.

Alexander Ross died in 1748 and his wife in 1749; buried at Hopewell Meeting.

(3) Joshua, born Jan. 10th, 1710. Died in Newcastle Co., Del., 1774. Married Deborah Oldham, daughter of Thomas Oldham, Sept. 9th, 1733. Had son Thomas, born Oct. 10th, 1734. Rachel, born Aug. 14th, 1736, died July 22nd, 1762. Susannah, born Aug. 5th, 1737. John, Sarah, Hannah and Mary. Grandsons Thomas and Joshua Canby, who were the descendants of Oliver Canby, who built the first mill in that section.

(4) Samuel, born Dec. 7th, 1712. Married Mary Brooks of Providence Township June 22nd, 1735, at Chester Monthly Meeting. Had a daughter Rachel, born July 19th, 1737. Rachel married Elisha Brown, son of Joshua Brown and wife Hannah, of Little Britain, Lancaster Co., Pa., March 19th, 1761, at Nottingham.

Mary Brooks Littler died Aug. 13th, 1738.

THE METCALFE FAMILY

Much has been written about this family, which was prominent and numerous in Yorkshire, England, for many centuries. From "Foster's Pedigrees" we learn a great deal about these people. Isaac S. Metcalfe and James T. Metcalfe have both given us a history of this family, and from the "William and Mary Quarterly" interesting information has been gathered. We are informed that the Metcalfe Family is of Danish origin, the founder, Arkefrith, Adam De Dente, Lord Dente in Denmark, a celebrated warrior, went to England with Canute in 1016, and in the division of lands, Canute gave him a large tract of land in what is now the Shire of York. This was situated between three hills, and according to one authority, a hill in Danish is called "Calfe," and "Metta" is the word used for "Between," this being one version of the origin of the name "Metta Calfe." There are several other versions as to the origin of the name, but this seems the most probable, and this gave origin to the Coat of Arms, which is charged with three black calves. The following is the authority for the Coat of Arms: "Being required of Matthew Metcalfe, son of Lucas of Bedall, gentleman, to make search in the registers and records of my office for the auncient arms belonging to that name and family whereof he is descended: Wereupon I have made search accordingly, and do finde that he may lawfully beare, as his ancestors hath borne, auncient armes hereafter following, that is to say. silver. three calves sable. Sep. 29, 1581." Surtees Society XLI, 41. The following names, giving the early generations of this family, are copied from "Metcalf Genealogy," by Istaac S. Metcalf:

This (14) James Metcalf was the founder of a very large family in Yorkshire, one of the descendants, in all probability, being the founder of this branch of the family of this name in the United States.

(1) James M. Metcalfe, or Midcalf, as he spelled his name according to his will, the founder of this particular branch of the family in the United States, was born about 1700, in England. His wife was an English woman by the name of Britton. Her given name was Margaret, according to his will. He was supposed to have been a British Officer, who was sent to Enniskillen, Ireland, from whence he emigrated to America in 1730. He settled at Lancaster County, Pa., where he died in January, 1760. On March 1, 1742, he received a grant of land in Lancaster County for 120 acres, and on March 21, 1755, he received a grant for 60 acres in the same county. According to his will, which was dated Jan. 3, 1760, and proved the same month, he left surviving him his wife, Margaret, and three children, to-wit:

(2) Curtis, born 1733, at Lancaster Co., Pa. Lived at Little Britain Township until his children by his first wife were grown. His first wife died and he married the second time and moved to North Carolina, where he died. His first wife was named Mary.

(3) Abraham, not of age when his father died in 1760. Born in Lancaster Co., Pa. Settled at Baltimore, Md., about 1770. Had several sons.

(4) Rachel, mentioned in father's will. Nothing further known of her.

The following is a copy of the will of James M. Midcalf:

Whereas I, James Midcalf of Little Britain Township in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, being indisposed and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of the Body knowing I must die, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following:

First, my will is that my Body be decently buried and my Debts and funeral charges paid.

Second, my will is that my beloved Wife have privilege of one-half of my Plantation till my son Abraham comes to the age of twenty-one years and to live in my Stone house that is one story high, likewise one-half of my orchard and I give and bequeath to my wife one-third part of my personal estate forever.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my two sons, Curtis and Abra-

ham my plantation in Little Britain to be equally divided both in quantity and quality to them their heirs and assigns forever, my son Curtis to Injoy his part immediately after my decease and my son Abraham to Injoy his part at the age of twenty-one years.

Fourthly, I give to my Daughter Racheal out of my personal estate the sum of fifty pounds, and Brown mare which is called her's, and her saddle and bridle.

Fifthly, I give to my son Abraham my sorrel three year old Colt.

Sixthly, my will is that my ploughs and plough tacklings to be equally divided between my two sons Curtis and Abraham. Sixthly my will is that after my son Abraham arrives to the age of twenty-one years, that my wife deliver up to my son Abraham the half of my plantation she enjoys. My will is that in Consideration thereof, that my two sons, Curtis and Abraham, pay yearly to their mother the sum of three pounds ten shillings apiece and maintain two cows and one horse for her during her life, and cut an half sufficient firewood and let her Injoy the stone house above mentioned all during her life. Likewise my Will is that my two sons maintain for their Mother six sheep on the premises and likewise my will is that my two sons shall allow two rows of apple trees to their mother such as she may choose.

Seventhly, I give to my beloved wife, one bed and bed clothes at her choice and likewise my two orphan children, viz: Samuel Crastor and Dorcas Mcqueston to be at her disposal.

Eighthly, my will is and I give to my two sons Curtis and Abraham all the remainder of my personal estate to be equally divided between them.

Lastly, I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Margaret and my beloved son Curtis to be my executors of this my last Will and Testament and disanul and revoke all wills heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and testament.

Signed, sealed and declared to be such this third Day of the first month one Thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty.

Lake Daraga as Radio operator, July 11, 1918. His vessel sent to France in August, and he then remained in service until Dec. 22, and his vessel sent back to the U. S. In June, 1919, he was on the U. S. S. Quail, a mine sweeper, and joined the fleet in the North Sea, otherwise called the U. S. Navy's "Suicide Club." His work is completed and he arrived in New York, Nov. 19, 1919. The following is a notice in one of the New York newspapers:

"New York, Nov. 24, 1919.—The United States Navy's 'Suicide Club'—3600 officers and men of 59 mine-sweepers just returned from the perilous task of clearing the North Sea of mines—was honored today by officials of the navy and city. Secretary Daniels and Rear Admiral Joseph Strauss, commander of the flotilla, reviewed the craft in the Hudson River. The Flagship Black Hawk fired the secretary's salute as the reviewing destroyer passed. Sweepers, submarine chasers and trawlers removed 50,000 mines planted in an area of 250 square miles of the North Sea. The work began April 29, 1919, and ended in September. BARHYTE.

The Barhydts came from Holland in 1665, and settled on the Hudson River, near Coxsackie, N. Y.

In 1700 Andre Barheit was surveyor of New Roschelle, N. Y.

In 1702 Andre Barheit was Collector of New Roschelle, N. Y.

The name was spelled differently by various members of the family. The first Barhyte which the author can trace as being a direct ancestor of persons given in this family history was John of New Roschelle, in Westchester Co., N. Y., whose will was proved Jan. 18, 1772. Following is a copy of his will:

Liber 28, Page 156. In the name of God Amen. Dec. 24, 1762. I, John Barhyte, Sr., of New Roschelle, in Westchester Co., being sick, I leave to my wife, Judith, ten pounds, and all the movables within the doors of my house, and the use of all my estate while she remains my widow. After her death or remarriage my executors to sell all. I leave to my son Andrew five shillings, to my daughter Hester, wife of Jacob Concklin, the best table. To the heirs of my late daughter, Judith, wife of Sevrance Acker, my best looking glass. To my son John, five pounds, he having received the rest of his portion. To my daughter Abigail, wife of Peter Alley, my best kettle. To my daughter, Charity, wife of Geo. Cornwell, my cupboard. All the rest of my estate I leave to my son Andrew, my daughter Hester, and the heirs of my daughter Judith, my daughter Abigail and my daughter Charity. Provided that if my son Andrew does not behave himself well in the management of the affairs, my executors are to make use of his part for his wife and children. I make by wife Judith, my son-in-law, Geo. Cornwell, and my son-in-law Peter Alley, executors. Witnesses, Abigail Bleeker, Moses de St. Croix, Jacobus Bleeker. Proved Jan. 18, 1772.

Judith, wife of John Barhyte, was the daughter of Frederick De Voorse, Sr., of Westchester Co., whose will was proved Dec. 8, 1743. This name was spelled De Voorse, De Voee, De Voe, De Vaux and De Veaux, by different members of the family.

From National Encyclopaedia of American Biography.

Frederick De Veaux, a native of France, and a Huguenot, fled to Mannheim, Germany, and thence to N. Y., in 1675. The family is an ancient one, of Norman origin. Frederick settled in Harlem, and married Hester, daughter of Daniel Tourneur, and by his marriage and purchase, became the owner of large tracts of land on

Manhattan Island, at Morrisiana and New Roschelle. A grand-son, Frederick, born about 1710, settled on a farm on the Phillipse Manor, below Yonkers, and his son John took an active part in the War of the Revolution. John married Rebecca Devoe, a relative, and had 11 children.

Liber 15, Page 16. In the name of God Amen. Jan. 23, 1741, I, Frederick De Voorse, Sr., of Westchester. My executors are to pay all debts and I leave to each of them £5. I leave to my grandson, John De Voorse, £20, to be paid by my son Abel. I leave to my son, Abel, all that my 100 acres of land at New Roschelle and he is to pay my executors £135. I leave to my daughter Judith my French Psalm Book. I make my sons Frederick and Daniel and my friend Abraham Northing, Executors. Witnesses, Gerardus Wilse, James Collard, Roger Barton. Proved Dec. 8, 1743.
